When the fireball got overhead it exploded with a bang and all the lights in the motel and the nelghborhood went out. "That was that?" I exclaimed. But they didn't answer as we piaired our way around in the dark. The lighta didn't come on again for fifteen or twenty minutes. I didn $t$ fesl like reading any more about flying saucers that night."

MLYING SAUCBRS? FHYBRE AINFT NO
SUCH ANIMAL
Pentioton, British Columbia (OP) Flying saucers are figmonts of the imagination of uninformed minds, say many of North America's leading astro nomers and space experts. ${ }^{n}$ Every sighting of a flying saucer car be explained rationally" said Dr. Jo. $V_{\text {o }}$ Oake of California's llount Palomar observatory.
"We hardly ever hear of saucers any more:" gaid Dre J.F. Heard of Toronto direstor of the David Dunlap observaen tory. "I guess the fad has worn off for a while."
"I have never heard of any person whose profession it is to look at the sky-an astronomer or meteorologistm who has reported seoing a flying sauoer." said Dr. Narten Schmidt of the Celifornia Institute of Technology. "Flying saucers are absolute nonsense, 3e1d Graham Odger of the Dominion Astrophyaical observatory in Victoria. The sclentists said there are usually at least half a dozen rational explanations for every moving light in the sky.
These range from bright stars and aurorel displays to reflections of ground light on the clovds and can be identified as such by persons with proper training, they said.
The entry of any forelgn body into the earth's atmosphere today can be readily deteoted by scientific instru. ments. It would be sighted first by rediontelescopes and by ordinary radar as it oame closer to the earth, the soientists say. (Victoria Daily T1mes, Jume 23, 1960)
The Vanoouver Area Flying Sauoer Clutb very aptly contests the above opinion in a letter sent to some Canadien newspapers. Here it is:

Dear SIn:
The Canadian Press reoontly geve some publio1ty to the convention just held at the site of Canada's giant Radio Teleacope near Pentiaton. especially to comments made by Dr. JoV.Oake of Iit. Palomar, and Graham Odger of Dominion istrophysical observatory, Viotoria.

Sald Dr. Oake-" "hstronomers believe that every sighting of a flying saucer can be explained rationalily. We are quite in agreement that they can be explained rationally'. We are aware that some people think that
astronomers heve not sinarod in the thousands of "flying saucer" sightings made by competent observers in reoent years. For the reoord may I cite the following: on the nisht of July 8, 1954 o.t $9.30 \mathrm{pm}, \mathrm{kr}$, Harold H111, for 20 years member of Br 。Sat, Soc., reportsusing a $12^{\prime \prime}$ refleoting telescope with low-power eyepiece of 50 diameters and field of 35 minutes: "What was seen was as amazing as it was unexpeoted--there was a principal bright silvery objeot of indeterminate shape--1t was accompanied by what appeared to be minute stars of difforent degrees of magnitude $\theta_{0}$ from 15-20 in number. The whole scene gave the impression of great aotivity... it was utteriy unlike anythins I have over seen in the heavens."
The late Dro HoP。Wilkingma oonfirmed 'saucer skeptic' until the morning of Jume 11, 1954, travelling by air in UoS. ${ }^{\circ}$ sighted three unidentified aerial objectson" They looked exaotly like polished metal plates refleoting suninghto" Dr. Wilkins subsequentiy stated "If flying sauoers are solid flat structures, or olosed oontainers, space-ships or even aircraft. it is difficult to undorstand their apparent ability to hover and to attain speeds over 1000 MPH whthout any noise ooif they are solid objectz...THEN THEY MUST HAVE BEEN DEVISED AND ARE OPERSTED AND CONTROLLIED BY INTELLIGENCES SUPERIOR TO MAN. (oaps ours) The final item cited was Dro Clyde Tombaugh's experience, quote: "We may have seen a meteor-m-BU'T I HAVE NEVER SEIAN A METEOR UITH PORTHOLZS IN IT*"

The item concludes with a statement attributed to Graham odger: "Fiying sauoers are absolute nonsense..a" So 1t would seem that no one, not even sciontists can rightly claim to know overy thing.

