

Dear Mr. [redacted]

We are unable to identify positively the object you observed on September 4, 1967, without additional information.

The description you provided is consistent with rotating satellite packages. It would be nearly impossible to determine which satellite component you might have observed since there are more than forty visible to the naked eye.

The State of New York is heavily ringed by SAGE stations, but none of these stations reported any unidentified flying objects. We did not receive any other UFO reports from the State of New York.

In the future, if you should observe another unidentified object, please contact the nearest Air Force installation immediately; it will be glad to conduct an on-the-spot investigation.

Thank you for bringing your observation to our attention.



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



Noise Quiet night, no
traffic, no wind.

Weather

Clear sky, starlight, 35-55 F
no moon no wind

Conclusions Both observers agreed object
could not be meteor. Very improbable
that it was airplane because of total
absence of sound plus obvious speed
~~at~~ if at high altitude. Not a echo
satellite such having been observed by
both previously also flashing, also
no red or green light as with airplane

Both observers had time to
train binoculars on object and observe.
No significant dimensions observable.
The object was comparable in
brightness to Venus.
