THE MOON ISN'T SO DEAD AFTER ALL


ITH two nations now committed to putting a man on the moon, it is interesting to find that recently there seem to be at least two authentic cases. where a certain amount of outgasing, or volcanic activty, has been observed on our satellite.
We had come to think of the lunar surface as a silent, dead world where nothing happens but the inevitable change from light to dark and from very high to very low temperatures, in a period of $291 / 2$ days. But new observations have changed the picture.
The latest word comes from the Lowell Observatory at Flagstinf. Arizona.
This observatory has long been famous for important discoveries, particularly in solar system astronomy.

## ERUPTIONS

Eruptions have been seen near the crater Aristarchus. This is lettered B on the accompanying drawing of the moon, shown approaching the last quarter, the present phase

Aristarchus is not difficult to locate as it is the brightest spot on the moon owing to some property of the local soil or rock.

The feature appears to the left of a very prominent crater, Copernicus C, and well below the semi-
circular R ainbow Bay. Sinus Iridum and the black crater Plato A.

This latest lunar activity was seert first on Nov. 27 when an eruption lasting 85 minutes was noted.

Three more, lasting about 20 minutes, were observed two nights later.

## PHOTOGRAPH

These observations from Lowell Observatory seem to support the announcement by the Soviet astronomer N. A. Kozyrev that he saw some type of bright vapor rising from the crater Alphonsus on Nov. 3, 1958. He actually took a photograph of the vapor's spectrum.

Alphonsus, $D$ in the drawing, is a fairly promlnent crater seen to the right of Copernicus. It is the centre of a row of three craters.

Other prominent features on the moon, as seen during the next few nights, are Tycho, F; Clavius, G, and Grimaldi, E, another black crater.

These new observations have not been achieved by chance.

They followed several years of careful and painstaking search, watching the lunar surface night after night.

## See Saucer, Sir?

Flying Saucar tive fashion, to provide a documentary film on som trange and atil not fully explained events which took place in the late forties and early fifties.

The narration is by former U.S. Air Force prew场formation officer who worked in the special Pentagen unit set up to deal with the flying saucer reports.

It is admitted at the outset that of the thousands of these reports which were investigated, about 80 per cent turned out to be hoaxes or phenomena which could be attributed to natural causes. But the remaining 20 per cent provided some baffling mysteries.

In the film, expert testimony is given that although still photos of flying saucers would be easy to fake in the darkroom by an amateur, movies would be difficult to treat in this way without elaborate equipment. It then shows two movie segments, taken by amateur photographers, which clearly show what appear to be glowing discs or balls speeding through the sky. One of these movies, taken in Utah, was made by a U.S. Na y acrial observer and photographer with 20 years of service.

It is also stated that on at least one occasion 14 of these objects were clearly observed hovering over Washington, D.C., both from investigating aircraft and os tho redar scopp of an airport control tower.

Mention is also made of the U.S. Air Force jet pilot who mysteriously crashed on the West Coast after reporting to the control tower that he had a strañe, disc-liRe flying object plainly in view and was closing in on it. This was his last communication with the grourd station.

Among the numerous trained observers who are ref-rred to in the film by a U.S. genarl as "credible" is an intine copten with years of experience who doacribes a huge object which flew with such terrific posd that it actually circled his creft while it was in flight.

Yet, such reports have ceased to appear. Is it becuuse a ctrange session of mass hallucination has finally died dnwn? Or does the absence of such reports indicate ther, for a period, such flighte I talre place and that thry, not mere hallucinations, have ceased?

## Scientists Studying 85-Pound Meteorite

Thirteen years after it blazed ficw ay across the Ontario sky, one of the largest meteorites over found in Canada is being sudied by University of Toronto ccientists.

The 85 -pound chunk of nickel and tron was found near Lake Manicoowabing last fall by Philip Johnson, a Parry Sound furniture maker and part-time prospector. Of the 25 meteorites known to have ben found in Canada only five are larger.

University officials belleve it is the remains of a fireball seen near Windsor in 1949. At that time its approximate path, plotted at the David Dunlap Observatory, led to the Parry Sound area.

Because of their hith metal content, meteorites are generally much heavier than a rock of comparable size. Mr. Johnson said he knew he had somesthing onusual when he tried to lift the rusty specimen, 12 inches long, nine incres wide and six inches deep.

When word of the find reached Professor P. A. Peach and D. H. Gorman of the university's geological sciences department they arranged its purchase through Prof. G. B. Langford, head of the department. Funds were donated by the Shell Oil Co. of Canada Ltd.

Becauge of their rarity, meteorites are considered to be worth a minimum of $\$ 100$. This would be for one about the size of a pea; the price goes up according to siize. They are recognizeable by thelr umusual weight, and a black fused surfice, often with dongated pitting.

Canada's largest meteorite is a 380 -pound giant from Alberta. It is owned by the university's Victoria College and is on display at the Rogal Ontarto Museum. Most larger meteorites, like the one which is believed to have caused the two-mile wide New Quebec Crater in Ungeve, explode when they strike the earth. No fragments of that one have ever been found.

# Intelligent Beings Exist on Millions of Planets 

 in Milky Way

New Iork, Jan. 23 - Intelligent belngs undoubtedly exist nn millions of planets in the Milky Way.

A $\$ 10,000,000$ program Involving 20 highly trained technical personnel for 30 years would make highly probable the detection of radio signals from one of these other races.

But two-way conversations between our planet and their: would thke millenia.

These staterents wer made today during a session on extraterrestrial intelligence at the 31 st annual meetings of the Institute of Aerospace Sciences.

Dr. Lloyd Motz of Columbia University's Rutherford observatory, said that most. sclentists take it for granted that life exjsts beyond the solar system, even though there is no direct evidence. He estimated that there in set $600,000,000$ planets in the Milky Way with life as wo know it.

Astronomers know that there are millions of stars similar to our sun in the Mulky Way, Prof. Motz said. Recent developments in the theory of stellar evolution, now confirmed by observation, show that all stars with the same general charac. teristics originated In pretty much the same way and have evolved through the same stages. When such stars are born a planetary system also arises.

Bigchemists have demonstrated that the complex organic molecules necessary to life are erethesised spontaneounly if phatcal and chemical conditions er richt, Prof. Motz said. This it must be coneluded that He in some form exists throughout most of the galas.

Prof. Motz eatimated the claxy contrins $200,000,000$ ctara similar to ous sun. "If we suppose that the stars we are considering have planetary systems like our own, we have, on the average, about three planets per star as abodes of an intollicont form of life.
"It is treo that in our solar system the earth appears to be the onl planet with a highly developed form of LIfe, but both Venus and Mnrs could support an fotalligent form of life undor elishtly altered conditions," be sald.
"We must therefore assignt

about three life-supporting planets to each star in accordance with the deta in our own. solar system.'

