These are amendments to bring the documents into line with current MoD practice and therefore the documents do not exactly match those that appeared on the website. The MoD file on this matter, D/Sec(AS)/12/7 Part A, is one of the files the MoD will be transferring to The National Archives as part of a programme to transfer some 160 files covering the period 1978-2007. It is not possible to state when the file will actually be transferred, but it is expected it will be within the next 12 months. Therefore, under exemption s.22 (Information Intended for Future Publication) the MoD is not obliged to provide you with the information you requested.

This is not the end of the matter, of course; section 22 is a qualified exemption, meaning that the MOD must assess the balance of public interest in release of the information.

Whilst there is undoubtedly public interest in this file being released to the public as it will enable them to have a more informed view of the MoD's role in this incident, there is no overriding reason why the public should have the information immediately. Indeed it could be argued, that by releasing files in chronological order, the public will be able to follow the role of the MoD in a more logical and orderly fashion, and to view actions in their correct historical perspective.

It is part of effective administration of government that the publication of information is planned and managed within the department responsible. The release of this file will undermine this release process, and delay the release of other files (which other members of the public may be waiting for) as work on them would necessarily have to be put off.

Finally, the release programme itself is complicated and the release of files out of sequence will result in unnecessary confusion for the MoD, The National Archives and, indeed, the public when they are attempting to track files once they are transferred.

Thank you for your Freedom of Information request of 4 June 2008 asking for a copy of the ministerial submission on the transfer of UFO files dated 18 September 2007 and the response dated 25 September 2007. Additionally, you asked for copies of any dialogue directly related to the two documents which took place between those dates. Finally, you asked for details of any formal, minuted, meetings regarding the transfer of the UFO files.

The ministerial submission and response are withheld under s.35(Formulation of Government Policy). Section 35(1)(a) of the Act provides that information may be exempt from disclosure if it would, or would be likely to, prejudice the formulation or development of government policy. The decision to proactively release such a large number of files to The National Archives (TNA), was quite clearly a matter of government policy.

This is not the end of the matter, of course; section 35 is a qualified exemption, meaning that the MOD must assess the balance of public interest in release of the information. We have done this at several levels and although the arguments are the same as outlined in my e-mailed dated 11 December 2007 in response to your FOI request 08-10-2007-090830-001, I reproduce them below:

i. There is an undoubted public interest in the public being able to assess the quality of advice being given to ministers and subsequent decision making based on that advice. Given the level of interest in the matter amongst a small but vociferous section of the public, and the probability that ill informed speculation and conspiracy theories are likely to be rife, it is reasonable that the public have a right to know why the Ministry of Defence has made its decision to release the UFO/UAP files.

ii. Greater transparency makes government more accountable to the electorate and increases trust; if by releasing these discussion papers we were to demonstrate that the decision to proceed was one taken on good advice and following a sensible debate, this may have a positive effect in increasing public confidence in government decision-making. However, if the advice and debate behind policy-making were routinely disclosed, officials may be less willing to offer frank advice or ministers may be less willing to explore the full range of policy options. There is a risk that officials could come under pressure not to challenge ideas in the formulation of policy, thus leading to poorer decision making. Ministers and officials also need to be able to conduct rigorous and candid risk assessments of their policies in a free space without constant scrutiny. Discussions surrounding the release of these files are still on going. This is a major exercise, which I believe is unique in MoD history. The MoD will be proactively placing a large number of files less that 30 years old in TNA in both paper and importantly, electronic format. The practical difficulties of this are still under discussion and may well continue to be for some time. As we work on the transfer of these files to TNA, we are coming across a number of challenges and need to be able to discuss and seek solutions without the concern that our discussions will be placed in the public domain while this process is ongoing.

Taking the above arguments into account, in this case, we believe that it would not be in the public interest to disclose the specific information you have asked for surrounding the decision to place the DIS and DAS UFO/UAP files in TNA. That having been said, I believe that you already have a clear explanation of the rational behind the transfer of these files from your previous questions. There has

already been considerable public discussion around the decision transfer our files and it is already clear that the primary reason behind the decision was the volume of FOI requests received by the MoD and that the transfer was a practical and efficient way of handling them.

Once a policy decision has been taken and the policy implemented, the position can be reconsidered and it may be that any factual background information can then be disclosed.

I am not aware of any dialogue directly related to the ministerial submission during the period in question. I do not re-call any correspondence or conversations requesting further information or clarification of any of the issues raised between the submission being sent to the Ministers outer office on 18th September and being informed of his decision on 25th September 2007.

I am aware of two formal, minuted, meetings that took place regarding the transfer of the UFO documents. The first took place on 1 October 2007 and the second on 8 January 2008. Both were concerned with the complex practical arrangements for the transfer itself, rather than the actual decision to transfer the files.

I appreciate that you will be disappointed with this response, however, if you have any more specific questions, I will attempt to answer them.



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Thank you for your Freedom of Information request of 26 June 2008 requesting a copy from our files of a document in your possession concerning what is known as the Rendlesham Incident. Additionally, you asked for material that accompanied this document, a voice recording, (allegedy of aliens talking), other documents relating to the department that wrote the letter and any documents written by the author of the document that refer to the incident including those written to other departments.

