Initial observation at 60 dgrs elevation 300 dgr azimuth falling to zero elevation 120 azimuth. Appeared like a/c fuselage on fire. Sighting estimated at 10-15 seconds. No radar contact in local area.			11. COMMENTS Duration too short for decay. No decay for 1 September. Characteristics of meteor sighting are present. Speed would be rather slow; however, still consistent with this analysis.