Dr. F. D. Drake of the U.S. National Radio Astronomy Observatory, sald scientists have now worked out the formula for calculating the optimum frequency for interstellar communication. Writing the formula on the blackboard, he said: "It is rather fascinating that this is one of the key equations in the galaxy."

What he meant was that any other intelligent beings whose civilizations had advanced far enough for them to have developed radio, would come up with the same formula, regardless of the state of their technology. For the formula lives a frequency which is dependent only on the limitations of the forces which bind molecules together, which are the same throughout the galaxy.

The formula gives an optimum frequency between 3.7 and 9.3 gigacycles (thousands of megacyclesh, Dr. Drake said. Seientists bnow how to use this frequency and could reach out to distancer of 1,000 ligha yeare to listen for otrual fron ther civilizations.

There are several million stare within this range.
It would not be simple to conduct such a search because com-
plex equipment and many manyears of effort would be aeeded, he said. But there would be a high probablity of succes with a $\$ 10,000,000$ capital expenditure on a program involving 20 tey men for 30 years.

Dr. Drake estimated there would be 1,000 light sears ithtrance between civilirations, so that radio stgnals would tate ' 1,000 yeare to reach us, traveling at the speed of Meht. Thersfore unless a ctvilieation existed les more than 2,000 years it would never rocelve an answer.

Dr. Drake said rockests semve: many useful purposes 1 ? 5 apace trivel within our solet oy tem, but the only thing w
across Interstallar space ins: formation. This must by radio or light waves bec osfreight by rocket mouid it tos expensive.

To gend the Rnciclonedia Britaninica to Alpha Cer suri, for example, woth - ngue a rocket with the por $-1,000$ battleships which wous gerate Florida upon launch, to send the Encyclopes y radio would cost only a carl a word.

Dr. Drake conducted the first short search for signals from other planets about two years ago. It was known as Project. Ozma, and listening was done on 21 centimetres - a wavelength not calculated by the new formula.

One of the biggest problems in receiving ather-world messages would be scanning all the stars from which one would likely originate, according to Dr. Bernard M. Oliver, vicepresident of research and development for Hewlett-Packard Co

Within a radius of $1,000 \mathrm{II} h \mathrm{~h}$ years from the earth there minht be $10,000,000$ stars, with 1,0u0,000 candidates amond them, suporting 1,000 races, ho said.

Many races which reached a high state of technology mighi have destroyed themselves with nuclear weapons, he suggested. But if they got over the hump and learned to prevent nuclear annihilation they probibly existed for a very long time.
Dr. Oliver said that if a 10 megawatt radio s! al could be generated at the proper frequancy, one symbol could be sent every second. Thus the sending rate would be slow, but there would be lots of tima be cause it would take a millen. lum for the signal to reach a distant star and another for an answer to return.

Complex codes could not be sent. It would have to be a bin. ary code, in which the atrol goes off and on. This would severely limit the informetlon that could be sent or recalred,

But, sild Dr. Drake, it woald be worth is 00,000 ectiatelco ally if we o:n could deteet the presence of another civitiations even if no information were obs tained about it.

My nelghbor Frisby's wife wants to know why if U.S. scientists are happy that the Venus shot went only 250,000 miles off course, he should get so mad because she missed the garage by six inches.

Frisby apart, many a man waits fascinated by the journey of the Mariner II. Since the decline and fall of the burlesque house, we have to get all the charge we can out of the chance to peer behind the veils of Venus. Hot dog. As says the song about Kansas City: "Theyve gone about as fur as they kin go."

The spacecraft will report its findings by radio impulse. Sort of a beeping Tom. It is scheduled to come within 10,000 miles of the provocative planet, which you chaps who have been to Paris will recognize as roughly eouivalent to the upper balcony of the Folies Bergere.

Success of the Venus shot depended on hurling the spacecraft towards the pinpoint in space where the plant will be during the second week of December. Hundreds of mathematicians worked on this problem of hitting the target. hut the actual launch was handled by Johnny Unitas. The Baltimore quarterback ensured that Mars would not intercept the long ball.

The primary mission of Mariner II will be to establish whether or not Venus is capable of suopnorting life. If the answer is "yes." another spacecraft will be despatched immediately. equipped to emnierce the plant with 50 cola signs and land at least one branch manager of a chartered U.S. bank.

To make things more interesting during the interval he. fore bets can be paid off T shall state that Mariner II will not onlv discover life on Venus hut will be directly resmonsible for ending life on Venus.
How this will happen is like this:

The Venusians are divided into these two power blocs, see. There are the Red Blobs, dom-
inating half the planet, and the Red-white-and blue Blobs, holding sway over the other half. There is also a smattering of minor Blobs - chartreuse, pol-ka-dot, paisley, etc., but they exert no real influence on the tide of events.

The two big opposing camps of Blobs hate and fear each other because the Red Blobs believe that a Blob should be all one color, whereas the Red-white-and-blue Blobs believe that being restricted to one color is tyranny, even though they must intermarry to preserve their stripes. "Better wed than Red" is their watchward.

As Mariner II approaches Venus, both sides are fully armed with devilish missiles capable of destroying all Blobs of whatever color. Their supersensitive antennae range the sky. alert to sneak attack.
Suddenly, there it is! A strange. unidentified craft orbitine Venus. seeking information rlassified as top secret by Blobs of both sides.
"It's not one of ours!" glub the Red Blobs.
"It's one of theirs!" glub the Red-white-an-blue Blobs.
And Venus dissolves in gigantic explosions
All the U.S.'s fault, you see, for not equipping Mariner II with a means of showing friendly intent - shoving out some beads and pipe tobacco or something. You mark my words.

## Moon surface green, black basaltic rock

## WIIBERT B. Sूयाँ THE PHILOSOPHY OF THE SAUCERS

Possibly one of the most interesting aspects of the study of flying saucers, beyond the realization that they are real and extraterrestrial, 18 their philosophy. What manner of creature build and fly them? What do they look like? How do they think? Are their 1deas and 1deals similar to ours? Could we understand them? All these and many other questions plague the serious investigator.

If we are to rely on sighting data alone we are bound to get a rather one-sided 1dea of these creatures. For example, we see saucers travelling at terrific speeds and then suddenly stop or change direction. Under our concepts of physics no creature of flesh, blood and bone could withstand the terrific forces which would be associated with such actions. Therefore, we are likely to assume that the Saucerlans must be elther some manner of robot or a creature the like of which we have never encountered.

