





Unidentified flying object was sighted visually by civilian observer, at Lynchburg, Virginia, 19 June 1952. Interception was attempted, with "negative" results. Westiner at time was excellent for observation. Observer reported to have had anti-aircraft experience.

1. One round silver object, showing no exhaust, flying very high and fast, travelling eastward from Reusen, Virginia, toward Madison Height, Virginia, was observed O9hhEST 19 June 1952.

- 2. Observed visually from the ground, at the Virginia Episcopal School, Lynchburg, Virginia (37° 25° W 79° 10° W) by James and Charles and Charles World War II, and to have had anti-circraft experience.
- 3. Interception attempted by F51 #AF2hO, dispatched from Langley Air Force Bese, with negative results.
- 4. Only reported air traffic in the general area at the time was Piedmont Airlines Flight #30 (DC-3 emroute from Roamoke to Lymehburg, Virginia), which was over Lymehburg at the time. No report of sighting was filed by this flight.
- 5. Weather at time and place of sighting: Lynchburg, Virginia, reported a few cirro cumulus clouds and visibility 30 miles at 0930EST. No extraordinary winds reported at any altitude.
- 6. No meteorological activity known which might account for the sighting. No reported physical evidence. Angle of observation unknown.
- 7. No record of CHRVIS. Original FLYOHRPT submitted by Olmsted Flight Service Center via electrical means 19 June 1952. (Message #MDT 19-F-03)
