# Area delegates will attend international UFO meeting

An international UFO symposium, the first to be held in Canada, will be presented in Toronto this weekend.

The symposium, which is open to the public, is being sponsored by the Mutual UFO Network (MUFON), one of the largest UFO research groups in North America. It is being hosted by the United Friends of Ontario, a committee comprising UFO research groups and individual researchers in Ontario. Theme of the 13th annual conference is UFOs Canada: A Global Perspective.

In conjunction with the symposium, a UFO "summit conference" will be

held Monday. This meeting is open only to executive officers of UFO research groups throughout the world and principal UFO researchers, said Henry H. McKay of Toronto, Canadian regional director of MUFON.

Bonnie Wheeler of Cambridge, chairman of the Cambridge-based UFO Research Group, and Pat Delfranier of the Stratford group will represent their organizations at the summit meeting. About 18 members from Cambridge and the Twin Cities are expected to attend the two-day symposium.

Both the symposium, which will feature UFO experts from both sides of the border, and the summit meeting will be held

at the Loews Westbury Hotel, 457 Yonge St.

There will be three sessions on Saturday, (morning, afternoon and evening) and two on Sunday. Conference fees are \$6 a session or \$25 for the full two-day package, said McKay.

Speakers include: Dr. J. Allen Hynek, a well-known astronomer and UFO expert who heads the Centre for UFO Studies at Evanston, Ill.; author William Moore of Prescott, Ariz.; Arthur Bray of Ottawa, a former pilot and lieutenant-commander in the Royal Canadian Navy who has written two books about UFOs; Dr. Michael A. Persinger of Laurentian University, Sudbury; David Haisell, Mississauga, author and UFO researcher; John F. Schuessler of Houston, deputy director of MUFON; and Dr. George and Iris Owen, of Toronto. The Owens are president and secretary respectively of the Toronto Society of Psychical Research.

Bray will open the conference Saturday with a talk on professionalism in ufology. He will be followed by the Owens who will discuss the UFO phenomenon and its relationship to parapsychological research. Moore, the author of The Roswell Incident, will discuss new information on the rumored crash of a UFO at Roswell, N.M.

On Sunday Paul Norman, vice-president of the Victoria, Australia UFO research group will provide an update on the Frederick Valentich case. Valentich is the Australian pilot who, along with the plane he was flying, disappeared Oct. 22, 1978 after a radio message to the control tower that a large UFO was flying above his plane.

Peter Mazzola, director of the New Jersey-based Scientific Bureau of Investigation, will discuss the police officer's view of ufology. The bureau is composed of police officers.

Haisell, of Mississauga, will give a talk on the In-

ternational Committee of UFO Research, of which he is Canadian representative. Sherman Larsen of Chicago, president of the National Investigations Committee on Aerial Phenomena (NICAP), will discuss The Most Significant Documentation of UFOs. Walter Andrus of Seguin, Tex., a MUFON international director, will give a slide presentation on UFO Close Encounters.

All the sessions will be held at Westbury Hall. There will be displays by UFO research groups and books by some of the speakers on sale in Buckingham Hall.

Delegates will have an opportunity to meet the speakers socially on Friday evening from 7 p.m. to 10:30 p.m. at Kent Hall. Preregistration and information on the conference will be provided in the hotel lobby on Friday from 1 p.m. to 5 p.m. and from 7 p.m. to 10 p.m., at Kent Hall.

"Based on early indications, this could be the most significant UFO conference ever conducted in North America," said McKay.

# Surprise: Little green men are greyish

Lawrence Fenwick's belief in unidentified flying objects took off when, he says, he clocked one outside his window travelling at 38,000 miles an hour last Nov. 16.

"I thought I saw a star — and then it started moving," said Mr. Fenwick, who added that he counted six long seconds before it was gone.

The 46-year-old Toronto resident, who has compiled data on more than 2,000 reported landings of unidentified flying objects, said he saw red, white and blue lights blinking on the object. But international regulations prohibit blue lights on aircraft, Mr. Fenwick said. "And I'm not color blind. I've

had my eyes tested."

Mr. Fenwick said that in one of the cases he has compiled, a UFO reportedly crashed in New Mexico. About six human-like bodies were found inside, he said, but they weren't little green men; they were greyish-white.

Mr. Fenwick's first experience with UFOs took place the same day and the same month as the one outside his window last year, but four years earlier.

"I saw an oblong-shaped object drifting over the trees toward Lawrence (Avenue) and Bathurst (Street)," said Mr. Fenwick, who, as a co-director of the Canadian UFO Research Institute, is attending an

international symposium on UFOs this weekend at Toronto's Westbury hotel.

Public skepticism about UFOs stems from a lack of knowledge, said Mr. Fenwick, who has been reading about the subject for 31 years.

Worse still, he says, government intelligence agencies in Canada and the United States are hiding information gathered from UFO sightings.

One of the most blatant government coverups dates back to 1947 — the reported crash of a 40-foot-wide flying saucer in Roswell, N. M., Mr. Fenwick said.

The object looked like "a crumpled dish pan" and the bodies inside were

4½ feet tall, had greyish-white skin, and four fingers instead of five, Mr. Fenwick said. Autopsies showed their heart and lungs were combined into one unit, as were their livers and kidneys. Their small intestines (six feet long) were empty because they don't eat.

"They don't talk; they communicate telepathically," Mr. Fenwick said, adding that the creatures are "at least a million years ahead of our intelligence levels" and come from a distant planetary system.

Mr. Fenwick said the data he has compiled are based on information from United States military intelligence agencies.

## Close encounter still up in air for UFO expert

The world's top ufologist has never seen a UFO, or had a close encounter of any kind.

But Allen Hynek believes his 35 years of gazing about for flying saucers has not been in vain.

"If I have convinced scientists that there is a real phenomenon out there that won't go away — even if all the officials are still saying, 'It can't be, therefore it isn't,' then I've done something worthwhile," he said in an interview yesterday.

The 70,000 documented reports of unidentified flying objects that he has recorded at his Centre for UFO Studies in Evanston, Ill., are an "amazing world-wide human phenomenon," he said, and the subject should be worthy some day of large outpourings of government money for studies on the highest scientific level.

"I suggest even setting up a mini-NASA (National Aeronautics and Space Administration)," said Mr. Hynek, 72, a PhD in astronomy who, in 1948, conducted the first official study of UFOs for the U.S. Government. His study concluded that the majority of "sightings" were such things as balloons, airplanes and clouds, but that about 10 per cent had no scientific basis.

Although Mr. Hynek, professor emeritus of astronomy at Northwestern University, said he still considers ufology "a crazy bizarre field," he believes that the daily sightings by people in 104 countries prove "that we have something that just won't go away."

The professor — who classified encounters with unexplained phenomena into three categories and was technical adviser to the popular UFO movie *Close Encounters of the Third Kind* — said that in all his years of looking skyward, he has never seen what "I would so

dearly love to see. Oh, I've seen a few nocturnal lights, but the subject has been so ridiculed I would never report a UFO even if I did see one — not without a witness."

Mr. Hynek, who was attending an international symposium on UFOs in Toronto on the weekend, said a 10-year research blitz on UFOs is needed. "We can forget about all this lights-in-the-sky stuff, which we can't do anything about anyway, and put two or three scientists on each landing or third encounter case, and do about 12 of these a year."

After all, he figured out which encounters are closer than others.

A first encounter is the actual sighting of a UFO, but with no contact with its inhabitants. A second encounter occurs when the spacecraft leaves physical evidence on earth such as a burned landing area. A third encounter occurs when earthlings actually see, or are even abducted by extraterrestrials.

Crisp, 42, has written to Solicitor-General Robert Kaplan and Attorney-General Roy McMurtry asking for revisions to the laws.

"If the legislators can't change the laws they should get the hell out," Crisp said. "We're not asking for capital punishment but a referendum on capital punishment," he said.

Crisp has a lawn sign outside his home asking concerned citizens to join him in his petition.

He also has made 200 lawn signs and 150 store signs for anyone wanting to publicize the crusade.

# Are ETs hostile?

Extra-terrestrials and UFOs are real and could be a threat to national security, says Sherman Larsen, president of the U.S.-based investigative committee on aerial phenomenon.

"There is always the possibility of a hostile craft," Larsen told the Mutual UFO Network symposium yesterday at the Westbury Hotel.

"We must be very careful in judging what is truthful and seek out any evidence of control over our people or equipment that may pose a threat to our national security," he said.

Larsen presented evidence of unexplained phenomenon which he said gives credence to the existence and visitation of another life form.

In October and November of 1975 on seven different occasions, UFOs were detected inside the security perimeter of various bases along the Canada-U.S.

border, he said.

The craft were observed about 150 feet above the firing line. They buzzed the air strips and left. Since there was no confrontation, U.S. authorities filed the information and nothing was disclosed.

The encounters remain unexplained.

Larsen also detailed a 1976 incident in which an Iranian jet, dispatched to identify a bright light in Iranian airspace, came within 25 miles of the light when the pilot lost control of the aircraft instruments. The same happened to a second jet. However, both pilots regained full control as soon as they altered their course away from the object.

Larsen also said that in 1979, a MiG jet was actually attacked and disintegrated by a UFO in the skies over Cuba. The attack was witnessed by the pilot of another MiG, he said.

Larsen said literally thousands of similar unexplained phenomenon have occurred over the years.

# UFO visits nothing new 'top secret' report says

Word is finally out. Extra-terrestrial visitors are among us and have been ever since bobby sox were the rage and most of us were marvelling at more pedestrian earthly wonders, such as television and the new Sludebaker.

It's all there in black-and-white, accompanied by the magic words "Top Secret," in a 1950 document released yesterday by UFO-watchers meeting at the Westbury Hotel on Yonge St.

