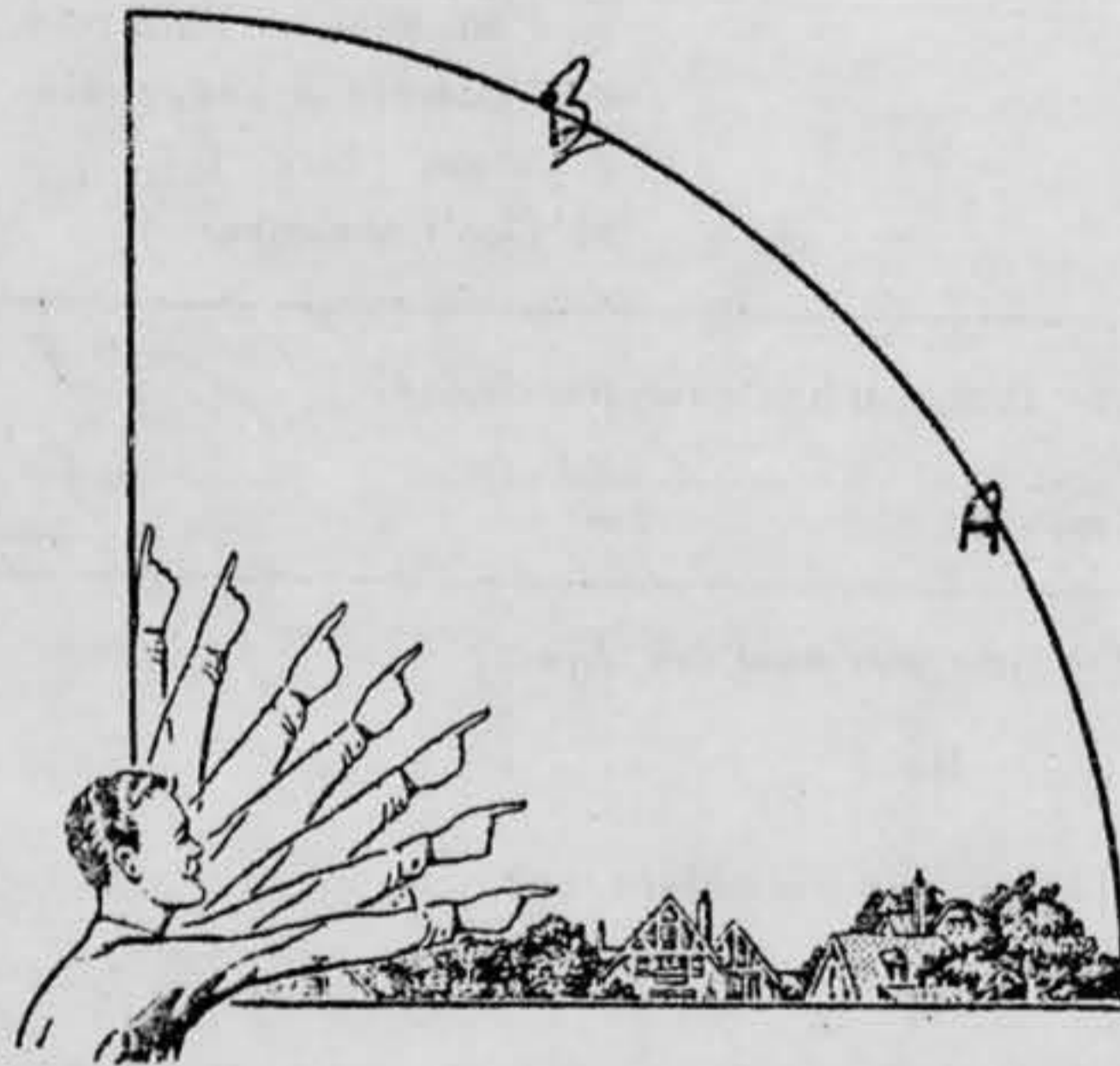