SEEE RIGHT UP THERE！AH，YOU HISSED IT？

Since the public first began to receive flying soucer reports from volunteer witnesses a few years ago，a good many thousand objects heve been observed in the okies．These have taken the form of lights of various colors，of tangi－ ble vehicles described right down to their portholes with faces lookins out， or of misty apparitions．They have boen seen standing still in the heavens travelling at low altitude at slow spoeds，and zooming at tremendous heights and velocities up to that of iight．They have been completely ai－ lent，they have swished gently，they have whistled with the speed of their passage or rung 11ke bells． Their shapes have ransed from saucer－ like，oigar－like，bullet－1ike and diso－ 11ke，to spherical，cloud－shaped，tear－ drop－shaped and indeterminate． They have been colored orange，yellow， silver，wilite，red，grey，blue and flame。
They have been small enough to hold little men three feet in height，and large enough to hold a city office building．They fly singly and in groups．
KADE TO ORDE？
Obviously，they all have at least one thing in common．They obligingly adapt themselves to the taste and imaginative ablilty of the viewer．Soeing may not be believing；but believing is certain－ iy see1ng．
A number of books have been written on the subjoot of what have become known as unidentified flying objects．That term doesn＇t mean quite what it would seem to．
ismons the thousands of sightings whioh heve been reported and laboriously cheoked by U．S．or Canadian Air Force authorities，a comparatively fow have been found impossible to identify．For want of an explanation，these were dub－ bed UFOs，meaning it was not known what they were，if indeed they were anything at all．
That wes all the UFO bellevers needed． Now every sighting that cannot be iden－ tified as a plane，meteorologioal bal－ loon，cloud shadow，searchlight reflec－ tion，moon，star and all the innumera－ ble things which excite people＇s 1magi－ notion－thet is，every UFO，is taken to be a flying saucer and 1ts listing as a UFO by the authoritiog 9 s taken as their seknowledgement that some sort of suucer has seen sighted．

It＇s as logical as your sayins：＂I sax a woman downtown today but I don＇t know tho she was．＂And someone＇s answer：＂Then obviously it was your Aunt Emma。＂
A number of books have been written on the subject of UFOs，most of them in favc； only a few have been written in contra－ diation．Soientists as a class are usu－ ally busy with other things promising more achlevement．Their attitude seems to be that if you want to belleve that every－ body you don＇t recognize is Aunt Emma， then it＇s alright with them．Their attitude，in fact，is the exact opposite of the man who sald the other day that he＇s going to belleve he saw a fiying saucer until 1t＇s proved otherwise． It＇s not so excitins an attitude；of course，but 1 thaves a lot of wear and tear on the oredulity glands． One of the most ambitious books on saucer was written by an itinerant philosopher who retired to a cabin on a hill some－ where in Callformia．He had not only seen saucers，he had been taken aboard one．He saw one saucer take off from a desert location．But when he went back to get some of the sand that had been fused by the take－off jets，somebody had removed 1t．Tough luok．
He had alao obtained a piece of the won－ derful colored．cloth which the saucer people had worn．Unfortunately，this was stolen from him later on．Tragic． He knows that some of the saucer people are walking around amongst us today are watching and waiting．Unfortunately they are unidentified waiking objeots－－they resemble us so closely you can＇t tell them from people．Another sauoer fan was convinced that the USAF was hiding valuable evidence of a saucer landins． He demanded that they reveal all，but they took no notice．They should have， because he spoke with all the power and prestige of a newspaper editor．The mere fact that it wasn＇t a soientific paper， but a journal devoted to the doings of stage and vaudeville folk should not have detracted from his oase． That is one of the insidious things about the whole saucer－sighting business．The authorities are always getting stupen－ dous information about UFOs and hiding it away in secret files．
By now there must be whole basements full in Ottawa and Washington with Irrefutable evidence of sightings，landings，photo－ graphs，piecee of celestial oloth，fused sand，frasments of metal nover seen on earth，and other priceless treasures． （Concluded on Page 5，Col．2．）

