

TO FTD (TDEW)

1. Reference is made to telephone conversation between Major QUINTANILLA and SA FOLINO of this office on 13 November 1967, concerning subject matter.
2. On 13 November 1967, Mr. [REDACTED] advised that Mr. [REDACTED], Springfield, Ohio, advised him that on 13 November 1967, at approximately 0400 hours, he had observed an unidentified flying object (UFO) in the vicinity of Reed Park, Springfield, Ohio. This object was approximately 30 feet in diameter and had an orange glow to it. [REDACTED] further advised that [REDACTED] told him that he had shined a spotlight on the UFO and it had taken on a pinkish tint and came towards him. When the object came towards him [REDACTED] became frightened and left the vicinity. [REDACTED] notified a lieutenant on the Springfield Police Department of this incident.
3. The above information was furnished to Major QUINTANILLA via referenced telephone conversation. Major QUINTANILLA said that his office would contact Mr. [REDACTED] first thing Tuesday morning, 14 November 1967, and [REDACTED] was so advised.

1. Reference your unidentified observation of 13 November 1967. We are attempting to make a further investigation into your observation to determine if your sighting may have been caused by a gas plasma similar to corona discharge from electrical high tension wires. At the moment, we are gathering weather data for the night, however, additional information on your sighting is necessary.

- a. Were there any high tension wires in the area?
- b. Were there any electrical wires at all?
- c. Did the object appear solid, have distinct edges, or did it have fuzzy edges?
- d. If there were stars visible and the object did appear as semi-gaseous, could you see stars through it?
- e. What size would you estimate the object to be?

2. In your conversation with Lt Marano you mentioned that the object appeared to be revolving. Could you also include a drawing of the object and indicate how the object seemed to be revolving.

3. We are inclosing another AF Form 117 for your completion. We would appreciate your placing any additional information on your sighting on the last two pages of the inclosed form.

b. Athens, Ohio - 20 November 1967 - 2300L:

Surface Wind 070 degrees at 6 knots.

c. Athens, Ohio - 20 November 1967 - 2400L:

Surface Wind 080 degrees at 7 knots.

2. Data sources were ETAC surface and upper-air history files. Extraction or evaluation of required weather data were adequate for all sightings.
