

APOLLO 14 WILL PROBE MYSTERY LIGHTS

Previous Apollonauts reported mysterious flashes of light says Aviation Week and Space Technology. The flashes are believed to be cosmic rays and were described as streaks or dots by Apollo 11, 12 and 13.

Dr. R. Benson, radio biologist, says there is no problem because they are not out there long enough.

Apollo 14 crew will be asked to use the moon as a shield in an effort to determine the direction of the light flashes. Benson said, "They will be asked, when they see the lights, to look toward the moon and then away from it. This may give us some idea of the direction the rays are coming from."

Aldrin and Armstrong were the first to report the flashes in July, 1969. Collins said he saw them in the peripheral area of his vision with his eyes open. He said they looked similar to St. Elmo's fire.

The Apollo 11 crew thought the streaks of light were going through the 'air'. Crews 12 and 13 could see them with their eyes closed.

James Lovell saw the flashes during Apollo 13. So did Swigert and Haise. Haise counted 10 flashes in a 5 minute period. They varied in time from 7 sec to $1\frac{1}{2}$ mins. One looked like a "roman candle". There were more dots than flashes or streaks, according to Collins.

(Comment: In a letter to your editor, John Keel says - "The article carefully ignored the fact that the astronauts have photographed the "flashes" on several occasions. And the notion that they might be Cosmic rays is utterly absurd. Cosmic ray particles have been viewed in a cloud chamber with very special apparatus, but the human eye simply is not able to view that end of the spectrum.")

REPORT FROM ALBERTA by W.K. Allan

Nick Davis, an insurance man from Calgary, Alta., was awakened by a strange noise about 5:30 a.m., 1968, which sounded like a "voom, voom, voom." He walked to every window in the house but saw nothing at all until the noise became louder and the bedroom window panes rattled. He saw a shadow gliding over the rooftop and stop in mid-air. Getting a better look, it was an object about 30-50 ft in diameter with about 100 multi-colored lights flashing and alternating in unison with the noise. It hung there and Davis watched it for about 25 seconds and finally the UFO tilted and it took off leading with its high side towards the northwest to the CFCN tower. It left a streak of red light behind it like a wake of a boat. Day was just breaking and the sky was cloudless. It reminded him of the Husky tower all lit up at night.

2 Frank Marwood, amateur radio operator, VE6AEY, on the evening of Nov. 11, 1968, at 11:30 C.S.T., was returning from Regina, Sask., to Calgary. About 30 miles east of Swift Current, Sask., he noticed a light to the left and above the car, moving in a circular motion. It was a bluish-white circle of light, about 25 feet in diameter. It was about 500 feet above the ground, spinning on an axis two to three feet off center about two revolutions per second. It gave the appearance of a whipping motion. He turned off his lights and the UFO remained in the same position in relation to the car. Then he speeded up to 90-95 mph and the UFO stayed in the same position, just slightly ahead of the car. He slowed down to 5 mph and so did the light. He stopped and the UFO stopped its forward motion but continued its rotating action. Turning on the radio on the 75-meter band, there was just "snow static" but didn't silence the radio. It had no effects on headlights or ignition system. Near the outskirts of Swift Current, the upper leading edge tipped up for about 1,500-2,000 feet into a cloud formation. Marwood has had a pilot's license since 1949, owned his own plane for eight years and has over 2,000 hours in flying time. The UFO was definitely an object, not a reflection. It may have been elliptical in shape rather than round because of the "whipping action." There was no sound. It followed him for about 20 miles.

Maureen Johnston and her husband Roland, of Crossfield, saw a burning reddish-glow, clamshaped ball, with orange tail coming straight down, then straighten out and fly easterly. It was 9:30 pm, Jan.30, 1969. It was a clear night when they arrived home and saw the object. Mrs. Johnston, who saw it for about 10 seconds, said it had lights on it like windows around it. It had an exhaust the size of the object. An engineer from the Alberta government phoned her and asked if she had ever been cut off on long distance calls and she said just about every time. He said that in the Alberta area it has been happening and they have no explanation for it. The UFO was as big as an airliner at about $\frac{1}{2}$ to 1 mile away. It was about 3,000 to 5,000 feet in altitude and there was no sound.

