WORLD-WIDE UFO REPORTS PROMPT CONCERN AT UNITED NATIONS

UNITED NATIONS, N.Y. — Secretary General U Thant has been personally concerned with the rise in reports of Unidentified Flying Objects around the world, says a reliable UN source.

During 1966, U Thant held a series of private conferences with leading American UFO authorities, including Dr. J. Allen Hynek, an astronomer with the Dearborn Observatory and long-time UFO consultant for the U.S. Air Force; John G. Fuller, author of two best-selling books on the "flying saucer" phenomenon; and Gordon Evans, an engineer and civilian UFO investigator.

Full details of these 90-minute discussions have not been revealed, however.

Special Study

For the past several months, a small group within the UN has been quietly studying the thousands of reports of "flying saucers" from reliable observers in almost every country. A UN directive channels all UFO information to this group, the Outer Space Committee.

The committee was established to study the problems of international law in space. UFO-chasing is just a sideline. All of the leading "flying saucer" magazines, newsletters, and other publications are subscribed to and reviewed by this committee.

Delegates from many nations—particularly those from Africa—are reportedly alarmed by the sharp increase in the reported appearances of unidentified cir-

cular flying objects over their towns and villages. Some of the delegates have privately complained that they believe the objects must be "spy craft" from the United States or the Soviet Union.

Kept Secret

Publicly, however, the UN officials prefer to remain silent on the "flying saucer" issue, and skepticism among many delegates will probably prevent an open discussion of the subject on the floor of the UN, the source said.

Nevertheless, interest in UFOs remains high in the "glass menagerie" on the Hudson. In September 1966, the "secretariat news", an organ circulated to UN employees, devoted several pages to UFO pictures and a discussion of "What are they? Where do they come from? What are they doing here?"

Ralph Rankow, a leading UFO photo analyst, recently addressed a large group of UN employees and delegates and hopefully suggested that the UN might one day look into the mystery on a large scale.

Maybe somebody heard him—for on Nov. 22, 1966, a large number of UN employees—including eight members of the American Newspaper Publishers Association—watched what they described as "a bright cushion-shaped object" as it hovered directly over the river next to the UN building and then slowly rose and disappeared southward.

40,000 watch for UFOs

LONDON

Flying saucers observed the 20th anniversary of their first sighting by turning out in force over Britain Saturday night.

Five unidentified objects (UFOs) were photographed doing "gyrations and extraordinary manoeuvres" near Manchester airport. And the patience of the London branch of the International Sky Scouts, which organized a round-the-world watch by some 40,000 persons in 23 countries, was rewarded when 15 people saw a cigar-shaped object cruising in the sky a few miles east of the capital.

Mysterious Objects Sighted

BUENOS AIRES, Argentina (Reuters)—Visitors from outer space took a good look at South America during the weekend, judging by the local newspapers.

Flying saucer watchers in Argentina, southern Brazil and Paraguay reported entire squadrons of mysterious objects zoomed through the skies.

Argentinian watchers reported a squadron of unidentified flying objects sighted in six provinces Saturday night. Flying at speeds up to 3,700 miles an hour, they were sighted by residents, pilots and airport control towers.

In Paraguay, at about the same time, six objects flying noiselessly in formation were sighted over the capital, Asuncion, for about 10 minutes. The airport said communications were completely disrupted while the UFOs were overhead.

FLYING SAUCER REPORT KILLED, SAYS SCIENTIST

WASHINGTON—The Central Intelligence Agency persuaded the U.S. government 14 years ago to debunk flying saucers, according to an Arizona scientist.

Dr. James MacDonald said the CIA acted in the purported interests of national security because it feared saucers might have been developed by a hostile foreign power.

But, although this theory has been discarded, the CIA's proposal "to reduce public interest in flying saucers" has been continued.

Dr. MacDonald, a senior physicist at the University of Arizona's Institute of Atmospheric Physics, told the American Society of Newspaper Editors Saturday that the CIA wanted time to study the hostile-saucer theory.

However, the embarrassed government has refused to declassify the since-discredited study of Unidentified Flying Objects, MacDonald said.

He explained he had by accident been allowed to study the secret Air Force report.

Calling for a full congressional inquiry into UFOs, MacDonald said the Air Force had "superficially and incompetently" handled the UFO problem in its Project Blue Book.

USAF Major Hector Quintanilla, in charge of the project, appeared on the same panel to dispute MacDonald's views.

The officer said Blue Book's conclusions were: "No unidentified flying object reported, investigated and evaluated by the Air Force has ever given any indication of threat to our national security."

COVER PHOTO - YOUNG MAN SUCCEEDS IN PHOTOGRAPHING A UFO

For the first time in our region, a photo of a flying saucer was taken. A young man of Cap-de-la-Madeleine, Quebec, photographed on Wednesday night, a display of this sort which passed over the Madeleine area.

The mysterious object had been seen about 7:15 p.m. when the young man was about to make a test drive with his new car. The object was inspecting a dirt road between Grandmont Blvd. and Rue des Veterans. The observer had time to take 2 photos before the saucer disappeared, while hovering for 20 seconds. He was alone at the time when he saw the machine, but a neighbor was said to have heard a whizzing about this time. The saucer was the size of a family dwelling or of an ordinary cottage. SAW 6-LEGGED OBJECT LAND, BOY, 12, SAYS

The object made a whirring sound as it spun toward the earth. It was more than five feet tall and about three feet in diameter, dark in the centre with flashing green and white lights. That's what 12-year-old Brian Dorscht of Kitchener, Ont. said he saw land on the lawn of the National Grocers Co. Ltd. premises, Wednesday night.

