The object appeared suddenly from nowhere, above and ahead of my auto. My first impressions was that I was being buzzed by a private plane. On my second look at the object, it appeared to hover for an instant over a farmer's buildings, and as I pulled over to the side of the road to view it, it immediately flew away on a low-level course. There was no sound, and it was as long as a Commercial Airliner, and had no markings. I did not see an underneath, top, or end view of the object. My body reacted as if I had just experienced a "close shave" with danger. The remainder of the day I was somewhat emotionally upset. I quizzed the farmer and his wife, who live very close to the place of the sighting, as to whether they had heard anything unusual that morning near their farm, and they said that they had not. I told my experience to my family a few hours after it happened.

Gentlemen:

For your information, on Wednesday morning, June 8th 1966 around 6:45 a.m. I was driving alone from my home (farm) in Kansas, Ohio (Seneca County). I was on my way to work in Toledo, Ohio. I have been driving 100 miles each day for around nine (9) years. I am an state Supervisor of Interest for KAISER Jeep CORPORATION. The weather was fairly clear, sun being up at the time but behind a cloud. I was traveling straight West on Sandusky County Road #1 headed towards State Route #199 which runs between Fostoria and Risingsun, Ohio. I was just approaching the the farm near Kansas when I was startled by a flying object just above and ahead of me a little to the right of my car and just above and to the East of the Murphy farm buildings. This object didn't seem to cross my path but just appeared all of a sudden to the right near my path. My first thought was that it was a plane buzzing my car. The second I focused my eyes on the object I was startled and confused because it was of such unusual huge length. I stopped and pulled over to the side of the road. When I focused on the object again it appeared to be flying a level (low) course. It appeared to be as thick as the height of a man. From my position I never saw anything but a side view.

I was not able to pick up a tail, assembly, a nose, windows or props. It was shiny new silver metal looking. It was blunt cigar shaped. I heard no noise, although I did not turn off the engine of my VW or roll down the right window. However, as close as it was at my first sighting I believe there should have been loud engine noise. It was traveling too fast to be a balloon or a blimp. It traveled NE from me and disappeared over a wooded area a mile away. I could not follow it after that point.
