This states:

- a captive balloon or kite shall not be flown at a height of more than 60 metres above ground level or within 60 metres of any vessel, vehicle or structure; - a captive balloon shall not be flown within 5 kms of an aerodrome;

a balloon exceeding 2 metres in any linear dimension at any stage of its flight ... shall not be flown in controlled airspace

Another area needing careful policing is that of discretionary powers given to member states under the market access regulation. This provides wide ranging rights of access to carriers holding operating licences. However, member states could limit these rights by using, for example, traffic distribution rules, or measures designed to deal with congestion or environmental problems. The commission itself has substantial rights to oversee and review any restriction imposed by member states - a power which, according to the chairman, should be used effectively.

Ensuring air travellers benefit from the promise of an open and competitive airline industry will depend on the way the rules are policed and enforced and by the laying down of a firm policy for competition and mergers by the Commission, Christopher Chataway concluded.

Thank you for your letter dated 9 July 1992, and for sending a soil sample containing the metallic fragments that appear to be associated with the "crop circle" on your lawn.

As I mentioned on the telephone, I doubt that we will be able to undertake a full laboratory analysis, but $I$ will pass the sample around and try to obtain some views. I will write to you again when $I$ have done this.

I was interested to see the extract that you sent from Section 40 book. There do seem to be similarities between the material you sent and the flakes he describes. It will be interesting to see if the researchers you have contacted can correlate the results of their analysis with the results of the analysis undertaken by Section 40 You might like to take up the suggestion of writing to Section 40 through his publishers, to let him know about what you found.

The fluorescent marking was not from material picked up locally. If the animals were marked in advance, bow was it done? When? By whom?'
Near midnight, Tribal Police Chief Raleigh Tafoya of the Apache Indian Police stopped by to see how the operation was going. 'Did you see the orange light moving around in the sky a while ago?' he asked. It was the kind that always shows up when there's a mutilation. Maybe they're watching you tonight.' Later that night two mutilations occurred a few miles away on a remote mountain slope.

About four weeks after the fuorescent hair - containing some apparently metallic, organic material - had been removed from the animal (for analysis by the Schoenfeld Clinical Laboratories in Albuquerque), the fluorescence suddenly and inexplicably 'turned off'.
Four days before the ultraviolet test, on 2 July, about twenty witaesses observed a disc hovering directly above a state highway inspector's pick-up truck, outside his home in Taos, New Mexico. The object was described as being about 25 to 30 feet in diameter, glowing a brilliant pinkish-orange and emitting a 'crackling' noise similar to that of an electrical high-tension corona discharge. As the witnesses watched, flaky material from the UFO showered down to the ground, some falling on the truck. The small light grey flakes, averaging about one-sixteenth of an inch by about three-sixteenths and as thick as heavy paper, resembled chips of dried paint. Leroy Graham, the highway inspector, collected a substantial amount of the substance in a sterile fruit jar, and Dr Burgess (after having learned of the incident six months later) arranged for an analysis to be conducted by the Schoenfeld laboratory. Dr Robert Schoenfeld found twenty-two elements that generally occur in organic material, plus trace elements of europium, lanthanum, yttrium, platinum and vanadium. In addition, substantial quantities of magnesium and potassium were found. ${ }^{4}$ Dr Schoenfeld told journalist Larry Statser that the substance he tested was of the same chemical composition as the substance discovered on the cow hides he had analyzed previously. He explained that the material was similar to 'slivers or chips of grey paint' with an extremety high' quantity of potassium and magnesium. In fact, the
potassium content was about seventy times higher than the normal amount for earth samples in the Taos area. A test under a spectrometer showed the substance to be similar to Teflon in composition, although both samples proved to be basically organic, "as opposed to a metal compound such as used on aircraft', Schoenfeld said. ${ }^{15}$

Perhaps coincidentally, a mutilated animal, fitting the general age pattern of those marked, was found later that year (or possibly 1979), a short distance from the point where the UFO had hovered over Leroy Graham's home in Taos. On the night before the mutilation, a similar UFO to the one reported in July was again observed in the area. ${ }^{16}$
In a report to the FBI Director alluding to the Taos incident, re tired FBI agent Kenneth Rommel, Jr, who came out of retirement to head a $\$ 50,000 \mathrm{FBI}$ investigation established in early 1979 (the Animal Mutilation Project), concluded as follows:
.. . Some of the individuals that are most vocal to the media have inferred that these flakes are identical with a substance that was taken from cowhides in a controlled test conducted in the Dulce, New Mexico area . . . I have not been able to locate a sample of the substance reportedly collected in the Dulce test, but it has been described as a fluorescent material.

I have to date been unable to confirm any connection between these two substances, and have been told by those that have seen both that they are not identical. However, I would appreciate it if through the use of a G.S. Mass spectroscopy test or any other logical test, these flakes can be identified. This in itself would go a long way to assisting me to discredit the UFO-Cow Mutilation association theory ... 17

The FBI Laboratory Report identified the material as a 'white enamel paint typical of an acrylic latex/emulsion-type exterior house paint' which "appears to have originated from a wood substrate', but that the 'particular origin and/or manufacture of this paint cannot be determined'.

Commenting on the animal mutilations in general, Rommel concluded that 'most credible sources have attributed this damage to

As you asked, I will only forward your personal number for "above average cases", although we receive very little that might fall into this category; nearly all of the reports on our files fall into the lights/discs in the sky category, and in my time here - over a year now - I have not received one report detailing a close encounter such as the sighting of alien entities or an abduction. I suspect that for whatever reason, people feel more comfortable about reporting these more exotic sightings to UFO groups such as yours, and not to us.