Brian said six legs appeared when the object was about four feet above the ground. It landed and the whirring ceased. Brian was frightened and started to run home. He looked back and the object was gone. Police later found six two-inch circular imprints in a circle of about two feet in diameter. Another imprint was found in the centre of the circle. Brian, his two sisters and mother later saw a triangular-shaped object with flashing red and green lights fly over the same area.

Mrs. Frederick Rolufs, said she saw three objects fly over in a perfect triangle formation. The lights were too far apart to be an airliner. All the sightings took place between 9 and 10 p.m. (Kitchener-Waterloo Record, April 27, 1967)

PULSATING LIGHT BRIGHTENED AREA

8:45 p.m. 1967, Easter Sunday, Mr. & Mrs. John Dick of Altona, Man. & Mrs. W. Buhr was being driven back to her home in Gretna. Suddenly the landscape changed from dark to a bright pink light. Mr. Dick's foot hit the brake pedal. "Look, a spaceship!" someone cries out. There, above them, almost low enough to touch, just above the hydro wires next to the highway, they see an ominously black object almost on fire with the brilliant pink light coming from a window extending around the ship. It hovers there, slowly moving away from them and rising higher as it moves. The light rhythmically flashes on and off every few seconds, and after the 4th pulsation of light, it vanishes.

Mrs. Dick didn't say anything for some days as she thought that no one would believe them. "I felt like someone was watching me from that thing up there," Mrs. Dick recalled. "I wondered what kind of beings could occupy that craft." The sighting took place about two miles south of Altona near three radio transmitter towers. Another car drove by at the time of the sighting, and Menno Giesbrecht, the driver said he saw a light that appeared to be going down "like a meteorite" but it was fantastically brilliant." Previous sightings were reported in the Red River Valley. (Altona Red River Valley Echo, Man. April 19, 1967)

FLYING SAUCER CHASES PLANE

An airliner carrying 52 passengers from Piura, Peru to Lima, the pilot noticed a dart-shaped object about 70 metres in diameter and emanating changing colors take a position directly above the control cabin & at the same time, was joined by another UFO from above. 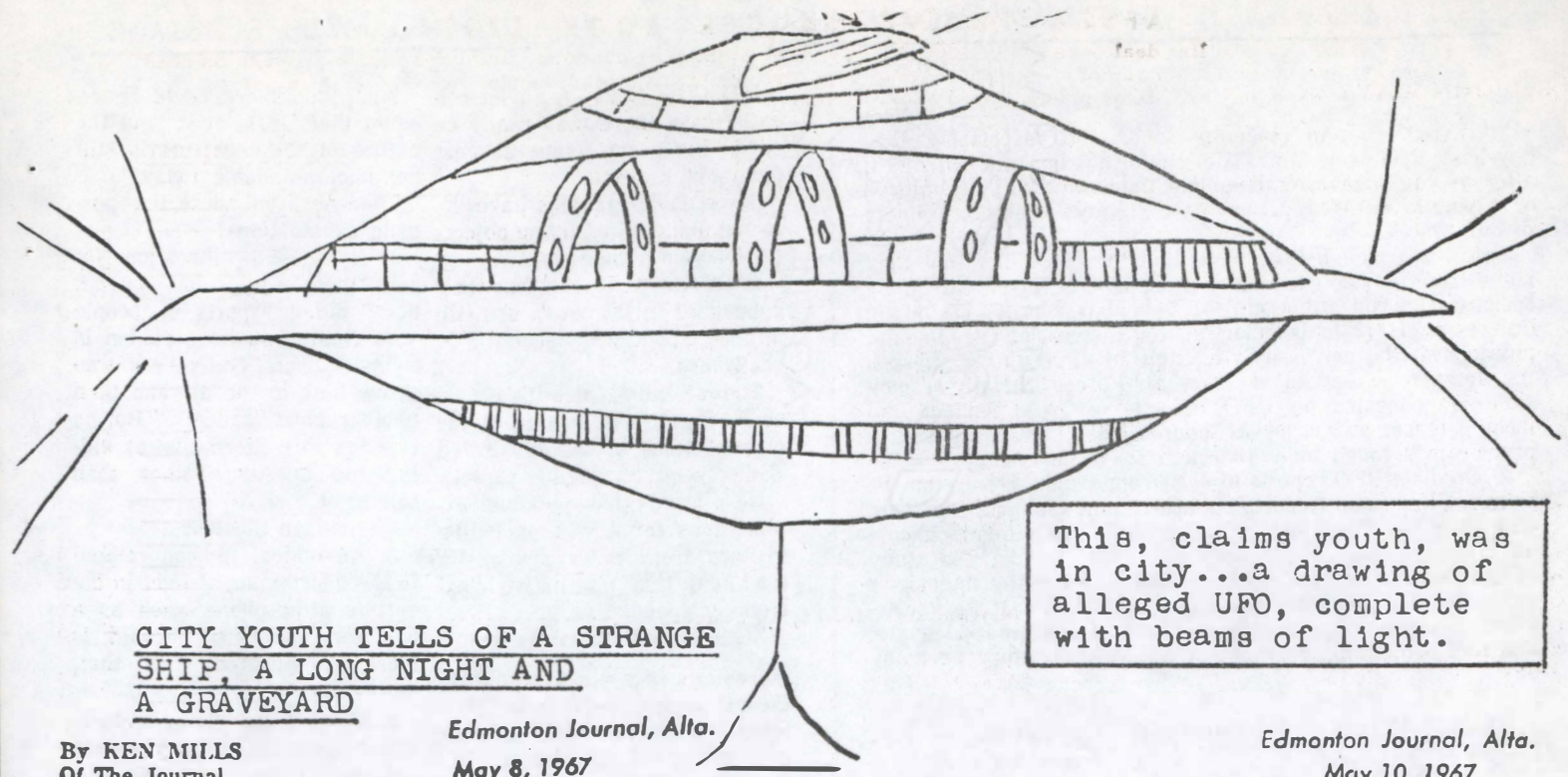

CITY YOUTH TELLS OF A STRANGE SHIP, A LONG NIGHT AND A GRAVEYARD

An alleged four-hour surveillance of an unidentified flying object began shortly after 2 a.m. Sunday for Ricky Banyard.

