WHEN OBJECT WAS FIRST NOTICED IT APPEARED TO BE MOVING TOWARDS ME. IT GREW LARGER. SHOUTED TO MY WIFE TO COME OUT AND SEE THE STRANGE LIGHT. WHILE SHE WATCHED I RAN IN TO GET MY 10-POWER BINOCULARS. THROUGH BINOCULARS WE COULD SEE BRIGHT OUTLINE OF A SAUCER STANDING ON END. THEN IT SEEMED TO REcede INTO THE DISTANCE. IT GREW SMALLER TILL WE COULD NO LONGER SEE THE OUTLINE. IT ALSO MOVED TO THE WEST. FINALLY WE COULD SEE ONLY A REFLECTED LIGHT IN THE SCATTERED CLOUDS. (LIGHT WAS REFLECTED OFF ROUNDED END.)

1. Submitted herewith, in accordance with the provisions of Air Force Letter 200-5, dated 29 April 1952, report of interviews held by this office with Mr. [REDACTED] and Mr. [REDACTED], who sighted an unidentified flying object at Macon, Georgia, on 24 August 1952, together with drawings made by the respective interviewees. Mr. [REDACTED] identified the time of sighting at 2030 hours EST. Mr. [REDACTED] identified the time of sighting at 2020 hours EST.

2. Check with Base Weather Station, Robins Air Force Base, Georgia, revealed that no weather balloons were released from the Base Weather Station on 24 August 1952. Further check revealed that ceilometer was in operation on night of 24 August 1952.

3. Check with Base Control Tower, Robins Air Force Base, Georgia, indicated the following air activity at Robins Air Force Base on 24 August 1952, between 2015 and 2115 hours:

4. Contact was made with Mr. Jim FINDLEY of the Communications Station at Cochran Field (Macon Municipal Airport), who reported the following aircraft in flight in the vicinity of Macon, Georgia, on 24 August 1952, between 2015 and 2115 hours:

Listed aircraft contacted Mr. [REDACTED] at 2042 hours, giving location over Butler, Georgia, altitude seven thousand (7,000) feet, five hundred (500) feet on top. This point is approximately thirty (30) miles from Robins Air Force Base. Aircraft stated that passing light was in use. FENDLEY had received report on unidentified flying object from Radio Station WMAZ, Macon, Georgia and relayed same to Lt. Col. FLETCHER, pilot of listed aircraft. FLETCHER stated that no object was seen.

2. Mr. [REDACTED], Age 35, Teletype Supervisor, Communications Branch, Robins Air Force Base, Georgia, was interviewed by a representative, this office, at 1445 hours on 25 August 1952. [REDACTED] stated that on the night of 24 August 1952, he started to his garage to get his car and go into town. While enroute to the garage, a lighted object in the sky "caught his eye." It was completely dark at this time. He said that the object appeared to be traveling toward him in a northeasterly direction. Upon deciding that it was neither an airplane or the moon, he ran into the house and got a set of ten (10) power binoculars. He identified the time as 2030 hours EST.

3. With the aid of binoculars, he again observed the object. At this time, he said that the object seemed to move slowly away to the southwest. He observed the object for approximately five (5) minutes before it disappeared.

4. The object as first sighted by Mr. [REDACTED], was in the southwest and appeared to be close to Robins Air Force Base. He could not estimate the altitude, but said it was at an angle of 25 or 30 degrees. It was half-spherical in shape, the vertical side hazy in outline, and the round end dark in color and distinct in outline. No light was seen on the vertical side, but a bright yellowish light was emitted from the round end. FUNCK said the object appeared to be about a foot high in size.

2. Mr. [REDACTED], Age 31, employee of Macon Hospital, Macon, Georgia, was interviewed by a representative, this office, at 2030 hours, on 26 August 1952. He stated that on the night of 24 August 1952, while in the backyard of his house, he noticed a moving light in the sky. He identified the time as 2020 hours EST. He immediately reported the incident to Radio Station WMAZ, Macon, Georgia.

3. Mr. [REDACTED] stated that the object was definitely not an airplane. He said that the object appeared to be about two (2) or three (3) miles from him and in a Southwest direction. He estimated the altitude to be between 200 and 300 feet. [REDACTED] said that the object appeared to be traveling very slow and in a straight horizontal line to the Southwest. He said the object was in view for approximately five (5) minutes before disappearing.

4. Mr. [REDACTED] revealed that the object was shaped like a huge light bulb, about three (3) or four (4) feet high, and was reddish-orange in color, the light seeming to be projected from the entire end.

5. [REDACTED] said that just before the object disappeared, a plane came into view and seemed to fly very close to it. The plane was traveling from northwest to southeast.