The Ministry of Defence (MoD) holds a file with documentation surrounding an alleged incident at RAF Bentwaters, which has become known as the Rendlesham Incident. The document you provided is not contained on that file. I assume since you already have copy of the document, you are seeking to confirm that it is genuine and I think it only fair to state that I believe it to be a rather poor "fake". It rather follows that we do not hold the tape of the aliens talking either. We cannot identify who wrote the letter as the name has been blanked out and therefore cannot identify any other documentation the individual allegedly wrote.

The Rendlesham Incident has aroused consistent interest from members of the public interested in UFO matters. Most of this information is in the form of letters asking for information which are stored on paper correspondence files (amongst others) in the date order they are received and not on the single file the MoD has on the subject. Answering your request fully would involve checking some 100 files, the cost of which would exceed the £600 limit set for compliance with the Freedom of Information Act and, as provided by Section 12 of the Act, the MoD is not obliged to comply with your request.

As you know, OSI has completed a report on the landing of a craft of unknown origin crewed by several entities near RAF Bentwaters on the night of the December 29/30 1980.

Interestingly, OSI reports that the entities were approximately $1\frac{1}{2}$ meters tall, wearing what appeared to be nylon coated pressure suits, but no helmets. Conditions on the night were misty, giving the appearance that the entities were hovering above ground level.

Tape recordings were made on which the entities are heard to speak in an electronically synthesised version of English, with a strong American accent. Similar transmissions intercepted irregularly by ISA (?) since 1973 (see attachment – Flag 1).

According to OSI, entities had claw-like hands and with three fingers and an opposable thumb.

Despite original reports (Flags 3 - 0), OSI said the craft was not damaged but landed deliberately as part of a series of visits to SAC bases in USA and Europe. Reports that craft was repaired by US serviceman or was taken on to the base are not confirmed by OSI.

Landing is not considered a defence issue in view of the overt peaceful nature of the contact, but investigations by XXX are to be continued on XXX authority. Precautionary plans for counter-information at a local level involving XXX and a XXX XXX is strongly recommended.

Information request of 26 June 2008 requesting a copy from our files of a document in your possession concerning what is known as the Rendlesham Incident. Additionally, you asked for material that accompanied this document, a voice recording, (allegedy of aliens talking), other documents relating to the

department that wrote the letter and any documents written by the author of the document that refer to the incident including those written to other departments.

The Ministry of Defence (MoD) holds a file with documentation surrounding an alleged incident at RAF Bentwaters, which has become known as the Rendlesham Incident. The document you provided is not contained on that file. I assume since you already have copy of the document, you are seeking to confirm that it is genuine and I think it only fair to state that I believe it to be a rather poor "fake". It rather follows that we do not hold the tape of the aliens talking either. We cannot identify who wrote the letter as the name has been blanked out and therefore cannot identify any other documentation the individual allegedly wrote.

The Rendlesham Incident has aroused consistent interest from members of the public interested in UFO matters. Most of this information is in the form of letters asking for information which are stored on paper correspondence files (amongst others) in the date order they are received and not on the single file the MoD has on the subject. Answering your request fully would involve checking some 100 files, the cost of which would exceed the £600 limit set for compliance with the Freedom of Information Act and, as provided by Section 12 of the Act, the MoD is not obliged to comply with your request.

However, if you would like a copy of the MoD file on this matter please let me know. As the file is quite lengthy, we would prefer to provide it on a CD rather than print out a hard copy, although you are entitled to a hard copy if you wish.

You may be interested to know that UFO files for 1967 to 1987, and any files prior to 1967 which have survived, are now available for examination at The National Archives, Ruskin Avenue, Kew, Richmond, Surrey, TW9 4DU, Telephone: 0208 876 3444. Thank you for your Freedom of Information request of 21 June 2008 asking for a copy of the police report into an alleged UFO sighting that took place at 12.40am on Sunday 8th June 2008. Additionally, you asked for any information from other sources concerning this alleged incident, whether the alleged UFO was recorded on radar and what the MoD's position on the incident is.

The Ministry of Defence (MoD) has not received a report from the police on this incident. I would suggest that you contact South Wales Police at Bridgend for a copy. We hold no information on the incident from other witnesses, although we have had a number of Freedom of Information requests from members of the public such as yourself and are aware that an incident has been reported in the media.

Other than confirming whether or not we have actually received a report, the MoD has not investigated this matter, but radar sites have not reported any unusual activity. The MoD does not record Air Traffic Control radar itself but might I suggest that you contact the Civil Aviation Authority at <u>www.caa.co.uk</u>, as they may have records for the date in question.

The MoD examines any reports of 'unidentified flying objects' it receives (and in this case it has not received any report) solely to establish whether what was seen might have some defence significance; namely, whether there is any evidence that the United Kingdom's airspace might have been compromised by hostile or unauthorized foreign military activity.

Unless there is evidence of a potential threat to the United Kingdom from an external military source, and to date no 'UFO' report has revealed such evidence, we do not attempt to identify the precise nature of each sighting reported to us. We believe that rational explanations, such as aircraft lights or natural phenomena, could be found for them if resources were diverted for this purpose, but it is not the function of the MOD to provide this kind of aerial identification service. It would be an inappropriate use of defence resources if we were to do so.



