

I am writing in response to your Freedom of Information request for copies of correspondence regarding the alleged UFO sighting near the residence of the former Home Secretary, Michael Howard, at Burmarsh, Kent on 8 March 1997. I apologise for the delay in replying.

The documents the MOD holds about this incident consist of a number of letters from UFO Monitors East Kent to the MOD, the Defence Special Adviser, Secretary of State for the Home Office, Kent County Constabulary and Roger Gale MP and associated replies. I have not attached copies of these as I assume you will already have them. We also hold correspondence from two members of the public who enquired about events around the time and one who made an enquiry in June 2004. It is, of course, possible that others have written to the MOD about these events between 1997 and the present, but without searching hundreds of paper records it is not possible to be certain. Clearly such an exercise would exceed the £600 cost limit set for compliance with the Freedom of Information Act 2000 and as provided by Section 12 of the Act the MOD is not obliged to comply with this aspect of your request.

I have however located four documents which are relevant to your request which I hope you will find of interest. These consist of a letter from Sec(AS) to the Air Defence branch (DAO) dated 1 July 1997 requesting confirmation that there was no unusual military activity in UK airspace on the date in question, DAO's reply dated 2 July 1997 confirming there was no unusual activity (plus a handwritten note about the Home Office confirmation that there was no security alert), Sec(AS) letter to the Home Office dated 25 February 1998 concerning these events and the Home Office reply dated 26 February 1998, confirming that the Kent County Constabulary had checked their records and there was no such security incident. Electronically scanned copies of these documents are attached for your information. Personal data has been removed in accordance with Section 40 of the Freedom of Information Act.

I hope this is helpful. If you are unhappy with the response or wish to complain about any aspect of the handling of this request, then you should contact the undersigned in the first instance. 2. Unsurprisingly, the Home Office have confirmed that there was no such security incident involving the Home Secretary on 8 March and in responding along the usual lines I would like to make the following statement:

"... there is no evidence that the UK Air Defence Region was compromised by unauthorized foreign military activity on the date in question."

3. I should be grateful for confirmation that this statement is factual.

1. At Reference, you asked for confirmation that no unauthorised military activity occurred in the UKADR on 8 Mar 97.

2. Having consulted HQ 11/18 Gp, I can confirm that there was no such military activity reported anywhere and, specifically, in the Kent/Folkstone area.

3. Additional inquiries with AIS LATCC, West Drayton, have also confirmed that no unusual or unauthorised air activity, civil or military, was reported or observed in that area on that date. LATCC holds a radar recording of air traffic in the Folkstone area for 8 Mar 97. As a precaution, since the Home Secretary was involved, I have asked for the tape to be preserved until 31 Jul 97 in case further enquiries are launched.

4. Could I have something soon please.

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


Thank you for your letter of 30 January concerning the alleged UFO sighting at the former Home Secretary's home in Kent.

As a result of your letter Kent County Constabulary have rechecked their records between the 1-15 March 1997 and have confirmed that no security incident took place at the property in question between these dates or that they have had any correspondence with the matter.

Given what the police have had to say, it is doubtful whether much could be gained from a meeting with officials. However should you consider that such a meeting would be helpful then the meeting would be willing to attend and could arrange for a representative from Kent County Constabulary to be present.

Many thanks for your quick response to my Freedom of Information request.

Would it be possible for me to obtain a copy of everything that is connected to the Burmarsh sighting, such as all corresponence relating to the case, both official and non official?

You state that the Home Office stated that there was no such security incident involving the Home Secretary. Are they saying that there was no security incident at all at the residence of the then Home Secretary? Did your department contact them recently regarding this? If they deny this, then it does seem strange that the Chairman of the Kent Police Authority Sir John Grudgeon, informed me in writing that he recieved a confidential report from the Deputy Chief Constable of Kent County Constabulary that there was indeed a security incident at the said property, but that it was minor in nature.

It seems that the Home Office were a bit economical with the truth, or the Kent Constabulary failed to inform them of the security incident at the Home Secretarys' residence. Does seem somewhat odd wouldn't you say?

I would like to state that I do not believe that what occurred at Burmarsh on the 8 March, 1997 involved anything that is possibly connected to so called extra-terrestrial phenomena. I believe it may have had some connection with the military, be it an excercise or otherwise.

It does seem strange that the whole incident could have been closed just by someone at the MOD or elsewhere stating that it was an Army helicopter on manouvers.