### Flying saucers

The document was written by a middle-level Canadian department of transport bureaucrat named Wilbur Smith, who went to his grave more than a decade ago convinced he could one day prove the existence of flying saucers, as they were then commonly known. Smith told his superiors he had made "discreet enquiries" through the Canadian embassy in Washington and learned the U.S. administration, under President Harry Truman, firmly believed flying saucers existed, although there is no mention of proof. Smith also reported the embassy told him flying saucers are "the most highly classified subject in the United States government, rating higher even than the H-bomb; the entire matter is consid-

ered by the U.S. authorities to be of tremendous significance" and a "concentrated effort" was underway to determine the modus operandi of the otherworldly visitors.

### Project Magnet

Smith, a senior radio engineer, was working on Project Magnet, a study aimed at tapping the energy from the earth's magnetic field.

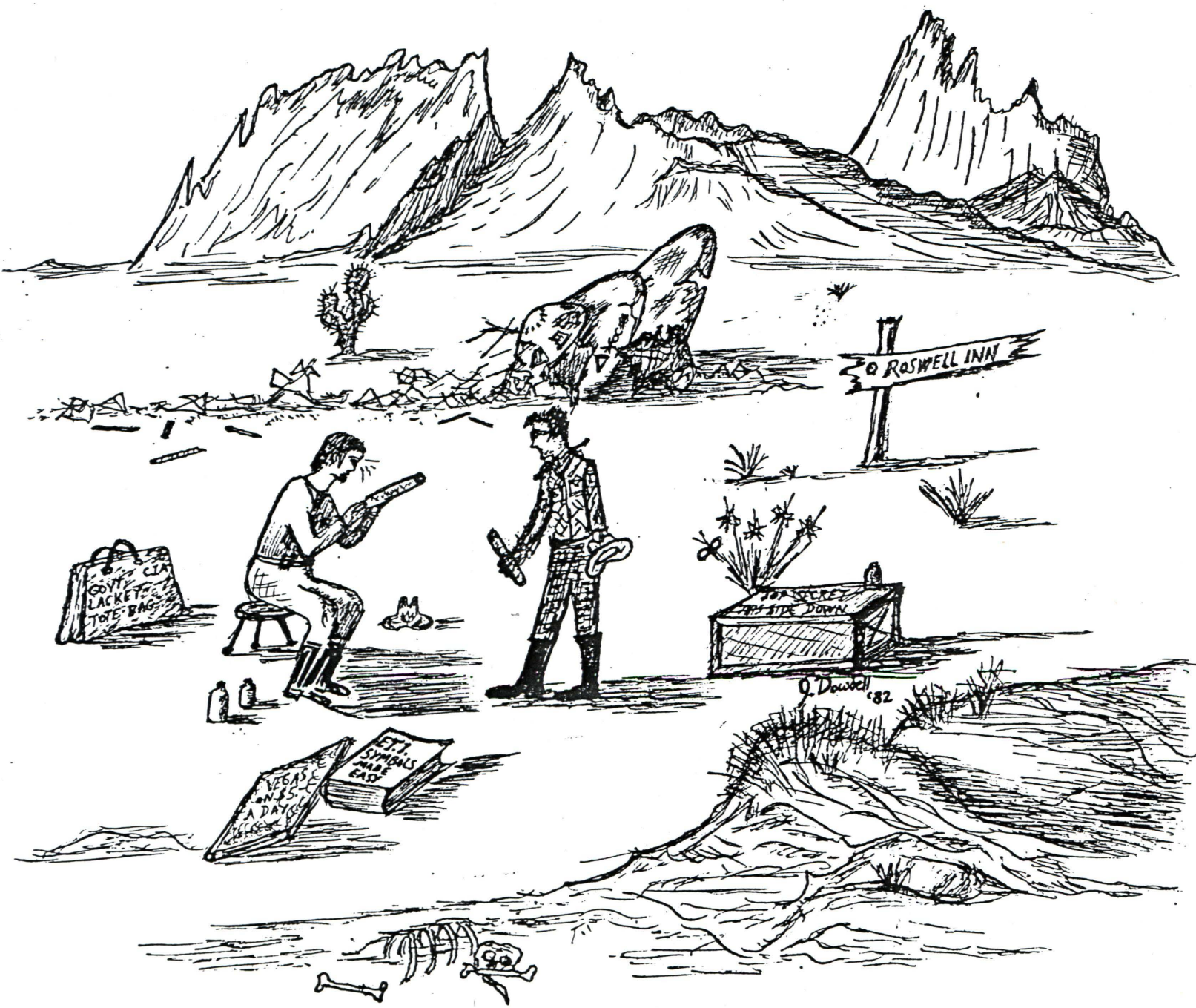
The man who ferreted out the document is a Kingston clerk who has had his name legally changed to Mr. X.

"The thing about flying saucers is a nice little conclusion," he says, "but to me that's obvious. I'm more interested in the whole question of government secrecy on this matter."

The only living person mentioned in the Smith memo, Dr. Omond Solandt, then chairman of the Defence Research Board, remembers Wilbur Smith differently from his backers at the Westbury.

"He was a nice person," says Solandt, 72, who now lives in Bolton and still does consulting work, "but he was so determined that these things existed, he would never take no for an answer."

Solandt says his department approached Smith's theories with an open mind.  
"We found nothing significant," he said.

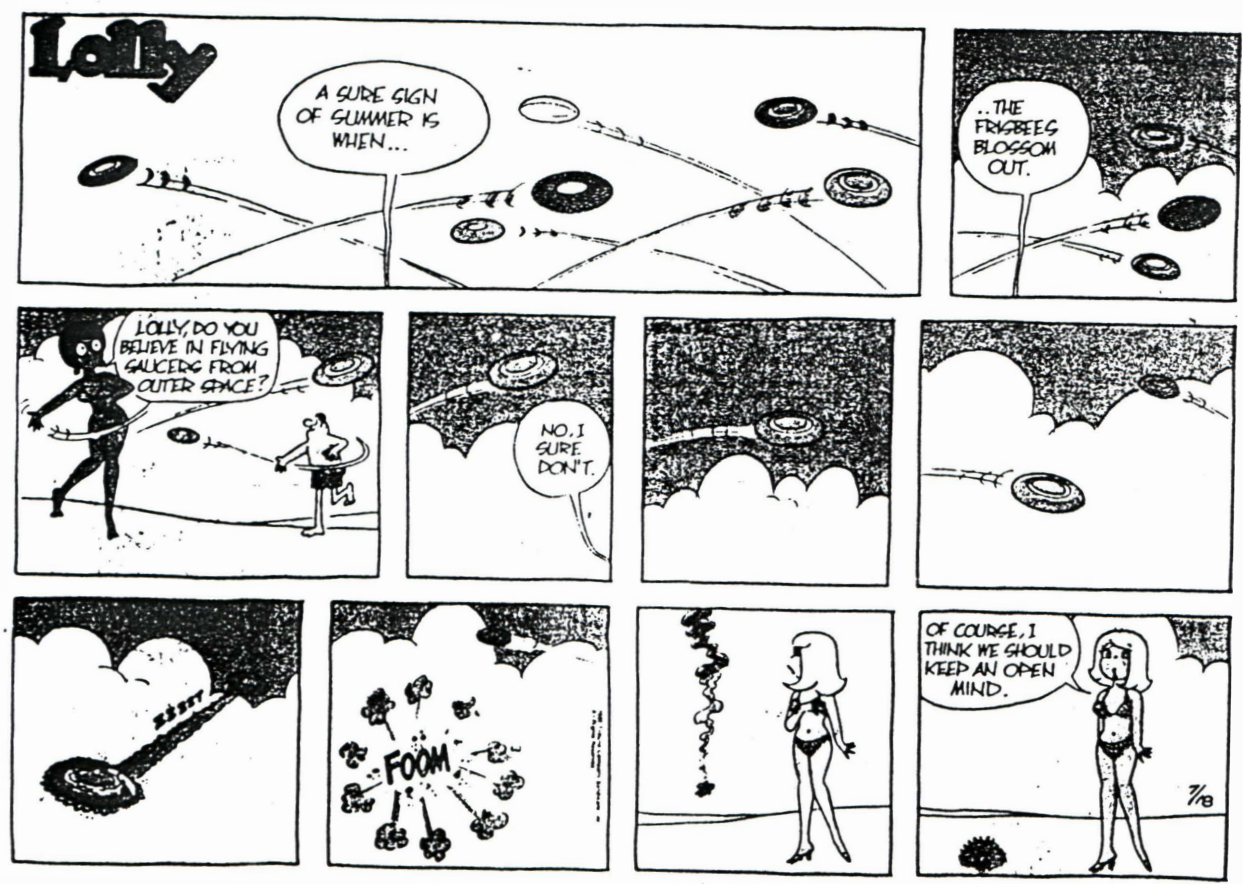

# UFO investigator heads local seminars

Dr. Frank Stranges of Van Nuys, Cal., an ordained minister, author, lecturer and UFO researcher for the past 37 years, will present three UFO, Space and Science seminars Aug. 18, 19 and 20 at the Conestoga Inn.

Stranges is being brought to Kitchener by Nick Benson of Kitchener, a member of the Cambridge-based UFO Research Group. The three-hour public lectures will feature new information on UFO cases, including an alleged crashed saucer case on an island off Finland in the 1950s, information from formerly classified CIA papers, and on "interplanetarians," such as Val Thor whom Stranges says came from Venus and secretly worked at the Pentagon for three years. Slides and films of UFOs will illustrate the lectures which will start at 7 p.m. and there will be a different topic each night.

Admission fee is \$7 per lecture or \$20 for the three-night seminar. Any profits after expenses will be donated to the UFO research group, said Benson.

Stranges, who has a doctorate from the National Institute of Criminology in Washington, is founder

and president of the California-based National Investigations Committee on UFOs. His organization collects UFO sighting reports from all over the world and he says he has submitted an annual report of sightings to every U.S. president since Richard Nixon and to the U.S. Air Force.

He graduated from the North Central Bible College (Assembly of God) in 1951 and was ordained that year. He was pastor of a

Minneapolis church for five years but since 1957 has been a fulltime traveling evangelist.

Stranges is president of International Evangelism Crusades Inc. and the International Theological Seminary.