Thank you for your Freedom of Information request of 29 May 2008 asking why information in paragraph 6 of the background briefing note to PQ0047 and PQ0048 had been redacted and for the background note to be released to you without that redaction. Additionally, you asked whether there was any correspondence between the MoD and the Defence Radiological Protection Service (DRPS) regarding the Rendlesham Incident during the period 1991-94. I assume by MoD, that you mean Sec(AS), as the DRPS was itself an integral part of the MoD. If this is incorrect, please let me know.

Firstly, the information redacted from paragraph 6 of the background note was withheld under exemption s.40 (Personal Information) as it related to an official's private activities outside their duties at the MoD. This remains the case and therefore I can see no grounds for releasing the information. I should point out for future reference that I believe the relevant PQ numbers were actually 0861i and 0862i.

The DAS and DIS UFO files for this period are due for transfer to The National Archives and therefore, as provided by exemption s.22 (Information intended for future publication) of the Freedom of Information Act 2000, the MoD is not obliged to comply with this part of your request. However, I have checked with the Defence Science and Technology Laboratory, who now hold the relevant DRPS files, but they can find no correspondence between them and Sec(AS) during the period 1991-94 on the subject of Rendlesham. They were approached by a member of Sec(AS), but this was by telephone only, although they believe that a note of the conversation was made by Sec (AS).

On 10 August 2007, you sent me a substantive response to an FOIA enquiry that I submitted on various Parliamentary Questions by Lord Hill Norton on UFOs? Please treat this as a separate follow up to that enquiry and kindly note various attachments, scanned jpeg images for your reference.

Attached there are two pages from a background note that you sent to me via post and there is a scan of a page from 'Open Skies Closed Minds' a book by Nick Pope former MoD UFO desk officer.

In the attached scan HillNortonPQs0048, one of the papers you sent there are redacted sections at paragraph 6. If you examine the first redaction, it is plain to see that this information is already in the public domain and refers to Nick Pope, as evidenced in attached scan OSMCNickPope and marked with red underline and arrow, showing it was Nick Pope who made the enquiry to the Defence Radiological Protection Service.

Here's my questions and request relevant to these papers.

In paragraph 6 of HillNortonPQs0048 (attached) there is another redaction concerning explanations offered by the Defence Radiological Protection Service.

1. a) Why was this information redacted, what exemption was applied? b) May I ask for the rerelease of this background note paper without the latter redactions and that offer alternate explanations for the higher than normal radiation levels involved in the Rendlesham Forest alleged UFO of December 1980. The grounds upon which I make this request are primarily because this information concerns an event which happened nearly 30 years ago, at an American USAF air force base that has long since closed down. I cannot see what exemption currently within the use of the FOIA should prevent the release of this information, if put to a public interest test, there's a strong chance it would be released, unless you can inform of some other reason why it should not?

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frenzy.' Someone on the recording says, 'All the barnyard animals have gotten quiet now.' Other witnesses remembered the animal agitation. Was this caused by the low-frequency hum of an alien craft, or, more sinister still, does it have some connection with animal mutilations?

Despite some high-level pressure brought to bear by Lord Hill-Norton, who, it will be remembered, was a chief of the defence staff and chairman of the NATO Military Committee; and from Sir Patrick Wall MP and Ralph Noyes, who was a former head of DS8 himself, nothing concrete was done. When Halt's report became public in 1983, the media had a field day. 'UFO LANDS IN SUFFOLK' trumpeted the News of the World on its front page on 2 October. 'And that's official.'

There has been a steady stream of letters from the public over the years, but inevitably, fact and fiction intertwined until Rendlesham Forest became a myth. Rendlesham Forest is the British Roswell – we know that something happened, but we don't know what. I believe the Ministry of Defence squandered a major opportunity by not investigating the incident in detail at the time. The trail has now gone cold: the airbase has gone, the personnel have gone; even a great swathe of the forest has been cut down – on account, some say, of the massive radiation to the trees. Brenda Butler was unable to discover who had felled the trees or what had happened to them.

One aspect of Rendlesham has been consistently ignored by ufologists and yet, to me, it is the most tangible proof that something extraordinary happened there, and that is the radiation readings. I contacted the Defence Radiological Protection

vice, attached to Haslar, the Institute of Naval Medicine in Sosport, Hampshire. Contrary to the claim made in Strange But True?, the readings were in fact ten times higher than normal, and the military Geiger counters used were probably designed to measure much higher levels of radiation, so the scale at the lower end might have been less sensitive, making accurate readings difficult. It is also possible that the night hours were not the best time to take readings, although Halt's careful figures – 0.05 and 0.07 rather than the average of 0.06 – suggest that a great deal of precision was involved. Most ufologists have concentrated on the bizarre non-human shapes in the craft and their meeting with senior personnel. It is human nature to focus on the most dramatic and exciting aspects, and this is the stuff of contactee legend, the closest of close encounters. In comparison the actual physical proof of the radiation readings pales into relative insignificance. Yet this does not say much for the general standard of scientific research among ufologists, and does little to enhance their credibility.

