as stated appeared as a morning star low on horizon at  $5^{\circ}$  to  $7^{\circ}$  redish white to glistening white, to pure solid white increasing slightly in size, appeared in stationary position but believed following a straight course N by NNW to S by SSE from true north (star). as object approached appeared to incline but believe maintained a course parallel to earth's surface, if any thing it probably declined in altitude. as a plane breaks over the horizon it may maintain an exact altitude but as it approaches appears to gain altitude until it passes overhead of  $90^{\circ}$  to observer's position yet actually at same altitude when first observed at  $0^{\circ}$  to horizon.

Distance, speed, altitude, size, are deceptive but estimate object to be round or conical in shape, approximately 120 to 150 miles at first sighting, believe object entered earth's atmosphere at this point due to red-ish. blend around perimeter and whitening at center getting brighter as heated up. Object did continue on a true straight course 4 minutes then made wide curve to disintegrate 8-9 minutes later, believe speed to be 400 to 500 m.p.h. + at altitude of 10,000 to 20,000 ft. perhaps as large as 50 ft across the diameter.

Believe this object to be the lost jettisoned rear section of the latest moon rocket nose cone.

significant factor, perhaps of vital information to Cope Kennedy was that object remained in full view in a clear sky for 8 to 9 minutes before disintegration where as previous "fire balls" disintegrated within 3 to 5 seconds after entering atmosphere.

This indicates a superior material being used in the rockets, or an exceptionally cold atmosphere at that particular time to ~~allow~~ extreme heating and dis-integration. never the less, the difference of 3 to 5 seconds, from appearance to disintegration of the 4 previous sightings, as compared to 8 to 9 minutes is extremely significant.

Ground temperature at time of sighting was 90<sup>+</sup> F. appeared to disintegrate over Augusta or Beaufort 35 miles WSW at 10,000 ft. This could be more easily demonstrated than put in writing, however perhaps you have enough information here. Sketch of "Fire Ball"







appeared first resembling planet mars with reddish white glimmer in a clear light blue sky then as reddish perimeter tends to fade the object took on a glistening white as a many feet diamond but perfectly round in shape. after 3 minutes glimmering ceased to become a solid very bright pure white and so its color remain through out the balance of its trajectory, except as it made its wide curve from its N by NW to S by SSE straight course. Then a profile view began to take form and a cherry red tail could be observed which lengthened as the object continued veering to N.W. approximately 45 seconds prior to total disintegration the cherry red tail lengthened to about the diameter of the object but with a blue mid section between the white object and the red tail.