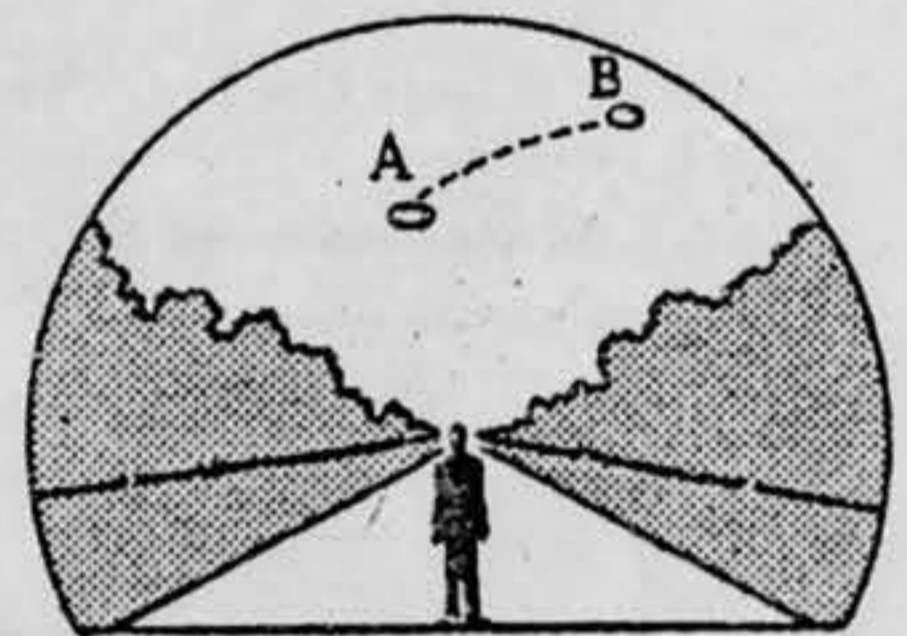
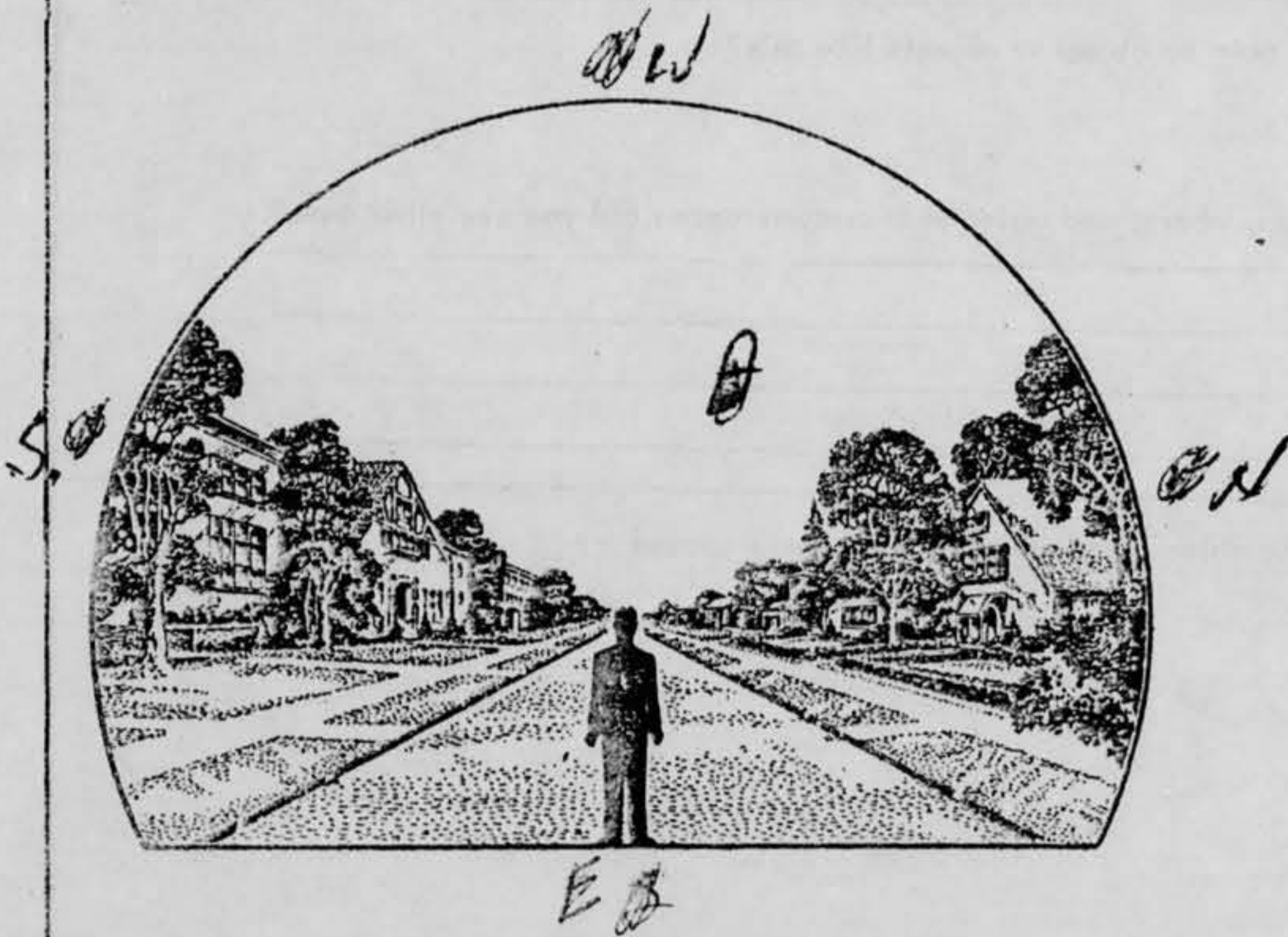