S owhat did happen in Rendlesham Forest? There have been some quite extraordinary attempts to explain away the events described in LteCol Halt's report. One comes from science writer Ian Halpath, whose theory is that the flashing, pulsating lights in trees were actually the rotating beams from Orford Ness Institutionse six miles away. BACKGROUND NOTE:

1. Lord Hill-Norton has a long-standing interest in "UFOs", was a member of the (now defunct) House of Lords All-Party "UFO" Study Group, and has written forewords for two books on the subject. He has previously written to Ministers supporting individual "ufologist" causes.

2. The MOD position on "UFO" sightings is that we examine any reports received solely to establish whether what was seen might have some defence significance; namely, whether there is any evidence that the UK Air Defence Region might have been compromised by hostile or unauthorized foreign military activity. Unless there is evidence of a potential military threat, and to date no "unidentified flying object" sighting has revealed such evidence, we do not attempt to identify the precise nature of each reported incident.

3. The alleged incidents referred to in the 1981 memorandum occurred between 27-29 December 1980 when unusual lights were seen by USAF personnel, including the Deputy Base Commander, outside RAF Woodbridge. A report of the sighting written some two weeks after the events (copy attached) was forwarded to the MOD by the RAF Liaison Officer at RAF Bentwaters. The report was examined by the Department at the time and no evidence of any matter of defence significance was found. This is of course the Department's only interest in such sightings.

4. This incident is regularly quoted by the media and 'ufologists' as evidence of "UFOs" penetrating the UK Air Defence Region. However, all available evidence was examined at the time and nothing of defence concern was judged to have occurred in the location on the nights in question. No additional information has come to light over the last 16½ years which calls the original judgement into question.

5. It was then, and continues to be the case that witnesses are not routinely contacted following receipt of a "UFO" report. It would only have been necessary to contact Lt Col Halt (or any other witness) had there been any indication that the sighting was of defence relevance and further information . was required.

6. The PQs may have been prompted by the publication of two books, one on "UFOs" and the other on "Alien Abductions" by a former member of Sec(AS), Mr Nicholas Pope. The incident is discussed in Mr Pope's first book. He states that the radiation readings taken by USAF personnel at the site were unusually high. There is, however, no evidence that any analysis of the radiation readings reported at the site was undertaken at the time. It can only be assumed now that in view of the assessment made at the time by the relevant air defence experts that the UK air defence region had not been compromised, no analysis of the reported readings was judged necessary.

The Defence Science and Technology Laboratory (Dstl) is the custodian of the files created by what was the Defence Radiological Protection Service (DRPS) and later became known as the Defence Evaluation and Research Agency Radiation Protection Services. Dstl have searched the files for the period mentioned and can confirm that there are no records of the type requested.

The above finding is not unexpected, as DRPS received many ah-hoc radiation-related enquiries. These enquiries covered a wide range of topics and the nature of any records maintained related to their apparent significance to DRPS's role, which was to provide radiation-related hrealth and safety advice to Ministry of Defence civilians and the UK Armed Forces. In this context, and given the nature of Mr Pope's enquiry and the lack of health risk associated with the doserates mentioned, it is not surprising that there are no records of what seems to have been a purely informal telepone conversation. Conversely, when it became apparent that this topic was attracting public interest, records of related correspondence were kept and an example from 1998 which summarises the DRPS position is attached for your information.

It is hoped this is helpful.

Dstl search report:

1. Records/documents related to this type of incident are usually recorded in the pack for unusual occurrences (pack no. 175/015). Searching this pack between the period 1991 - 1994 yielded no documents related to the radiation monitoring incident at RAF Bentwaters/Woodbridge.

2. A further search for files related to RAF Bentwaters/Woodbridge over this period has been conducted, but no such files exist.

3. A DRPS health physicist, Section 40, was contacted by Nick Pope (who for the period 1991 – 1994 was Sec(AS) 2a with responsibility for conducting UFO investigations). There are no DRPS files relating to this meeting, the only evidence being a note (figure 1) written by Nick Pope on 15/04/1994[1]^{, 2}, which has been commented on in the public domain by ufologists[2]. 

Thank you for your letter of 19 August (ref A). You will recall from our previous correspondence (Refs B and C) that in my original discussions with Mr Pope I did indeed state that the readings were around 10 times normal background levels, provided that the instrument was appropriate for measuring background radiation (at the time of our discussions he could not state what the instrument was), calibrated and being used/interpreted correctly.

I share the NRPB view that the use of a high-range survey instrument to measure (accurately) environmental levels of radiation is somewhat questionable and this must throw some doubt on the validity of the data reported.

I hope this is of use to you.



This office is the focal point within the Ministry of Defence for correspondence relating to UFOs. Sorry for the delay in replying, this Department has been very busy.

First, it may be helpful if I explain that the Ministry of Defence examines any reports of 'unidentified flying objects' it receives solely to establish whether what was seen might have some defence significance; namely, whether there is any evidence that the United Kingdom's airspace might have been compromised by hostile or unauthorised air activity. Unless there is evidence of a potential threat to the United Kingdom from an external source, and to date no 'UFO' report has revealed such evidence, we do not attempt to identify the precise nature of each sighting reported to us. We believe that rational explanations, such as aircraft lights or natural phenomena, could be found for them if resources were diverted for this purpose, but it is not the function of the MOD to provide this kind of aerial identification service. It would be an inappropriate use of defence resources if we were to do so.

