

Dear Sir,

On the evening of July 3rd at
the geographic position Latitude $17^{\circ}54.5'N$,
Longitude $87^{\circ}36.5'W$. I sighted at 19:30
C. P. T. in the S. W. quadrant a
brilliant object moving S. I tried to
interrupted observation to get the dimensions
and found it again without much
change in position. Almost immediately it
changed course into the N. W. direction.
It crossed my zenith in an erratic course
into the N. E. It passed at
about 20 degrees altitude and decreasing
altitude at a slow gradually from
right. My Mother, Father, and older
brother all saw this object. I hope
this information is of use to you, and
would like to hear if you have information
what it was
