IN BOTTOM HALF OS SPHERE. (7) MAIN SPHERE SURROUNDED BY A GREEN FIELD EXTENDING ABOUT ONE DIAMETER OF SPHERE IN ALL DIRECTIONS. BINOCULAR VIEW REVEALED A RED COLORED EMISSION DISTINCTLY SEPARATED FROM GREEN FIELD. THIS EXTENDED UPWARDS AT AN ANGLE OF 45 DEGREES FROM UPPER LEFT HAND AREA OF SPHERE FROM VIEWERS POSITIONS APPROXIMATELY TWO DIAMETERS. (8) NO SOUND. (9) FIELD EMANATING FROM MAIN SPHERE OCCASIONALLY APPEARED TO CHANGE COLORS, DESCRIBED AS VARIHUED. B. DESCRIPTION OF COURSE: (1) INITIAL OBSERVERS AWAKENED BY BRIGHT LIGHT SHINING IN THEIR EYES. SOME DIFFERENCE OF OPINION AS TO REASON FOR AWAKENING BETWEEN THESE TWO OBSERVERS. (2) ANGLE APPROXIMATELY 50 DEGREES FROM HORIZONTAL IN AREA OF 160 TO 170 DEGREES AZIMUTH FROM FIRST OBSERVATION.