The bespectacled 14-year-old was just going to his home at 5311 106th St., when he said he noticed the "space ship" and began the vigil which has probably resulted in the most detailed report of any UFO in the Edmonton area.

He said he noticed a white beamed light moving over the neighborhood and followed it for several blocks.

"It disappeared over the Alendale district and I went home again.

"When I reached the front doorstep the second time, I saw it again and went and told my friend, Glenn Coates.

"Then we got some binoculars and watched it for a while.

"When Glenn had to go home, I watched for a while longer and then followed it into the cemetery."

Ricky lives across the street from Mount Pleasant Cemetery where he said the closer observations and strange happenings occurred.

"I hid under some trees for quite a while. I don't know how long it was but it was long enough to get wet with dew.

"It had a white ribbon of light coming down from the bottom of it. The ship was about 200 feet up in the air and it made sort of a muffled whistling noise as it hovered.

"I was about 50 feet away

from the thread of light and the ground was white, as though white hot, under it.

"The beam came straight down and then spread out in kind of a rectangular shape about six inches above the ground.

"When I stepped out from under the trees for a better look, the light disappeared then there was kind of a screaming noise like a jet starting up.

"All the lights in the ship went out and there were about seven or eight bangs and it took off."

Observations of the cemetery later Sunday revealed several rectangular-shaped black streaks along the sand-gravel roads in the cemetery.

There were several cinder-like rocks in these "burned" areas and pebbles appeared to be charred.

None of the grass areas or trees appeared to have been "harmed."

Joseph Laforge, foreman of the cemetery, said today he could not explain the black marks.

A grader went over the roads on Saturday, he said, and may have exposed some of the cinder base under the gravel.

"But these ones here," he said pointing to two other large black marks, "I don't know about them. . . they look pretty unusual."

Mr. Laforge had no explanation for the black marks on the stones.

"I don't know. . . We don't use oil on the roads at all," he said.

A sample of the rock has been sent to the Alberta Research Council for analysis.

Ricky described the "ship" as spherical with red and green lights. The top and bottom portions spun.

"I could see it quite plainly because it was almost daylight when it took off."

Ricky sketched his observation and showed the sketch to several other people who saw either the "ship" or the light beam. All five agreed that was what the object resembled.

EDMONTON UFO SHOWS UP AGAIN

Edmonton's shy UFO showed up again Tuesday night.

It was seen by a middle-aged couple living in the same area as Ricky Banyard, 14, who claims he watched an unidentified flying object for four hours Sunday morning around Mount Pleasant cemetery.

A description given by the couple Tuesday night fitted that given earlier by Ricky.

"Don't use my name," the woman said. "People will be calling me and accusing me of being a kook."

The couple said the object had red and blue flashing lights on its edges and a bright white light coming down from underneath. It seemed to be only about two blocks away and some 500 feet high.

When the woman called The Journal, the object moved away towards the west. Five minutes later it reappeared, she said, but vanished again while a second call to The Journal was being placed.

A Journal cameraman on the spot kept watch for some time but the UFO wouldn't come back to have its picture taken.

Other city residents have called The Journal since Monday, corroborating Ricky Banyard's story.

But Tuesday night, neither the weather office nor Air Traffic Control could give any information on the UFO, and nothing unusual had been noticed on radar.

UFO SIGHTED

The Mercury heard of one report of a UFO being sighted near the Champlain Airfield Saturday night.

Mrs. Ann Luecke, who along with her husband and several other members of the RCAFA Wing spent the evening at the airfield in preparation for the air show Sunday stated she saw what looked like a star going steadily across the sky while sitting outside of the office at the airfield.

Two UFO's were also sighted over the weekend in the Ottawa area.

LONDON — An evidently sober and responsible U.S. physicist, Professor James McDonald, has become convinced, after a year of investigation, that unidentified flying objects, or "flying saucers," represent "the greatest scientific problem of our time."

He has concluded, he says, that the possibility that they come from outside the earth "must now be given extremely serious scientific attention." McDonald is a professor in the University of Arizona's department of meteorology, and senior physicist at the university's institute of atmospheric physics.

He accuses the United States Air Force, officially responsible for checking on UFO reports, of gross neglect and incompetence, and urges a Congressional investigation as a prelude to a much more thorough scientific inquiry.

"Credible UFO reports of close-range sightings are on the increase," he says. Reports published in newspapers represent only "the tip of an iceberg." Scientific and official ridicule have made many people keep quiet. But his detailed study of sightings on record, he says, backed by many interviews with witnesses concerned, have convinced him that the "scientific explanations" commonly proffered are totally inadequate, and that something quite out of the ordinary must be going on.

★ ★ ★

McDonald started his investigations by delving into the files of project bluebook, the U.S. Air Force office at Wright-Patterson Air Force Base, Ohio, which handles UFO reports. This office, in fact, consists of three men, a major, a sergeant and a secretary, and is run as "an extremely low priority project," one among 200 projects of the base's "foreign technology division."

Nevertheless, the office frequently issues authoritative sounding "scientific explanations" of UFO sightings. In fact, says McDonald, these are often scientifically "outrageous."

