About a month after the wellapublicized Galt saucer landed in front of youns Jack Stephons eyes in July，1957，I went to intorviev Jack with a friend， Whe wa w172 call Leslie．We had talk－ ed all afternoon bbout his experience whiah er wote about in issue \＃4 of this publidetion．Jack had the urge to Bo back in the evening to the seene of＂the zanding．No gigns f1ed oux spproval and left right after wo bad supper：We trudged through the farm－ $e r^{\prime} g^{\prime}$ field and e．s we mede our way slong the path In the semi－darkness， my flashlisht went out．I found out jater the bulb burned out．Te only had the Ilght of the full moon to light our ray．Te stoppod in this sentre of the recently ploughod field overlookins the gully and conversed 3 bit more．Suddenly I became aware of an orengered 11ght above the tree＝ tops on the far side of the gully． I immediately toild my companions and Leslieisaid it had been there for about a minute but thought it vas a in light from a farmhouse uindowe wo all watched 1t and memorized it＇s position in relation to the outline of the trees．It deinnitaly vas above the trees，Ve lookad at each other mysti－ fied and when we looked againg it was． gone．Ve dian ${ }^{3} t$ know what to think． A few minutes lator，behind Jack ${ }^{\text {s is }}$ baok，and much nearer．being at the side ol our field adout 50 jards amay， appeared the samo or simplar orenge red Jight．This time it blinked on and ofi twice and diseppeared．By the time my two comporions oould tum
asound．It was not to be seen．It seemed to be in a smell tree or shrub．I ran over to the apot and could see nothing thet could heve made the 11ght．Behind the shrubs was a geeep incline down to mother 11tile lake or pond．You could see the reflection of the moon on the water below．We walked back to the Gedar Road，feeling we wouldn ${ }^{1} t$ ses anymore that night and besides．1t was getting ohilly\＆We played with the idea that it was some sort of gignal from the ocoupants of the aaucex，oven though it was row a month later，that the original contact by Jack was authentic．Who knows，the spaceeraft could have reo furned but wished to remain invisim ble for reasons unlnnown to us． A ehack up in the daylitht two weoks later shed no further light on the situation and the jights still rem main a mystery．The reason I ha．d not written about this sooner tas that I thought I may have had some－ thing more to add to this incident at a later date．A story called the＂Joshue Tree Saucer Contaet＂ In the November issue of SEARCH relates a Bimilar experionce with orange lighta．I＇m wondering if there 20 a relationship here and were wo really thisclose to our visitore from apace．I mould 11te to hear from anyone who thinks they mey havo in answer to this ghono－ momon．Incidentally，隹ere are moxe reports from the Galt orea anstie this buliatin．

STRANGE SIGHTS WATCHED IN THE SKY
Wallaceburg, Ontario - It was seen here again last night. For the second time in less than two weeks an unidentifled flying object was sighted low in the northeast sky from this area. Last night a group of newsmen watched it through binoculars. Opinion as to the identity or nature of the sighted object differed. Several known physical sights however, were tentatively agreed upon.

1. The object flashed brilliant red, green and blue.
2. It was not a highflying weather balloon.
3. It was not a conventional aircraft. 4. It moved much as a kite would move when flying.
The flashing lights followed no particular sequence but were more brilliant at one time then another. Speculation as to 1 ts 1 dentity ran the gamut of imagination all the way from a helicopter to a flying saucer. Through binoculars onsteainess in the holding made clear sighting impossible. It did not however, present a much different appearance to that of a star except for its movement and color. The suggestion that it was indeed a star whose light was being affected by the earth's atmosphere
appeared to be unsound because 1ts movements did not coincide with other stars in the same section of sky. A similar objeot in the northeast slky turned out to be a star after 1ts pattern of behaviour had been examined over a half hour period. Similar sightings over the past three weeks all appear to conflrm that it 18 somethins unidentified as yet. An official of the Chatham-based Inter Continental ierial Research Foundation said last night that he had recoived reports of the object from several sootters in the northern part of Kent but the object could not be identified Inquiries to the RCAF brought dead silence. Two polioenen from Wallacebury, Constables William Laprise and Gerald Stanlick saw the object less than a weok ago. (Chatham Dally News. October 6, 1958)
Central Intelligence's latest top-seoret repott, filed directly from $U_{0} S_{0}$ asents in hoscow, states the Russians will launoh a rocket carrying a man. or two, into space before Christmas.

