I was returning on a solo flight from W. J. to Reading, Pa. on a clear summer afternoon. When about 20 miles S.E. of Chiles, while following my west, northwest course, I was suddenly aware of an object overtaking me on my left and slightly below. In a second or two I saw another object slightly behind & to the side of the first. They passed me at about a 15°-20° degree angle, more to the west, than my course, at a speed I estimate about 300 M.P.H. They were definitely circular, made of shiny metal and had a ring of orange-yellow

flame surrounding ^{2.} them and trailed considerable grayish black smoke.

Due to the closeness at which they passed, I had an excellent view. I estimate they were within 150 feet of my airplane. They flew in a straight line towards the west and seemed to ~~take~~ ^{put} on a burst of speed after passing me.

I estimate they were 6 to 8 feet thick in center, no windows visible, and tapered to a thin edge. The outer 2 to 3 feet seemed to be spinning and emitting the orange-yellow flame at equally spaced distances around the edge. I estimate they were 40 to 50 feet across.

Dear Sirs:

I have just read that the Air Force has been issued a directive to treat U.F.O. sightings seriously, so I thought I would ^{relate} my experience, hoping in some small way, to help uncover the mystery of the so-called "Flying Saucers" which I am sure, do exist.

I have been flying since 1928 as a private pilot. Presenting holding license # I42649.

I was returning to Reading, Pa. from the south New Jersey shore, at an altitude of 5000 feet, when about 10 miles southeast of Phila. Pa. I detected a movement out of the corner of my left eye that caused me to turn my head sharply in that direction.

Coming from behind and slightly below me, on a course about 15 degrees more westerly than my own, were two circular objects. The one slightly to the side and rear of the other.

Due to the closeness and the fact it was clear and daylight I had an excellent view. I could plainly see they were made of a bright, shiny metal, similar to stainless steel or polished aluminum. They were about 40 to 50 feet across, about 6 to 8 feet in thickness at the center, tapering to a thin edge.

The outer 2 to 3 feet of the edge seemed to be vaned and spinning, although not the rest of the object. It was surrounded by an orange-yellow flame and quite a bit of smoke, which trailed at the sides

and rear. No windows were apparent.

They did nothing unusual, just when by in straight level flight toward Chesapeake Bay, at a speed I estimated about two to three times my own 100 M.P.H. A short distance past me they seemed to increase speed considerably and disappeared rapidly to the west.