With regards to your request for recent UFO sighting reports for the year 2007, the Ministry of Defence Information website has a database which contains information on UFO sighting reports from the year 1997 up to 2007. This can be accessed via the internet at: <u>http://www.mod.uk/DefenceInternet/FreedomofInformation/PublicationScheme</u>, by searching under 'UFO' reports.

You may also wish to be aware that the MOD has already released a great deal of information about UFOs which is available for public viewing. MOD files were routinely destroyed until 1967, when they were generally preserved for The National Archives. A few have survived before 1967 and these together with records up to 1987 are now available for public viewing. It would be an inappropriate use of defence resources if we were to do so.

A few have survived before 1967 and these together with records up to 1987 are now available for public viewing. With regards to your question of requesting to see all information the MOD holds relating to UFOs for the whole of the twentieth century and the present twenty first century, I should inform you that this Department holds details of UFO sightings reported to the MOD spanning a 25 year period. These records are not held electronically, but are filed on paper files in the order in which they are received. Before any of this information can released, personal data has to be removed in accordance with the Data Protection Act 1998. Clearly, if we were to process copies of all these records, the costs would quickly exceed the permitted £600 limit set by the Freedom of Information Act 2000, and as provided by Section 12 of the Act, the Ministry of Defence is not obliged to comply with your request.

You may wish to be aware that the MOD has already released a great deal of information about UFOs which is available for public viewing. MOD files were routinely destroyed until 1967, when they were generally preserved for The National Archives. A few have survived before 1967 and these together with records up to 1987 are now available for public viewing. The National Archives can be contacted at Ruskin Avenue, Richmond, Kew, Surrey TW9 4DU, telephone 0208 876 3444. The National Archives also have a website giving information about the records they hold and how to access them. This can be found on the internet at: http://www.nationalarchives.gov.uk.

Thank you for your Freedom of Information request of 26 April 2008 asking for details of UFO sightings reported under the Condor/Murphy/Anymouse/Acorn schemes during 2006-07. Additionally, you asked for details of these schemes including inception dates, the Service they related to, their predecessors and the retention regime. Additionally, you asked for similar details for the Defence Confidential Occurrence Reporting Scheme.

There have been no reports submitted under any of the MoD's Confidential Flight Safety Reporting Systems (Condor/Murphy/Anymouse/Acorn or DCORS) for the years asked for 2006/07. This is not surprising as the schemes are essentially for personnel to report technical or engineering problems with aircraft or, on occasion, failure to follow existing safety procedures.

Regarding the schemes requested, there appears to be no information available concerning the inception dates of Condor/Murphy/Anymouse/Acorn. There are however, Condor and Murphy reports at the Directorate Aviation Regulations & Safety (DARS) dating back some 35 years, but no UFO related reports have been found. Records for Anymouse and Acorn were checked for some 20 years with similar results. As these schemes have been around as far back as anyone can remember, there are no previous schemes which anyone is aware of, or holds information or reports on. Details of the schemes are as follows:

a. Condor/Murphy. RAF Confidential Flight Safety Reporting System, Condor for Aircrew and Murphy for Groundcrew. Historically, reports were sent to the Head of the Inspectorate of Flight Safety (IFS) and following the introduction of the Defence Aviation Safety Centre (DASC) in 2000, these were sent to the Director DASC. DASC retained all previous Condors and Murphy reports and DARS continue to hold this data.

Thank you for your Freedom of Information request of 26 April 2008. You asked a number of questions that I shall respond to in turn. DIS will respond separately.

In addition to volume of requests, what other factors contributed to the eventual decision to release the UFO files?

The overriding reason to release the files to the public through The National Archives was to reduce the level of work taken up in answering UFO related FOI requests. Additionally, it was considered that the Freedom of Information Act had made eventual, if piecemeal, full release inevitable. By establishing our own programme of release, the files could be placed in the public domain in an orderly fashion avoiding duplication of effort. There were also considered to be presentational advantages to the MoD in releasing this information voluntarily. Additionally, it was considered that the files themselves contained minimal amounts of information of direct defence relevance.

To what extent did these other factors influence the decision to release?

This question is difficult to answer satisfactorily as all the above factors needed to be considered in the decision making process. However, if you are looking for external influences other than volume of work, then I am afraid that there are none. I am aware that there has been a considerable degree of speculation that the French release of their own files played a part in our decision to release our own files. Other than noting it increased media and internet speculation on the subject of UFOs, this is simply not the case. There has also been speculation that the decision of the MoD to release its UFO files is part of an international agreement, allegedly to prepare the worlds population for the news that aliens are amongst us. I am afraid any such speculation is pure fantasy.

When was the idea of a wholesale release first suggested?

The notion of a wholesale release has been discussed within DAS for some years and is certainly not new. It was considered by my predecessor but not taken up primarily due to the heavy workload created by answering FOI requests. I had discussed the matter with her informally (it was not within my remit at the time) whilst she was still in post in 2006 and held informal discussions with my line managers and my opposite number in DIS, when I first covered the post on a temporary basis in late 2006 and early 2007.

What specifically triggered the idea?

The DIS decision to review their files for release caused DAS to revisit the question of release themselves.

Details of meetings to discuss release?