I look forward to hearing from you in due course, and thank you in advance for your help in this matter.


I am writing concerning your Freedom of Information request for a list of the amounts of calls the Ministry of Defence received from Flintshire, Wrexham, Denbighshire, Conwy, Gwynedd and Anglesey claiming a UFO sighting. Your request has been passed to this Department because we are the focal point within the Ministry of Defence for correspondence concerning UFOs.

The MOD does not keep lists of the amounts of calls we receive from specific areas of the UK. We receive reports of UFO sightings in a number of different ways including by letter, e-mail, telephone calls on our answer-phone and via Police or RAF Stations. The messages left on our answer-phone are listened to daily and the details recording on a form. All of the correspondence and reports we receive are filed on paper files in the order in which they are received and are not segregated by date or geographical area. We currently hold details of UFO sightings reported to the MOD and public correspondence about UFOs (some of which also contain sighting reports) spanning a 25 year period. The cost of searching all of these records for reports specifically from the areas you have mentioned would exceed the permitted £600 limit set for compliance with the Freedom of Information Act 2000 and as provided by Section 12 of the Act, the Ministry of Defence is not obliged to comply with your request. However, you may wish to be aware that in order to assist members of the public we are compiling a database of all the sighting reports we have received in date order. This has now been completed for sightings between 2002- 2005 and can be viewed in the Disclosure Log on the Freedom of Information page of the MOD website at http://:www.mod.uk.

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

I am writing concerning your Freedom of Information request (addressed to Secretariat 2a) for documents relating to the "start of the collaboration between Section 40 (MOD S4), Section 40 (RAF), and Section 40 (DI55)" and their investigations into five UFO sightings in 1967. You may wish to note our new title and address given at the head of this letter.

While I am not familiar with the three individuals you have named, it may be helpful if I explain how UFO sighting reports are handled by the Ministry of Defence and the relationship between the departments concerned. Directorate of Air Staff (previously S4) is the focal point within the MOD for UFO sighting reports and correspondence about UFO matters. The Directorate of Counter Terrorism and UK Operations (DCT&UK Ops) have responsibility for the integrity of UK airspace and DI55 is a Defence Intelligence branch who at one time looked at UFO sighting reports to see if they provided anything useful in their task of analysing the performance and threat of foreign weapons systems, nuclear, chemical and biological warfare programmes and technologies and emerging technologies. During the period of your request UFO sighting reports would have been seen by all three of these departments and it is possible that the individuals you have named were incumbents of these posts.

With regard to your request for documents concerning the collaboration between these branches and their investigations into UFO sightings in 1967, I should inform you that the MOD does not carry out any such investigations. In 1967 S4 would have been responsible for handling incoming UFO reports, correspondence and media issues and the other two branches would have briefly looked at the reports they received to see if there was anything of interest to them in their roles described above. Government records are destroyed once they are no longer required and before 1967 all "UFO" files were destroyed after five years, as there was insufficient public interest in the subject to merit their permanent retention. However since 1967, following an increase in public interest in this subject "UFO" report files are now routinely preserved. Any files from 1967 which did survive are now available for examination at The National Archives, Ruskin Avenue, Kew, Richmond, Surrey, TW9 4DU, Telephone: 0208 876 3444. Details of how to access these records and The National Archives on line catalogue can be found on their website at http://:www.nationalarchives.gov.uk.

I am writing concerning your freedom of information requests for information about UFO sightings in the Berwyn Mountains on the 23 January 1974 and for UFO sightings reported in Shropshire in the last five years. Your requests have been passed to this department as we are the focal point within the Ministry of Defence for correspondence about UFOs. Please accept this reply as a response to both requests.

With regard to your request for information about the alleged events in the Berwyn Mountains, I can advise you that the MOD UFO report files for 1974 are no longer held by the MOD, but are now open for public viewing at The National Archives, Richmond, Surrey. Details of the records held at The National Archives, (including an on line catalogue) and how to access them, can be found on The National Archives website at <u>www.nationalarchives.gov.uk</u>.