## IF TABLES REVERSED

Again, it is hard to understand why any race of creatures having the tremendous power at their disposal which we see demonstrated by the saucers, should be content to fly rather almlessly over our globe, without doing something more definite. If the tables were reversed, we most certainly would. After a very brief reconnaissance we would land and announce to the natives that we were taking over, The fact that the Saucerians have made no such move appears to indicate that they must regard us in the same general category as the other flora and fauna native to this planet, and to them our civilization is so primitive as to be indistinguishable from that of the lower animals and insects.

We could go on speculating in this manner for quite a while without coming anywhere near the truth. Fortunately the people who come to us
from elsewhere in flying saucers have been fit to make contact with people of earth, and to impart as much information and understanding as the contacts were capable of assimilating or passing along to others. There have been many published instances of contacts between these people from outside and people of earth, and a very great many more which have not been published. As is always the case in any now and romantic field, there are those who exaggerate, but it is not too difficult to establish that the vast majority are honest and authentic. For ingtance, when a dozen or so independent contacts having no common connection, and each alone believing that he or she has been favored above all others to recelve this message, all tell the same message, even to names and descriptions which tally perfectly, one has little choice but to belleve thet they are telling the truth.
MAGNIFICENT PHILOSOPHY
Furthermore, when the material given to us through the many channels is all assembled and analysed, it adds up to a complete and elegant philosophy which makes our efforts sound like the beating of jungle drums. These people tell us of a magnificent Cosmic Plan, of which we are a part, which transcends the lifetime of a single person or a nation, or a civilization, or even a planet or solar system. We are not merely told that there 18 something beyond our immediate experience; we are told what it 1s, why it 1s, and our relation thereto. Many of our most vexing problems are solved with a few words; at least we are told of the solutions if we have the understanding and fortitude to apply them. We are told of the inadequacies of our science and we have been given the basic grounding for a new science which is at once simpler and yet more embracing than the mathematical monstrosity which we have conjured up. We have been told of a way of life which is utopian beyond our dreams, and the means of obtaining 1t. Can it be that such a self-consistant, magnificent philosophy is the figment of the imaginations of a number of misguided morons? I do not think so. (Con't. on next page)

If the only evidence we had was philosophical, we might justifiably suspect 1t, but when coupled with the reality of the observations, thousands of then, we cannot dismiss it so easily. This is especially true when we consider that the science which has been passed to us from these people from elsewhere explains in a manner which we have been quite unable to do why the saucers behave as they do, and how 1t 18 that they can do things which to us are virtually impossible. The science and the performance check perfectly!

Again, we have been told where our scientific 1deas are wrong, or inadequate, and experiments have been suggested and carried out, and in every case the alien science has been vindicated.

## YOU CANNOT MAKE HIM DRINE

We may ask, if all this is known, why has it not been publicized, why are not these me.tters being studied instead of atom bombs? The answer: it has been publicized. Books have been written and hundreds and thousands of coples sold. There are available many periodicals containing this material which may be had for quite a nominal sum. Reports have been prepared by serious investigators and presented "through proper channels." But it is truly said that one can lead a horse to water but one cannot make him drink: Those who are in control of our society are satisfied with it the way it is and will resist any attempt to change anything which is likely to disturb the equanimity of their lives. There are those who can't be bothered to get the facts and make up their own minds; they would rather dismiss the whole matter as nonsense, because someone who holds their respect says it is nonsense. There are those who fear for thelr social securlty, and will therefore have no part of anything which might place it in jeopardy. There are those who say our science works and gives us many things which we would not otherwise have. What is wrong with that? Why discard 1t? There are probably as many private reasons for not facing up to the facts as there are people sho reluse to do so. Howerer, it is con-
soling to realize that, through the humble and often criticized comic strip and science fiction stories, the younger generation is being conditioned to accept the reality of people from else. where, and when given the opportunity to do so avidly assimilate all they can get on flying saucers and the people who fly them.

## THE FUTURE

The question may well be asked, what of the future? This question has been posed many times, and to the people from outside. The answer: we don't know for sure but we are aware of trends. We ourselves are also aware of trends, but consider 1r. $b$ our limited means for gathering data we must of necessity do a vastly infecior job of predicting events. Our experience has been that when they choose to do so, the people from outside can be quite accurate in their predictions. We may summarize the entire flying saucer picture as follows. We have arrived at a time in our development when we must make a final choice between right and wrong. The people from elsewhere are much concerned about the choice which we wlll make, partly because it will have its repercussions on them and partly because we are their blood brothers and are truly concerned with our welfare. There is a cosmic law against interfering in the affairs of others, so they are not allowed to help us directly even though they could easily do so. We must make our own choice of our own free will. Present trends indicate a series of events which may require the help of these people and they stand by ready and willing to render that help. In fact, they have already helped us a great deal, along lines which do not interfere with our freedom of choice. In time, when certain events have transpired, and we are so oriented that we can accept these people from elsewhere, they will meet us freely on the common ground of mutual understanding and trust, and we w1ll be able to learn from them and bring about the Golden Age all men everywhere desire deep within their hearts

Tom Robbins Interviews ROBERTIR

wHEN a Boise businessman landed his private plane on June 24, 1947, to report excitedly that he had seen nine "saucerlike" things flying in and out of the high peaks around Mount Rainier, he added a new phrase to the world's vocabulary and a new dimension to Rohert J. Gribble's life.

Saucers are Gribble's cup of tea.
Actually, he prefers the term "unidentified flying, objects." "Flying saucers are identified with the screwballs," he explained. Gribble is sober and scientific in his approach to the mysteries of space.

Fifteen years ago, if amone hat asked Gribble, "How are things?". he would have answered, "Looking up." He was an amateur astronomer who spent a lot of time with his nose in the air. Today, he is so busy evaluating the things others see in the sky, he seldom has time for a squint at the stars.

AS A DIRECTOR of the National Investigations Commission on Aeriial Phenomena, he is a one-man dataprocessing center. When not attending to earthbound tasks with the Seattle Fire Department he constantly is analyzing the material on U. F. O.'s that
overflows from five filling eabinets at his Findlay Street home.

Because of their relationthip to astronomy, the first outbreak of "flying saucer" reports in 1947 gripped Gribble's imagination. It was ten years later that he really "saw the light."

It was a "huge glowing light" that moved across the sky at high speed and appeared just to miss a passing air liner. He and two companions were camping near Auburn, observing a new comet, when the object suddenly appeared above them.

At that moment, Gribble's interest in U. F. O.'s lost its academic aura. "It was my first sighting and naturally I was excited," he said, "but It was the one this year that really shook me up."