Project Bluebook has had the effect of setting back serious scientific study of UFO's by many years. McDonald alleges, the U.S. Air Force has become convinced by its own propaganda, while scientists have been led to believe that UFO reports were being effectively checked and shown to be generally due to natural phenomena. Although many saucer addicts believe there is a vast official conspiracy to hush up the "truth" about UFO's (in which they often believe newspapers are implicated), McDonald says that "the big cover-up is really just a big foul-up."

★ ★ ★

He traces the foul-up back to 1953, when a committee of five eminent scientists, the Robertson Panel, spent two days studying a small group of UFO reports, and concluded that there was no evidence they were "artifacts of a hostile foreign power." The result, McDonald says, was that a recommendation was attached to the panel's report, deriving from the central intelligence agency but never fully made public, urging a systematic "debunking of the flying saucers" in order to "reduce public interest in them."

The "UFO" at first appeared to be a bright star that moved from Saskatoon Mountain west towards Window Mountain, and then disappeared.

MOSCOW (AP)—A Soviet scientist says there may really be such things as flying saucers from outer space.

Soviet radar screens have detected unidentified flying objects for 20 years, he says.

But Soviet scientists, like their colleagues in the West, are still puzzled about what such UFOs really are.

The scientist, identified only as F. Zigel, was writing in the current issue of the illustrated Soviet youth magazine, *Cmena*.

He offered five possible explanations for UFOs, including visitors from outer space. He called this alternative "extremely speculative."

Zigel was identified as one of the editors of a book, *Inhabited Cosmos*, being prepared for publication here. The book will discuss the possibility of living beings in space and efforts to communicate with them.

In his magazine article, Zigel said the *Angel Echo*, a UFO detected by radar, is constantly observed by scientists at the Central Aerological Observatory near Moscow.

Global sightings

Similar observations, he said, have been made in the United States, Australia, India and Japan.

He rejected the idea that birds, insects or plant seeds could cause such reactions on radar screens.

Zigel said there could be no doubt that UFOs exist "but the nature of these objects is still not understandable today."

Then he listed these five possible explanations:

1. Nonsense or invention. He said there was some untruth here, citing reports of people who claimed to have ridden in flying saucers and others who threw hats in the air and then photographed "saucers." But he rejected this alternative as killing the question rather than solving it.

An illusion?

2. An optical illusion related to the distribution of light in the earth's atmosphere, such as a rainbow. The UFO, he said, is more complicated than that, however.

3. A new secret flying apparatus of one of the military powers on earth. "No one holds this view now," he said.

4. An unknown phenomena of nature, just as radioactivity was unknown until the end of the last century. In this context, ionized particles and charged particles of dust in the atmosphere were given as a possible explanation. But, Zigel said, this does not explain the color or manoeuvrability of UFOs or their appearance in good weather.

5. Space ships from an advanced civilization on another planet. Zigel said the speed of UFOs supports this theory. So does what he called "the fact" that no UFOs were ever reliably reported to have landed.

Zigel called for "an all-sided, thorough, scientific exploration" to clear up the origin of UFOs once and for all.

Interviews with several of the persons who looked at the hat-shaped object, confirm that the object seemed to be a saucer with a loaf- or dome-like structure sitting in the saucer. The edge of the saucer protruded out beyond the loaf-like top and was ringed with red and green lights. Every once in a while a vertical shaft appeared to come down out of the bottom of the saucer and this shaft seemed to be a bright white light. The object appeared to remain absolutely still, and then would roll and appear to rock.

Reports also indicate that horses and dogs, owned by persons in

the area, appeared to be very nervous over something during the time that the "UFO" was spotted.

CANADIAN REPORTS

UFO SIGHTED AT CLIMAX - Several teenagers of Climax, Saskatchewan, were witnesses to a UFO Sunday night, February 12 just in the western outskirts of Climax. Dennis Nerada and Donald Gardner tried to follow the large ball of light which had a saucer shape, with their cars. After chasing the thing for some distance, the light changed direction and headed in a southwesterly direction. The object was reported hovering about the height of the elevators at or near the garbage dump, and then followed highway 46 west until it moved southerly. The light was reported as being bright orange, similar to a large rising harvest moon. (The Leader Weekly News, Sask. March 2, 1967)

THAT OLD UFO PAYS CITY ANOTHER VISIT - Prince George, B.C. had another UFO hover over it again on Thursday, March 2, 1967 at 7:30 p.m. It was described as mushroom-shaped, big, bright, and surrounded by an orange light. Mrs. Jon George and family watched a strange bright object moving across the southern part of the sky for 20 minutes before it disappeared. The weather office discounted the possibility it could have been a weather balloon. No signal was picked up on the RCAF Baldy Hughes Station's radar screen. (Source: Prince George Citizen, B.C. March 3, 1967)

UFO OVER ALDERGROVE - On the evening of March 2, at about 7:45 p.m., a bright light was sighted low in the southern sky by a teen-aged resident of Ross Road, Aldergrove. As the girl walked in a northly direction, she saw the light was moving too, and when she reached home, the light was in the western sky. Borrowing a neighbor's binoculars, the girl, her mother and the neighbor observed the light up closer. All three described the object as being disc-shaped, with alternating glows of color, mostly blue and red. The disc jumped and flew in the sky, as if performing. Suddenly it stopped and remained stationary. After a lapse of perhaps 15 minutes, the object started moving back and forth, then it disappeared with no warning at all. Other persons in the area also reported the phenomenon. (The Star, Central Fraser Valley, Aldergrove, B.C. March 7, 1967)

ANOTHER 'FLYING SAUCER' - Up in Port McNeill, B.C., Mrs. Peter Flick, while visiting friends, first spotted an object travelling from Port Hardy to Port McNeill in the vicinity of the bay. It looked like a star travelling in a straight line, then it turned left and right. Suddenly it became very large and bright, white on top, blue on bottom and took on an oval shape and appeared to have a tail. It disappeared and reappeared approximately 6 times, once appearing a bright red. (Source: The Upper Islander, Campbell River, B.C. March 8, 1967)