Don Wood, Didsbury, a truck driver said he saw a UFO going from west to east at incredible speed. It was cigar-shaped with windows. The date was also Jan. 30, 1969 at 9:30 pm. It was travelling north of Crossfield when he saw it.

Betty Rynert, was halfway between Carstairs and Didsbury at 2:30 a.m. on Jan.30, 1969 when she saw a greyish-silver, oblong object hovering with points of light around it for about fifteen minutes. It was bigger than the full moon. It was just above the trees, went up fast at a steep angle.

Lloyd Fox, on Feb.2, 1969 saw a UFO come out of the trees with a dome on top, round but flat and shiny. White smoke came out of the edge of it. It tipped and went up straight in the air. It was about 30 feet in diameter and about one mile away. The smoke gradually turned dark. The time was about 4:30 p.m. and was a sunny, clear day.

Leo Hamish, forestry worker, saw a UFO on Feb. 28, 1969 at 9 a.m. It moved over on top of a hill, hovered and disappeared. Shaped like a cup, right side up, curved on the bottom and shiny as a reflected light. It was four or five times larger than a plane and two

planes fly over the area every day.

SS&S No.59 - 1970

Gordon Levinski, saw a disc-shaped object on Feb.28, 1969, for up to two minutes. The UFO was going in a south to north direction and was bigger than a jetliner, but smaller than a full moon. It was seen in the forenoon.

Peggy Loos, in mid-February, in the morning, saw a cigar-shaped, silvery object. There was a bright light in the center. The UFO was lower than the mountain in the background and about a $\frac{1}{2}$ mile away. It hovered, went down and up slowly, then went straight up very fast and went out of sight.

Arnold Slutton, Didsbury, on Feb. 11, 1969, about 7 p.m., saw a bright ball of light with his wife. When it was directly in front, he stopped the car, shut off the motor and the UFO had three small blue lights around the outer edge below the white upper light. It travelled south about a mile and turned southwest and disappeared in a few minutes. It was about 1/8th mile away and about 1,800 feet high. It was dark outside and the object was about 1/2 the size of a full moon. No sound. They saw it for 30 seconds.

About 5 years ago last Feb. 1970, a farmer ploughed some prairie land that hadn't been ploughed before and noticed three rings which were distinctly much greener and about 30-40 feet in diameter. The outer circles were not more than two feet in width. He thought at first that some Indians had had a pow-wow and he went over to look for artifacts. They were not fairy rings or fungus growth. The grass was dark green and four inches taller than the rest. No indentations on the ground. A crop was grown on it and no evidence remained.

12 On Jan. 23, 1969, Charles A. Bennett, was returning to Carstairs and said he saw a UFO about ½ a mile away. He stopped his car and watched. It looked like a cloud of smoke, but when it got closer to him, he saw it had a dome on top and bottom and was about 50 feet in diameter and 20 feet in depth. It was a cloudless day and the time was 2:20 p.m. The UFO came down on an angle and dipped with the sun shining off it. Silvery and nickel-plated in color. Around the outside was a ring about two feet wide, like Saturn. There was an exhaust of black smoke and shot out about 20-30 feet before disintegrating. Then the UFO dipped and went back in the same direction at about 25 miles per hour.

13 Mrs. Barbara Smythe of Craigmile, saw a gigantic object on the morning of Feb. 18, 1969. It was a bright, pinky-red color and there were two larger, huge, flashing white lights and spinning counter-clockwise so fast it was hard to see it. The top was tent-shaped and something like flames came out, and the sides seemed to be going in and out, or pulsating. It was about three times the size of a 14-foot steel grainery and about 15 feet in diameter. The UFO was about eight feet above the ground at first and then disappeared behind a hill and then it was quite a bit higher. It moved very fast and an awful silence pervaded the area as her car seemed to float along the ground as she drove away from the house for a full mile at about 20 m.p.h.

At Crawford's Hill, something had landed and left a circle of about 30 feet in diameter.


Bob Smythe told about a farmer near Didsbury in the summer of 1969 who thought his field was on fire about 5:30 p.m. He found three circular areas burned together and the complete burn-out area was 75 feet in diameter and no markings of any machine having landed there and also no reason three fires started in the middle of his field.