On July 31, 1962, at 10: 45 o'clock at night, Gribble walked out into his front yard on a now-forgotten errand. The conditioned reflexes of a long - time stargazer were in operation; he glanced up at the heavens. "There was a white light in the western sky," he said, "At first it was sharply defined, but seconds later it flared up. It was very brilliant. I thought a plane had exploded, but it continued across the sky. In less than 20 seconds, it had assumed its original shape and disappeared.'

GRIBBLE had not seen the light alone. It was viewed by weather obearvers and from the control tower at Seattle-Tacoma International Airport, as well as by hundreds of private citizens. It was sighted from Seattle south to Medford, Ore. The Weather Bureau reported that, in three Northwestern cities, the object caused a mysterious momentary change in barometric pressure.
"I stood out there and couldn't believe what I was seeing," Gribble said. "I went in and told my wife, 'Now I know how the others feel.'

If he had any doubts about how the "others" felt, Gribble had only to check his files. He began collecting data on "flying saucers" soon after the Idaho pilot coined the phrase. He subscribed to a New York news-clipping service and founded a magazine about U. F. O's.

By 1955, he was the recognized saucer expert in this area and was interviewed on television. For days after the program, Gribble, the fireman, answered the bell. "Everyone from serious scientists to first-class nuts tele phoned me," he said.
ELYING-SAUCER reports had an immediate attraction for fourth-dimension metaphysicians, do-it-yourself devil worshipers and California cultists. Interested engineers and scientists seldom voice their opinions for fear of being grouped with the Los Angelesstyle loonies.
"In this field we have the 'saucerites' and the 'ufologists'," Gribble said. "We ufologists limit our activities to research and analysis. The saucerites will believe anything they hear, no evidence needed. They carry fantastic stories from place to place and unfortunately, they are the ones the press plays up. The so-called Spacearama encampment at Marysville in August was saucerite and the tales that came out of there about trips to Mars and 350 -pound Venusian dogs speak for themselves."

Does Gribble believe that any earthling ever has had intimate contact with the crew of an unidentified flying object? "With the exception of one man in Brazil, there is considerable doubt in my mind," he said.
"That man is a renowned university professor and a devout Roman Catholic. He has a high station in life, a spotless reputation. For nearly a year after his experience, he would not talk about it. Finally, a close friend coaxed him into reporting it to the government.
"The professor claimed that a spaceship landed near him on $\sigma$ deserted beach. Its crew communicated with him telepathically, then took him for a short ride. The Brazilian government paid rapt attention to the professor's report and the president of his university repeatedly vouched for his integ. rity.
"I've come to believe a lot of things I used to think incredible. I'm not so quick to doubt anymore. But most of the contact reports, as we call them, are nothing but a third-rate science fiction. And I pay little attention to science fiction, I'm too busy."

W
ITH MORE than 100 sources feeding him data from around the globe, Gribble is busy indeed.
"I analyze each report that comes in," ho said. "How thoroughly I investigate depends on the spectacularity of the sighting and the qualifications of the witnesses." If the witness is a professional pilot or has a scientific background, Gribble will usually contact him personally.

Each sighting is plotted on a map (pins sprout in profusion from the Seattle area, where there are consistently two sightings a month). Then, before the report is placed in his chronological files, Gribble subjects it to a series of tests. "What we are looking for are common, systematic patterns of behavior," he said. Like Madison Avenue admen, the ufologists track down trends.
"For example, we tried to learn if there is a tie between U. F. O.'s and sonic booms. Sonic booms were common long before jets, you know.
"We've found somewhat of a correlation between U. F. O. sightings and disasters. They quite often are seen before or after earthquakes. And there are several dozen cases where U. F. O.'s were seen in areas where aircraft accidents took place.
"When Mars comes in on a close approach to earth, there is a definite Increase in sightings.- In ive7, when we had our most spectacular 'flap condition' (a period of numerous sightings), Venus was very close.
"Sightings are heaviest in industrial areas and around military installations, but they're often reported from remote regions."

G
RIBBLE paused and when he spoke again, his voice had an ominous ring. "The sightings of U. F. O.'s began soon after we began to test nuclear weapons." He looked at the floor. "This could have something to do with it, but I cannot say that it does."

The rieightening of international tensions, however, has no jamming effect on saucer traffic.

Gribble feels so strongly that there is "something to" U. F. O's that he has devoted all of his free time for 15 years to the study of them. What exactly does he think there IS "to them?"

Gribble, a tall, lanky man with close-cropped dark hair and heavylidded brown eyes, looked across the room at Gloria, his wife, and cocked an ear toward the cacophony upstairs where his five children were preparing for bed. He was slow to answer, but when he did it was without doubt.

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"I am convinced that they are interplanetary," he said.
"There is a mountain of evidence to prove it. The government has more information than I, but they won't release it. Our leaders believe that if the public were told the truth about U. F. O's, there would be a mass panic.
"The persons behind the censorship appear to hope that if they can prevent the public from taking interest, spaceships may forget about us and go home.
"The people should demand information. I have faith in them. If we can keep the street-corner fanatics off of their apple boxes, I don't think many average persons would panic. The sad part of this thing is, America is missing a real bet. If we could establish contact with these beings, who undoubtably are thousands of years ahead of us, it would be of great benefit to the free world.
"The fact that they have shown no deliberate hostility must mean they don't want to take us over. They have more fear of us than we of them. The Air Force admits that its planes have fired on U. F. O.'s. Whenever one has appeared on our radar screens, as they did in the widely publicized events around Washington, D. C., in 1953, our warplanes have gone up after them. In the past few years, they have restricted their activity to darkness, and when they come in low, they are very low .... below our radar."

Since so many of the reported U. F. O. sightings have come from pilots and law-enforcement officers, Gribble feels that it would be relatively easy to contact our benevolent brothers in space.

THERE should be a standard recognition signal," he suggested. "lf they hear the same signal each time they approach one of our planes or radio cars, they will soon realize we are trying to communicate.
"During the 1957 'flap condition', they made mass attempts to communicate with us. All over the world, strange signals were heard on the same frequency."

Gribble will not speculate on the outcome of the U. F. O. question. He has no more theories to offer. He will just go on investıgating - objectively, he hopes. He finds it increasingly difficult to scoff, even at tales of little green men.
"After all," he said, "if one believes in evolution, four arms are not impossible."

It is possible to leave Robert Gribble's chartroom unconvinced that we have cousins in the cosmos. But after two hours of conversation with Seattle's sincere saucer man, one can never look at the sky quite the same way again

Gribble saids "Hundreds of top scientists are concerned about U. F. O.'s, but they stay far in the background. Conversely, the crackpots are quicle in speak up and THEY get the headilises."