FLYING SAUCERS SEEN BY FISHERMEN AT PLEVNA - Two young men from Kingston, Ont. who scoffed at the idea of flying saucers are now ready to admit they are a reality, after the experience they had on Sunday night, March 5. They had come down from Mackie Lake to the village, to bring Ray McInnes home from fishing and on their way back saw strange lights near the Walker Ohlman farm towards the Lucky Lake region. They were going in by snowmobile, so stopped and watched the object, go up and down several times, hover over the field, and move around. They had a very good look at it and are convinced they saw a flying saucer. After it left they went on to their camp, and one chap was quoted as saying, "Their hair was still standing straight up when they got back." (The Tweed News, Ont. March 8, 1967)

POWER FAILURE COVERS WIDE AREA - The power failed in the area of Waterloo and taking in all of the Eastern Townships served by Hydro-Quebec. Cause of the interruption under study by Hydro engineers is believed to have originated at the sub-station at Magog and was due to failure of a piece of transmission equipment. Reports of a UFO from the Narrows area, have not been substantiated. (Source: Rock Island Stanstead Journal, Quebec, March 9, 1967)

STRANGE OBJECT IN SKY AT WASAGA - When Bud Steinhoff of this community opened the back door of his restaurant late one night recently, he was amazed to see a strange object in the sky. With quickness of thought, he grabbed his camera and snapped a picture, which definitely shows a white object, with splashes of red and blue at top and bottom. (Midland & Penetang Free Press Herald, Ont. March 10, 1967)

Your editor and his wife visited the Steinhoff's and unfortunately were unable to see the photo, as Mr. Steinhoff had it in a bank vault for safekeeping. He has been bothered by a number of persons about the photo and wishes to forget the incident.

'HELMET, SAUCER' SPOTTED FLYING OVER CITY - In Hamilton, Ont. a 15-yr old boy, Sheldon Wilson, spotted an object shaped like a First World War helmet, around 300 feet wide, hovering over highway 403 west of the city at 8:05 p.m. the night of March 10. The disc swooped up over the escarpment and vanished. Two other boys, Peter Sutton and Hans Witolla, said they saw an elongated object, saucer-shaped, moving slowly over the new Education Centre building also at the same time. The downtown saucer moved slowly back and forth between Hess and James streets, maintaining an altitude of around 200 feet. The boys put the size of the UFO at a little bigger than a car. The saucer vanished over the city's west end belching ragged streams of blue exhaust. Both reports had something in common. Both had red flashing lights on top. Saucers with red lights were reported over west end Hamilton by more than 20 witnesses about 4 weeks earlier. Those UFOs moved slowly over the Chedoke Golf Course area, then took off in the direction of Toronto (The Hamilton Spectator, Ont. March 11, 1967)

REPORTS SEEING UFO - A Dyer's Bay resident along with a neighbor saw a bright moving object Saturday night, March 8 at different places. The neighbor lives about a mile away. It had several lights and looked about 8 feet long. It would hover, then move very swiftly. Again on March 15, another neighbor and his family saw apparently the same object. It was not too far above the trees. (Owen Sound Sun Times, Ont. March 21, 1967)

C.N.T. FIND NO TRACE OF UFOs. - A spokesman for the Canadian National Telecommunications microwave dept. told The News that because of the reports of UFOs seen in the vicinity of 2 microwave sites there had been a routine examination of these areas and that nothing unusual had been found, neither to the equipment or any marks in the snow in the surrounding area. The microwave site at Summit Lake has an electronic checking system and any movement outside or inside the area is recorded on their machinery. No unusual recordings were noted. He added that a small light which would be visible from the Alaska highway had been fitted to the door of the building at the site recently. The News received a further report of UFOs sighted this time by a crew working on the Liard Dam project near the Liard River. The team, who is employed by Canadian Longyear told a local pilot that they watched an object in the sky for some time. (Fort Nelson News, B.C., March 22, 1967)

THAT UFO WAS JUST OLD VENUS - At 8:50 p.m. Friday, Victoria artist and art critic Mrs. Ina Unthoff was listening to her radio and heard an American announcer say a UFO was reported over Seattle. Mrs. Unthoff picked up her binoculars and began scanning the sky over southwest Victoria and spotted an object she later described as "five green lights in a row above a strong red light."

By Sunday, there were UFO reports coming in from Oregon, Idaho, Washington and northward. In Vancouver, photographer Ross Kenward, was near International Airport when he stopped his car and took a picture of a bright object in the sky. By Sunday night, the RCAF at Comox, the Dominion Astrophysical Observatory at Victoria and the USAF had all agreed it was the planet Venus. (Vancouver Sun, B.C. Mar. 27, 1967)

SKY OBJECTS STILL DEFY EXPLANATION - Victorians are still in the dark about mysterious illuminated objects which were reported floating across the sky in the past few days. The army, navy and air force could not shed any light on the mystery. Several persons reported seeing colored and white flares in the sky over Gordon Head, Saxe Point and Ten Mile Point. The planet Venus was discounted this time and so were military manoeuvres. (Victoria Times, B.C. Mar. 29, 1967)

YOUTHS SPOT UFO - On April 1st, police were called to the scene about 8 p.m. to the 900 block Laurel Street. They were told that an orange disc "no more than about three feet in diameter" had hovered for about three minutes at a height of some 60 feet above the ground. The apparent sighting occurred in the rear of a home owned by Dr. J.S. Kennedy. His 14-year old son Blaine told police the object ejected an orange flame, travelled up at a high speed then hovered at about 200 feet before speeding away. The object was first seen by Terry Bradley, age 12. Deputy police chief Peter Mehan commented that no other local sighting has been as well documented by witnesses. (Source: The Columbian, New Westminster, B.C. April 3, 1967)