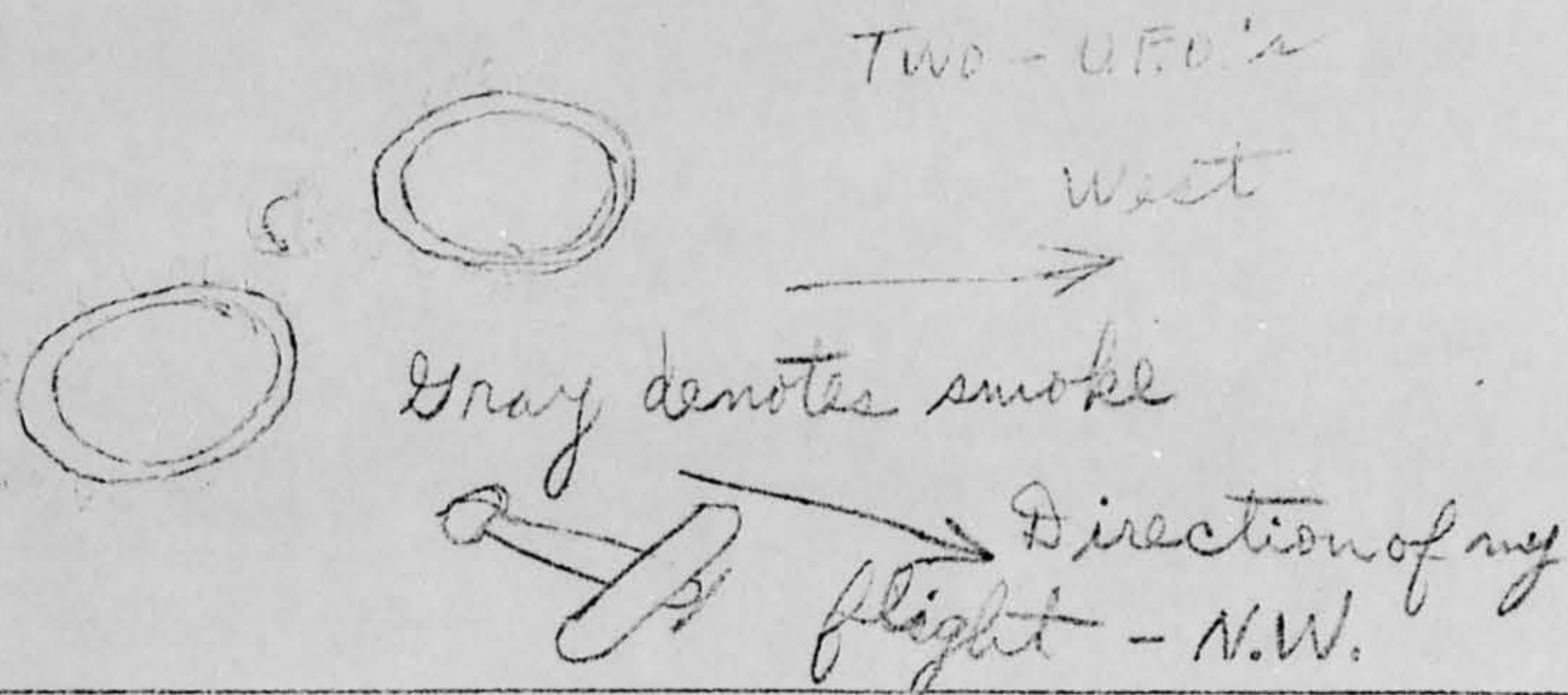

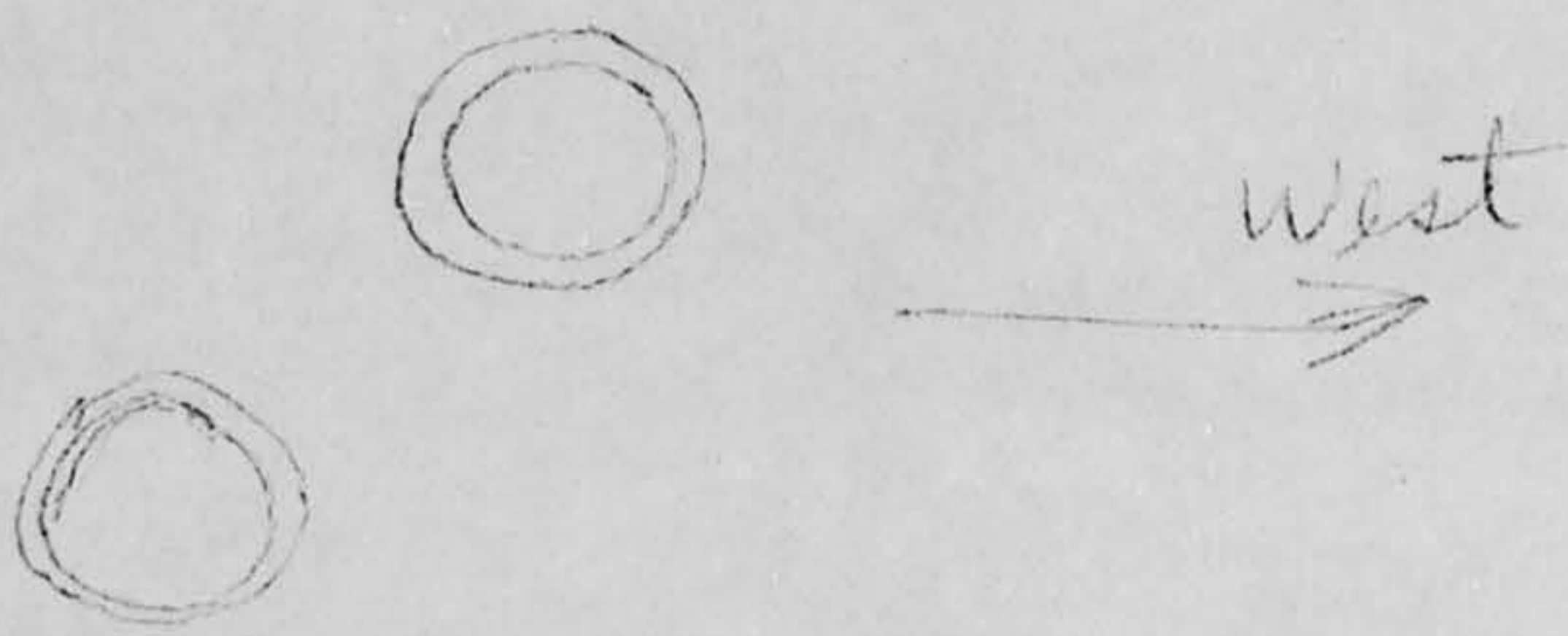