15 Mrs. Cliff Foster, now of Barnworth, said that in May of 1935, that she and her husband were in the Georgian Bay area of Ontario and were walking on the very rocky beach and saw a light coming along the road. As it neared them, it swerved toward them, no sound came from it, and when it got to within two feet of them, her husband took a big rock and threw it at the light. It didn't swerve and no indication that it had been hit. It went towards the lake and out of their sight. It was the size of a Japanese orange and about three feet off the ground. It travelled about the speed of a person walking. There was no breeze and there had not been any storms so it couldn't have been ball lightning.

By Soren Andersson (as told to him by Mr. G. Johansson.)



The incident occurred at the market town of Mariannelund, Smaland in 1959. Mr. Gideon Johansson was employed as chief engineer at the factory of AB Brusafors-Hallefors, and was responsible for the operation at the factory's interlocking plant.

On one of the last days in October, 1959, just before 8p.m., there was a power blackout at Mariannelund and its environs. As Mr. Johansson was responsible for the operation and was on duty, he was immediately ready to carry out his service work. When he came out from his house, he met his son, Rolf, (25 years old), who was on his way in when it suddenly was totally dark at the market town. Rolf then saw a shining light and pointed it out to his father. Over the three-storey building of Folkets Hus (House of the Public), they could see an extraordinarily strong light appear.

They first thought it was an airplane with an engine not functioning and was going to crash, as it seemed aimed at their house, Mr. Johansson called his wife to run out of the house. She didn't hear him. At the same time he called, the object stopped, and Rolf and his father got the impression it could be a helicopter. Since no sound was heard, they had to reconsider even that explanation. After the object had been motionless for a minute, it started moving again, and seemed as if it had the intention to land in the garden.


The object swayed three times, moved to the right and struck a maple tree, damaging it at the top. Thereafter a scraping sound was heard and the object descended straight at a street, but stopped approximately one meter above the level of the street. All the while it rocked like a boat on the waves of an ocean.

Mr. Johansson walked to his door and was only 3 meters away from the object. Now he saw that it was a space vehicle. The white light emanated from something resembling a window, like the wind screen of a larger car. It was a more compact and whiter light than he had ever seen before. In this light, Mr. Johansson saw two humanoid beings with a friendly appearance. They had extremely high foreheads, and very large beautiful eyes radiating intelligence. They had no external ears. Their noses were long and narrow with small nostrils. Their mouths were small and their chins pointed and small - they had weakly-shaped lower jaws. Their size seemed to be that of our 14-year olds, in other words somewhat short statured. Further they were dressed in white uniform-like clothes with wide black belts laid crosswise over their shoulders. They seemed to be well fastened.

Mr. Johansson had time to study them. The one to the right quickly loosened his belt and began working with something below the screen, in the right section of what seemed to be the cockpit. During that time, Johansson found it fitting to show them a little friendliness by means of waving his right hand. The one at work in the right front part of the cockpit had

now finished his job, and saw Johansson wave and smile at them. While Johansson was waving he wondered where they came from. The only reaction from their side was that the right one widened his eyes for a second. (At that selfsame moment a picture formed before his inner sight. A picture of a brown



landscape with brown cacti having green veins. There also were some kind of large archshaped buildings under which the people lived. The craft started after awhile, floated forward, and Johansson followed it on the sidewalk for about 25 meters. The craft stopped at the stop-boarder on the street, as it was a crossing street. The craft turned off its light and disappeared in a fraction of a second. They didn't see where it went, but Johansson felt a current of air when the air rushed to occupy the place where the vehicle had been situtated.

As proof that Mr. Johansson experienced this event, it should be said that he came down with some kind of radiation-injury from the spaceship. All glands swelled up and the doctors could not explain the cause. Now, ll years after, his health is fully restored. There was no explanation of the power black out. But they found at one part of the power line that all phase-lines at a length of $3\frac{1}{2}$ meters were glazed with a black substance of which they could find no reasonable explanation.

To Mr. Johansson, it looked as if the beings did not speak, but only exchanged looks. Still there were wires running from the ceiling to the place we (Earthlings) have ears, possibly some kind of a radio.

The material the UFO was built of resembled armor-plate, eight to ten millimeters thick, hammered on the surface.