SCORES REPORT UFO ZOOMING OVER MALTON - A flashing red and white UFO was reported by scores of people to radio stations and newspapers on Monday, April 3. Toronto International Airport officials said they had calls and the control tower staff had been aware there was some object in the vicinity but it had not been any danger to aircraft. They would not say what it was. Later identified as an American Airlines plane by CAPIC, a Scarborough UFO club, this did not explain the many other sightings all across the eastern part of Ontario and extending into Quebec. (Source: Toronto Daily Star, Apr. 4, 1967)

OBJECT MYSTIFIES VIEWERS - An object in the sky over the western section of Saint John, N.B. remains a mystery to weather officials and the persons who saw it. Sheila Tonner saw a "round brightly lit object at about 9:30 p.m. It changed from a reddish color to white and then green, and then repeated the color rotation. "It was stationary for about 5 to 10 minutes," she said, "and then sank in the sky. I judged it to be over the Martinon, Westfield area. It dimmed as it went down and eventually went out." Miss Tonner was with her parents at the time. (Evening Times Globe, Saint John, N.B. Apr. 4, 1967)

MYSTERY 'ROCKET' SPOTTED OVER KITCHENER, WATERLOO - A bright light heading south over the twin city was spotted by two residents at 6:30 pm. Tuesday. It was pink at first, changing to green and turned into a ball which disappeared. Mr. Donald McDonald said the color appeared in streams, like a firecracker trail during his 5-second observation. (Source: Kitchener-Waterloo Record, Ont. April 5, 1967)

WOMAN WATCHES UFO OVER PORT ARTHUR - At 10:30 p.m. Monday night Mrs. Dorothy Bennet was getting into the car in the driveway of her home to drive her mother home. Mrs. Bennet gazed into the sky over the houses across the street and saw a kind of horizontal cross "all lit up and glowing" with reddish lights on two ends. The women said they could hear no sound and "it was too big and bright to be a star." At one point the object appeared to be hovering directly over the River St. shopping plaza. It remained in view for half an hour. It finally grew smaller as if it were slowly receding towards the west. (Port Arthur News-Chronicle, April 5, 1967)

UFO MYSTIFIES EBENEZER VIEWERS - A UFO affected TV reception at Ebenezer, Sask. Monday evening. Mrs. O. Fandrey and son Douglas noticed an odd light in the northwest at 10:50 p.m. Both observed the object with binoculars. At first the object looked like a star. This was encircled by an orange light and finally by a larger round red circle. It appeared to be trailing flames. The object then turned and again looked like a star trailing red, glowing flame. Mrs. Fandrey also noticed two bright lights which looked like the sun reflecting from two car aerials. The object kept bobbing up and down and at times moved with great speed. It would stop again, then repeat the bobbing motion. Mrs. Fandrey telephoned her nephew Bob Neibrandt and he said the picture on their TV was going wild. Her TV reception was normal. Mr. Neibrandt and his wife went outside the house and said the object was right above them. At this point the TV went right off. The object then took off in a northerly direction and the TV reception returned to normal. The sighting lasted about 10 minutes. The UFO looked like shields that were carried by knights, rather oval-shaped said Mrs. Fandrey. The RCAF Station at Yorkton had no reports on it. (Yorkton Enterprise, Sask. April 5, 1967)

SIGHT UFOs - Irvin Nickerson, Moods Hill Rd. saw 2 UFOs which looked like flying saucers. Also seeing the UFOs was a Pleasant Lake resident, Mrs. Margaret Purdy. Sightings were reported also in Wedgeport and other locations in the Yarmouth area. (The Vanguard, Yarmouth, Nova Scotia, April 5, 1967)

UFO OVER OTTAWA SETS PHONES RINGING - A UFO was spotted in the skies over Ottawa early Wednesday night. It was a blue and white flaming object with a long tail. Another person described it as "quite bright moving from SE to NW. Uplands Airport sighted the object at 7:33 p.m. EST. A tower spokesman said it definitely was not an aircraft but speculated it might have been a meteor. (Brockville Recorder & Times, April 6, 1967)

SCORES WATCH UFOs - On April 5, reports were widespread. A "ball of light" was seen at North Bay and Haileybury, Ont. Dr. A. Moore of Callander said it travelled toward the south and then abruptly turned east and disappeared. Mrs. Mervin Stoughton of North Bay said the direction was roughly from the northeast to the southwest. Officials at North Bay's SAGE complex said they had no unidentified radar contacts during the evening. An object was also seen at Dorval, Que., Toronto, Brampton, Kingston, Cataraqui, Oshawa, Ont.

A BLACK FLASHING LIGHT? - Provincial police received reports of an object over Waterford which had red, blue, green, pink and black flashing lights. Toronto International Airport said it was almost certainly a meteor. (Brantford Expositor, Ont. April 6, 1967)

STARTLING SIMILARITIES IN CITIZEN'S UFO REPORTS - "It was all orange and it seemed to be on fire. But then, when it seemed to be falling, it just turned and disappeared. It was travelling too fast to be a plane" This is the startling account of a New Westminster woman's sighting of a UFO. Eight detailed accounts of the same apparent sighting were filed over the weekend. (Source: The Columbian, New Westminster, B.C. April 6, 1967)