He became interested in UFOs after a Bible college classmate told him of his encounters with disc-shaped craft during the Second World War. The classmate was in the Marines then and his squadron was, according to him, buzzed three times by three UFOs while flying over the Pacific. When the squadron landed, they were told that what they had seen was really a flock of Canadian geese and not to say anything more about it.

This intrigued Stranges who decided to investigate the incident. He was able to locate and interview the other former pilots in the squadron who corroborated the story.

Stranges has written several books, among them Stranger at the Pentagon, and My Friend from Beyond Earth. He has also produced a documentary for television, Phenomena 7.7, which discusses the 7.7 per cent of the more than 100,000 UFO sightings the U.S.

## UFOs discussed

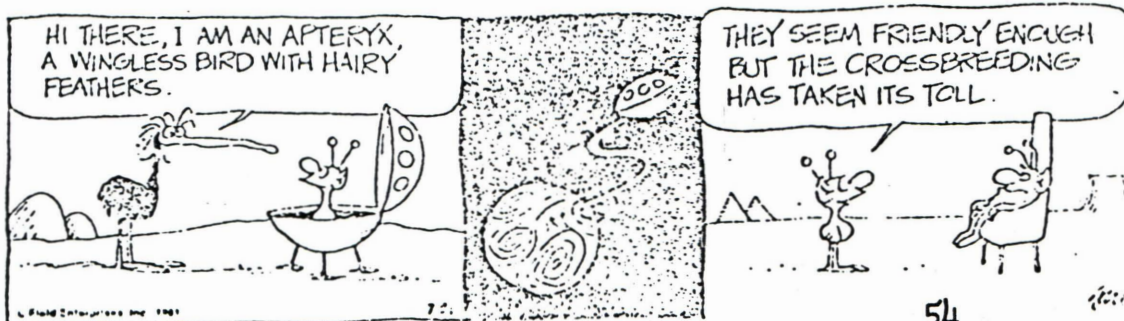

# CIA accepts UFOs, minister says

## Flying-saucer believer looks into old government files

Frank Stranges doesn't blame extra-terrestrials for not openly landing on earth and showing themselves to humans.

In the past, earthlings have been known to fire rockets and other weapons at innocent space travelers, Stranges said, lounging in an easy-chair in a room at the Conestoga Inn.

"I think that people have been conditioned to fear them rather than conduct an open-minded approach," said the California-based expert on UFOs.

"That's because we have come to expect bug-eyed monsters, and I'm totally opposed to that idea."

Stranges, founder and president of the National Investigations Committee on UFOs, is in Kitchener this week to participate in a three-night seminar on unidentified flying objects at the Inn. The UFO, Space and Science seminars, sponsored by the Cam-

bridge-based UFO Research Group, start at 7 p.m. today.

The 54-year-old minister — ordained at North Central Bible College in Minnesota — and president of the International Evangelism Crusades Inc., said he doesn't consider it at all strange that he combines his evangelist teachings with a life-long interest in UFOs.

"I think there's a positive link there," he said. "Both the Old and the New Testaments are full of countless references to the fact we are not alone here in the universe."

An example is the destruction of the Twin Cities — Sodom and Gomorrah, that is.

"What scripture refers to in the destruction of Sodom and Gomorrah could have been a nuclear blast," the bearded preacher said seriously, citing similarities scholars have noticed between the devastation of the biblical cities and Hiroshima, Japan.

This destruction could have been wrought by ex-

tra-terrestrial agents of God, he added.

He said he spends about 80 per cent of his time in evangelical work, the rest on UFO investigation. He became interested in the latter during the Second World War after a Bible college classmate told him of his encounters with disc-shaped craft.

But since then he has had a tough time gathering data about UFOs because of what he alleges is a conspiracy of silence among official government agencies. As a result, Stranges has been calling for open congressional hearings about what he describes as UFO contacts with earth.

He maintains that such powerful bodies as the U.S. Central Intelligence Agency (CIA) and the U.S. Air Force have been squelching information about UFOs for more than three decades. He also believes that ex-Nazi scientists have been building their own saucer-shaped flying objects in South America and have a plan to use them as global, trading aircraft.

He said he realizes some people find the whole subject a bunch of nonsense.

"They're entitled to their opinion, as I am to mine."

He says the three-hour lectures contain new information on UFOs which he and his wife Denise have gathered through their research group in Van Nuys, Calif., he said.

At the core of the lectures are once-classified CIA documents which he has obtained containing what he called proof that the agency believes there are UFOs.

"They have denied any interest whatsoever for the past 30 years, but due

to the freedom of information act (in the U.S.) this has all been released and proven to the contrary.

"Their agents have been involved in documenting sightings, landings and contacts (with extra-terrestrial craft) for many years."

Stranges believes that eventually public opinion will force open the flood of information secretly collected about UFOs.

And when that happens there won't be "panic and mass hysteria" as some government agencies fear, he said. "People are far more sophisticated now they're more open to new information."

# Space clones knock on suburban doors, but ignore UFO seminar

The extraterrestrials were conspicuous by their absence at a seminar devoted to the topic Thursday at the Conestoga Inn.

However, many of the more than 110 people attending the first night of the three-day discussion on UFOs didn't seem to notice. Others seemed convinced there was an E.T. or two around, even if it was only in spirit.

"I don't want to say too much about this because they might come after me, but I've been visited by the men in black," said Tom Grey, a Mississauga orange juice salesman who has studied UFOs for 30 of his 40 years.

"They're extraterrestrials and are sinister in their appearance. It was May 15 at my apartment in Mississauga. One knocked on the door and he had pure white skin and red lips. They wear black suits, black hats and drive black Cadillacs and

they all look identical. I would say they are clones."

Grey said he wasn't home at the time of the visit, but that his 10-year-old daughter answered the door. The visitors left after being told Grey wasn't home.

"I think I was paid the visit because of certain research I've been doing in Guyana. I believe I've stumbled onto the sighting of a hostile type of craft and someone is going to great lengths to prevent me from researching it."

Grey said he is a member of the Northeastern UFO organization, a group which has been monitoring sightings over Lake Ontario since the early 1970s.

"And we've uncovered a hornet's nest of activity between Niagara-on-the-Lake and Oakville. I've lost count of how many UFOs I've seen."

He said his most memorable experience with UFOs was in 1976. "I was at the office of a research group member in West Hill and I was a

little depressed because I hadn't seen a UFO since 1957. I said to him that my chances of seeing a UFO are one in a million — three hours later (at about 6:30 p.m.) I had a bonanza sighting.

"I was on the (Highway) 401 near Scarborough Town Centre and I looked over to my left and saw a strange light over Eatons and it wasn't part of the plaza. I thought, 'My God, if this is real, there's a UFO sitting over Eatons.'"

The white, glowing object rose vertically into the air, travelled horizontally for a distance and then settled about 400 feet off the ground for about 20 minutes, Grey said.

"I called all the radio and television stations and they all said, 'sure, sure' (and never showed up). Then at about 6:55 the craft dimmed out completely and then glowed red and disappeared."

The Stratford director of the Southern Ontario UFO Research team which looks into reported sightings in that area was also at the seminar.

"My strangest experience was last year at On-

tario Place," said Pat Delafranier, the mother of two children. "I was thinking about what was rumored to be out there on Lake Ontario and then a very good looking young man walked by."

The man, she said, disappeared behind her and her children into the crowd and then, twice more, appeared to be walking towards them.

"It was impossible for him to do that. He had to have teleportation abilities."

Delafranier said "things are very slow in Stratford" these days as far as UFO sightings go.

"One sighting my husband and I had in 1971 was at Lakeside, Ont., at the cottage. Both of us had a feeling there was something above us and when we looked up we saw three flat, white lights separated like a triangle (on the bottom of the flying object)."

Delafranier said the lights stayed over them for about five minutes and "they had a numbing effect on us. I wasn't even interested in UFOs at the time, but this makes me think I was always des-

tinued to be involved."

John Dowdell of Acton, is an astrologer who studies UFOs because of his "interest in the unknown."

He says his first glimpse of a UFO was in April, 1976, from atop the physics building at the University of Guelph where he and some friends were observing an eclipse.

Dowdell, who has a B.A. in physical geography, said he reported his two-second sighting of the pair of objects to the Centre for UFO Studies at Northwestern University in Illinois, but got no response.

There were also some people in the crowd who have never managed to be in the right place at the right time when it comes to sightings.

"I'm a fanatic and I'm still hoping to see one — I go camping a lot hoping to see a UFO," said 19-year-old Gord Glass, a Kitchener press operator.

"It seems like I've always been interested and I watch a lot of documentaries on it."

# UFO 'cover-up' charged

## Cambridge seminar told of 37-year worldwide conspiracy

**KITCHENER** — Frank Stranges has no idea why there has been what he calls a 37-year worldwide conspiracy to cover up unidentified flying object (UFO) sightings.

Stranges, from Van Nuys, Calif., head of the National Investigations Committee on Unidentified Flying Objects, has no doubt UFOs exist.

People have been frightened of, and mocked, the unknown for thousands of years, he told a three-day seminar sponsored by the Cambridge UFO Research Group.

Many of the up to 150 people who attended each of the four-hour nightly sessions not only believe in UFOs; they claim to have either seen spacecraft in the sky or landing.

A "close encounter of the second kind" — a UFO landing without sighting an alien being — is now being investigated by the Cambridge group, president Bonnie Wheeler said.

### Strong urge

A Cambridge-area woman — who would not give her name — said she took her son to hockey practice about a year ago and, on the way home, spotted a UFO hovering near the road.

She said she remained in her car, terrified, but felt a strong urge to leave it and approach the saucer-shaped craft hovering a short distance in front of her.

Several minutes later, the craft ascended the woman said, and she went home badly shaken.

Wheeler said her group's inves-

tigators questioned the woman for several hours before they were convinced the sighting was genuine. They are now trying to find a reliable hypnotist to work with her to find out exactly what occurred.

But Stranges is long past basic landings. He claims to be friendly with a Venusian (a being from the planet Venus), whom he met at the Pentagon — United States military headquarters — in Washington, D.C.