And there was a strengthening frame around the large window, it was riveted on with long pointed rivets (sharp, and resembling a half rifle bullet). The UFO seemed to be constructed by hand. The uniforms worn by the humanoids were white, neat, but the cut seemed to be of the 19th century. These were observations made at a distance of 3 to 4 meters from the craft. The humanoids were seen through the large windows at the left as per the diagram at the top of this page.

UFO STUDY 'DEAD'

UFO spotting in Canada is dead as "space grass." University of Toronto officials have admitted that a Canadian study of UFOs has never gotten off the ground.

Dr. Rod Tennyson, director of the UFO project said the 7-man UFO team has not considered a case in the past year.

"We needed something with physical evidence and we didn't get it," he said.

Dr. Tennyson says that his group could only find six serious cases in the hundreds of reported sightings turned over to the U of T by the Dept. of National Defence. Forestry experts were called in for soil tests in one case where a landing UFO was said to have scorched the earth but the results were negative. In another, a specimen of "space grass" sent through the mail turned out to be radar chaff, probably aluminum foil. The Aerospace researchers, who discuss cases over coffee breaks, never really got enough evidence to sink their teeth into.

Dr. Tennyson says the group is ready to launch a full-scale probe if a report warrants.

The study was advertised and brought little response, even from citizens groups formed to report such sightings. "One of our objectives was to say to people that these were a group of scientists who were willing to listen to anything they had to report," Dr. Tennyson said.

Even with the apparent demise of the U of T study, Canadians who spot UFOs still have an attentive ear in the form of Dr. Peter Millman, head of upper atmosphere research for the National Research Council. Since 1968, Dr. Millman and the NRC have been the sole keepers of the UFO file, termed the Non-Meteoritic Sighting File.

he Sasquatch is a legend of British Columbia, our answer to the Bigfoot of California

and the Abominable Snowman of the Himalayas. We last reported the creature in SS&S #53 when a 200 pound, fivefoot creature was seen in Salmon Inlet by Gordon Baum, a logger, sometime last June.

Rene Dahinden, of Lumley, B.C. (see photo of him holding a plaster cast he says is of a Sasquatch foot print) wants to put a miniature radio transmitter into him (with a tranquilizer gun?) and then trace him wherever he goes.

A movie entitled "Sasquatch", the only film footage in the world actually showing the creature, was exhibited Jan. 30 to Feb. 1st in Calgary, Alberta. This film included the Roger Patterson footage taken in California in 1967. The film ends with comments from scientists involved in the investigations. The movie is the property of Arctic Safari Productions.

Last August, five construction workers at the Calgary Power Big Horn Dam project, west of Nordegg, saw a mysterious figure at least twice the size of a man.

Natives of the area reported seeing a creature six times in a limited area. The creatures walk erect and are covered with hair.

Floyd Lngen of Eckville, Alta., said he and two friends spotted the creature $a \frac{1}{4}$ or a mile away. It appeared to be sitting down, watching the dam site. Then it stood up and walked about a t mile before disappearing into the hills. The creature was about 15 feet tall with round shoulders and dark in color. They watched it for 20 minutes. They waved their hats but it ignored them and just kept striding. No tracks were found.

The Cree Indian workers used to entertain the construction

workers with stories of enormous creatures they had seen in the mountains around Nordegg.

Mark Yellowbird said he saw four human prints along Rabbit Creek, 20 miles west of the dam. The prints were $14\frac{1}{2}$ " long and over six feet apart. His daughter had seen four of the creatures working at something part way up a mountain along the David Thompson Hwy.

Ivan Walley of Vancouver, B.C., was driving to Kamloops on November 20, 1969 when he saw an "elderly Sasquatch". It was sitting by the side of the road but jumped up and made for the woods when Walley's dog saw it

and began to bark loudly. The creature was about seven feet tall, with long legs and weighing from 300 to 400 pounds. It was covered with short, grey-brown hair. Upon seeing it, Walley turned his truck around and reported to the nearest RCMP station. He said it had the face of a wizened old man and that it lifted its arms as if to surrender.

John Green, publisher of the Agassiz Advance, has personally investigated scores of mysterious tracks which he says defies explanation. Mr. Green believes the creature is a type of ape which came to North America from Asia through an ancient land bridge. He says

> there may be as many as 1,000 living in the mountains. Green was in Toronto recently to sell his 78-page book to booksellers.