AIRPORT, RESIDENT SPOTS STRANGE OBJECT OVER CITY - Edmonton's International Airport apparently traced a UFO for two hours on radar Thursday night. It radioed a pilot flying from Fort McMurray to Edmonton to help track the UFO from the air. The sightings occurred between 9 and 11 p.m. The pilot said he saw a few flashes of light, but couldn't say anything for sure. He added that the airport was receiving a pretty strong pattern on its radar screen. The resident said it appeared above the city for about 20 seconds. It had a reddish glow. Colorado State University reported tracking a UFO on its radar screen in a northern area (presumably around Alberta) about 9 or 10 p.m., Thursday. (Source: Edmonton Journal, April 7, 1967)

SIGHT GREEN UFO - A 13-year-old Mountjoy Twp. girl reported she saw a strange object hovering above trees on the Naybob Road late Friday night. It was described as being greenish yellow with red, flashing lights. It would appear for awhile and then disappear, to reappear in a few moments. The girl stated that the object was spinning, yet emitting no sound. The sighting took place about 1 a.m. Two dogs that were accompanying the youngsters were reported to have run into the bush, barking. (Timmins Press, Ont. April 8, 1967)

BOYS REPORT UFOs FLYING IN FORMATION - Saturday night two London, Ont. boys saw more than 30 UFOs in flight over the city. They saw the 1st UFO about 8:15 p.m. travelling north. "It looked like a string with knots in it," said George Pain, age 12. One wave of UFOs, 10 or 12, flew by in a V formation about 9 p.m. "There was no sound, no vapor trails, just white, bright lights, brighter than any plane or star" said Bill Hampton, age 16. Another boy, Stephen Albert, also saw the space vehicles. (Source: London Free Press, April 10, 1967)

YOUTHS WATCH OBJECT FLYING OVER CITY - Three city youths saw an object Sunday night with orange and red lights all blended together, and had a "weird" blue light underneath. It was in sight for only about 50 seconds, they said. (Source: Edmonton Journal, April 10, 1967)

ANOTHER UFO SIGHTED - It was seen by Parry Sound residents around midnight on Friday, April 7. Mr. & Mrs. Todd and their daughter sighted a greenish glowing object like a star travelling from south to north across the sky. (Parry Sound North Star, April 11, 1967)

NO DOUBTER NOW - Leo Zonnekyn sketched his impressions of a UFO seen over Don Mills last Wednesday evening. Many others reported an object that night. (Source: Aurora Banner, April 12, 1967)

UFO IS SEEN NOT A METEOR - Several people saw a UFO Wednesday evening last but Harry Toop said "It appeared to be a bluish white ball of fire, trailing a long bright tail and sparks." He saw it about 7:35 p.m. in the southern sky, travelling westerly not far above the horizon. He said it took some time to travel across the sky and disappear followed by a "bluish-white glow". It travelled in a fairly straight course and slowly. (Source: Arnprior Chronicle, April 12, 1967)

MOVING LIGHT SEEN BY COUPLE - Harley McKay and his wife, of Silver Creek, reported to police an unexplained moving light in the sky. They saw it twice on Sunday evening, at 7:45 p.m. and at 8:50 p.m. The night was fairly clear. He first saw a spherical object like a large star, but brighter, in the southwest. It advanced in an easterly direction, with changes in course, then disappeared. The second time it seemed to idle, then accelerated at a high rate of speed towards the north. It took 4 min. to cross the sky from horizon to horizon and appeared to grow in size and grow brighter as it moved. There have been other reports from nearby areas. (The Standard Hope, B.C. Apr.12)

WOMEN, GIRL SEE OBJECT IN SKIES - Did anyone sight a strange object in the sky in the Lowville-Kilbride-Campbellville area on Tuesday evening of last week? At between 7:30 and 7:35 p.m. a Kilbride lady and her daughter drove a car east on #10 Sideroad near the Guelph Line. They saw an unusual object "the most beautiful turquoise blue color" about as big as a washtub, flying slowly in a south-north direction and visible for more than a minute. They described it as global rather than disc or saucer-shaped. It didn't appear to make any noise for they shut off the car and rolled down the windows to listen to it. It seem- to be about 100 feet off the ground. (Milton Cdn. Champion, Apr.12)

TEACHER & STUDENTS SEE STRANGE MARKS ON THE MOON - A teacher and some students saw a light on the dark part of the moon from Chomedy High School on Wednesday, April 12. An another part of the city, a lady also saw the same thing. Mr. Ronald Anstee looked at the moon with binoculars and saw for a split second 2 tiny points of light. Also seen along the entire lower edge of the dark area, a pronounced reddish brown color would suddenly develop and gradually fade back and then come back again. This happened on 4 occasions and lasted 15-20 minutes each time. (Credit: Ronald Anstee, Montreal, Quebec.)

UFOS STARTLE GIRL GUIDES - Flashing lights on UFOs around Regent Heights Public School in suburban Scarborough Wednesday night amazed 18 girl guides. "The things went up and down like elevators and one even banked around the school" said Kristina Vasiliaufhas, 13. It lasted a few minutes, but the objects sped off when an airplane approached the area. She estimated the objects were about the size of a small foreign car. (Source: Fort William Times-Journal, April 13, 1967)

GUIDES SIGHT UFOS - UFOs which undulated up and down and flashed red, white and blue and green lights for several minutes were sighted over O.M. MacKillop School on Lucas St. April 12. The UFOs were seen by a group of girls leaving a regular evening meeting of 1st Richmond Hill Guide Company, who report that one of the objects came within five yds. of the building. Another group of Guides saw similar objects the same night in Scarborough. (The Liberal, Richmond Hill, Ont. Apr. 20, 1967. Credit: Mrs. Demetre Pollock, Thornhill, Ont.)

