(A) INDICATIONS ARE THAT THE OBJECT SIGHTED WAS NOT THE FAA C-54 OR THE RADIO SONDE WEATHER BALLON KNOWN TO BE IN THE AREA OF ERNEST HARMON AIR FORCE BASE, NEWFOUNDLAND, AT THE APPROXIMATE TIME OF THE SIGHTING. REASON FOR THIS CONCLUSION IS THAT THE OBSERVER REPORTED THAT THE OBJECT PASSED DIRECTLY OVER HIS RESIDENCE. NEITHER THE C-54 NOR THE WEATHER BALLON PASSED OVER THE OBSERVER'S POSITION.

(B) CHECKS WITH RAPCON INDICATE NO KNOWN HIGH ALTITUDE TRAFFIC. IN ADDITION, DESCRIPTION OF THE OBJECT INDICATES AIRCRAFT NOT SOURCE OF SIGHTING.

(C) CHECKS WITH 640TH AC & W SQUADRON GIVES NEGATIVE INDICATION THAT GEMINI OR OTHER KNOWN SATELLITES ARE INVOLVED.

2. POSSIBLE CAUSE. IN VIEW OF THE KNOWN DATA IT IS ASSUMED THAT THE SOURCE OF THE SIGHTING IS:

(A) UNKNOWN ORBITAL OBJECT OR

(B) AN OPTICAL ILLUSION OR OTHER PHENOMENA.

3. NOTE: OBSERVER REPORTED THAT HE MADE A SIMILAR SIGHTING 48 HOURS BEFORE THE SIGHTING REPORTED HEREIN.