The MoD held, and continues to hold, a number of meetings to discuss the release. These have involved, at various times, staff from DAS, DIS, Corporate Memory, MoD Press Office and The

National Archives. Chairmanship of these meetings was based on the subject matter and who called the meetings. The majority have been quite informal, without title or minutes.

What dates were key stages reached in decision to release and what were those stages?

On 18 September 2007 a Ministerial Submission was sent to the Under Secretary of State for Defence asking him to agree the proposal to release the UFO files. This was agreed on 25 September 2007. I can think of no other key stages.

Does DAS have a projected schedule for release? If not, when does it expect to have one? Please provide a copy.

Any schedule for release is dependent upon files being accepted by The National Archives and until such time as this happens, it is not possible to provide a meaningful schedule. However, it is hoped that files covering the period 1979-92 will be released over 2008, those covering 1992-2000 in the 2009 and the remainder in 2010. It is planned that files will be released throughout the year rather than in a single batch. Naturally, if we are able to release files ahead of this schedule, we will do so.

Have any FOI requests been refused on the grounds of the scheduled release. Please provide copies of requests and answers.

Two FOI requests have been refused by DAS under exemption s.22. Both are attached for your information. Personal information has been withheld under exemption s.40.

Are the records relating to the decision to release held in a particular file? If yes what is the reference and title?

Thank you for your Freedom of Information request of 28 February 2008 asking for the release of as many documents on UFOs and the alien phenomena as possible. Additionally, you asked for information on the above topic that is at Secret, Top Secret or above Top Secret level of classification. You also asked for the re-publication of any information on UFOs that might have been withdrawn from the MoD website. Further to that you asked for information on Peter Horsley and the Janus case.

You may be interested to know that the MoD will shortly be commencing a programme to release some 160 UFO and UFO related files to the National Archive. The files from the Directorate of Air Staff and the Defence Intelligence Staff will cover the period from the late 1970s to 2007. The files themselves will be released in accordance with the same principles that the MoD applies when it releases information for Freedom of Information requests such as yours. The files will be released in chronological order and the programme is likely to take some three years to complete. A public announcement will be made when the first files are ready for viewing at the National Archive. Only a handful of files and documents are actually classified as Secret, but Ministers are content for them to be released, subject to Defence or National Security concerns (for example if they discuss radar capability or weapons capability). Whilst I have not looked at these documents recently, I expect that we will only need to withhold minimal amounts of information on these grounds. Therefore, as provided by exemption s.22 (information intended for future publication) of the Freedom of Information Act 2000 the MOD is not obliged to comply with this part of your request.

I am unaware of the MoD holding any files or documents on UFOs or aliens that are classified as Top Secret and there is no classification of Above Top Secret.

I am sorry to hear that you have had difficulty locating documents on UFOs on the MoD website. It is possible that there were difficulties with the website when you tried. Might I suggest that you search in both the Publication Scheme and the Disclosure Log under the subject of UFO. However, I can confirm that the MoD file on the so called Rendlesham Incident, together with information relating to the Corsham incident have been removed from the website.

Whilst investigating the best way to the release our UFO files, it became clear that placing letters from non MoD sources such as members of the public on our website, without the express agreement of the individuals who wrote those documents, would place the MoD in breach of copyright. Since the above documents contain a great many documents written by the public, and we simply do not have the resources to trace every individual who wrote to us, we recently (within the last week) withdrew the above document from publication. It may have been possible to leave the MoD documents on the website, but it was felt that the remaining documentation made little sense without the public correspondence that related to it. That having been said, not only will this information be released at a future date to the National Archive as part of the release programme I mentioned earlier, but we can still release the information to members of the public as part of a direct response to a Freedom of Information request as the responsibility for complying with copyright legislation effectively transfers to the individual requesting the information.

Finally, you have asked a copy of the Peter Horsley and Janus case file. I am unaware of any such

file existing.





It is being treated as a new Freedom of Information request. Your outstanding request for a copy of the MoD's file on Rendlesham will be answered very shortly. Additionally, you asked whether files on other cases would be released and if not, where they can be viewed on line.

The Rendlesham Incident has aroused consistent interest from member of the public interested in UFO matters. Most of this is in the form of letters asking for information which are stored on paper correspondence files (amongst others) in the date order they are received and not on the single file the MoD has on the topic. Accurately answering your question would involve manually checking some 100 plus files, the cost of which would exceed the £600 limit set for compliance with the Freedom of Information Act and, as provided by Section 12 of the Act, the Ministry of Defence is not obliged to comply with your request. However, I can tell you that this branch, which is the lead branch for UFO matters within the MoD, has received some 26 requests for information under the Freedom of Information Act on the subject of Rendlesham since 2005.

As you may have seen last week in the press, the MoD is releasing some 160 UFO files over the next three years which will be available for viewing at The National Archives. This will include all the 100 plus files mentioned in my second paragraph, together with other case files. When they are released, you will be able to view them at The National Archives, Ruskin Avenue, Kew, Richmond, Surrey, TW9 4DU, Telephone: 0208 876 3444. 



Thank you for your e-mail of 3 March 2008 on the subject of the MoD position regarding UFO and extra terrestrial behaviour.

I am afraid I can add little to what you have already read.