Stranges says the Venusian has no fingerprints, can speak every dialect and language known to man and is able to prevent any human tragedy or conflict by the force of his will.

Stranges showed slides and movies of UFOs at the seminar which he said were taken by farmers, businessmen, doctors and military personnel.

According to Stranges, UFOs come in many sizes and shapes, including saucers, cones, beehives, doughnuts and ships shaped like cigars.

Stranges says there has been a continual cover-up of UFO sightings by the U.S. air force — whose

pilots have had many experiences — and by the Central Intelligence Agency (CIA).

He displayed several dozen photocopies of what he said were formerly classified Central Intelligence Agency documents describing UFO sightings in all parts of the world and made available by the Freedom of Information Act.

Stranges, a minister in the National Evangelistic Church of California, says he finds no conflict between his religious beliefs and his extra-terrestrial investigations. He claims God is at least androgynous — "has both male and female characteristics" — and is more likely to be "many Gods."

During the seminar, he repeated a conversation he claims he had with the late scientist Werner von Braun, who told him, "Humans would have to be foolishly egotistical to think they are the only intelligent beings in the universe."

As well, von Braun, who headed early German rocket development and, after World War II, the U.S. space effort, was quoted as saying, "Earth is the insane asylum of the universe."

Date: December 9, 1961

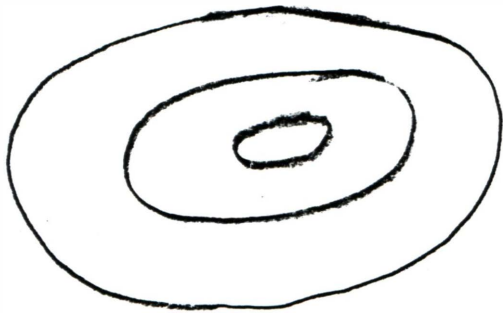

Location: Lithgow, N.S.W., Australia, 100 miles from coast, 3400 ft. altitude

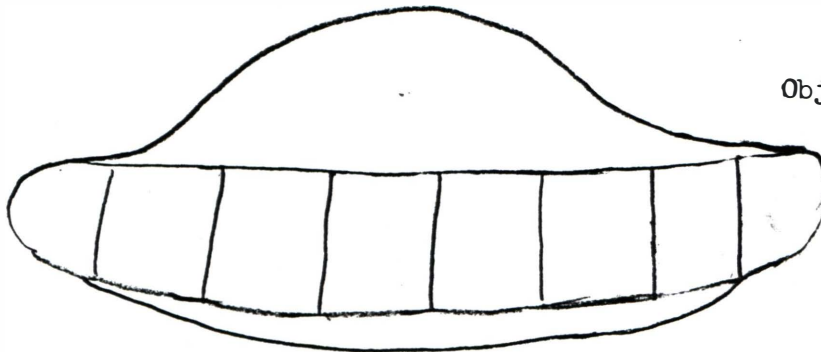
Walter Reynolds went outside to obtain firewood, it was summer, but it had turned cold. Weather was dry and sky was covered by flecky clouds. Suddenly the sky was lit up and Walter saw a "huge floodlit vessel" pass overhead, height about 40,000'. He stated the speed of the enormous object was faster than any plane he had ever seen. He informed several friends and was met with ridicule, scorn and accused of being drunk. However, he did meet some people who claimed to have seen the same object as Walter witnessed. Three months after that sighting, he saw a round object over the mountain and another object following it. He spoke of his experience to a person who was previously a watchman at a military installation. He said he saw a similar object, only not as large. It landed outside the fence of the military depot. Another watchman also reported that he saw this object land silently outside the fence, it was about 30' across and 4' high. They saw this object land many dark evenings. A high ranking officer was sent to investigate and told the men "you saw nothing, understand?"

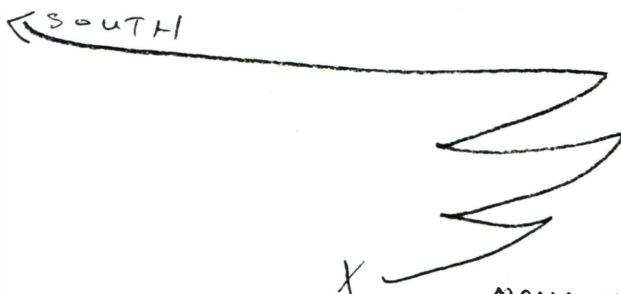

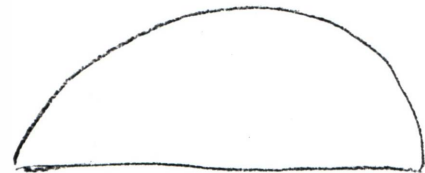

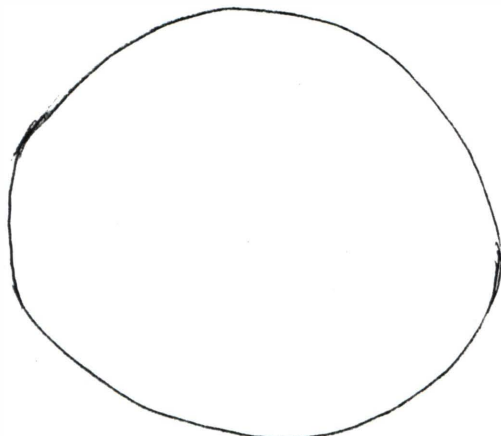

Mrs. Miller and her daughter were watching TV when daughter looked out the window towards the field and swamp area. She saw a large, orange, round, ball shaped object, about the size of a fifty cent piece held at arm's length. Two round white lights were seen to the side and bottom of the orange ball. The two white lights looked like truck lights. No light was thrown outward onto the ground. The orange ball and two white lights were at tree top level and appeared to be  $\frac{1}{2}$  to  $\frac{3}{4}$  miles away. The lights simply vanished after five minutes. The sky was clear, area rural and swampy. Small power lines were nearby. The lights did not move and were a steady glow. No noise was heard.

John Dowdell attempted to follow up a UFO case which appeared in the Herald paper (near Acton) on May 5/82, entitled "Glen William's sighting." John logically called the Herald staff writer, Chris Aagaard, identifying himself and our group and requested the witnesses full name. Mr. Aagaard stated he would ensure the witness, or Mary Lou, an intermediary, would call John with details. He stated the lady in the second article (see attached) wished to remain anonymous. No phone call ensued, so John contacted Mr. Aagaard again, he reluctantly gave John the witnesses name, "Jane", and her place of employment. John contacted her place of employment and was told that a message would be left for Jane to call. As expected, nothing happened. John drove to Jane's place of employment, he was told Jane had been ill, but would call him. John called the Herald again and relayed the events, but all they said was that Jane didn't volunteer her story originally, a friend encouraged her to tell her story to the Herald. They could do nothing more. All John received was one giant "run around". As this case cannot be properly substantiated, and the events surrounding this case in attempting to substantiate it lead to a dead end and deliberate cover up, this case cannot be considered valid in UFO research.

# Have you seen the saucer?

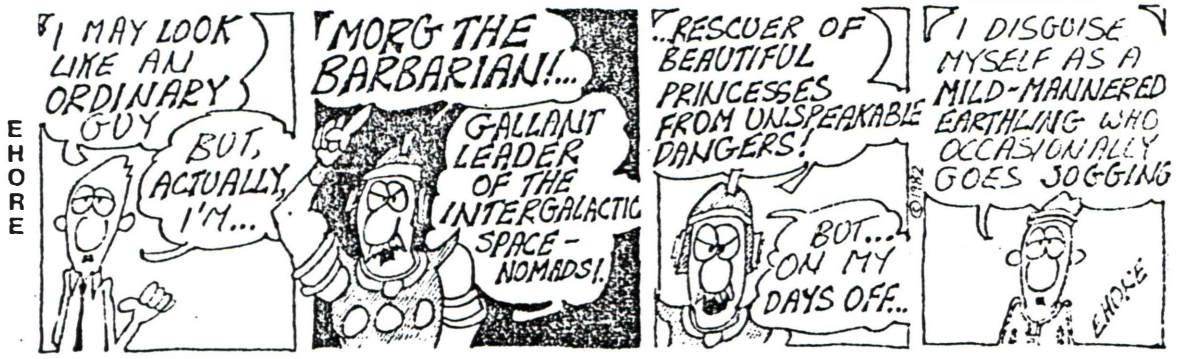
After reading The Herald's story last week about an unidentified flying object experience shared by a local woman and her son while driving through Glen Williams recently, one caller recounted her own mysterious tale. She said she was travelling west along Highway 7 Thursday night when she heard a loud "humming" while passing the Sideroad 27 intersection. The noise, she said, appeared to be very close and was loud enough during its brief duration, to be bothersome. She said she saw nothing and the rest of her trip continued uneventfully. In last week's story, the woman and her son reported they were bothered by a large roar while parked near the Eighth Line and Sideroad 27 intersection and their car was shaken. Neither passenger or driver saw anything.





Sid MacKinnon and Nick Bensond interviewed a witness to a supposed sighting in northern Ontario. The interview was conducted in February, 1982. During the extensive interview they found out that Eric contradicted himself frequently, was very depressed and had very poor memory in answering questions. He had no judgement of weight, height or distance. He was on welfare, couldn't hold a job, under doctor's care, and was seeing a social worker. He had lost his father recently and moved out of the house he had shared with his mother. He could not cope with society. Sid and Nick felt they should contact Eric's social worker. The social worker confirmed that Eric was experiencing difficulties in socializing in society; and in speaking with people about UFO's, Eric would feel self assurance in socializing. Due to Eric's many problems, it is felt no valid information can be obtained with regard to a UFO sighting.

Sid has written up a full report on this case and anyone wishing to read same can contact me.





In the December, 1981 issue of the newsletter, I inserted an article prepared by Chris Rutkowski of Manitoba, on the Val Johnson case, where in a flying object struck his police cruiser, near the town of Stephen, Minnesota. G.A.J. Wescott was involved in investigating this case and has sent me further data, which follows.



