1. In compliance with letter, Headquarters, USAF, AFOIN-C/CC-2, subject as above, 19 December 1951, the following information, as reported to this headquarters by E. R. Storey, A. R. Autrey, and C. H. Lewis, is forwarded. This report was not transmitted by electrical means due to the fact that no other activity or observations were reported from this area and report was not deemed of sufficient value to warrant electrical transmission.

- a. Description: The objects were two very bright, starlike lights. They gave off a white-blue light like a mercury arc light. Both remained stationary for about five minutes. At this time the lower object moved vertically downward to about three degrees above the horizon, then moved up to approximately the same position. Both objects then began moving Northwestward, first slowly, then seemed to accelerate uniformly to a very fast speed until they were completely out of sight in a few seconds. The objects had no tail or exhaust according to the witnesses.
- b. Time Sighted: 2020C, 19 August 1952. Objects were sighted for about ten minutes.
- c. Manner of Observation: The objects were first sighted visibly from the surface from Naval Air Station, Dallas, Texas, by C. H. Lewis, 4071163, USNR, who immediately drove to the Hensley Tower where he observed the objects with binoculars until they disappeared from sight.
- d. Location of Observer: Naval Air Station (Hensley) Dallus, Texas, W Long 97°, N Lat 32°44', near Mountain Creek Lake. The objects were due North of the Hensley Tower; altitude and distance undeterminable; one object approximately ten degrees, the other approximately five degrees above the horizon.

- e. Identifying Information on Observer: All three witnesses, E. R. Storey, 3591128, USNR, A. R. Autrey, 4300776, USNR, and C. H. Lewis, 4071163, USNR, are men trained and experienced in the observing of aircraft, the first two, Storey and Autrey, being Control Tower Operators of considerable experience.

  - g. Other Activity or Condition: None reported in this locality.
  - h. Existence of any Physical Evidence: None Reported.
  - i. Interception or Identification Action Taken: None.
- j. Location of Air Traffic: Flight Service reported no aircraft flying between Dallas and Fort Worth at this time.

  Normal supply of AF Forms 112 was exhausted due to excessive number of reports being received from this area. Subject forms were requisitioned by Special Requisition on 10 August 1952 but have not been received to date.

#### 2. Duncansville, Texas - 18 August 1952

Visual sightings were made at 0245Z on 18 Aug 52 of a slow moving object and reported to Carswell AFB. Red and green lights changing to white were noted. Object moved up and down, hovered and then moved off at a rapid rate of speed.

At 0247Z two unidentified aerial objects were picked up by the 147th AC/W Squadron, Duncansville, Texas. Objects changed directions several times and had an estimated speed of 300 mph. This electronic signting coincides with the visual sighting as far as area of sighting is concerned.

No local air traffic at the time.