AVRO ATHHCRAFT will test fly 1 ts supersearet "FLXING SAUCER" early next year, Few detalls of the revolutionary aircraft have leaked out, espocially aince the project was taken over by the U.S. Air Force after the Canadian government washed 1 ts hands of the saucer in 195\%. The Liberal Gov't. spent four hundred thousand dollars on the disc shaped aircraft. It is now belleved Avro has two saucer projeots under wraps. The one that will be unveiled eariy in the new yeer will be a vertscal take..off and landing oraft with wide military and civilian potential. To the military, it will be a flying joep or an alr observation craft. In its oivilian role, it may be the successor to the helioopter.
InSedgley, England, ghostly flgures of 13 people in medieeval robes have shown up on a oolor picture taken of the deserted high altar of Winchester Cathedrel. In trging to de-bunk the photo, color-film experts said the pleture is not a double-exposure as the camera is fitted with a preventative device against double-exposures. T. L. Taylor, an olectrical engineer. had no explanation for the ancient figunes. H1s wife and 16 year-old daughter were present when he took the photos of the altar. The first shows the choir stalls empty. The second shows the 13 people. The seatod figures are dressed in robes and cloaks of Plantaganet or Tudor Times. One is bearded like a Blblical patriarch. Riverside, Gailf. (AP) -- Funny thing happened to Charile Wetzel on the way home Saturday night.
A monster jumped out at him.
That' $s$ what he told authorikies who planned to continue an investigation of the increaible story.
Wetzel, 24, a resident of nearby Bloomington, reported soberly that he was driving on a street near Riverside when a frightening creature jumped in front of his car.
"It had a round scarecrowish head," he said, "like something out of Halloween "It wasn't human. It had a longer axm than anything I'd ever seen. When it saw me in the car it reached all the way beok to the windshield and began clawing at me.
"It didn't have any ears. The face was round. The eyes were shining like something fluorescent and it had a protuberant mouth. It was scaly, like leaves." Wetzel said he became terrifled when the creature reached over the hood of his car and began clawing at the windshield. He said he reached for a. 22 pistol he had in the car. "I held that pistol and stomped on the gas," he said. "The thing "fell back from the car and it gurglea." "The noise it made didn't sound human, I think I hit it. I heard something h1t the pan under the car."
Sheriff's officers said Wetzel pointed at sone thin sweoping marks he sald the oreature mate on his windshield. They went too the scerie of the claimed apparition but said they could find nothins to prove or alsprove the storys (Gredit - Bill kawlinson, from The San intonio Express - Nov. 10/58)
U. S. NAVY CLATMS MYSTERY OBJECT Bridzotom, Barbudos. (CP)-A metal object containing a tape recorder and other equipment ilished out of the sea at Consetts Bay on the east coast of Berbados has been claimed by U.S. off1cials.
"I am sure it is U.S. property" said Cmar. G.R. Shaclelette, commander of U.S. nevy facility station at Harrison's Point. The object, Blightly laiger than a footwall, was brought ashore by fishermen. Police recovered the "1ron beil" and reported the matter to the receiver of wreaks.

Frankfurt, Germany, Nov. 7/58-(UPI)-German rocket expert Hermann Oberth said today the U.So. is working intensively on an electric space ship and he belleved a manned space vehicle will reach the moon in "around 5 years. Oberth, 64, fatiner of modern rooketry, also said he belleves supernatural forms are watching the earth and have been doing so for a long time. He said: "I call these supernaturel forms of life 'Uraniden' and believe they are very inteliligent beings." Oberth said a flight to the mooon would be by an electric space ship and that it would be launched from a space station. He said rockets driven by the fuel in ourrent use could not make a substantial journey into space. Of supernatural beings Oberth said: "If you strike out everything in the flying saucer reports that has been proved humbug, there still remains two per cent of these forms that cannot be explained by esrthly means" (Toronto Daily Star -Nov. 7/58)

"FLYING SAUCERS AND THE STRIIGHT LINE MYSTERY"

The author declares he has discovered a means by which the movements of the saucers oan be studied scientifically. He finds that the saucers trevel in a straight line. He calls his discovery Orthoteny vhich means stretched in a straight line。

It was visible again monday night and seomed to be larger than a star. The newspaper had several calls regarding the object. Homer Schaefer, area reporter for this area told me it wasn ${ }^{\text {t }}$ Mars. Mr. Garriok of Galt is oredited with this 1 tom and the next two. oot. 11/58. Canadian and American Air Force officers and the FCMP held a seoret session "somewhere in Kitchenor this morning. The conference was called in the hope of establishing the nature of a large mysterious flying object, that frightened a horse which in turn tossed it's rider. The rider, Mrs. Laverne Asmussen, of Preston sustained a compound frasture of the right leg. The incident occured Saturday pomo, Sept. 27. Some eyervitnesses said the object might be likened to what they have read about filying saucers. All agreed it was flying low at tremendous speed and perilously low. "It had double fins" commented Ken Nathews, proprietor of Sumset Ridine Club. "I could see no markings on $1 t_{0}$ " The day was bright and olear. The object shot out of the Chicopee hills at troe top level
Oct. 14/58-Many Galt and district citizens were mystified last evening When mysterious flashing rays of 11ghts appeared on the Northern horizon. The origin of the lights are unknown. They appeared to stem tovard the earth in long fingers reaching from the dark evening sky. By the angle of travel they were judged to atrike the Kitchener-Inmira area. $\Lambda$ witness said it was not the aurora boreal1g.

