10. BRIEF SUMMARY OF SIGHTING Two high school girls sighted obj in East going fm N to South. Brighter than star appeared to scintillate. Obj appeared to move around, go up and down.		11. COMMENTS Venus 15.38 on Ecliptic, just rising. Arcturus at 20 dgr elev & Spica at 5 dgr elev in East. These three astro bodies were the brightest in the Eastern sky at the time. There was a temperature inversion of 7-8 dgr F to 6-700ft and another of 4 dgr between 10,000 & 10,400 ft probably contributing to the unusual appearance. Most likely culprit was Venus.
