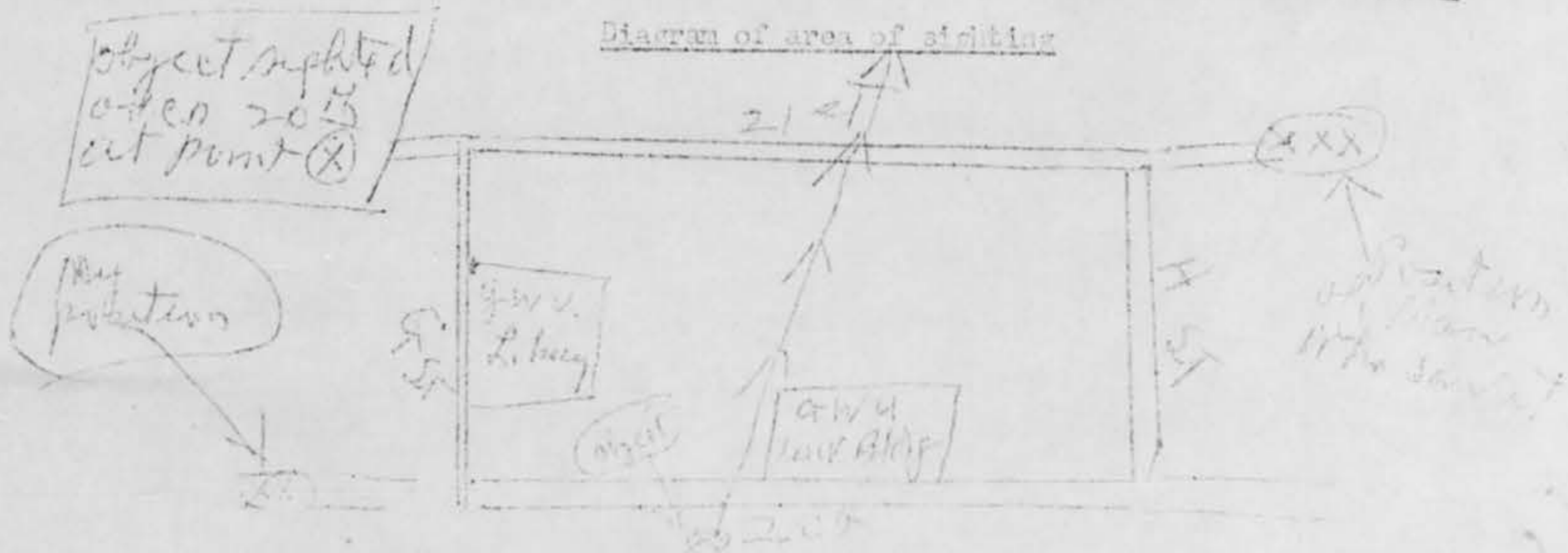

Sighting of luminous object in sky

One week ago, in the vicinity of G and 20th, about 10 P.M. or a bit later, walking North on 20th just south of G, I suddenly saw ahead and seemingly about 150 to 200 feet high an object moving West or a bit NW at a moderate speed, so that by the time I walked a few steps it passed from sight over the George Washington University Law Building, seemingly on a slightly descending path. In a few seconds, I noticed several people on the corner and asked if they saw it but none had. But I walked to 21st and H and just to the north of that intersection asked a man sitting in front of a house if he had seen it and he said yes and he thought it was a shooting star. To him it had appeared to be to the southward of where he was sitting, so his and my views of it indicate it was quite low and about over the middle of the block between G and H and travelling north or NW. What makes it unusually interesting is that it appeared to me to be about the size of a football or a bit larger, glowing brightly with a pale green light, with a slight tail of orange color. Its descending path, to my eye, was at such a definite angle that I would not have been surprised to have learned that it landed only a couple of blocks away but this was apparently illusory--seemingly NW and not descending so steeply as I had thought.

I do not consider it to have been a mysterious object but thought it worth reporting for your records.
