Dear John,

Per the telephone request of Major Tippy on 19 July 1967, I have made an informal investigation of the background of Mr. [REDACTED] Street, Sullivan, Indiana.

Mr. [REDACTED] is about forty years old, unmarried and resides with his mother, a widow. He is intermittently employed at various unskilled jobs and is frequently intoxicated.

I have contacted (1) a former employer, (2) the local police department, (3) a local service station operator who has frequent contacts with Mr. Borders, and (4) Mr. [REDACTED]'s uncle, who is a respected local businessman.

Mr. [REDACTED] is an Air Force veteran and receives a disability pension. All persons contacted including his uncle, reported him to be an unstable and unpredictable individual of questionable veracity.

About two years ago he was the prime suspect in an attempted armed robbery but was not indicated due to a lack of more than circumstantial evidence.

In view of the foregoing, I did not contact Mr. Borders directly as it did not appear his credibility was reliable.

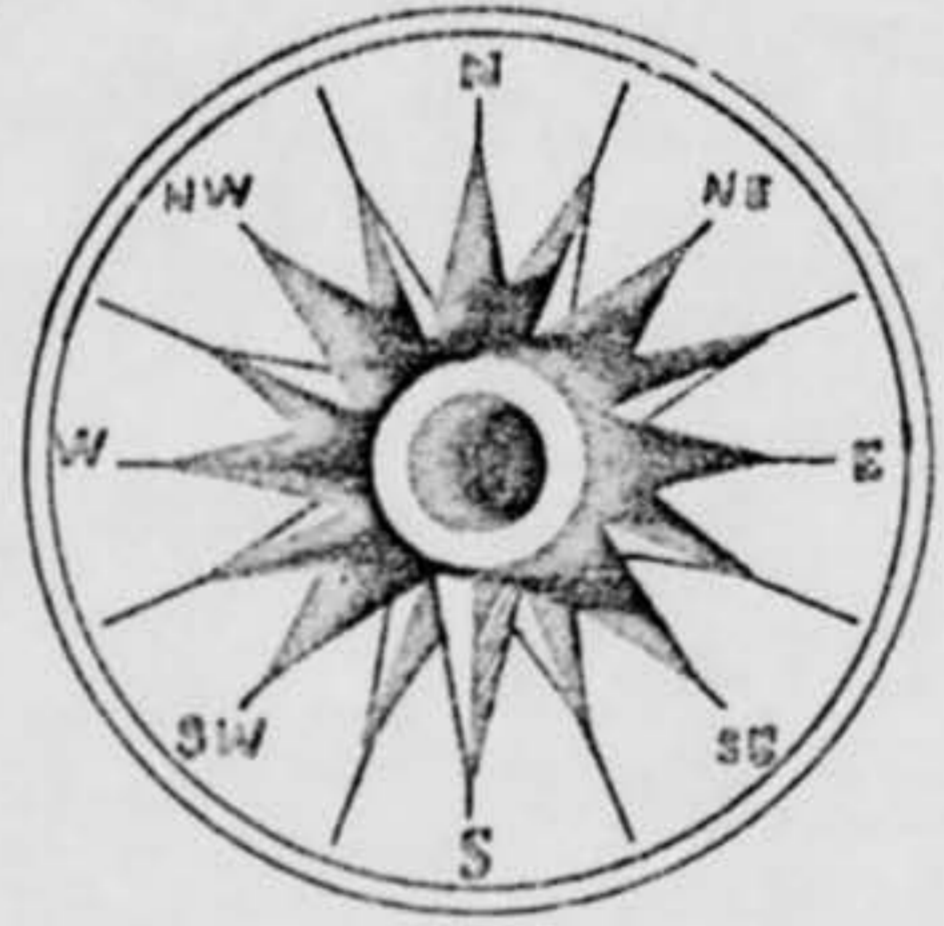
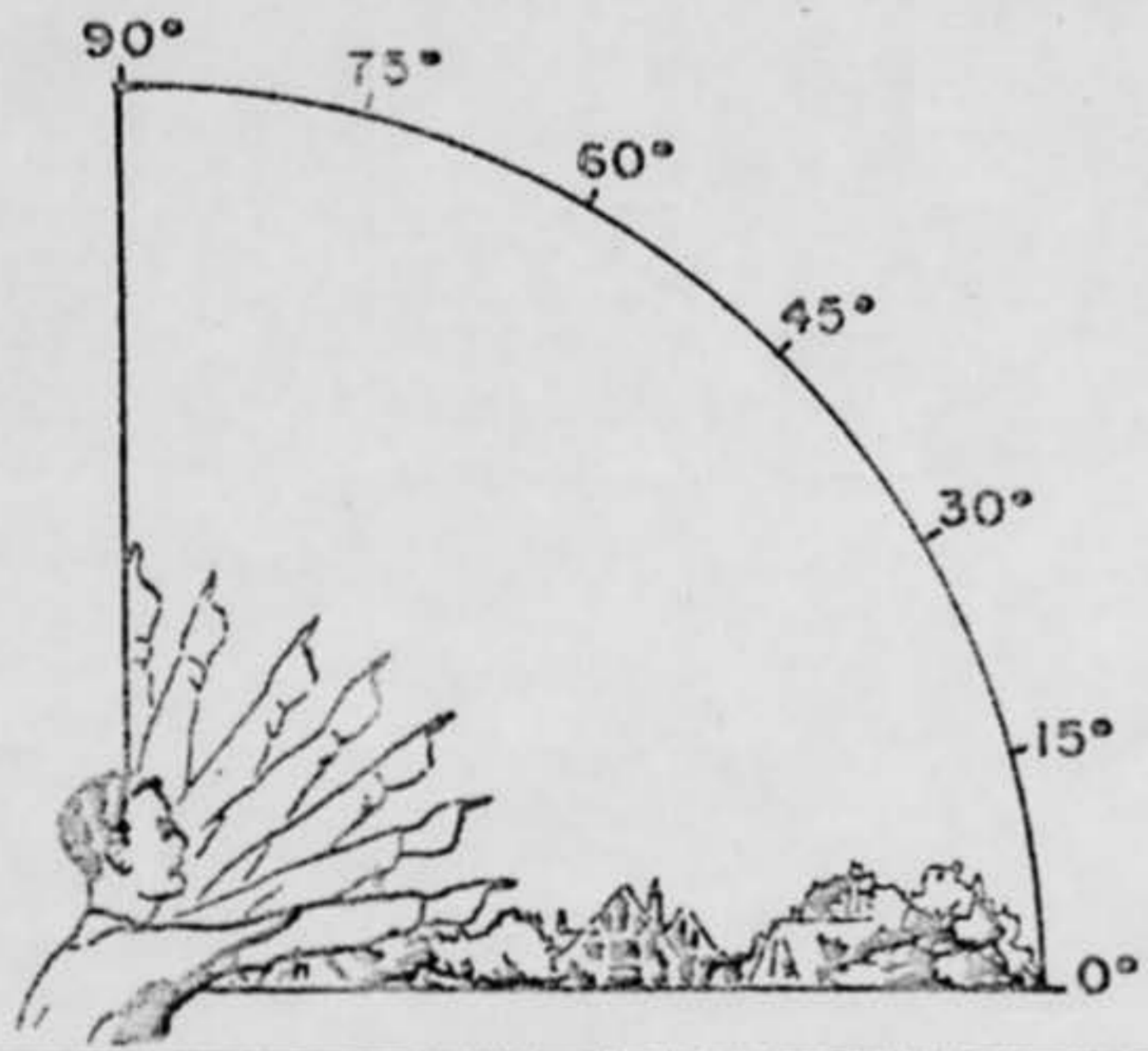