> And in Pahang State, 160 miles east of Kuala Lampur in Malaysia, an expedition is searching for the mysterious, hairy creatures reported seen in the jungles. Rattan cutters and loggers say the creatures look like a cross between humans and apes.

Loren Coleman, a Bigfoot enthusiast and SS&S associate wrote to us recently and had this to say:

"Apparently there is a great deal of ABSM-UFO correlations going on these days. I think John Keel has correctly point-



ed to simultaneous UFO-ABSM activity in many areas, most notable in the Erie, Pa. area (July-Aug.-1966) and in the Point Pleasant - St. Albans, W.Va. region (Nov. 1967-Dec. 1966). Jennifer Stevens found UFO-ABSM reports coming from Delaware County, N.Y. in November of 1968. Allen Greenfield writes that the period of Aug.-Sept. 1965 finds ABSM reports coming from all over Michigan and Ontario and may have been one of an "unusually large number of UFO reports in the United States. If this was a 'peak' period for yeti reports, this may be of some interest."

"Interestingly, at the time of the big ABSM flap in Wisconsin in Nov.-Dec. 1968, there may have been some UFO activity nearby the rural Fremont site of the ABSM encounter. In the Daily Northwestern, Oshkosh, Wisc., of Monday, Dec. 2, 1968, is a clip I have on the seven foot tall ABSM seen near Fremont. Under this item is but a part of an item entitled "Glowing Object Sighted in Sky". The only line left with this reads: "Neenah - For the Second"...Were there UFOs in the Fremont-Neenah area at the time of the ABSM reports?" "Realistically, is there anything to these correlations? Among the vast numbers of pro-

bable possibilities, I find basically four important ones:

- 1) It's all entirely meaningless.
- 2) The news media in times of either a large UFO or ABSM flap is more amiable to all types of Forteana, tends to print them, and the "buffs" "FIND" a correlation.
- 3) Fairly in-depth researchers in the field tend to leave no source unturned, often find ABSM reports when they are "investigating" UFO cases, and thus a correlation arises. (The report by Keel in FSR, July-Aug.1968 on "Mothman" is a superb example of what a good man can find if he looks for it, ie, if number 4 is not (?) true.
- 4) There is a "real" relationship between the occurence of UFO-ABSM reports at the same place in time and space. (This may be related to an "occupant" theory, a paraphysical one, etc.; at this time "theories" should not be that important in discussing the matter. To find a true, and workable correlation is the problem.)"

Our roving reporter, Emmett Kelly, Jr., told us he had a chance to see the "iceman" shown in Memphis, Tenn., last year. Because of his reputation as the "best known clown" in the U.S., he was able to see the "iceman" close up. He was told that the creature was evidently running away and fell into a crevice or off a cliff as one eye was gouged out. It doesn't seem to be a fake, as upon close scrutiny, there is dirt under the worn fingernails and toenails, also prints on the underside of the toes. A faker would not likely think of this in constructing a dummy. But John Keel wrote to tell us there were two or three known fakes which he knew about. The "iceman" was on display last year in Calgary, Alberta, at a special showing.

Lorne Coleman sent us this recent item: "PHANTOM SCARE IN THE VALLEY" - Reports of a "phantom" 18 feet tall near this Annapolis Valley town of Berwick, Nova Scotia, are unsettling residents. The "phantom" is described as a "tall, very dark form," either walking or floating at 20 mph. Police said two police cars have been keeping watch in the area, but only to control traffic. Cars have caused bumper-to-bumper traffic jams in the quiet farming area as the curious hope to catch a glimpse of the "phantom." (The Evening News, Berwick, N.S., April 25, 1969)

UFO near Caledonia

"I never believed the stories before, but I do now!"

That was the reaction of John R. Gibson, R2, Caledonia, Ont., after his wife and family were awakened at 2:30 a.m. Friday by what they believe was a UFO as they are commonly known.

Mr. Gibson's home is on the River Road. about two miles west of Caledonia. Here's Mr. Gibson's story:

"About 2:30 a.m., our daughter, Morey, age 18, was awakened by a whirring sound. bright light was shining in her bedroom, so she got out of bed and went to the window. In the sky, towards the west, she saw this object and called us.



