UFO QUESTIONNAIRE

1. Description of object.

Shape. Form with a fin on the top and on the bottom. The bottom fin was four times larger than the fin.

Size. About the size of a Paper One. When asked to describe a relation to known object couldn't give an answer. Insisted on being told it was 3/4 mile from observation point.

Color. No color given. Light very bright. It was in a row around the center of object. Light seemed to emanate from windows around the center of object.

Number. One.

Discernible features. The windows described above and the fins.

No tail, trail or exhaust.

No sound, only splash when object fell into reservoir.

2. Description of the course of the object.

Object was moving north to south along the Credell Reservoir.

When first observed it was at tree top level. The object hovered over a tree, moved south hovered again and then dropped into the reservoir. It immediately took off again proceeding south. It had about 500 feet altitude when it passed over the persons observing the object. Take off from the water was gradual and not vertical.

When first observed the object was due north.

When the object disappeared (last observed) it was heading due south.

Time period of observation was unknown.

3. Manner of observation.

The persons observing the object were on a bridge, oriented east to west, over the reservoir. The bridge is estimated 30 feet off of the water. The reservoir is estimated to be 125-150 feet across at the bridge. The persons were standing in the middle of the bridge on the north side.

The object was observed with the naked eye.

On Saturday Sept. 15th, at 7:55 p.m., three boys told police that they had seen a strange oval-shaped craft set down in the Cradell Reservoir, just south of the Cradell Avenue Dam. The three said that the object hovered over the water, submerged for a few seconds, and then rose vertically and disappeared. As further proof, a fisherman on the opposite side of the reservoir reported hearing a loud splash at just about the time the boys said the object hit the water. To complicate matters still further, large banana-shaped tracks were reported in Emerson (a nearby town), where several witnesses claimed the UFO had landed first. The Air Force sent a representative to the area and the police then barricaded the land from the public.

The next day, Sunday Sept. 16th, two Emerson youths reported see-

1. Reference the attached copy of the report of an unidentified flying object sighting which occurred in Oradell, New Jersey on 15 September 1962. The information contained in this report is limited, both in scope and detail, precluding a positive finding as to what caused the sighting. However, the available information points toward the misidentification of a bird as the most logical cause.
2. The witnesses reported the object to be approximately the size of a Piper Cub at a distance of three-quarters of a mile. If this is true the angle subtended by the object, assuming the longest dimensions of the Cub, would be approximately 0.5 degrees, the same angle subtended by the moon. However, if the object passed overhead at 500 feet as reported, it would now subtend an angle of approximately 4.5 degrees or would appear nine times larger. The witnesses reported limited details of the object when first observed but were unable to observe any additional detail when the object was larger by a factor of nine.
3. If we assume that the object was a bird, approximately 150 feet away from the witnesses when it was first observed and closer than 100 feet when passing over them, the bird would then approximate the angular sizes derived from the information provided by the witnesses.
4. This sighting took place during the middle twilight hours and the shadowy effects common to this time of day were probably a contributing factor.
5. If the witnesses can provide further information regarding the sighting, we will re-evaluate the case in the light of this new evidence.


US SIGHTINGS-NICAP-Sept (14-18) 1962:

For five days, the East experienced many sightings. Again, as on Sept 18 here, many state patrolmen and policemen were witnesses. Ground-level observations of U F Os were reported. One UFO struck the surface of a water reservoir with a splash and then hovered above the surface. Eighteen feet of colored movie film was taken of a UFO or UFOs. We are awaiting word of results. NICAP has requested copies of our tape recordings pertaining to the Sept 18 sightings in this area. (This information given to Co-chairman Larry Hoyers by Richard Hall of NICAP.

ORADELL, N.J..... Sept. 15, 1962..5:00 pm.. Two shiny discs seen. 6:00 p.m. Two shiny round UFO's were sighted by former Navy flying officer J.J. McVickers. At 7:50 pm a NICAP member saw a glowing object descend toward Oradell, and other witnesses saw it dart back and forth near the reservoir. Details: At 7:53 PM, 9/15/62, three boys, (listed below), came into bks. They were out of breath and appeared to be very frightened. They reported seeing a flying object over the reservoir in the area of the dam. This object seemed to hover in the air, then either the object or something dropped from the object came down and struck the water. It seems it landed in the water south of the dam, in the river. Then the flying object left the area at a high rate of speed.

Car #30, S.O. Bremmer responded. He checked the area of the Gradell Ave. bridge, where the boys were standing when they sighted the object, then proceeded to the East side of the reservoir and checked area. Nothing was found.

Haworth P.D., Hackensack Water Co., notified, they responded and checked their areas, nothing found.

Called Teterboro Airport, they report no missing aircraft, however they will call us later. They still have some aircraft in the air.

Motordyne Air Force Base called, spoke to Operations Officer, he took report of unidentified flying object. A Major Vance, Operations Officer New York Air Defense Command, called from Motordyne A.F.B., took a full report from Ptl. Walla, on object. The Air Force appears to be very much interested in these type reports.

S.O. Bremmer spoke to two boys, [redacted] Bergam; and [redacted] St., West H.Y. These boys reported seeing no flying object, they were fishing on the South side of the bridge. This put the bridge between them and the area in which the object was reported.

This "object" is reported by the boys to be round with a fin protruding, possibly from the back or bottom. It made no sound. The only noise reported was a loud splash when object hit the water. Haworth P.D. reports they spoke to men working on their side of the reservoir and at about the same time they also heard a loud splash.

A full check of the water around the edge of reservoir revealed no disturbance.

Ptl. Walla has three sketches made by boys of object.

The point is stressed that when the boys entered bks., they appeared to be very much frightened. One boy became very frightened even later when talking about incident.

The boys said there was a man in the area and they pointed out object to him. He saw it and ran, very fast, in opposite direction. A search revealed no man in area, though this was a bit later.