The MoD is not charged with investigating the existence of extra terrestrial life and it is certainly not funded to do so. Nothing we have seen to date gives us any reason to believe that UFOs or extra terrestrials are a defence threat to the UK and its interests. Until such time as we are presented with clear evidence of the existence of extra terrestrial lifeforms, and to date we have received none, we remain open minded about their existence and by extension any defence threat they may pose.

The MoD is quite open on this matter and in fact, and you may be interested to know that we will shortly begin releasing some 160 UFO related files to the National Archive. The files will be released in chronological order over a period of three years commencing this year and will cover the late 1970s to 2007.

Thank you for your Freedom of Information request of 29 February 2008 asking whether any military aircraft were flying over Ormskirk at 19:00 on Sunday 24 February 2008.

The MoD has no record of any military aircraft flying within the low flying system at that time. However, this only records flights at 2000ft or below. The MoD does not maintain central records of military flights within the UK above 2000ft and in order to answer your question we would need to contact every flying station in the UK to see where each individual aircraft was at that time. The costs would exceed the permitted £600 limit set for compliance with the Freedom of Information Act and as provided by Section 12 of the Act, the Ministry of Defence is not obliged to comply with your request.

Whilst I cannot provide you with the information you require, I can say that there is only very limited military flying at weekends. It is therefore unlikely, but certainly not impossible, that the lights you saw were from military aircraft. Beyond that, I am afraid that the MoD is not resourced to provide an aerial identification service to the public.

I am writing concerning your Freedom of Information request asking what your sighting could have been on New Year's Eve and if any flying objects are picked up on either airport or national security radars. Your request has been passed to this Department as we are the focal point within the Ministry of Defence for correspondence relating to UFOs.

First, it may be helpful if I explain that the Ministry of Defence (MOD) examines any reports of 'unidentified flying objects' it receives solely to establish whether what was seen may have some defence significance; namely, whether there is any evidence that the United Kingdom's airspace might have been compromised by hostile or unauthorised air activity. Unless there is evidence of a potential threat to the United Kingdom from an external source, and to date no 'UFO' report has revealed such evidence, we do not attempt to identify the precise nature of each sighting reported to us. We believe that rational explanations, such as aircraft lights or natural phenomena could be found for them if resources were diverted for this purpose, but it is not the function of the MOD to provide this kind of aerial identification service. It would be an inappropriate use of defence resources if we were to do so.

It is possible that the cause of the lights may have been picked up by either civilian or military radar. However, I should explain that neither civil nor military radar attempt to identify every radar return they receive and that contrary to what many of the public may think, much of British airspace is uncontrolled and aircraft are entitled to fly without direction from air traffic control. If the radar returns were not giving particular cause for concern or were not interfering with controlled airspace, military and civil radar operators may not have attempted to identify them.



Thank you for your Freedom of Information request of 28 February 2008 asking for the release of as many documents on UFOs and the alien phenomena as possible. Additionally, you asked for information on the above topic that is at Secret, Top Secret or above Top Secret level of classification. You also asked for the re-publication of any information on UFOs that might have been withdrawn from the MoD website. Further to that you asked for information on Peter Horsley and the Janus case.

You may be interested to know that the MoD will shortly be commencing a programme to release some 160 UFO and UFO related files to the National Archive. The files from the Directorate of Air Staff and the Defence Intelligence Staff will cover the period from the late 1970s to 2007. The files themselves will be released in accordance with the same principles that the MoD applies when it releases information for Freedom of Information requests such as yours. The files will be released in chronological order and the programme is likely to take some three years to complete. A public announcement will be made when the first files are ready for viewing at the National Archive. Only a handful of files and documents are actually classified as Secret, but Ministers are content for them to be released, subject to Defence or National Security concerns (for example if they discuss radar capability or weapons capability). Whilst I have not looked at these documents recently, I expect that we will only need to withhold minimal amounts of information on these grounds. Therefore, as provided by exemption s.22 (information intended for future publication) of the Freedom of Information Act 2000 the MOD is not obliged to comply with this part of your request.

I am unaware of the MoD holding any files or documents on UFOs or aliens that are classified as Top Secret and there is no classification of Above Top Secret.

I am sorry to hear that you have had difficulty locating documents on UFOs on the MoD website. It is possible that there were difficulties with the website when you tried. Might I suggest that you search in both the Publication Scheme and the Disclosure Log under the subject of UFO. However, I can confirm that the MoD file on the so called Rendlesham Incident, together with information relating to the Corsham incident have been removed from the website.

Whilst investigating the best way to the release our UFO files, it became clear that placing letters from non MoD sources such as members of the public on our website, without the express agreement of the individuals who wrote those documents, would place the MoD in breach of copyright. Since the above documents contain a great many documents written by the public, and we simply do not have the resources to trace every individual who wrote to us, we recently (within the last week) withdrew the above document from publication. It may have been possible to leave the MoD documents on the website, but it was felt that the remaining documentation made little sense without the public correspondence that related to it. That having been said, not only will this information be released at a future date to the National Archive as part of the release programme I mentioned earlier, but we can still release the information to members of the public as part of a direct response to a Freedom of Information request as the responsibility for complying with copyright legislation effectively transfers to the individual requesting the information.