SIGHTING DATED: 27th August 1979 at 1.40 a.m. Central Daylight Time.  
LOCATION: Approx. 10 miles west of Stephen, Marshall County, Minnesota.  
WITNESS: Mr. Val Johnson, age 35, Deputy Sheriff of Marshall County,  
Resident: Oslo.

Interview taken on Location of Sighting, September 4th, 1979

On Monday 27th August, 1979, Deputy Val Johnson of the Marshall County Police Department was travelling west on Marshall County Road #5 from Stephen Minnesota. The time was 1.40 a.m. when he got to the junction of Minnesota State #220 and County #5. At the intersection he observed a non-blinking, solid white light with definite defined edges, approx. 8 - 12 inches in diameter. He turned down 220 from 5, and after travelling for approximately one and four tenths of a mile his vehicle was struck by the light. Upon reiterating, he heard a very intense sound of breaking glass when the vehicle was struck. He was blinded by the light (receiving welders burns to both eyes), and believe he lost consciousness for approx. 39 minutes. It was determined later that the Deputy's vehicle coasted from the location he was struck in a straight line for 854 feet and at this time the brakes were applied, leaving another 99 feet of straight skid marks on the road. The car finished up sideways across the road facing east. Deputy Johnson regained consciousness at 2.19 a.m. (time lapse of 39 minutes), and put in a call for assistance. The car engine was not running when he came to, and both the vehicle clock and the Deputy's wrist watch were exactly 14 minutes slow, whereas they had both been accurately set before the sighting.

Herein follows a transcript of a tape of the sighting recorded by  
Mr. Johnson in my presence on 16th September, 1979

  
G.A.J. WESTCOTT C.C.U.F.O.S.

This is Deputy Sheriff Val Johnson ... I report in connection with an incident which happened August 27th, 1979 at approximately 1.40 a.m., western section of Marshall County, approximately ten miles west of Stephen, Minnesota. This Officer was on routine patrol, westbound down Marshall County Road #5. He got to the intersection of #5 and Minnesota State #220. When I looked down south #220 to check for traffic I noticed

a very bright, brilliant light 8 - 12 inches in diameter, 3 - 4 feet off the ground. The edges were very defined. I thought perhaps at first that it could be an aircraft in trouble, as it appeared to be a landing light from an aircraft. I proceeded south on #220. I proceeded about a mile and three tenths or a mile and four tenths when the light intercepted my vehicle causing damage to headlight, putting a dent in the hood, breaking the windshield and bending antennas on top of the vehicle. At this point, at the interception of the light, I was rendered either unconscious, neutralized or unknowing, for a period of approximately 39 minutes. From the point of intersection my Police vehicle proceeded south in a straight line 854 feet, at which point the brakes were engaged by forces unknown to myself, as I do not remember doing this, and I left about approximately 99 feet of black marks on the Highway before coming to rest sideways in the road with the grill of my hood facing in an easterly direction. At 2.19 a.m. I radiod a 1088, Officer needs Assistance, to my dispatcher in Warren. He dispatched an officer from Stephen who came out, ascertained the situation as best he could, called for the Stephen Ambulance to transport me to Warren Hospital for further tests, X-rays and observation. At the time the officer arrived I complained about having very sore eyes. At Warren Hospital it was diagnosed that I had a mild case of welders burns to my eyes. My eyes were treated with some salve and adhesive bandages put over and instructed to keep them on for the remainder of the day, or approximately 24 hours. At 11.00 a.m. Sheriff Dennis Brekie, my employer picked me up at my residence in Oslo, and transported me to an Opthomologist in Grand Forks, North Dakota. He examined my eyes and said I had some irritation to the inner portions of the eye which could have been caused by seeing a bright light after dark. That is all I have to add except to say that my timepiece in the Police vehicle and my mechanical wrist watch were both lacking 14 minutes of time to the minute. Upon further investigation .....end tape.

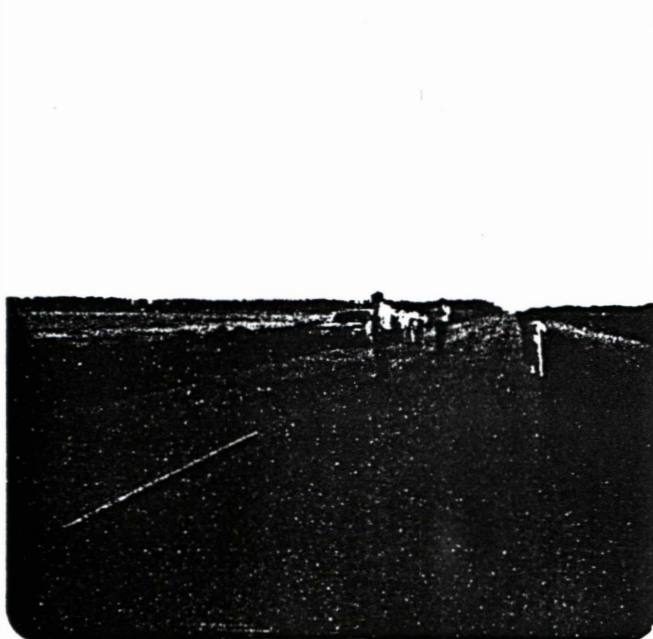

It is perfectly round and about the size of a 25¢ piece. Windshield - lefthand side - three definite impact points forming a triangle with glass crazing tapering off to the top of the windshield. Roof - lefthand red side light on roof, glass knocked out. Roof antenna spring loaded metal whip antenna bent at approx. 45°, 5 inches from base. Rear trunk - antenna spring loaded metal whip antenna bent at approx. 90°, 3 inches from the top.

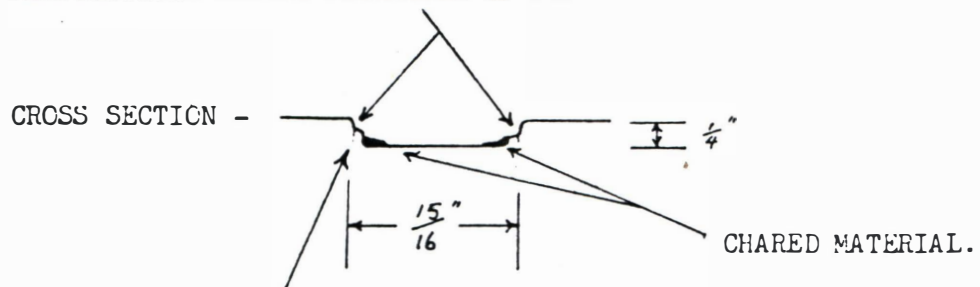

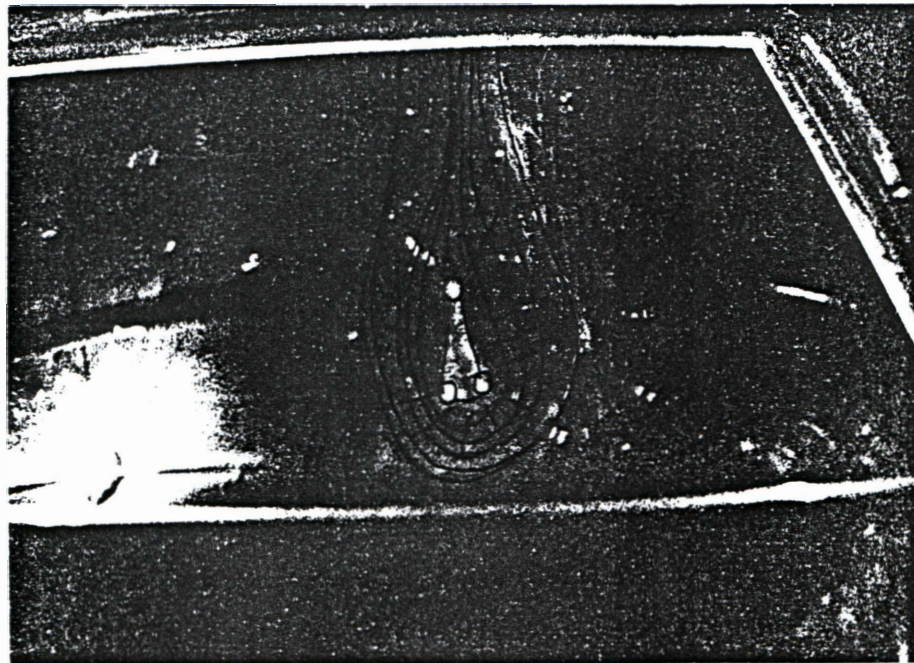
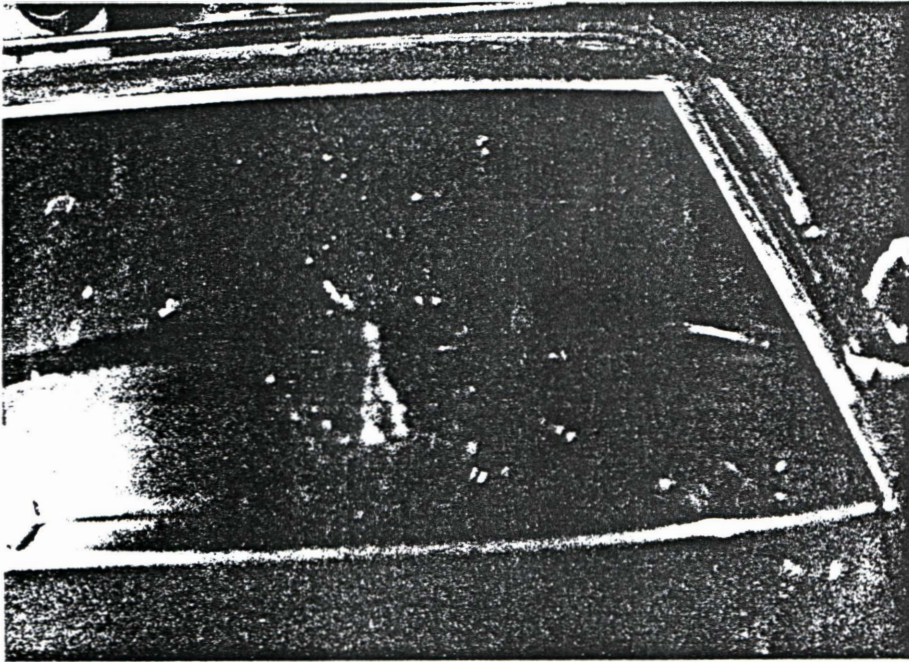