Dear Mr. President,

I don't know if I am doing the right thing in writing this letter to you as it will be screened and probably thrown out before you see it. I did, however, feel it was my duty to inform you of what was seen.

As my husband and I were driving home yesterday evening about 5:15 along Veteran's Highway we noticed what appeared to be a small piece of sky writing about a mile or two distant. I noticed it first and after waiting a reasonable time for more of the writing to appear I called it to the attention of my husband who was driving the car. As it turned out, it wasn't sky writing at all but some kind of aircraft.

As we approached David Drive, we noticed that the silvery white streak started turning a pink and then into a light red and as it started to move a reddish light, of what appeared to be a light, was at the "front" of the craft. It moved rapidly and finally was lost to sight because of the great height it attained.

A couple of other cars stopped and looked at it also, even asking others including us if we knew what it was, but we don't know who these people were.

We called several places when we arrived here such as the airport, the newspaper, the F.B.I. and the Special Investigation Department of the Air Force, but we got no information nor did they seem at all interested in finding out just what the "thing" could be. The newspaper wanted to get names so they could print something, but other than that, we got no action whatsoever.

Now I know you get lots of reports of people seeing "flying saucers" but this was no "saucer" and was no mirage. We both saw it and saw the same thing! It was definitely some sort of powered aircraft which could stay suspended in the air or take off at a fast pace at will.

My husband judged it to be about two or three thousand feet up when it was still but it climbed rapidly once it started moving.

Now I've reported the thing to you and it is up to Washington to do as it sees fit. I feel better about getting it off my mind.