As for your request for details of sightings in Shropshire in the last five years, I should inform you that this department holds UFO sighting reports and correspondence about UFO matters (some of which also contain reports of sightings) for the full 5 year period of your request. However they are not segregated by geographical area, or held electronically, but are filed on paper files in the order in which they were received. This means in order to locate reports specifically from Shropshire, a manual search of hundreds of paper records would be required. Clearly, such an exercise would quickly exceed the permitted £600 cost limit set for compliance with the Freedom of Information Act. I can advise you, however, that in order to assist members of the public we are compiling a database giving brief details from sighting reports received throughout the UK and this has now been completed for sightings from 2002 to 2005. These records include some sightings from Shropshire, so if you wish to view these details please look at the MOD website at http://www.mod.uk/DefenceInternet/FreedomOfInformation/PublicationScheme/SearchPublicationScheme/UfoReports200.

With regard to your enquiry about the names of witness, I am sorry that in accordance with the Data Protection Act 1998 we are unable to provide personal data concerning those who have corresponded with the MOD.

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

I am writing concerning your Freedom of Information request for details of UFO sightings in Bromley and Bexley. Your request has been passed to this Department as we are the focal point within the Ministry of Defence for correspondence regarding UFO matters. Several attempts to send this information by e-mail have failed, so I am replying by post. If you have now received my e-mails, please ignore this letter.

You have not specified a time period which interests you, so it might be helpful if I explain what information we hold and what is already available. The MOD files containing UFO reports received between 1967 and 1978 are fully open for viewing at The National Archives in Richmond, Surrey. A few records have survived from the 1950s and early 1960s and these are also available. The National Archives on line catalogue and details of how to access these records can be viewed on their website at <u>www.nationalarchives.gov.uk</u>. Records from 1979 to date are still held by the MOD. These consist of records of UFO sightings reported to the MOD and public correspondence about UFOs (some of which also contain sighting reports). These records are not held electronically, but are filed on paper files in the order in which they were received. They are not segregated by geographical area.

With regard to your particular request, it is not possible for us to search all of our records for sighting reports specifically from Bromley and Bexley without exceeding the permitted £600 limit set for compliance with Section 12 of the Freedom of Information Act 2000. However, we are in the process of compiling a database of sightings which has now been completed for the years 2002 to date. A search of these records has revealed only one sighting from Bromley during this period. There were none from Bexley. Details of the Bromley sighting are as follows;

At 02.25 on 17 November 2003 two adults and a child in Bromley saw 20-30 red flashing lights in the sky accompanied by a whirring noise. The family called the Police who confirmed the sighting. The Policeman using a lamppost as a marker concluded that the lights were zigzagging/turning across the sky at speeds faster than any man-made aircraft. The crew of a Police helicopter which was airborne at the time also confirmed they saw the lights, but thought they might be lights of aircraft on the approach to London Heathrow Airport. We do not hold details of the exact location of the witnesses, nor their age or sex. As for your questions about the MOD's response, I should inform you that the MOD examines reports of UFO sightings solely to establish whether there is any evidence that the United Kingdom's airspace might have been compromised by hostile or unauthorised air activity. Unless there is evidence of a potential threat to the United Kingdom from an external source we do not attempt to identify the precise nature of each reported sighting. We believe it is possible that rational explanations, such as aircraft lights or natural phenomena, could be found for them, but it is not the function of the MOD to provide this kind of aerial identification service and we could not justify expenditure of public funds on investigations which go beyond our specific defence remit. On this occasion the MOD was satisfied that this report did not represent anything of air defence interest.

Information can be found in the Publication Scheme, the Disclosure Log and the Freedom of Information Top Choices. New information is added whenever possible.

I am writing concerning your request for information about military aircraft activity in the area around Sanquhar and Carronbridge Village at 10.30pm on 9 February 2006.


As explained in my previous correspondence, military aircraft do not fly fixed flight paths, but plan their sorties individually. Fixed wing aircraft travel hundreds of miles on an individual sortie, so aircraft seen in any area, do not necessarily originate from a RAF Station in the immediate vicinity. The flight plans for these sorties are held by each Squadron and with the exception of aircraft conducting low flying training (below 2000 feet) no records are kept centrally. It is, therefore, not possible to identify whether there were any aircraft in the Sanquhar / Carronbridge area at the time you have specified without checking the individual flight plans of any aircraft that could have been flying. The cost of conducting such a task would exceed the permitted £600 limit set for compliance with the Freedom of Information Act 2000 and as provided by Section 12 of the Act, the Ministry of Defence is not obliged to comply with your request. I can, however, inform you that military aircraft conducting low flying training are required to make a booking to fly in individual low flying areas. I have checked the night low flying area which covers this area and there were no fixed wing (jet or transport aircraft) or rotary wing (helicopters) booked to low fly at the time you have specified.

I hope this is helpful.
