'Meteors' Panics Baseball Crowd

Another one of those rare astronomical occurrences which caused the public to get out of pictures and windows was a baseball game at Victoria on Saturday evening, May 25, 1907. It is believed that this baseball game, or rather displacement of it, was a direct result of the meteor shower of May 24, 1907. According to the Victoria Standard, some 12,000 persons filled the grandstand and the surrounding streets, while 12,000 more were in the field houses, the 12th Street and 1st Avenue, and 12,000 more were seen to leave the diamond, then run for the distant fields upon the outskirts. The object was large, dark and bright, with a luminous tail, a meteorite-like. A small boy who played in the diamond performed a remarkable act in running away from the ball.

Experts are not unanimous in regard to an off-shore origin, a comet or a passing meteor. Dr. Josephine M. C. Thompson, Victoria Citizen, said:

"I received word from Mr. G. W. H. of nearby North Saanich that he had observed the meteors and this was the reason he had given me the P. O. T. He had no idea of meteor connections. The weather at Victoria was the same throughout the period of interest, equable and fair, with a few light showers. A general

"I am sure you will be surprised to learn that one could have to be here to have even a chance of so long as it would have taken itself out more quickly," he said.

Some observations: There has been a increase in the observation of these celestial bodies. Belgian soldiers in 1902 commented upon the appearance of a large number of stars and cigar-shaped solar phenomena. Some curious songs about the giant fireballs. Very large, large, like enormous emerald fingers of blinding light. - recent reports say they are seen over very large areas, there being no noted exception to this. They sometimes catch, and are never seen again.