THREE SHINY DISCS SIGHTMD ON FARM

Around 5.30 pm ．on October 23， 1959 ， three UFOs were sighted by K．L．Jonkins and $\mathrm{D}_{0} \mathrm{E}_{0}$ M111er，both of Bunker H111． Indiana．Jenkins first saw them over a patch of timber shortly after he had left the east end of a field，heading wost At the west end，the disce ils－ appeared．They were approx． 1 mile at their farthest point from Jenkins and a little over $\frac{1}{8}$ mile at the olosest point．They werent over 200 feet off the ground．They were also seen by Mil． Ier at the position marked＇$A$＇，when he noticed three bright iighta in the west， but pald little attention to themg thinking they were the exhausts of three jets heading west．He did remark that the light was unusually bright，like the refleotion of the sun off a metallio surface．
Jonkins noticed the obvious diso－shape at first and they appeared to be tiltod upward（see djugram II）。 The midale


Notioed more of underside，probably tilted slightily upward．
diso seemed to be eitior larger than the 2 outside discs or closer．The underside of the large disc appeared to be brighter than the top position． The two smaller dises had an all－over steady color，silvery appearance． As he watched them，the 3 objeats （alternately back and forth）levelled off and lay flat and then tilted up to their original position．The disos appeared to hover，except the large dise moved closer at one point and then moved back towards the west．None moved from their original positions to the north or south．There were no viaible pro－ trusions nor anything resembling land ing gear．Surfaces were smooth and no openings were visible．Jenkins was on a combine at the time and therefore could not deteot eny noise from the discs because of the sound of his own motor．The sky was olear and the sun had just gone below the borizon． （Credit：A．V．Sampsel，Bunker Hill．Ind。

A strange aerial phenomena，seen over Idaho and in Vyoming about the lat of February， 1960 was seen also by $W m$ o C． Lamb about 5 miles southwest of New－ castle，It rose straight up out of a cloudbank，the object，being about 400 feet long， 200 feet in diameter，dark red color and a yellow flame shot out of $1 t^{\prime}$ s rear for about 200 feet．It was visible e．bout 30 seconds then van－ ishod into the higher altitudes．It travelied about 1 mile per second． （Crodit：Wa，C．Lamb，Newcastle，Wyo．）

Joseph Whitney answers the question ＂Are flying seuoers an optical illusion？ In his newapaper colum MIRROR OF YOUR－
 paychologiat，believes that most unex－ plained flying asucors are after－imeges which appear after looking at a bright objeat such as the sun or a flash bulb。 He said eye－witness desoriptions of flying auoers could desaribe after－ image equally well．Size and speed of an after－1mage depend on 1ts distance； it will appear larger on a nearby wall than on far oloud but 1ts speed on the latter will outdistance a jet plane．（Vancouver Provo July 6／60）

iIIt could be the start of co-operation amons all governments of the vorld," he says. "If all governments woula pool their information on UFOs and voris in unison on this it would help to ease vorld tensions." stringfield, advertis ing manager for DuBois Chemicals, Inc., believes the UFOs are from outer space and that they are controlled by inteliligent beings who are observing earth. "I don't belleve there is any hostile intents" he sald. "I belleve they have bean using planets in our solar bystem for beres, even the moon. Astronomers for years have observed shifting spots on the moon." Stringrield said he believes U.S. Air Forge secret files contain evidence or "near evidenoe" that the objecta are from outer space, but that officials are afraid it would oause panio if released.
Foreign governments, too, have suah ovidence, he said, but are keoping it secret for the same reason. Stringfleld, who heads Cincinnati's Unidentified Flying Object Society, became interested in unidentified fiying objeots in 1945 while in the Air Force. He said he saw a formation of them from a bomber. since then he has served a,s a spotter : For the Air Defence Command, pubilshed a magazine about the objects, and writton a book on them.
