


Thank you for your letter dated 18 February 2001. I apologise for the delay in replying.

Firstly, I can confirm that we received no reports of sightings of an 'unidentified flying object' from in or around South Kirby, near Pontefract, West Yorkshire for 9th February 2001.

With regard to your second query, I can confirm that we received several reports from Northern England and Scotland between 19:40 - 20:00 on 8th February 2001. The reports were considered in consultation with air defence advisers within the MOD, and the conclusion was reached that they contained nothing that represented a threat to the security of the United Kingdom.

As you will be aware from previous correspondence, the Ministry of Defence's interest in these matters is limited to whether there is any evidence that the UK's airspace might have been compromised by unauthorised air activity. Unless there is evidence of a threat we do not attempt to identify the precise nature of each reported sighting.







I am writing with reference to your report of a sighting of an 'unidentified flying object' on 19 February 2001. The report was passed to us by RAF Fylingdales as this office is the focal point within the Ministry of Defence for correspondence relating to 'UFOs.'

First, it may be helpful if I explain that the Ministry of Defence examines any reports of 'unidentified flying objects' it receives solely to establish whether what was seen might have some defence significance; namely, whether there is any evidence that the United Kingdom's airspace might have been compromised by hostile or unauthorised air activity. Unless there is evidence of a potential threat, and to date no 'UFO' report has revealed such evidence, MOD does not attempt to identify the precise nature of each reported sighting. We believe it is possible that rational explanations, such as aircraft lights or natural phenomena, could be found for them, but it is not the function of the MOD to provide this kind of aerial identification service. We could not justify expenditure of public funds on investigations which go beyond our specific defence remit.

With regard to your particular observation, I have looked back through our sighting report files and can confirm that we received no other reports of 'UFO' sightings for 19 February from anywhere in the United Kingdom. We are satisfied that there is no corroborating evidence to suggest that the United Kingdom's airspace was breached by unauthorised air activity.



We believe it is possible that rational explanations, such as aircraft lights or natural phenomena, could be found for them, but it is not the function of the MOD to provide this kind of aerial identification service. We could not justify expenditure of public funds on investigations which go beyond our specific defence remit.

With regard to your particular observation, I have looked back through our sighting report files and can confirm that we received no other reports of 'UFO' sightings for 28 January from anywhere in the United Kingdom. I can also confirm that there were no Tornado or Nimrod aircraft operating in the area at the time you gave. It is of course possible that civilian aircraft were in the region and if you wish to pursue your enquiry on this basis, you should contact: The Civil Aviation Authority, CAA House, 45-49 Kingsway, London, WC2B 6TE.

We are satisfied that there is no corroborating evidence to suggest that, on 28 January, the United Kingdom's airspace was breached by unauthorised air activity.





I am writing with reference to your report of a sighting of an 'unidentified flying object' on 14 February 2001. The report was passed to us RAF Leuchars as this office is the focal point within the Ministry of Defence for correspondence relating to 'UFOs.'

First, it may be helpful if I explain that the Ministry of Defence examines any reports of 'unidentified flying objects' it receives solely to establish whether what was seen might have some defence significance, namely, whether there is any evidence that the United Kingdom's airspace might have been compromised by hostile or unauthorised air activity. Unless there is evidence of a potential threat, and to date no 'UFO' report has revealed such evidence, MOD does not attempt to identify the precise nature of each reported sighting. We believe it is possible that rational explanations, such as aircraft lights or natural phenomena, could be found for them, but it is not the function of the MOD to provide this kind of aerial identification service. We could not justify expenditure of public funds on investigations which go beyond our specific defence remit.

With regard to your particular observation, I have looked back through our sighting report files and can confirm that we received no other reports of 'UFO' sightings for 14 February 2001 from anywhere in Scotland. We are satisfied that there is no corroborating evidence to suggest that the United Kingdom's airspace was breached by unauthorised air activity.

Dear Flying Officer Section 40

It was suggested by Section 40 who runs the Information Kiosk on Bangor Pier, that you might be able to help me with my enquiries about a 'fireball' or 'meteorite' sighting on Ynys Môn last August. Below is a short report that I only received just before Xmas from one of the members of staff at Coleg Menai, and I wondered whether or not this 'fireball' was observed at RAF Valley - either visibly or on radar of any sort.

Date: 26 August 2000 Time: 20.30 BST approx.