UFO SIGHTED BY LOCAL FARMER - Mike Pereduda reported a UFO at his farm about 10 $\frac{1}{2}$ miles south of Wynard on Sunday, April 2, between 10:30 and 11:00 a.m. The brilliantly white object was about the size of a softball. It first appeared at a very high altitude travelling at extremely slow speed from west to east. It also appeared to be swinging from side to side. He only saw it from a certain spot. When he moved aside from the line of sight, the object disappeared. (The Wynyard Advance, Sask. April 13, 1967)

"I WAS BURNED BY A UFO" -- Winnipeg man says

Steve Michalak is suffering from chest burns he claims he received Saturday, May 20, 1967, from an unidentifiable flying object he touched just north of Falcon Lake, Manitoba.

It was about 35 feet long, eight feet high with a three-foot protrusion on top, looked like stainless steel when it landed, but gave off a glaring red light when it started to move through the air at a speed the 50-year-old industrial mechanic says he can't "even begin to describe."

- And there were voices coming from it, he said in an interview... voices that sounded human but were obscured by a whirring sound the UFO made all the time it was on the ground.

He has remnants of an undershirt with a geometrically-patterned burned spot on it, a hat with a hole burned through it, and, he says, there seems to be a smell "coming from inside me and I can't get rid of it."

Mr. Michalak was out looking at some land north of Falcon about noon Saturday when he heard a pair of geese start to cackle insanely. "I looked up and saw these two objects coming from a south south-westerly direction. They were glaring red. I can't describe how fast they were going. You just can't put it in time.

"One was cruising about 10 feet above the ground and one landed. I watched it for about half an hour before going near it. It gave off rainbow reflections. And when a three-depth door finally opened, all he could see was a brilliant violet color. "It seemed to be making a sort of whistling noise, like it was sucking in air or something. Air seemed to be coming in or going out somehow." He said the joints on the UFO were "the most perfect joints I've ever seen."

"I can't understand how it was done. There was no welding, no rivets, no bolting, and when the door closed I could see nothing." Hearing voices coming from it, he spoke English, Russian, German, Italian and Polish, but the door closed, heat came from a pattern of holes in the side, it started to move in an anti-clockwise direction and took off."

He tried to tell the RCMP at Falcon, but they told him they could do nothing about it he says.

Mrs. Michalak says her husband is definitely not acting normally. He hasn't eaten since he's been home, has been vomiting and does have a strange odor about him. Mr. Michalak says he does not know if the UFO was a flying saucer or not. "Our technology doesn't have anything like it, but it could have been a new innovation being tested from the U.S. It came from that direction and took off to the same space. FOLLOW-UP TO ABOVE STORY:

Prof. Ray Craig, associate professor of physical science at the Boulder, Colo. University, arrived in Winnipeg, Saturday, June 3, to conduct a 3 to 4 day investigation. Prof. Craig said although a number of sightings can be explained by balloons, mirages etc., there are also a lot of things that can't be explained. He is a member of the UFO team preparing a report for the USAF. He went out on Sunday with Mr. Michalak searching for the landing area but had no luck. "I was sure I knew where it was but when you get there the whole scene has changed. There were no leaves then and now you can't even see 50-ft. ahead of you." he said. Prof. Craig says that although no two stories are ever alike, Mr. Michalak's is "typical." The burns Mr. Michalak had on his chest are pretty well healed and difficult to tell what kind they are. The RCAF radar site at Beausejour revealed nothing had registered on the screen that fateful day of May 20, 1967.

SPACESPOTS

THE Earth's magnetic field has reversed itself nine times in the last 4 million years.....The Earth is heading for the star Vega at the rate of about 12 miles per secondThe asteroid ICARUS will come within 4 million miles of Earth next June.....Two Rice University scientists have claimed discovery of a star and planet system forming in deep space. The star is R. MONOCERITIS..... Dr. John J. Green, director of research for Litton Systems, (Canada) in Toronto, said man will have laboratories on the moon and a solar station on the planet Mercury within 30 years..... A physicist-astronomer, Fred M. Johnson of Pasadena, Calif., said at a specially convened symposium of skeptical astronomers and biochemists at the University of Calif. that he has discovered that stellar dust in the universe is mostly chlorophyll, a key compound to life on Earth. It true, this would mean that biological life may be possible in outer space.....Cameras aboard Orbiter II have photographed such fine details as the trail left by a large rolling stone careening down a moon slope and the crater left by Ranger VIII when it hit the moon nearly 2 years ago.....Japanese amateur astronomer, Tsutomu Seki has spotted his 4th comet which has been confirmed by the Smithsonian Institute.....A space scientist has estimated 6 astronauts could be rocketed to the asteroid Eros when it passes within 14 million miles of Earth in early 1975 in what could be man's first interplanetary space venture.....The Institute of Radio-physics & Electronics is building a new radio astronomy observatory near the Ukrainian city of Kharkov. The telescope will be able to pick up signals from points ten billions of light years distant in our universe.....Two Smithsonian scientists have found continents on Mars from 6 to 9 miles high..... Well-informed sources say that in the next few years the Soviet Union will have a spaceship weighing 100 tons at its disposal. Gemini 10 weighed 4 tons and Apollo will weigh 47 tons The Marshal Space Flight Center is planning to put up a secret satellite project using a giant mirror about 2000 feet in diameter in orbit, turning night into day.....NASA discovered that the tail of the Earth's magnetic field extends $3\frac{1}{2}$ million miles into space.....Recent photographs of the lunar surface provides evidence of dynamic processes including faults or slippages of the surface, vulcanizing, and sliding of materials from the rims of craters.....In a 1,000,000 to 1 chance, two U.S. satellites collided in space but are still in orbit..... An experiment designated a "S-26" measured the "wake" of Gemini XI and the results indicated that any orbiting body, streaking along at nearly 5 mps, literally "digs a tunnel" through the charged gases of space and cannot be covered up by any means even theoretically known to man.