Only a handful of files and documents are actually classified as Secret, but Ministers are content for them to be released, subject to Defence or National Security concerns (for example if they discuss radar capability or weapons capability). Whilst I have not looked at these documents recently, I expect that we will only need to withhold minimal amounts of information on these grounds. Therefore, as provided by exemption s.22 (information intended for future publication) of the Freedom of Information Act 2000 the MOD is not obliged to comply with this part of your request.

I am unaware of the MoD holding any files or documents on UFOs or aliens that are classified as Top Secret and there is no classification of Above Top Secret.

I am sorry to hear that you have had difficulty locating documents on UFOs on the MoD website. It is possible that there were difficulties with the website when you tried. Might

I suggest that you search in both the Publication Scheme and the Disclosure Log under the subject of UFO. However, I can confirm that the MoD file on the so called Rendlesham Incident, together with information relating to the Corsham incident have been removed from the website.

Whilst investigating the best way to the release our UFO files, it became clear that placing letters from non MoD sources such as members of the public on our website, without the express agreement of the individuals who wrote those documents, would place the MoD in breach of copyright. Since the above documents contain a great many documents written by the public, and we simply do not have the resources to trace every individual who wrote to us, we recently (within the last week) withdrew the above document from publication. It may have been possible to leave the MoD documents on the website, but it was felt that the remaining documentation made little sense without the public correspondence that related to it. That having been said, not only will this information be released at a future date to the National Archive as part of the release programme I mentioned earlier, but we can still release the information to members of the public as part of a direct response to a Freedom of Information request as the responsibility for complying with copyright legislation effectively transfers to the individual requesting the information.

Finally, you have asked a copy of the Peter Horsley and Janus case file. I am unaware of any such file existing.

I am writing concerning your Freedom of Information request asking for copies of any documents held relating to the UFO sighting over Archway, Islington on the 1 February 2007, if the sighting was investigated, the total cost of the investigation and the conclusions drawn. Your request has been passed to this Department as this office is the focal point within the Ministry of Defence for correspondence relating to 'UFOs.'

First, it may be helpful if I explain that the Ministry of Defence examines any reports of 'unidentified flying objects' it receives solely to establish whether what was seen might have some defence significance; namely, whether there is any evidence that the United Kingdom's airspace might have been compromised by hostile or unauthorised air activity. Unless there is evidence of a potential threat to the United Kingdom from an external source, and to date no 'UFO' report has revealed such evidence, we do not attempt to identify the precise nature of each sighting reported to us. We believe that rational explanations, such as aircraft lights or natural phenomena, could be found for them if resources were diverted for this purpose, but it is not the function of the MOD to provide this kind of aerial identification service. It would be an inappropriate use of defence resources if we were to do so.

Enclosed is a copy of the single piece of correspondence of the sighting that was sent to this Department by a member of a UFO research group. Personal details (names, addresses and telephone numbers) have been removed in accordance with section 40 of the Freedom of Information Act 2000. We received no other reports of this specific UFO sighting. The sighting was not investigated, in accordance with the policy outlined above.





I am writing concerning your Freedom of Information request asking for information regarding UFO incident files. Your request has been passed to this Department as we are the focal point within the Ministry of Defence for correspondence relating to UFOs.

First, it may be helpful if I explain that the Ministry of Defence (MOD) examines any reports of 'unidentified flying objects' it receives solely to establish whether what was seen might have some defence significance; namely, whether there is any evidence that the United Kingdom's airspace might have been compromised by hostile or unauthorised air activity. Unless there is evidence of a potential threat to the United Kingdom from an external source, and to date no 'UFO' report has revealed such evidence, we do not attempt to identify the precise nature of each sighting reported to us. We believe that rational explanations, such as aircraft lights or natural phenomena, could be found for them if resources were diverted for this purpose, but it is not the function of the MOD to provide this kind of aerial identification service. It would be an inappropriate use of defence resources if we were to do so.

With regards to information on UFO incidents, copies of UFO sighting reports are not held electronically, but are filed on paper files in the order in which they are received. Before any of this information can be released, personal data has to be removed in accordance with the Data Protection Act 1998. Clearly, if we were to process copies of all these reports, the costs would exceed the permitted £600 limit set for compliance with the Freedom of Information Act 2000 and as provided by Section 12 of the Act, the Ministry of Defence is not obliged to comply with your request.



I have spoken with colleagues and can confirm that neither RAF Cosford or Shawbury received reports of unusual lights over the West Midlands on the dates given and no aircraft were scrambled to intercept UFOs. For your information, you may be interested to know that the MoD will shortly be placing details of UFO sighting reports for the year 2007 on its website www.mod.uk.

The MoD does not have centralised records of every military aircraft flight in the UK. 

Thank you for your Freedom of Information request of 4 December 2007 asking whether a UFO sighting over Bognor on 4 October 2007 had been reported to the MoD. Additionally, you asked whether any aircraft were in the vicinity at the time.

The alleged incident has not been reported to this office which acts as the focal point for UFO reports across the MoD, although we have received a number of Freedom of Information requests on the matter, including your own.

The MoD does not routinely retain radar tape records beyond 30 days and we are therefore unable to answer the second part of your question. It is however, possible that the Civil Aviation Authority may be able to help you. What I can confirm is that the MoD did not send aircraft up on an intercept mission or redirect aircraft already airborne to intercept. No military aircraft were booked into the low flying system in that area.