## THIISTY <br> SAUCRS

 ByWilllam Gryzik

The great flying saucer hunt of 1960, over Lake Michigan, went off as scheduled in October of 1960. It was spurred by eyewitness accounts of unidentifled flying objects setting down in Lake Michigan north-east of Chicago, and at the Guantanamo Bay, Cuba. "Spacecraft, commonly called flying sacers, are using underwater as a rendezvous place," explains John Otto, Chicago patent engineer and space onthusiast.

A group of 75 members of the Great Lakes Identified Flying Objects Assoc., armed with special electronics apparatus, set out from Waukegan aboard flshing tugs in a serious attempt to make contact with such craft.

The group, led by Norman Jack Maynard of Waukegan, was sparked into action by a chief petty officer from Great Lakes Naval Training Center, Charles V. Dillon, who observed "the phenomenon" in Cuba first hand.

Dillon, 36, an 18 year veteran, made public his experience for the lst time at a meeting of Maynard's group in Waukegan.

He said he was in charge of a watch at Guantanamo Bay on July 21, 1959, when he and h1s men observed "an orange glow" on a hillside. He sa1d they approached close enough to observe "two large orange things, like eyes" but he advised his men to go no closer.
"I investigated $1 t$ myself the next day," he sald. "There were no hoor marks or any other tracing of animals on the ground whatsoever, but the grass was bent down like something slid over 1t, right down the slope into the ocean. It was like if you take a huge dishpan, about seven feet wide, and just slid it into the ocean."

D1llon sa1d h1s 1mpression, subjoctively speaking, was that the ground impression was caused by a UFO. It came from somewhare else, as far as I 2 m concerned. Where, I don't know, the universe 18 very large. I believe it came frod another world."

Maynard, who claims about 50 positive sightings, sald he has observed

UFO over Lake Michigan for 6 years.
"On Christmas Eve of 1954, I saw an object come up from the lake and go off into space so clearly that I oven saw the spray from 1t," he told the UFO group.
"My latest sighting was a fow weeks ago while driving along the toll way. I saw a cigar-shaped craft, very large....you could oven see the nort holes...going down into the lak."

The results of the "Flying Saucer Hunt" were not released...and two attempts to contact the group by ma1l, were without reply. The last. I reard the group had disbanded.

In the past few years ther ere many reports of alrcraft...that emed to have van1shed into the lake. No debris or ollslicks were ever found. But more baffllng, no reports of any alrcraft as belng reported missing. On February 13, 1963, a hellcopter from Glenview Navai A1r Station and a Coast Guard cutter, the Raritan, searched Lake Michigan off Evanston at dawn after a Northwestern University student reported seeing what appeared to be flares and then an explosion on the lake. All the operators of the cutter and helicopter could find in the area were a small fishing vessel and a Sinclair 011 Co. tanker, both of which reported nothing was wrong.

On another occasion, a glowing ball of flame that seemingly disappeared 1 n Lake Michigan was sighted by many Chicagoans on the night of Apr1l 2l, 1963. It is belleved to have been a large meteor.

While along about the same time a shock wave was felt in a three state area. Was it an airplane crush? A meteor? Experts were baffled by a mysterious shock wave that was felt in various sections of the M1dwest, including parts of Illino1s, Kentucky and Oh1o.

The unexplained blast, about 7:30 pm , was especially strong on Ch1cago's far southeast side and in the Indiana suburbs. Because of the wide-spread reports, authorities were undecided whether more than one di turbance occurred, or if all queries stemmed from the same incident.

Sgt. Wm Kacak of Whiting police said he was nearly "knocked out of my cha1r." (Con't. on noxt page)

Scores of residents reported rattling windows and other seeming shock wave offects.

Once unconfirmed rumor was that the shock was caused by the dumping of slag into Lake Michigan near the Indiana industrial area. 011 refinery of ficials said they knew of no explosion. The Air Force sald the shock may have been caused by a meteor that passed over about the time the shock wave effects were felt.

A report from Canton, Ill., Fulton County, that an airplane plummeted in a "ball of fire" into a strip mine area apparently proved false.

A report that a plane has gone down on June 25, 1963, in Lake Michigan had a happy ending, so the report goes.

The alarm set the police department, fire dept., Navy and Coast Guard into a flurry of activity. But no plane was found, and officials were able to mark the report erroneous.

The excitement started when a phone call came into the Central Police Station from Victor Walters, 61, of 1207 W. Jarris. Walters told a police dispatcher he has been watching a plane through binoculars from his third-floor apartment. The plane went down into the mist hovering over the lake and did not come back up, he sald.

Walters sald the plane, which he estimated was several miles out over the lake, appeared to be a 4-engine jet.

Four police boats, three Coast Guard cutters and several private boats raced to the scene. A helicopter was also dispatched...after more than an hour, in which not even an oll slick was found, the search was called off. Tower operators at O'Hare Alrport and Meigs Field said none of their planes was missing. Similar reports came from Glenview and from Bunker Hill Alr Force Base at Peru, Indiana.

Many so called "sonic booms" have startled Chicagoans in the past few yrs. Some were explained as those caused by alrcraft breaking the sound barrier... others still remain a mystery. The "red glow" sometime seen in the southern part of Chicago...are explained away as "reflections from steel mills in Gary, Ind." The blue flash, seen mostly in winter months also remains a mystery. Its origin seems to be from the south of the city. Is Chicago and surrounding area, including Lake Michigan, host to the curiousity of the UFO???

THE STRANGE CASE OF DR. M.K. JESSUF
Gray Barker in h1s introduction to th1s book says "Th1s book does not attempt to unravel the mystery of the researcher's unfortunate passing. Instead, it is content with presenting a great many facts, along with some speculation."
One of the oddest things to have happened was a specially marked-up copy of h1s book "The Case for the UFO", called the Varo edition, which was known in government circles, including the military. The Allende Letters indicated much secret knowledge, incluaing the Navy ship that dematerialized while experimenting with Einstein's Unified Field Theory. The men would appear and disappear at the oddest times ending up insane sooner or later. The new data presented in this book should be in everyones 11 brary who earnestly is seeking out every facet of the flying saucer mystery. ## A UFO LEAVES MANY MARKS

Mrs. Claire Ducau has a farm in Cerons, France. July 17 t a and 18 th , 1958, M.Jean Marthiens and her other farmhands mow and harvest some or her hay. Saturday moming, July 29th they return to finisin the job. "What happened here?" they thought as they walk through the field. The thing wasn't there when they left Friday night. Right there in front of them 18 a strenge 35-ioot o1rcle with a periectily clear edge.

