DISPATCH, LORING AIR FORCE BASE CONFIRMS THIS OFFICE'S INFORMATION THAT THERE WAS AN EXERCISE IN PROGRESS ON 10 AUGUST 1962, SEVERAL AIRCRAFT FROM LORING WERE ENGAGED IN REFUELING OPERATIONS OVER THE OBSERVATION POINT DURING THE NIGHT AND A NUMBER OF AIR DEFENSE COMMAND INTERCEPTORS WERE ENGAGED IN LOW ALTITUDE OPERATIONS DURING THE SAME PERIOD IN THE AREA OF THE OBSERVATION POING. K. REPORT PREPARED BY 2LT PETER A. RUBSTEIN, COMBAT INTELLIGENCE BRANCH, INTELLIGENCE DIVISION, 4038TH STRATEGIC WING(SAC), DOW AIR FORCE BASE MAINE.