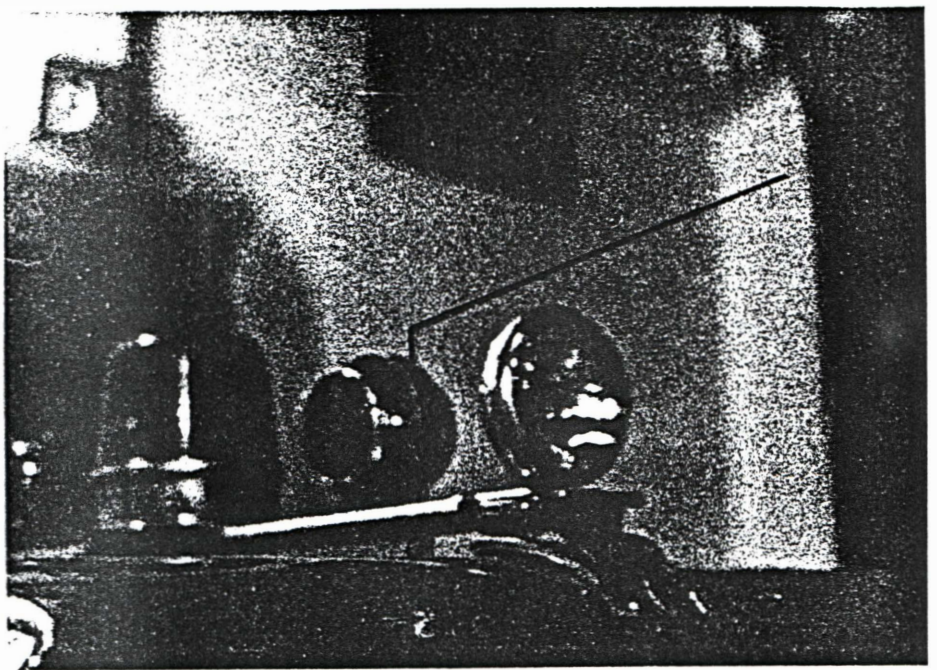

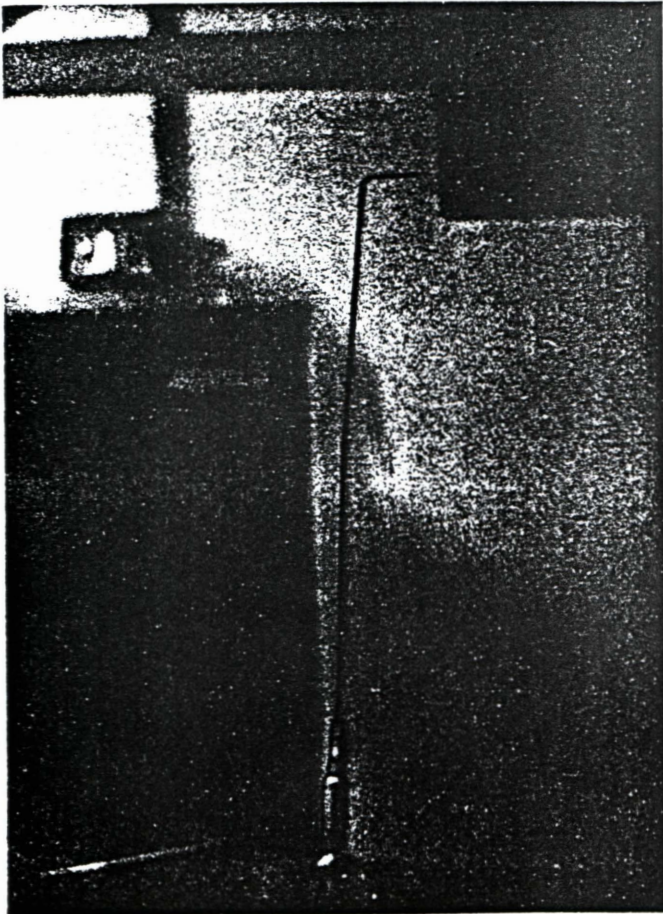

Investigator's Report and Conclusions:-

Investigator: G. Westcott, N.O.A.P. C.C.U.F.O.S.

I have interviewed Deputy Val Johnson twice, and on both occasions have found that his story ties in with what was previously told. I am sure that this man is a capable observer and relater of the facts as they happened. However, it is my opinion that on the morning of the 27th August, 1979, the Deputy's car was in fact struck by ball lightning. The evidence pointing to the fact is as follows:-

26th August 1979. The day was very hot and humid with little or no clouds. Therefore, a considerable electric charge could have built up in the atmosphere. This charge condensed into a ball of lightning and hovered about the power lines running along Minnesota Highway #317 west approximately 5 km from the location where the Deputy first saw the light. The Deputy started to travel south down #220 towards the light; at approx. 3km from the light, it electrically sensed the presence of the car as an opposite pole of force and was instantaneously attracted to it. The Deputy was blinded on impact and the car was electrically heated up. Fortunately, the windshield, being glass and an insulator, deflected the ball or electric energy upwards. When the Deputy was blinded he instinctively applied the brakes. This caused the already heated up antennas on the roof of the vehicle and on the trunk to whip forward and impact upon the large red dome light in the centre of the roof. This can be proved by the fact that on the back of the dome light there are two small marks melted into the plastic where the antennas impacted and were bent. Also, if the height of the bend on the antennas is measured, you will find that it corresponds with the distance that the antennas are from the centre dome light. Another point is that the dome light is approx. 7" high, and the bend on the roof antenna is only 5" above the roof, or 2" below the top level of the light. The light was not damaged, so whatever passed over the car could not have bent the antennas by contact. Some discolouration was also noted around the bends on the antennas, and was also evident in the dent on the hood of the vehicle. Note pattern of impact on windshield, ball impact then flows up the windshield to a point. In conclusion, I would say that the Deputy is a very lucky man not to have been electrocuted as the car was: very evidently damaged by ball lightning.

3/ DENT IN THE HOOD (BONNET) OF THE CAR IS DIRECTLY OVER THE MASTER BRAKE CYLINDER. VAL JOHNSON INSISTS THAT HE NEVER APPLIED THE BRAKES. IS IT POSSIBLE THAT THE BRAKES WERE APPLIED EXTERNALLY.

4/ FOR THE LAST YEAR AND A HALF, VAL JOHNSON HAS HAD A RECURRING DREAM HE CAN'T REMEMBER THE DREAM BUT WAKES UP WITH THE WORDS " I AM COMMITTED."

5/ ALTHOUGH VAL JOHNSON'S DENTAL WORK WAS ALL INTACT BEFORE THE SIGHTING, EXTENSIVE WORK HAD TO BE DONE AFTERWARD AS ALL HIS EXISTING FILLINGS ETC. WERE FOUND TO BE CRACKED.

6/ APPROX. 30 OTHER REPORTS AROUND THE AREA ABOUT THE SAME TIME ARE NOW COMING TO LIGHT DUE TO THE PUBLICITY GIVEN TO VAL JOHNSON'S CASE.

PLEASE TAKE THESE NEW FACT INTO CONSIDERATION WHEN READING OVER THE FIRST REPORT. I AM NOW INCLINED TO WITHDRAW MY FINAL ANALYSIS OF THIS CASE.

# EVALUATION OF MEDICAL INJURIES RESULTING FROM UFO CLOSE ENCOUNTERS

Richard C. Niemtow, M.D.

Many of the witnesses of close encounters associated with the UFO phenomenon report substantial medical injuries. These injuries may be classified into three categories. The first category is of a temporary nature, dealing with paralysis,<sup>1</sup> dizziness, nausea, vomiting, headache, blindness, perception of odors, and high frequency audio sounds. The second category deals with the more chronic effects usually associated with skin lesions, which may represent direct pathology through unknown mechanisms. These skin lesions, which previously were described as burns<sup>2</sup> produced by ionizing radiation, do not compare clinically, as we know it, to ultraviolet radiation or megavoltage photon or electron skin reactions as described in classical radiotherapy. The third category may involve parapsychological manifestations which may interrupt normal emotional behavior.<sup>3</sup>

The untoward effects of UFO close encounters clearly demonstrates the possible existence of the phenomenon. Because the reports of the selectiveness of the pathological and psychological impact to humans remains poorly studied and poorly understood an in-depth evaluation is suggested.

The purpose of this paper is to recommend to physicians the acquisition of certain data that may be helpful in the clinical setting to evaluate and possibly assess the credibility of an actual close encounter.

The following medical tests are suggested (pathophysiology is supplied where appropriate):

**1. COMPLETE BLOOD COUNT WITH DIFFERENTIAL.** Net increases in the number of white blood cells have been reported resulting from exposure to weightlessness during various

manned space missions.<sup>4</sup> A reduction in the lymphocyte population will result if exposure to ionizing radiation is encountered. Suppression is also seen under stress situations due to release of glucocorticoids<sup>5</sup> or weightlessness. One can expect an increase in neutrophils and a decrease in monocytes, eosinophils, and basophils in weightlessness.

**2. SERUM CORTISOL.** Diurnal fluctuations are known to exist for serum cortisol, as well as in sodium and potassium excretion. Cortisol tends to peak near the early morning hours. Rapid displacement from geographical location and time zones may disturb this rhythm.

**3. WEIGHT LOSS.** All but one U.S. astronaut has lost weight in space.

**4. SERUM AND URINARY POTASSIUM, SODIUM AND CHLORIDE.** Serum and urinary potassium, sodium, and chloride retention have occurred in postflight observations of astronauts, with weightlessness producing an important potassium loss and consequential abnormal cardiac rhythms.

