In compliance with Air Force Letter 200-5, dated 29 April 1952, paragraph 7e and 7d, the following report is submitted:

- 1. The object was round to tear drop shaped, about the size of a dime held at arms length, pale green in color, left no trail or exhaust, moved at a tremendous speed, left no sound, traveled in a smooth arc following the curvature of the earth and disappeared behind trees.
- 2. Time of sighting was approximately 10:50 P.M. on June 28, 1952 and object was observed for about 2 seconds.
 - 3. Object was observed visually from the ground.
- 4. The grid coordinates at the place of sighting are 42 Degrees 44 Minutes 00 Seconds North and 90 Degrees 28 Minutes 30 Seconds Nest. The nearest known landmark is the town of Platteville, Wisconsin. The object was viewed in the North-Bast sky from Platteville at an unknown distance and altitude, moving in a North-Morth-West direction. The angle of observation with respect to the observer was approximately 35 Degrees.
- 5. There is no knowledge of the observer, consequently his rating will be 6-F/.
- 6. Weather was clear over the area at time of sighting but lightning was observable in the western sky due to an oncoming cold front.
- 7. No meteorological or other solar disturbances were reported for this time.
 - 8. No physicla evidence exists.
- 9. No interception or identification action was taken due to the delay in receipt of report.
- 10. There is no evidence of air traffic in the general area at the time of sighting.
