1. On 23 September 1958, the Intelligence Officer of Royal Air Force Station, Manston, Kent, England, reported by telephone that he had received a message from the Police Headquarters in Margate concerning four (4) unidentified flying objects. The RAF Intelligence Officer was informed as to information would be required. Below is the report that was filed at 406th Fighter Bomber Wing, Intelligence Officer:

23rd. September, 1958.

REPORT OF UNIDENTIFIED FLYING OBJECT MARGATE.

Sir,

I have to report that at 12 midnight on Sunday, 21st. September, 1958, Mr. [REDACTED] of [REDACTED] Margate, came to this station and reported that at 11 p.m. when he was fishing from the end of the jetty extension at Margate he had observed four objects in the sky to the North of Margate which resembled "Flying Saucers."

These objects which were glowing brightly and were of the size of a dinner plate, were travelling in formation from East to West across the sky at a low angle from where the observer was sitting.

In view of the National publicity being given to these phenomena [REDACTED] was told that his report would be recorded in case similar reports were forthcoming from other persons in the district.

I respectfully suggest that this information be passed on to the R.A.F. Authorities for record purposes.

I would add that the informant was quite sceptical about having seen these objects and appeared to be a sensible and intelligent person.

Note. Distances not ascertained; travelled in formation and unclassified aircraft formation (appeared to be two bottom).