**5. URINE CALCIUM AND PHOSPHORUS.** Urine calcium and phosphorus may be increased.

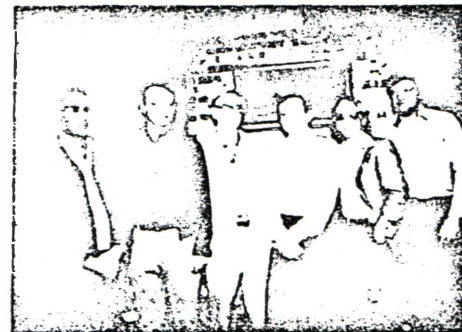
**6. URINARY KETONES.** Starvation should cause the formation of urinary ketone bodies.<sup>6</sup>

**7. SERUM GLUCOSE.** This is a baseline test.

**8. CHEST X-RAY.** A standard chest x-ray should be taken.

**9. BIOPSIES OF SKIN LESIONS.**

The aforementioned tests are suggested as a baseline for an in-depth study of medical injuries resulting from UFO close encounters. These simple tests, if administered by qualified physicians, can be in the best interest of the witness (i.e., patient), as well as providing valuable data on the reported

incident. Because of the lack of data to date, a number of assumptions must be considered — test to determine if the witness was subjected to prolonged weightlessness, moved from one geographical location to another, prevented from receiving nourishment, etc. The results of this study should be quite valuable in assessing the credibility of future close encounter reports. (Project VISIT, P.O. Box 877, Friendswood, TX 77546.)

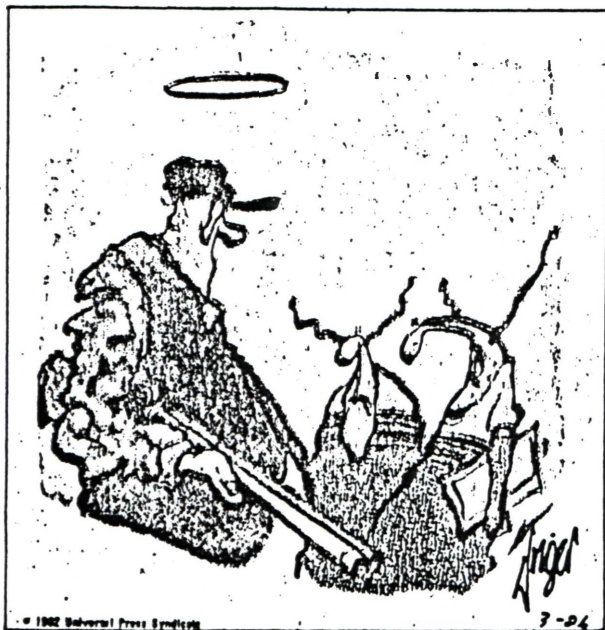

Its even gotten to a point with all the claims being made by various Ufologist that Reticulians, Venusians, Star People, Space Brothers, etc., are walking amongst us, that the real rare species is a bonafied Earthling.

In August of 1980, Ufology was given another interesting mystery to add to its confusion, a set of photos showing an alleged crashed UFO with its burned pilot inside. Interestingly, there were two different sets of photos which appeared in 1980. Unfortunately, only one set was ever made available to the general public. This particular set is the basis of this investigative report.

The Coalition of Concerned Ufologists, of which OUFOIL was a member, released the photos with the intention to share them with the world. It was hoped that help would come from fellow Ufologist in identifying them, if possible. It was also hoped that with the publication of the photos, it would possibly encourage others who may possess evidence of crashed saucers and/or alien bodies to come forward.

In an attempt to get the full story out to our fellow Ufologist and the general public, the Coalition of Concerned Ufologists released a publication called, "ALIEN BODY PHOTOS: AN UPDATED REPORT". This publication included all information released by the alleged source at that time, along with copies of the actual 8x10 black and white glossy photos of the alleged crashed UFO with its burned pilot. It was a good report, as far as giving out all the information that was available at that time on the photos. However, it wasn't a very good investigative report.

There was an agreement among the three Coalition members, that before any report would go to the printer, all parties involved would have an opportunity to read the rough draft in-case any additions or deletions were needed. Since there seemed to be some haste to get the report out, this agreement wasn't kept, since OUFOIL was never consulted during the make-up of the report. Matter of fact, we received a letter(1) informing us that we really had nothing to contribute towards the report and for us to just sit back. However, we felt that we had plenty to contribute, but it would have delayed the report for several months, while certain aspects of the story needed to be checked out. We pointed out several discrepancies in the story. For example, we found that the flight pattern of the craft as described by the alleged source would put the crashed site in the United States and not Mexico. This was one of a dozen several flaws that we found with the alleged sources story. However, the other Coalition members totally ignored them. It even got to a point, that things got heated between us and the other Coalition members, that we were contemplating putting out a release stating that we weren't involved in the make-up of the report.

Since the first report ignored many important facts, OUFOIL decided to release their own independent investigative report on the alleged alien body photos. We feel that this report is an honest and an unbiased one. For well over a year, we have been researching out every possible aspect of the case. This report should also give everyone an indication that the Federal Government isn't going around and shutting people up in Ufology. We have received tremendous amount of help from many different agencies within the U.S. Government.

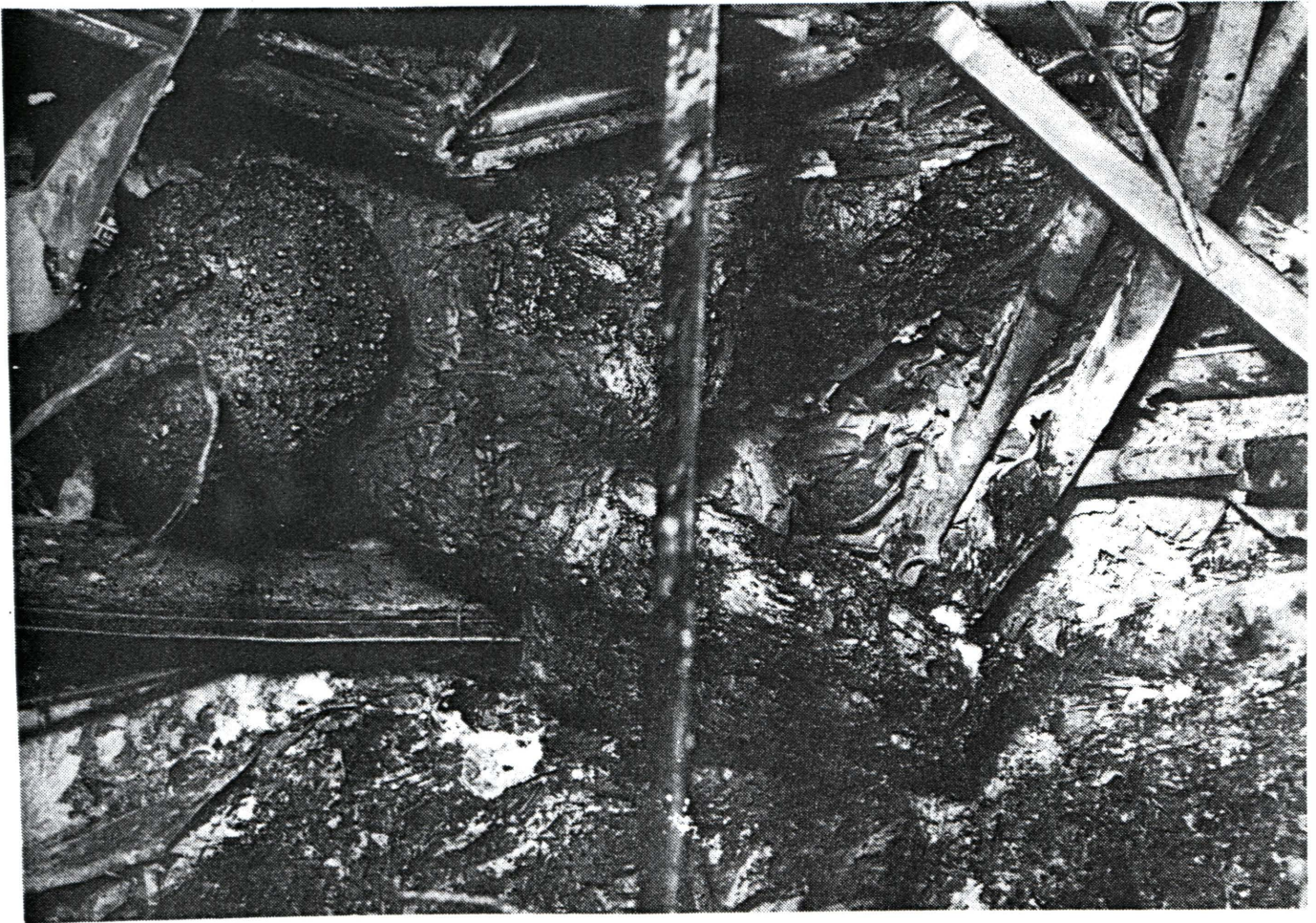

## REVIEW AND SUMMARY ON SECTION TWO OF THIS INVESTIGATIVE REPORT

- ITEM 1. Letter from White Sands Missile Base, stating that they never have or do investigate such air disasters.
- ITEM 2. Letter from White Sands Missile Base, stating that their records show no such special or any type of photographic team assigned to perform the functions as described by the alledged source.
- ITEM 3. Information obtain from the Military Historical Division proves that the DEW line early radar warning system wasn't operational in 1948 as stated by the alledged source.
- ITEM 4. Checking the flight pattern as described by the alledged source, would have put the unknown object in the state of Oklahoma and not the country of Mexico.
- ITEM 5. Information obtained from the USAF Historical Division showed that the mentioned Dias Air Base by the alledged source, wasn't in operations in 1948. Matter of fact, the air base was called at that time, the Abilene Army Airfield which was deactivated in 1945 and not activated years later. Also of great importance is the mis-spelling of the word Dias. The correct spelling is Dyess and the base wasn't name that until 1956 not 1948. This is one of many points that a well known crash saucer researcher missed in his published abstracts. It makes one wonder if anyone really checks on anything at all.
- ITEM 6. Letter from the Lockheed Corporation stating that the F-94s didn't fly until 1949, which were only prototypes. The U.S. Air Force didn't fly them until 1950.
- ITEM 7. Letter from Dr. Salisbury indicating that the vegetation in the photo is similar to what is found in the eastern states and not Mexico.
- ITEM 8. Replys from the different Mexican Embassys in the U.S. and Mexico stating that they had no record of any type of air disaster in or on the date and area in question.
- ITEM 9. Information received from the Center of Military History confirms that no L-19 flew in 1948 or could accommodate more than two people and had no cargo space to carry the equipment as stated by the alledged source.
- ITEM 10. Blow-ups of the major photographs show wiring present, when the alledged source stated that none were discovered.
- ITEM 11. Blow-ups of the major photographs points out earthly metal configurations with welded joints.
- ITEM 12. Information similar to the Rosewell, New Mexico case.
- ITEM 13. According to experts, some signs of smoke should have shown up on at least on of the major photos if the heat was as intense and the craft still smouldering as described by the alledged source.