Cottagers at oxiey, ontario, are puzzled by blobs of semi-transparent jelly-like lumps which are floating to the beaches. Guntown M1ss. (UPI) - Cherlene Magers holds claim to a huge, round piece of real estate, but doubts she'il ever set foot on it. It's the Moon. Miss Magers, a student of Mississippi State University, revealed that the claim on the moon was filed on her bohalf Oot. 14, 1950, at Tupelo, Miss. She apparently has a clear titlo, too. When a Knoxville, Tenne, man tried to file a claim, recently the U.S. Reclamation Bureau denied it on the grounds that Miss Magers had beat him to it. Her claim reads: "I, Charlene Magers, am hereby placing olaim on this planets moon, and shall defend said title againgt any persons or nations that might attack."
She has not yet revealed any plans for carrying out such defence. Nor has she voiced any objection to at. tempts to reach the moon with a rocket. She isn't the only member of her family with a celestial olaim. Her cousin, Mitohell Herring, holds titie to Mars. (Windsor Daily Star-Nov. 19/58)
The other day two commercial travellers going from ottawa to Kingston, both in Ontario, reported seeing after dark, "an unusual object in the cloudless sky-a round object about the size of the moon, speoding off to the north faster than a jet plane." This was in the beginning of November.
On Oct. 8, the U.S. Atomic Energy Commission thumped the northern cormer of the test site with an underground explosion. The blast in a tunnel 415 feet inside a towering desert mesa. A week later in Braviey, Califo, an earthquake hit the northern Imperial Valley. Two smaller shocks followed.

## HOLD THE PRESSENENS FTASHL

A reddish spot in the moon arater Alphonse, was discovered by Soviet scientiot Hikolal-Kozyrer at Crimea Observetory on Nov. 12. British astronofers branded as "nonsense" the Soviet report that a rolcano erupting on the moon had been photographed. The generel opinion at this moment is that. the araters on the moon are caused by meteordtes, not by volcenoes. However, on November 19, H. Perey Wilkins, British astronomer, said that he observed the reddish patch on the moon whioh might confirm Kussian claims. He said the red patch on the moon could have been caused by "gases-anytilng of that nature."

GLOW LIGHTS SKY FROM ONTARIO TO PENNA.
$\Lambda$ flash of light lit up the sky on Oet. 21st, for about a minute. Dunlap Observatory gave their stook answer to any lishts seen in the sicy, saying it was a metoor. P.C. Stanley Hunter of Barrie said it looked like "A shooting star" only much brighter, and lit up the area for miles around. Other sicghtings at 3.39 a.me came from London, Niagara Falls, Perth, Tlllsonburg, Toronto and western New York state. State police from Lake Ontario to Pennsylvania saw a bright bluish-white glow that shone with the brightness of daylizht. A spokesman at Toronto's Nalton Airport said the flash appeared to be on the airport boundary and lookod like a flare. Nothing had been found and that fos had hemmed in the airport all night.
This brilliant flash seen by Roland Michaud of Godbout, Saguenay, province of Quebec, said that "we suddenly felt a bis push of wind, followed just a fow instants after by the flash, and right then a "big bang", undoubtediy casused by the impact of an objeat of great magn2tude hitting the groumd and sending violent tremors of high intensity like earthquoke vibrations, around the whole area.
Rev. Haurice Buist, director of the seophysical observatory at the Colloge of St.Jean de Breubeuf, liontreal, said the records show a minor quake close to the time mentioned.
lirs. Woil. Brooke of Val David, heard "a noise like a large explosion and then some large thumps."
Dous llapes of Burfalo, N. Y. sent me the following information which concludes this speoifio case. Mr. Wayne Stanley saw the same thing over Nianitobe on oot. 15, and on the 22nd, he ought the tall end of a report over CKX, Brandon, saying that a voman saw a flash and it was sichted over two other touns in British Columbia, partioularly the Vancouver area. Later, the radio station reiterated that it never made the transmisaion.
On Sept. 22, over CJBC, Toronto, a report that a cuard at a petroleum factory in Nova Scotia, sav 23 objects passing overhead and that 4 UFOs were spotted by radar ecrlier, was denied. 011 this after many heard it in Buffala Samnel J. Ciurca, Jro, Director of the

Saucerian Researoh Centre, 255 Third Sto, Rocheater 5, NoY. , reported to Dous that a friend of his was listeninc In on Radio Australia on Oct. 21, and heard that these (or this) flash was sighted over Indonesia, New Zealand and Australia.
The Buffalo Courier-Express reports the next item. Dated Nov. 1 (AP) from Plymouth. Encland, $-\infty$ blue-green flash blazed over the western end of the Eng11sh Channel tonight. The brilliant flash lasted five seconds and was sight ed by a dozen ships and Coast Guard units. It set off a flurry of aotivity at the RAF Sea Rescue Center here, but authorities reported no plane was reported missing in the area.
A meteorological office spokesman in London said. "It is unlikely to have been saused by lightning or to have some other meteorologiaal origin." A Coast Gusrdsman in Southwest Cornwall said, "For a few seconds the whole sky was ilt up with a great big blue glare that was nothing like a rooket or anything else I know."
The French liner Colombie, in a radio message from the Guernsey area, said the flash seemed to take a downward path out of the sky. "We take it to be a meteor or meteorite," the ship's message said.