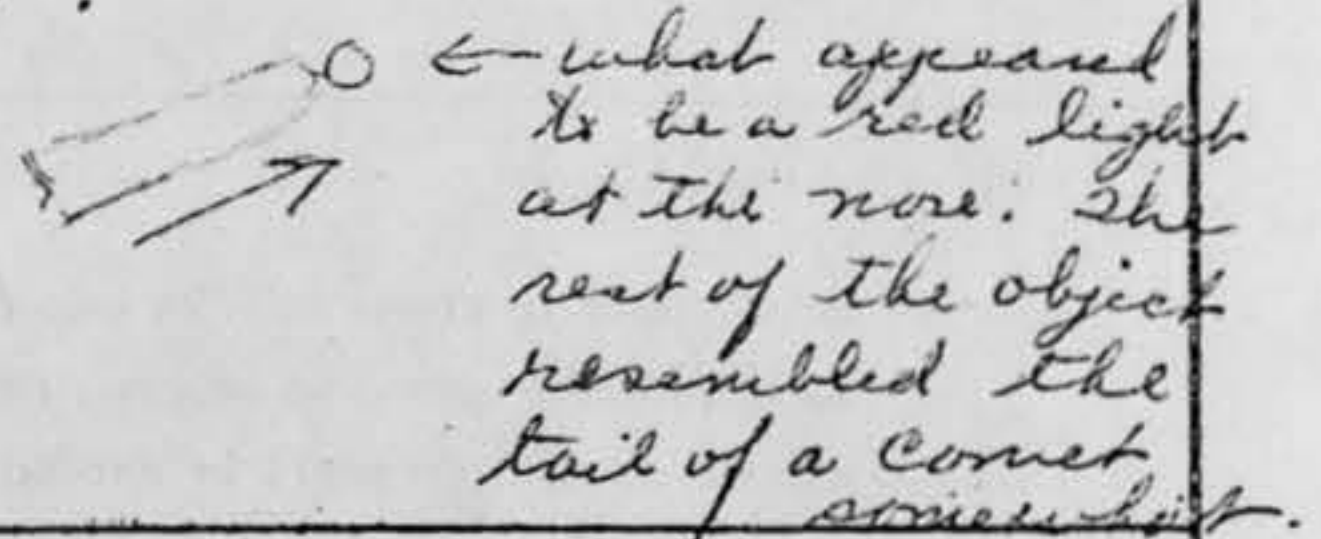

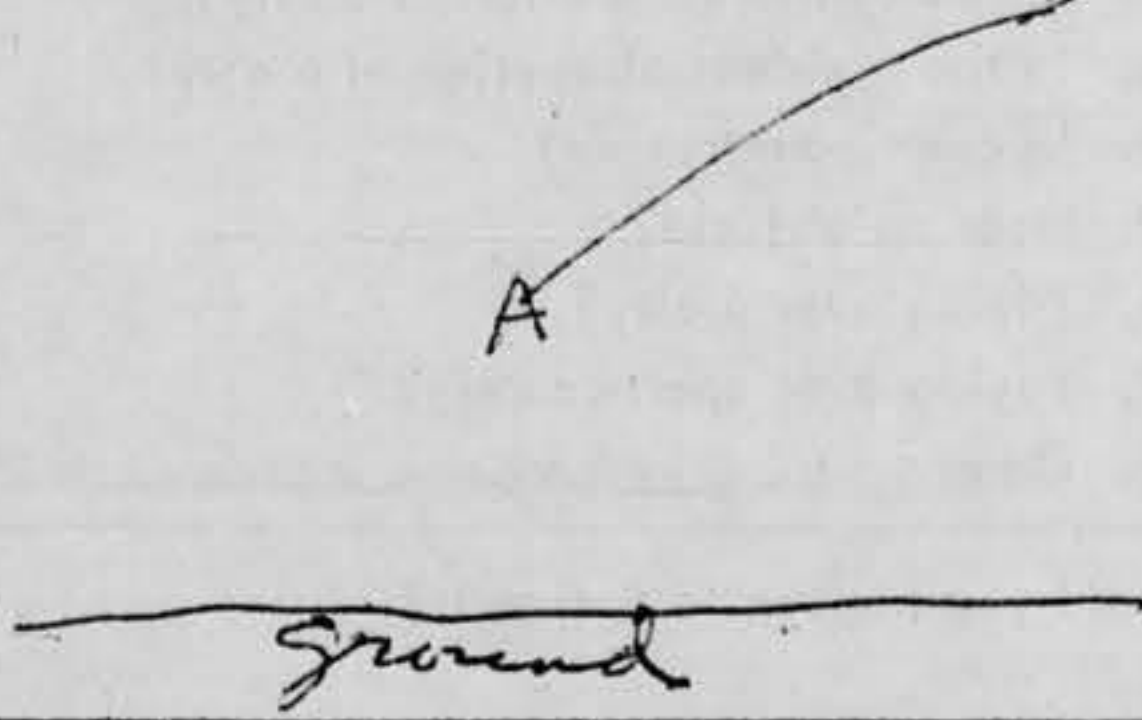

When we first saw it, it appeared to be the start of some sky writing. After I watched for the plane to write more for a few minutes I called it to the attention of my husband who was driving the car. We both watched until we were almost under it and that is when it "took off".