Summing up section two on the twenty items discussed, we need to list the items as they would fall into three major categories, in-order to be fair in evaluating the information gathered.

The first category would confirm the alledged sources story or that the information obtained from the various sources by us, may have been false. Those items that would fall into this category are numbers 1-2-8 and 16. Giving each listed item five percentage points, we come up with only a 20% rate for the story to be true.

In the second category, we list the items that are probable, which may fall into either the first and/or third categories. Those items are numbers 7-12-14-15-17-18 and 19. Here we have a total of 35% for probability.

The third and final category list the items that definitely prove the story a hoax. Those are numbers 3-4-5-6-9-10-11-13 and 20. Thats a total rate of 45%, which is the highest among the three categories, indicating that the story isn't true.

## ☆ CONCLUSION ☆

It is the opinion of OUFOIL and only OUFOIL, based on all the information gathered in this investigative report, that the photographs in question are not those of a crashed UFO with its burned pilot. We also feel that they do not represent a V-2 rocket test failure.

The narrative portion of the alleged UFO incident as presented by the alleged source, we feel was the accumulation of various UFO crash stories that have circulated over the years. The major portion of the story was taken from ABSTRACT NUMBER 1 on page 7 of the "UFC-OHIO YEARBOOK 1979". Other abstracts used from the same publication were abstract number 6 on page 9, abstract number 18 on page 16, and finally abstract number 22 on page 24. It is very possible that the alleged source obtained a copy of this publication and put together his story. This publication was available long before OUFOIL ever got involved with the alleged alien body photos. Also to be noted here, is that those same abstracts were presented at the MUFON SYMPOSIUM in 1978 in Dayton, Ohio. Again the alleged source had plenty of time to put together his narrative story.

The above paragraph talked about an alleged source putting together pieces of various stories into one major one. Why would we say an alleged source? We feel very strongly from all the evidence gathered in this investigative report, plus other various aspects, that no source ever existed. No source, you say! Then who master minded all the interest in the photos? Who else, but the individual who came in contact with the photos first, Mr. Williard McIntyre.

Yes we firmly believe that Mr. McIntyre put the whole fiasco together, based on the following facts:

- 1) We meet Mr. McIntyre in the summer of 1979, months later after the UFO-OHIO publication was on the market, plus copies were on sale at the convention where we meet him.
- 2) In December of 1979, we were told briefly about the photos. However, in early 1980 we received Xerox copies of one of the prints from Mr. McIntyre.
- 3) Mr. McIntyre knew that OUFOIL'S director has been involved with the crash saucer syndrome for many years, plus he was the source of several of the abstracts in the UFO-OHIO publication. Therefore, he thus knew that the interest was there.
- 4) Mr. McIntyre was well aware of the great interest in the UFO-OHIO project and the crash saucer syndrome.
- 5) Mr. McIntyre gained much confidence and trust from OUFOIL by his willingness to share his information. We would like to point out here, that in all the years of our involvement in Ufology, there has been no other individual or group who has shared more material and kept in constant communications as Mr. McIntyre did. His sincerity in delicate matters in Ufology, gained much respect from OUFOIL people at that time. Perhaps now we know why he was so kind to us, but this also could be speculation on our part.
- 6) Mr. McIntyre's lack of producing the various lab reports that he claimed existed. Also the letter that we received from Kodak.
- 7) His botched up job on the alleged sources background and story.

- 8) The similarities in the handwriting of Mr. McIntyre and the ever mysterious Dr. Rosen, plus the psuedonym name of the alledged source.
- 9) The letter style of Mr. McIntyre is very much like that of the alledged sources.
- 10) Mr. McIntyre at one time was an executive with a major U.S. company that operated photographic laboratories and studios. He was also NICAP's chief photographic consultant in the 70's. (Source of above information: NICAP's issue of their February, 1971 UFO INVESTIGATOR)
- 11) Perhaps the greatest reason besides the one just mentioned in number 10, was in August of 1981, we finally confronted him with our suspicions that he was behind this whole mess. His response at that time was none and eluded to other conversation matters. Coincidentally, that was the last time we ever heard from him. For an individual who would call on an average of twice a week and would talk for hours at his expense, plus send material after material in the mail weekly, would stop all of a sudden! This makes one think that perhaps we hit the nail on the head. You would think that if he was innocent, he would have defended himself. But he didn't.

If Mr. McIntyre is guilty and from the above eleven points, it seems that he is, then why would he do such a stunt? Perhaps he wanted to:

- 1) Create an interest in the general public and the UFO community to promote his organization MARCEN. He has always claimed a very large membership (7010 members as of 1979 according to the MARCEN JOURNAL Vol. II Number III on pages 22 & 23), but no-one has ever meet another MARCEN member nor has any of them ever showed up with Mr. McIntyre at several different functions that OUFOIL members have also attended. Another very interesting point is that no MARCEN investigations have ever appeared before the general public or in the UFO circles. We can't really count the photo case, nor the Mt. St. Helen case and the questionable Bigfoot case, since he was the only MARCEN member involved.
- 2) Or just to confuse the field of Ufology for reasons only he can answer.

It is beyond the scope of this investigative report to prove or disprove all the information from the alledged source and/or Mr. McIntyre. It seems no matter how hard we have worked to explain the photos, there are those who will still look at those photos and want to believe that they truly depict a crashed UFO with its alien body. After all, if one keeps looking at the burnt body with their imagination running wild, yes one could pick out certain aspects of the photos that look unearthly.

With equal candor, we would like to think that Mr. McIntyre is innocent, but from all the evidence presented here in this investigative report, we feel that he has much to explain. Perhaps Mr. McIntyres' subconscious mind gave us all the answer in the third paragraph of his introduction in the "ALIEN BODY PHOTOS:AN UPDATED REPORT", when he stated the following, "....it showed the remains of a light aircraft crash with its burnt pilot."

Review:

MISSING TIME (A Documented Study of UFO Abductions) by Budd Hopkins. Richard Marek Publishers, 200 Madison Ave., New York, N.Y. 10016. 1981, hardcover, 258pp, \$12.95.

We have here a carefully documented, well written account of seven UFO-abduction cases--people of various backgrounds who, under regressive hypnosis conducted by psychologist, Dr. Aphrodite Clamar discover that a period of "missing time" in their lives was spent in the company of "space creatures" who used the hapless victims for specific biological purposes.

It appears that there is a near epidemic of such incidents. The book offers photographic evidence of unusual scars of wounds which mysteriously appeared after the abduction experiences, and of which the abductees were apparently unaware. The material is generally presented in a straightforward manner, eclipsed now and again by the author's personal speculations and unnecessary compulsion to continually reassure the reader of his sincerity. The evidence is sufficiently engrossing to speak for itself. Nevertheless, Budd Hopkins, an internationally known artist, sometimes obscures his canvas by patronizing his readers with superfluous commentary. Also, and perhaps unavoidably, the sameness of the hypnotic material tends to pale after awhile: The contactee is driving down a road, sees a strange light, the car stops, he is aboard a UFO with strange, silent beings who treat him with precise biological indifference. The victim yells, "Oh!" "Ouch!" "That hurts!" He (or she) feels "love" (?) for his captors, followed by jarring pain. There is scarcely any verbal communication, and it becomes clear that the victims are regarded as little more than laboratory mice.

Finally, the victim is returned to his car or home, a bewildered amnesiac with strange aches and pains and riddled by obscure anxieties. The implications of all these UFO-related abductions are quite shocking, and while Dr. Clamar performs her hypnotic techniques with responsible gentleness and concern for the victims, one can only speculate about the motives of these space beings, the possible "messages" or "tasks" implanted into the minds (or bodies) of each, and the many additional "programmed" Earthpeople who have no idea they were abducted.

In his chapter, "What Can Be Done?", Hopkins does not side-step the sobering side of this picture:

First, the government has an obligation to prepare the public for the day when the extraterrestrial presence is obvious to everyone. The potential for panic and economic disruption must be recognized and effectively reduced by careful advance planning.

He also calls for international cooperation through the United Nations. Personally, however, I doubt very much that such a suggestion--in view of the dismal progress of Dr. J. Allen Hynek and others named by the author--will ever bear fruit. In balance, this book has been carefully tailored to suit the average mentality without pinching or binding. There are no allusions to specific UFO hostility cases, nor any mention of the serious UFO pioneers, e.g., Keyhoe, VonKeviczky, Stringfield, or anyone else touching upon the possibly hostile motives of these alien invaders. Missing Time raises a thousand questions and answers none. Its appearance after decades of evasion, however, indicates the grave concern behind the appearance of this book. And for this we can be grateful to Budd Hopkins. JE

You have my gratitude for mailing a complimentary copy.

May I ask the investigators to reflect on the following anomalies of "The Wildwood gravel pit case"?

"In the third pit...I was right under the object, crouched down..."

Dan repeats the 'heat theme again': "walked into the (first) pit and found the area where the object had rested 'TOO HOT TO STAND ON.'" (Italics mine.)
