Law Enforcement Division, Hill AFB, Utah. Preliminary analysis indicates that the observer interviewed was a logical, mature person, and was convinced that he observed some tangible object, not identifiable as conventional type aircraft. No unusual meteorological or astronomical conditions were present which would furnish an explanation for the sighting. No missile test firings are conducted in the immediate area.