"We saw this object quite plainly," Mr. Gibson said. "It was up about 2,000 to 3,000 feet. The noise was not that of an airplane or a jet. I know what they sound like. It made a sort of whirring noise. "The object was all lighted up and glowed with red and white lights. The lights were so bright they illuminated the object, which was saucer-shaped and obviously metallic. Judging from the altitude the object would have to be about 40 feet in actual diameter. We observed it until about 2:45 and then it suddenly passed out of sight to the south towards Hamilton."

"I have read stories in the newspapers and magazines about UFOs, and really didn't believe in them, but I do now," he said. "I am positive this was not an airplane of the type we know." Mr. Gibson said he understands some people in Hagersville and Jarvis also saw the object. The whirring noise was heard in various parts of Haldimand county. Some public school students attending Oneida School were asking other students if they heard the "funny noise in the sky."

At various times in 1967, there have been reports of "mysterious objects" floating around in that area of Haldimand county. Some people have seen it at almost ground level, others have watched it in the sky. The visits have always been during the evening or early morning hours. (The Hamilton Spectator, Feb. 11, 1967. Astronomers have found new knowledge about star systems in which stars seem to behave like drunk-

Astronomers have found new knowledge about star

en drivers going every which way on celestial superhighways at fantastic speeds.

Up to 10 billion of these stars seem to be racing around at velocities of 1,000 miles per second - 3,600,000 miles per hour - in a rather confined space in the universe.

Often, they ram into each other. Then they explode, or parts of two stars fuse together, or parts of the two are thrown out to become new stars, the scientists think.

The collisions produce tremendous amounts of light and radiation. And that could be why these particular and peculiar star systems - known as Seyfert galaxies - are so extremely bright in the heavens, the astronomers said.

Because of the collisions and speeds, "It would be a very unsafe place" to live on a planet around a Seyfert Galaxy star, if indeed such stars could or did still have any planets that might bear life, says Dr. Martin Schwarzchild of Princeton University. On the other hand, it could offer a spectacular sight, with billions of bright stars close by, and frequent explosions producing fireworks. Less than 12 Seyfert galaxies have been spotted. They are extremely small and intensely bright.

Dr. Schwarzchild said that the sun and other stars in the Milky Way Galaxy travel around 20 miles per second, relative to one another, and tend to keep their place in the rotation of the whole galaxy with each star travelling about 130 miles per second in that orderly procession. (Source: The Montreal Gazette, June 11, 1970)

STRANGE EXPERIENCE

I would like to tell you of an experience a friend of mine had in August, 1968. He had been in a flying saucer. He says he has told this only to very few people. Mr. S. was on his lunch hour walking down Yonge Street in downtown Toronto. A dark car stopped in front of him and two men inside asked him if he would like to come for a ride. He was addressed by his name. When Mr. S. hesitated, he was assured that he had no reason to fear and that he wouldn't regret it, so he got into the car.

The next thing he knew he was let out in the country where there was a flying saucer. He could not describe it well because the car stopped directly in front of the saucer, but believes it was grey and round.

There were altogether 5 men in dark brownish clothing and he was told that the pilot was a woman, but he did not see her. All men were about 30 years of age and ordinary looking. Mr. S. was told everything about the propulsion of the saucer. He said that when this was explained to him he understood perfectly and everything seemed very simple, but he did not write anything down and now he does not remember. He says the most peculiar thing were the walls of the saucer. They looked like made of wood, but when he touched them they felt like velvet to touch, or something living. He was offered a ride in the saucer but he declined saying that he must get back to work.

I asked Mr. S. whether he asked the men who they were. He said that he was too much surprised and awed to ask anything, but that he just knew they were not from this Earth. I asked what language they spoke (Mr. S. speaks several), he did not know. I assume they spoke by telepathy.

He was taken back to Yonge St. Again he does not remember about the trip back. He was back at work half an hour late.

This is his story and I am convinced it is true because I know Mr. S. to be a sincere and well balanced person. He has a university education and works as an accountant. He is also socially very active. I asked him whether it might have been a psychic experience, but he is very sure this actually happened. He says he was under the influence of this experience for a long time. It was several months later that he told me about it and I know he must be coaxed very much to tell it to others.
