224;3 HOURS, PACIFIC STANDARD TIME. THE OBJECT APPEARED TO SOME
VIEWERS TO BE 200 FEET LONG. A BALL OF BRIGHT LIGHT, WITH A LONG
TAIL BEHIND. THE TAIL APPEARED AS BURNING, AND PIECES FALLING