In view of these and many more extraordinary marks Mres. Ducau judges that this is so serious sine must call upon the mayor to inveatigate. Unfortunately he is abseint. So she wastes no time and calls in the mayor of a noighboring town, Barsac. His name is Jean Bernadet and he happens to be an engineer. He and many other weli qualified people and in autiority rush to the spot to investigate thoroughly and get scientific, objective, firsthand information while the scene is still fresh. Here are the detalis as published mainly by OURANUS, July 1961, a magazine about the ufo edited by Harc Thirouin who is assisted especially by Jimm Guieu and Aime Michol.

Inside tho amazing above-mentioned circle are three others, and all four are concentric. In the center, common to all, is an efg-shaped zono, which is approximately 16 inches by 8. In this contrel and Well defined area covering roughly 1 square foot, the grass has been completely pulied out and the so11 1 s presued hard in such a way that the oval is inclined downward in the direction of the longer axis. Closer examination reveala small ridges in 1t. At the higher end of the oval, i.e. in tho conter of the circles tinere is a lovely conical hole, 3.9 inches wide and 4.8 inches doep.

The edge of each circle is constituted by a clear end well bounded croinn about 2.3 inches wide. The grass in the three inner crowns is pressed clockwise and covered. with soil-dust. But, the grasi in the outermost crown 1a clipped at about an inch from the ground. Betweon the crowns, however, thengrass is normal.
with dew on it as elsewhere in the meadow.

Moreover, on tine third arom counting from the center, there are about 50 littile holes or depressions about 2.5 inches wide and approximetely $3 / 4$ inch deep. They are all regularly spaced about 15 inches apart.

A fow armchair pundits explained away the whole mystery with a few strokes of the pen spelling out: HOAX. These savants, of courge, did not duplicate the "hoax" because they simply can't do it if they take into consideration ALL THE FACTS With their circumstances.

On the other hand, the abovemerstionsd qualified investigators, tho made a long and complate, on-tho-spot-check with the things and people concerned, agreed that sometime during the night of July 18 29 th an aircraft with a circuiar

Howaver, it 's entirely probable that someone has seen it, eithor local residerts or autoists on the much travelied and, nearby hicinway Number 113. Perheps for fear of ridioule or losing thoix job or any of several probuble reaw sons, they won't telk.

However, when one puts together the colossal amount of very reliable information gathered in this particular case and in the bundred of thousands of ufo-cases over the globe, from time ammemorial especialIy since the last winter of World Var II, 1944-45, one is bound to conclude that a ufo did at Cerons What so many others did elsewhere, the only difference boing thet this tine, no one, as far as we know, saw it come and/or go. THE UFO AND THE 3-4-5 RELATIONSHIP OF RIGHT-ANGLE TRIANGLES

By Kenneth Larson
This is a discussion of an interesting article written by Dr. Dan Q. Posin in the September, 1963 1ssue of SAUCERS. SPACE \& SCIENCE. The title of the article was "Can We Commun1cate W1th Distant Planets?". The article concermed the possibility of communication between inhabited planets in the galaxy. Dr. Posin suggested that intelligent beings in nearby solar systems might utilize an elementary, introductory type of communication pattern. He sald: "Perhaps many solar systems have planets sending out such elementary contactestablishing pulses right now... pulses that by your count would find to be grouped in this way: 9-12-15, 12-16-20." Posin elaborates on the 3-4-5 relationship of right-angle triangles, so that if one makes the square of 3 by 3,4 by, 4 , and 5 by 5 , the areas of the first two squares together add up to the area of the third square. For example, $3 \times 3$ equals $9,4 \times 4$ equals 16 and $5 \times 5$ equals 25. Thus, 25 equals 9 plus 16. An intelligent race, he suggests, might use these simple mathematical patterns for communication between worlds.

Commencing in January, 1960, I started a technical analysis of certain unusual UFO reports over the American continent between 1896 and the present time. These UFO reports involved geographical features such as mountains, lakes, harbors, coastlines, etc. At the conclusion of this analysis...an analysis involving mathematics, geometrical designs, maps and literary research of UFO reports... I had come to the reasoned conclusion that these UFO reports indicated a mathematical, pre-determined long-range and scientific program of operations. This program involved the mathematical design of the USA West Coast and of the Planet Earth by a Designer. Furthermore, these UFO reports seemed to be closely connected to the record of the Old and the New Testaments, the Dead Sea Scrolls caves the Rosetta Stone site, the Book of Mormon plates, the Great Pyramid de-
sign and location, the first atomic test site, and the concept of extraterrestrial life. Basically, there appear to be regular or equal units of measurements between certain outstanding UFO reports on the American West Coast. These UFO reports extend from 1896 to the present year....but the most important UFO dates and sites appear to be as follows:
(1) San Francisco, California:

11-24-1896 and 1-18-1961
(2) Red Bluff, California:

11-24-1896 and 8-13-1960
(3) Los Angeles, California:

2-25-1942
(4) Mount Rainier, Washington: 6-24-1947
(5) Salt Lake, Utah: 7-2-1952 (also Wash1ngton, D.C.)
(6) Levelland, Texas; White Sands, N.M. Salton Sea, California: 11-3 and 4-1957
(7) Red Bluff, California: 8-13-1960
(8) Salton Sea, California: 4-11-1963
These UFO report sites have been plotted on a standard Ilbrary map follo of the western USA. They appear to be positioned in such a way that the sites become part of a mathematical and geometrical design. This mathematical design is the chief feature of the plan and side views of the Great Pyramid of Gizeh in ancient Egypt. The plan view is shaped like a square, with the apex or top-stone In the center of the square. The Great Pyramid 1s approximately 481 ft. bigh and 755 feet long at the base. It was flrst forced open by the Arabs In 820 A.D. ...after being constructed around 2600 B.C. The Arabs dug into the side of the pyramid and discovered an ascending passage (which had been blocked or hidden from view for thousands of fyears by a granite block) leading up to the King's Chamber. This King's Chamber was of a high degree of perfection in design. It reportedly contained only an empty red granite coffer. This coffer did not have a lid or any inscriptions. The Great Pyramid was the world's first ancient Wonder...and it 18 the only remaining First Wonder. Professor $C$. Plazzi Smyth of Scotland and David Davidson, the first an astronomer and
the latter an engineer, concluded that the Great Pyramid contained highly technical mathematical designs and a graphical message addressed by the designer to a future race of the Planet Earth. They concluded that the designer of the Great Pyramid was also the designer of the Planet Earth. The technical drawing portrays the UFO reports between 1896 and the present. The mathematical units are based on a basic un1t of 68.1818 miles. These mathematical units appear to involve the 3-4-5, 6-8-10 and 9-12-15 relationships of rightangle triangles. In other words, these geometrical relationships were superimposed over the western USA land surface...s so that these UFO report sites and year-dates become a logical part of the mathematical design. These UFO reports and the mathematical design make clear the intelligent design of the USA West Coast and other geographical features. They also involve the diameter and circumference values of the circle... known as p1 (1:3.14159). P1azz1 Smyth pointed out in his book OUR INHERITANCE IN THE GREAT PYRAMID that the p1 factor was designed into the Great Pyramid. The height of 481 feet and the base of 755 feet become part of the pattern: 1:3.14159::481:755x2. The top drawing shows the areas of the squares. The area of the largest square (25) is equal to the sums of the smaller two squares ( 9 plus 16). Other ratios are 6-8-10 and 9-12-15. These relationships appear to become a mathematical part of the bottom drawing. The USA West Coast is to the left, and North is at the top. The seven Levelland, Texas, UFO's of 11-3-1957 appeared at point 8-A (lower right-hand corner). Point B is 11 units west of Levelland. Since each unit is 68.1818 miles long, this distance of $A$ to $B$ equals 750 miles. At point $B$, a vertical ine extends north to point G. This point represents the site of the Great Pyramid on a map of ancient Egypt...except that the USA West Coast Quadrant of the Circle (or quarter-circle) faces west instead of north as at the Nile Delta.