Event: a large fireball/meteorite/piece of debris/whatever, spotted in the western quadrant at a low angle (we were seated at a height of approx 80m. ASL and facing the Snowdonia mountains. When first sighted, the object was about 10 degrees higher than the mountain horizon). It followed a fairly shallow trajectory and then plunged into Llyn Cefni, which was down the slope in front of where we were sitting, and approximately 80m away. The point of impact was behind a group of conifers, but almost certainly into the water. The object appeared much bigger than the houses and farm buildings which were on the opposite side of the lake, and towards the end of trajectory almost appeared to be flaming, rather than "glowing". From first observation to disappearance from view was about 2 - 3 seconds.

I have been asked to try to corroborate this 'sighting' by Section 40 at Liverpool John Moores University, who is also the moderator of the Cambridge Conference Network (CCNet), which is a scholarly electronic network serving the international N.E.O. (Near Earth Object) community. Their archive can be found at: <u>http://abob.libs.uga.edu/bobk/cccmenu.html</u>

The Morien Institute is a small group of people in Wales with a global network of independent and academic researchers focussing on ancient astronomy. We all work from home, and I am an occasional contributor to the CCNet. I would like to be able to discover the true nature of this 'fireball', and to be able to rule out the possibility that it might have been some debris from one of the aircraft based at RAF Valley, or perhaps some space debris, which unfortunately is becoming increasingly common. Any confirmation of similar 'sightings' at the base would be sent to Section 40 for inclusion in a CCNet circular, and any assistance you might be able to offer in this regard would be most appreciated.





If you Know what Venus Looks Like at the moment, at around 6. pm, G.M.T. in the South sky, then the object Oseen is about 3 times Larger than venus. I have contacted Satellite officers in the Astronomy organisation that I am a member of, and it seems it was not a Satellite going over that time of night, and, alparently, the International Space station and MIR had already gone over earlier. Following investigation by the Department, SEC (AS) 2a, MOD Main Building, Whitehall, London SW1A 2HB you may well receive a reply to your sightings.

Unfortunately, I am unable to give you any information at this time, but I thank you for your concern and for reporting the sighting.

I am writing with reference to your report of an 'unidentified flying object' seen on 4 January 2001. The report was passed to us by the Aeronautical Information Service (Military) at RAF West Drayton as this office is the focal point within the Ministry of Defence for correspondence relating to 'UFOs.'

First, it may be helpful if I explain that the Ministry of Defence examines any reports of 'unidentified flying objects' it receives solely to establish whether what was seen might have some defence significance; namely, whether there is any evidence that the United Kingdom's airspace might have been compromised by hostile or unauthorised air activity. Unless there is evidence of a potential threat, and to date no 'UFO' report has revealed such evidence, MOD does not attempt to identify the precise nature of each reported sighting. We believe it is possible that rational explanations, such as aircraft lights or natural phenomena, could be found for them, but it is not the function of the MOD to provide this kind of aerial identification service. We could not justify expenditure of public funds on investigations which go beyond our specific defence remit.

With regard to your particular observation, I have looked back through our sighting report files and can confirm that we received no other reports of 'UFO' sightings for 4 January 2001 from anywhere in the United Kingdom. We are satisfied that there is no corroborating evidence to suggest that the United Kingdom's airspace was breached by unauthorised air activity.

# subject: Report of an Unidentified Flying Object

### a) Date, time and duration of sighting

The original sighting occurred at 1805hrs Friday 15th December 2000 on two separate occasions both lasting for a few minutes.

# b) Description of object

It was a single object that seemed to hover above the treeline of a wooded area of Cannock Chase. At first it looked to be similar size to that of the moon in the night sky but over the time it was viewed changed size and shape. It changed to colour and seemed to change from its original white colour to be tinted with shades of blue and red before returning to its original colour.

### c),Exact position observed

The object was viewed from the rear garden of the informant's home address. He was stationary. It appeared to be over the treetops above the Stile Cop area near to Wanden Crossroads. On the first occasion it moved off right towards the A460 Hednesford Road. On the second occasion it seemed to move directly away from the informants location.

## d) How observed

The informant viewed the object on the first occasion with the naked eye before he lost sight of it. It then returned a short time later and was recorded on a hand held video camera with footage lasting for two minutes and twenty seconds before his video switched itself off.

## e) Direction in which object first seen

The object was first viewed stationary over the Stile Cop Road area it seemed to hover above the treetops before moving off at great speed, right towards the A460 Hednesford Road Rugeley.

## f) Angle of sight

2.5

The object was viewed at an approximate twenty-degree elevation

# g) Distance

From viewing the video and speaking to the informant we formed the opinion that the object was approximately two miles from the informants vantagepoint.

## h) Movements

As previously stated on the first sighting the object moved off right towards the A460 Hednesford Road and out of sight before returning to its original location a short time later. On the second occasion it seemed to move directly away from the informants vantagepoint.

# i) Meteorological conditions during observation

It was a fairly clear night with only a few clouds in the sky.