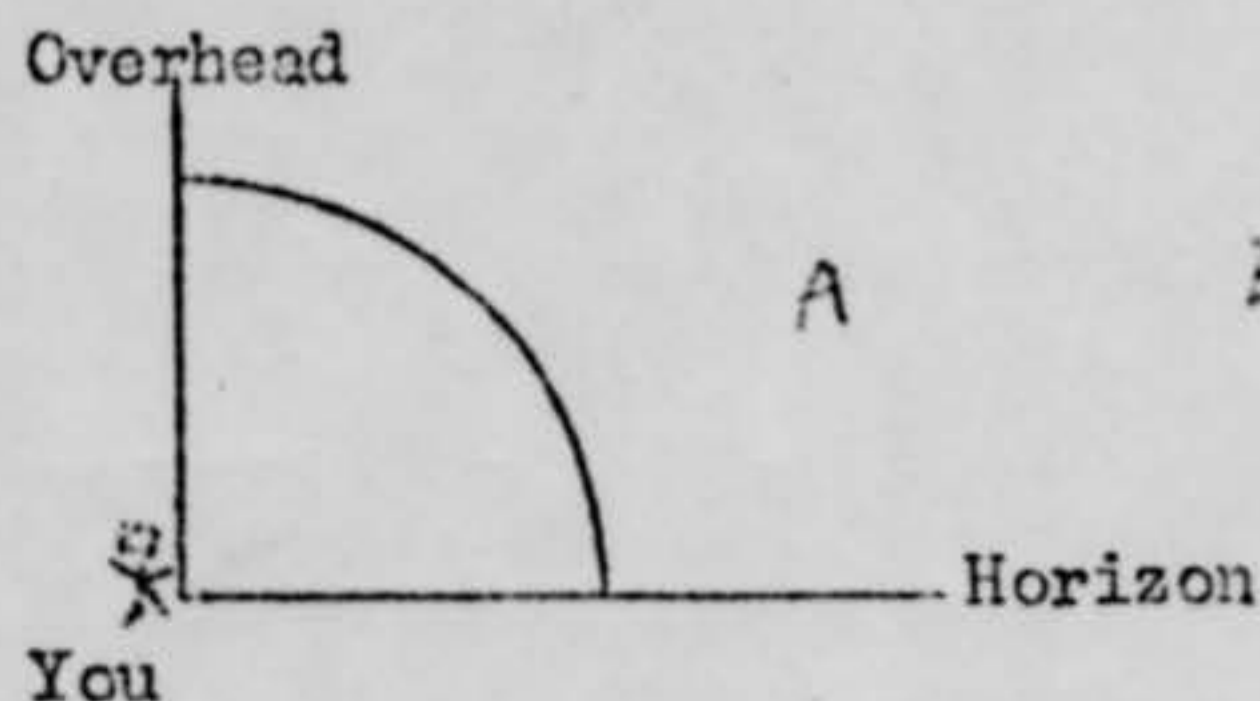