Point C represents the 9 UFO at
Mt. Rainier, Wash., on 6-24-1947
(count the sixtis unit northwest from

Salt Lake). Point D represents the San Francisco UFO of 11-24-1896 and 1-18-1961. Point E indicates the Red Bluff UFO of 11-24-1896 and 8-13-1960. Point $H$ represents the Salt Lake UFO's of 7-2-1952. Notice the five-year intervals between 1942-1947-1952-1957 and the 10-year intersal between 19471957. Point J representis the Los Angeles UFO's of 2-25-1942. The angle B-A-C equals 45 degrees. Levelland $1 s$ 8 units of 95.45 miles each southeast. from Salt Lake (H). Mount Rainier 1s 6 units northwest of Salt Lake....so Mount Rainier is 14 units northwest of Levelland. Point H (Salt Lake) would also correspond to the Great Pyramid site. The 3-4-5, 6-8-10 and 9-12-15 patterms can be applied to the Levelland-Salt Lake-Mt.Rainier straight line. Levelland would become point 8 of the 6-8-10 pattern ... as would Salt Lake. Mt. Rainier becomes part of the same patterm. Note that the square 3-3-3-3 is centered on Salt Lake. This square has an area of 9. In the same manner, the square 4-4-4-4 has an area of 16 , and the square 5-5-5-5 has an area of 25 .

The circle is centered on Point $G$, and the radius extends from $G$ to $C$ (Mt. Rainier). Notice how the circle extends from Mt. Rainier through points 3 and 3 of the $3-3-3-3$ square. These points 3 and 3 (when multiplied) form the area of 9. In the same way, larger circles... When centered on $G$ ...cut through points 4 and 4,5 and 5 ! eto. This oan be continued on so as to form the areas of larger, explodedview squares.

The dotted curves point to the patterms of 3-4-5, 6-8-10 and 9-12-15. These patterns extend along the diagonal lines of the square 10-10-10-10. This square forms the plan view of the Great Pyramid of Gizeh, with the cen-. ter at Salt Lake. In the same way, square 8-8-8-8 forms the Great Pyramid plan view. Thus, Levelland (point 8) becomes a comer-socket of the Great Pyramid plan view. It is interesting to note that the Salton Sea (at point B) 1 s about 755 miles west of Levelland (point A). The Great Pyramid base length equals 755 feet....and this would equal one foot to each mile. On ll-3-1957, the seven UFO's appoared at point A. Then, on 11-4-1957, a

flashing UFO appeared at the Salton Sea and blinked a powerful white light eight times in succession. Notice that the Salton Sea $1 s 11$ units west of Levelland...and this accounts for the ll-4 date. Levelland is 11 units east...so we have the 11-3 date. The interesting point is that on 4-11-1963, another UFO appeared at the Salton Sea and blinked a powerful blue light 7-8-9-10 times in success10n. NOTICE HOW 11-4. AND 4-11 CAN BE INTERCHANGED. The Salton Sea is 4 units east of point 7 in the lower left-hand corner...so that the salton Sea site 1s both 11-4 and 4-11 (1957 and 1963).

The straight line extending from Mount Rainier (C) to $E$ and D forms an angle of 76 degrees $17^{\circ}$ with the Levelland-Salton Sea base Ine. The apex angle of the Great Pyramid 10 also 76 degrees $17^{\prime}$. The angle B-A-E equals 26 degrees $18^{\prime} 10$. This angle is found within the Great Pyramid, since it is the angle of slope of the Grand Gallery leading up to the King's Chamber. The King's Chamber is on the 50th level of the Great Pyramid and it is 19 ft . high. It has 7 stones in the top 5th layer of stones in the walls. Notice how 19-50-5-7 becomes part of the Levelland-Salton Sea UFO dates of 11-3-1957. Another Great Pyramid researcher...Morton Edgar... pointed out that the ange extending from the Great Pyramid to Bethlehem (the birthplace of Jesus Christ) and along the latitude 30 North line also forms the angle of 26 degrees $18^{\prime} 10^{\prime \prime}$.
"In that day shall there be an altar
to the LORD in the midet of the land
of Egypt, and a pillar at the border thereof to the LORD." (Isaiah 19:19) "Where wast thou when I la1d the foundations of the earth? declare, if thou hast understanding. Who hath laid the measures thereof, if thou knowest? or who has stretched the Ine upon it? Whereupon are the foundations thereof fastened? or who laid the cornerstone thereof? When the morning stars sang together, and all the sons of God shouted for joy?" (Job 38:4-7). "Who hath measured the waters in the hollow of h 1 s hand, and meted out heaven with the span, and comprehended the dust of the earth in a measure... (Isa1ah 40:12 KJV)

Seeing the Invisible -(Conclusion) seemed to live in the sky as though that element was it's natural habitat. At the center of the arc in the lighted areas was a smaller brighter spot of blue (scout craft). But bear in mind nothing was real brilliant but rather etheral and that is as close as I can come to describing the lighted section of the object. It seemed to cut a swathe through the sky or perhaps a better word, atmosphere.

The object was real and yet a quality of unreality or etheral... hard to explain."

This huge craft which suddenly appeared above me, without a sound as if it had emerged from the invisible world taking on matter, so as to become visible long enough to be photographed. I also experienced the same feelings that Mr. Watson had when he witnessed the object. One felt that th1s object knew without a doubt it was on a definite mission. You knew that it knew where it was going, what it was doing and above all why 1t was doing it, and for what good reason!

One more word of caution---don't read it alone in the house.. "they" may be observing you as their next victim, and your calls for help would go unnoticed. ## UFO REPORT BY GEORGE D. FAWCETT

Worldwide skies in 1963 were flooded by reports of renewed flurries of sightings of UFOs.

Mr. George D. Fawoett of Easton, Pa., UFO investigator for the past almost 17 years, stated that these sightings of strange, mysterious unknown flying objects are increasing and have been for many years a ser1ous worldwide problem. A documented 128-page "UFO EVIDENCE REPORT" to be published by NICAP in Washington, D.C., in 1964 will prove UFO censorship and reallty and spark probable 'open hearings' in Congress.
"The U.S. Air Force policy is to continue to deny the existence of UFOs on one hand and to openly tell credible witnesses not to talk about them on the other", stated Fawcett. The record of a few of the many UFO encounters in 1963 indicates a real and a serious problem. Let's take a close look at some of them.....

Jan. 26, 1963--Livron, France. Two farm workers sald they saw a luminous object in the sky yesterday for 30 seconds. It appeared round and flat and revolved in the skies.

Feb.16, 1963--Willow Grove, Australia. Dairy farmer Charlie Brew reported a 'thick disc' that frightened his horse and herd of cows into panic. Brew described the object as "battleship grey" in color with a band of glass or plastic around its circumference and a number of protrusions which looked like scoops.

March 9. 1963--Crystal Lake, Montana. Mr. AmOs B1ggs spotted a "strange contraption" that hovered and landed on frozen Crystal Lake. It was silver in color, saucer-shaped on the bottom with a slight oval compartment at the top. It stayed on the lake for around 10 minutes, during which time a door was seen to open and to shut. with no one getting on or off the object. When the door closed the object took off with a slight buzzing sound.

April 23, 1963--Hurohoro Bluffs, N.z. Alwyn Green heard a "real weird swish, whooshing no1se" and saw something like a round black sphere coming to-
wards h1m. It then stopped, momentarily, then took off with a loud swish.
May 12, 1963--Oncativo, Argentina. Yolanda and Mirlam Curas of Cordoba saw an elongated brilliant object with streaks of green, red and yellow cross their car road at high speed ahead of them. Later they noticed the strange object sitting beside the road, "a reddish hut-shaped thing" with windows or portholes evident.

May 19, 1963--Lake M1ch1gan. Rev. Father R. Dean Johnson and his wife saw a huge circular object with two rows of square lighted windows near a road. They estimated that the object was about 80 feet wide and 15 feet high and around 200 feet above ground.

June 21, 1963--Ch1cago, Ill. An object with five small individual lights or windows, spinning like a top and in tight circies was observed by M1ss Janice McKay and her friend Paul. They both reported sharp manoeurres by the object.

June 25, 1963--Quincy, Mass. Reporter Richard Pothier of the Quincy PatriotLedger took a time exposure photograph of an orange and white-lighted UFO using a tripod mounted 35 mm camera. Dozens of sightings that night were reported from all over the state of Massachusetts of a similar object like the one photographed.

July 20, 1963-- Califormia. At 7 a.m. Bob Renaud got two snapshots of a saucer with a dome on 1ts top by using an inexpensive Ansco Ploneer camera on Kodak 620 Pan F1lm.

July 26, 1963--Edinburgh, Scotland. Mr. J.G. Ben Oddotte, a student at Edinburgh University watched "an object with a flat base and a round top", silvery-blue with a rotating base for 3 minutes. It was like a saucer with a cup on top and upside down.

July 31, 1963--Philadelphia, Pa., Numerous Philadelphians reported a strange reddish UFO with a "flashing red and white light" and a red tail that hovered over Philadelphia for a long period of time. The object was also seen by observers at the Tower
of the Philadelphia International Alrport and radar contacts were made by both the International and McGuire A1r Force Base, New Jersey. Three UFOs were picked up by the radar shack at the International Alrport and were later confirmed by visual sightings by the Tower. Pllots confirmed the sightings from the air and radarscope photographs were taken from the ground. The UFOs manoeuvred with a series of twists, turns and loops.

August 5, 1963--Fairfield, Illino1s. Ronnie Austin and his date Phyllis Bruce reported a UFO that pursued Austin's car for almost an hour. The orange-lighted UFO came within 100 ft of his car and appeared to be the size of an auto. His radio went wild with static on his car and his motor sputtered, as his car raced at 120 mph. Austin was place under sedation.

September 17, 1963--Copley, Oh1o. Mr. E.J. Diehl, Fire Insurance Inspector of the Ohio Inspection Bureau sighted two brilliant hovering UFOs in the N.E. sky at 11:30 pm. One took off West, stopped and hovered again. The other took off East and disappeared rapidly over the horizon.

September 26, 1963--Sunnyvale, Cal1f. A disc with a small off-center bright spot was seen at $4: 15$ am to $4: 20$ am by observers in scattered locations. Police officer Galen Anderson described a straight line flight, a sudden turn and an edgewise view during his 45 second observation.

October 4, 2963-- East Hartland, Conn. state Rep. L.B. Martin sighted a triangular UFO at about 1:00 pm. The UFO sped over at an estimated $2,000 \mathrm{mph}$ and trailed a fire-like exhaust. Martin said the detalls were sharp, including a row of black dots near its forward edge. The object flew with the base of the triangle forward.

November 12. 1963--Port Huron, Mich. Deputy Sheriffs Robert Baker and Merle Clark at 5:15 am, chased a lowflying UFO at speeds up to 75 mph . At times it seemed to have a big divided window on 1t, Baker said. It flashed a red light and moved away to the N.W. making a motor-like sound.

Many area residents reported a similar object on the same night.

November 20, 1963--Neche, North Dakota. Two high school girls reported that a bright orange oval-shaped object circled their car at night while thej were enroute home. The girls, Nita Kain and Cheryl Kelm, were driving on Hwy. 55 east of town when they first saw the UFO. It appeared to be surrounded by a light haze. The glowing object sped across in front of the car and circied around the gide before disappearing to the southeast.

December 2. 1963--Grand Rap1ds, M1ch. A motorist stopped at a traffic light about 9:30 am. noticed a strange object "glittering in the sun." Mrs. Wayne Elllott reported that, as she watched, the UFO tipped up on edge (showing that it was a disc) and quickly sped away to the southeast. She described it as looking "like a pancake".

In the meantime, 1964 continues to see increased sightings, pllot pursuits, radar trackings, photographs \& movies, background radiation increases, electro magnetic interference reports, landings and near-landings, angel hair falla and fragments. 1964 should open a 'new era' of serious UFO investigation.