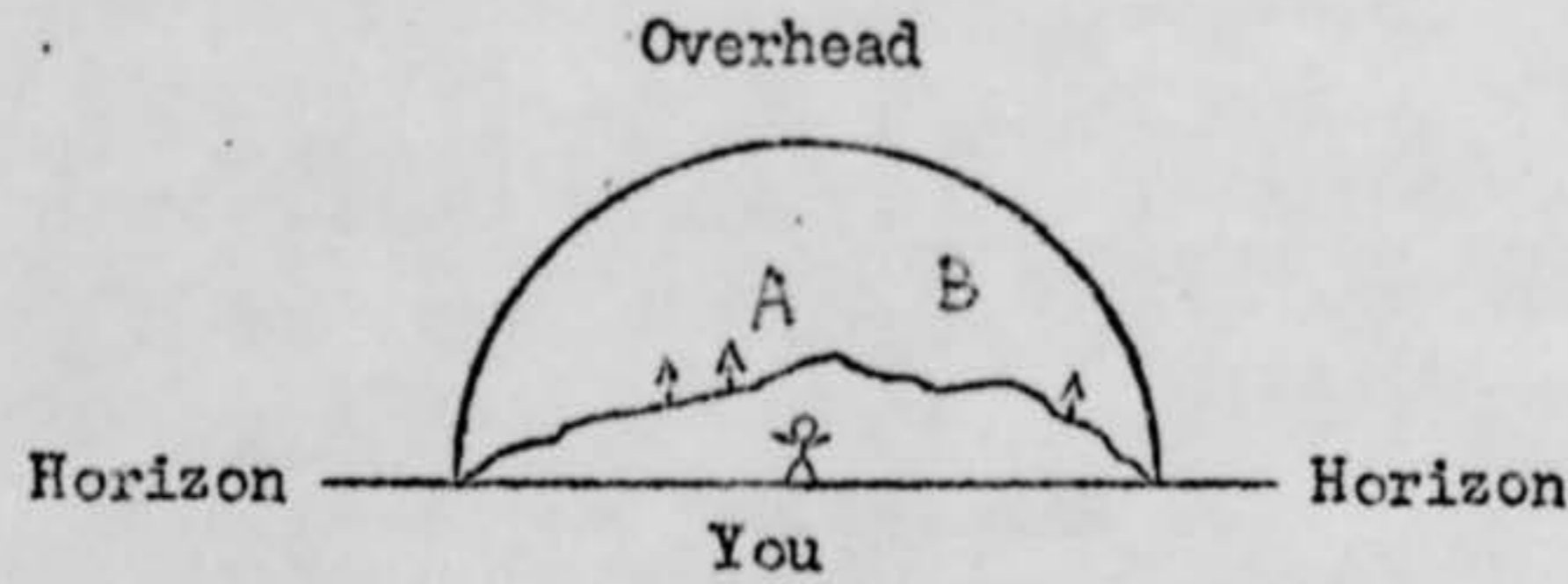

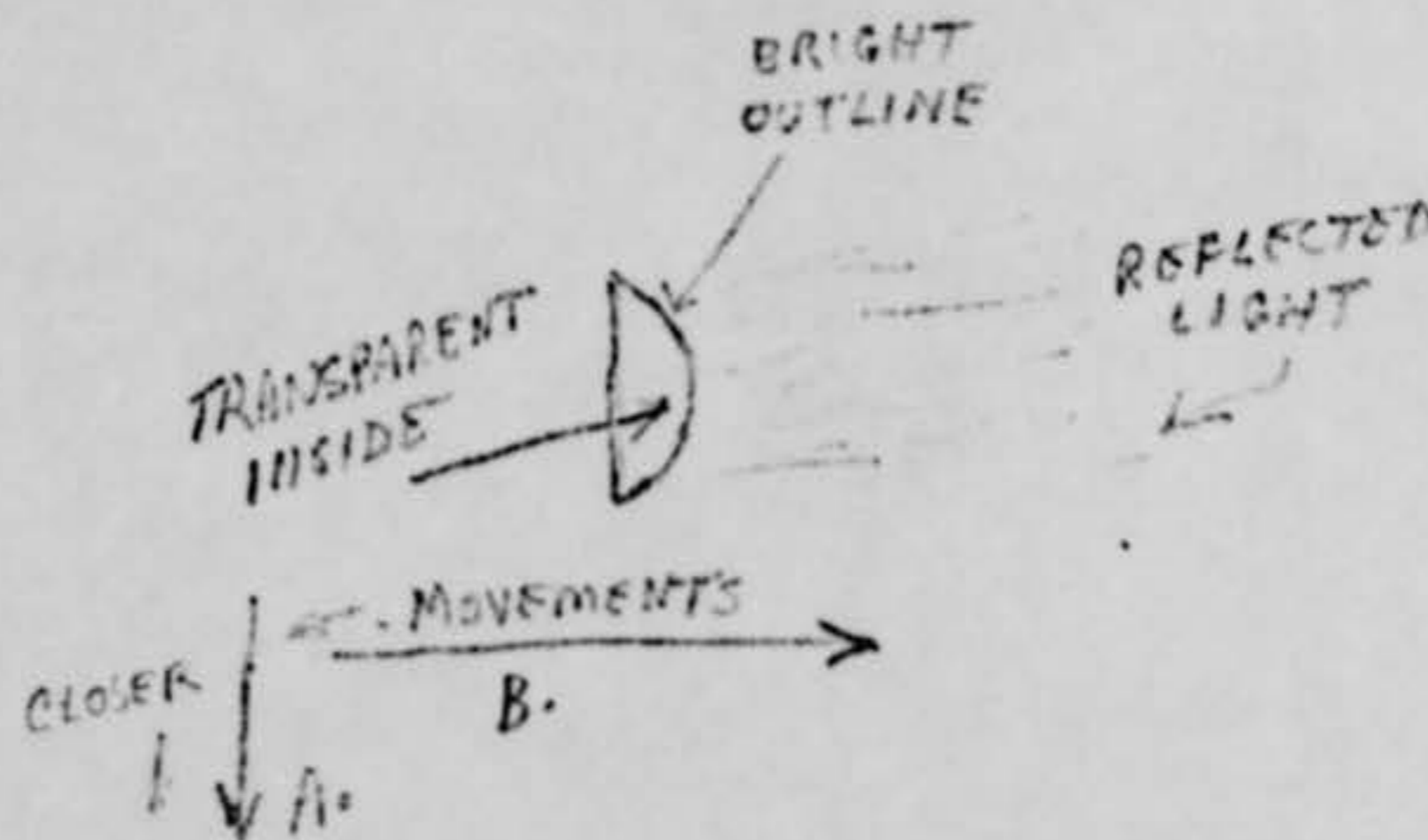