I read the copy of UFO Magazine that you sent with interest, and would like to take up your kind offer of receiving it regularly; this will clearly help me in some of the conversations that I have with people who telephone about aspects of the UFO phenomenon, and give me an idea of current ufology issues.

I was interested to hear accounts of the wave of UFO sightings over Hereford, and the airship sightings over London, as I received many calls on these incidents - and got to the bottom of things! I will try to ensure that I keep you informed on these sorts of matters.

I hope this is helpful, and I will do my best to answer any queries that you may have on specific sightings or on more general aspects of the UFO phenomenon.

Dear Mr Noyes,

I am writing to confirm our recent telephone conversation in which we agreed that members of the public writing to the MOD to enquire about, or report sightings of crop circles would be referred to the Centre for Crop Circle Studies. Thank you for your letter dated 7 July in which you asked about our UFO files. The 54 division no longer exists, and this section - Secretariat(Air Staff )Ra is now the point of contact for any questions about UFOs.

I am afraid that the position with regard to access to UFO files is not quite the same as was notified to you by S 4 ; prior to 1967 all UF0 records were destroyed after five years, as was the usual practice at the time. Since then, files will have been sent to the Public Record Office, although as these files are covered by the " 30 year rule", they will not be open to public viewing yet.

I do not know the precise nature of your enquiry, but if you were after a general idea of what our UFO files contain, then $I$ suspect that they are far less exciting than many would suppose. Essentially, they contain letters asking about the official view on the UFO phenomenon, and actual UFO sighting reports. These reports are almost all ones that could be classified as "lights/discs in the sky". In my time here (almost exactly a year) I have not received one report of any "close encounter" or "abduction". From my study of our previous files (ie those that we have cupboard space for here, going back to about 1985!) I can only recall one or two such reports. I suspect that for whatever reason, people might feel more comfortable about making such reports to UFO groups as opposed to contacting us.

When we spoke the other day $I$ promised to let you have some information about recent UFO reports, together with anthing else that might be useful to you.

Please find attached a few papers that I think give a flavour of what is going on at the moment. These comprise two fairly recent sighting reports, and two letters that clearly set out the MOD's position on UFOs. I have deleted the details of names and addresses of witnesses to UFO sightings and of those who correspond with us, in line with our usual policy of protecting their privacy.

1992 continues to be a slow year for UFO sightings; during the first six months of the year we had received only 60 reports - and at least twelve of these almost certainly related to sightings of an illuminated airship over London. Although I might have expected more reports recently (simply because it seems more likely that sightings might increase in the summer months as people are generally outdoors more), this has not happened, and if the current rate of sightings continues, I would anticipate a 1992 total broadly in line with last year's figure of 117 - nothing like the hundreds of reports we got in the late seventies and early eighties!

I hope that you find this material useful.

Thank you for your letter dated 26 June 1992 in which you asked about our UF0 files.

The position with regard to our files is that we keep the recent ones here, but when we run out of space, the oldest files are "archived", and sent to the Public Record office. This means, effectively, that our records in this office go back to about 1985 (available cupboard space is the key factor here!). Previous files are held at the following address:

However, as you may be aware, prior to 1967 all UFO records were destroyed after five years, as was the usual practice at the time. Furthermore, any files at the Public Record Office will be covered by the "30 year rule", remaining closed from public viewing for 30 years after the last action has been taken. Again, this is standard procedure, and applies to all government departments. The upshot of all this is that the only accessible UFO files will be those held here in Sec(AS) - usually dating back little more than five years from the present day, as space dictates.

With regard to access to our files in $\operatorname{Sec}(A S)$, we have always taken the view that we do not release material "en bloc", or open our files for viewing. This is because we would have to treat all requests the same, and once we had released material to one person or group, we would have to do the same for any subsequent requests, as we could not "play any favourites". I am afraid that we simply do not have the time or resources to make such an open-ended commitment. That said, we will always try to be as helpful as possible; if people ask about a specific sighting, we can search our files and release a copy of any UFO report we have received that might tie in. We would have to delete information pertaining to the witnesses identity though, for obvious reasons of privacy. We will also help by answering any questions about MoD policy on UFOs, or enquiries about the number, location and type of reports that we receive. Additionally, when people ask about MoD policy, or write in reporting a UFO sighting, we do suggest that they contact UFO organisations such as BUFORA.

- On this latter point, I suspect that our files are far less exciting than many would suppose. Essentially, they contain letters asking about the official view on the UF0 phenomenon, and actual UFO sighting reports. These reports are almost all ones that could be classified as "lights/discs in the sky". In my time here (almost exactly a year) I have not received one report of any "close encounter" or "abduction". From my study of our previous files I can only recall one or two such reports. I suspect that for whatever reason, people might feel more comfortable about making such reports to UFO groups as opposed to contacting us.

I hope this is helpful. If you have any further questions, I will do my best to help.

Thank you for your letter dated 18 June 1992 in which you asked whether we have a UFO report relating to a sighting over the MoD buildings on Warminster Road, Bath, on 3 June 1992.

I have checked our files, and can confirm that we have not received any reports that would tie in with this date or location. Furthermore, given that nearly a month has elapsed since the sighting, I would not now expect to receive anything, as most UFO reports that are sent to us arrive no more than a week or two after the sighting.

I did speak to a couple of people at our Warminster Road buildings, but neither was aware that there had been any UFO sighting.

I do not know the background to this case, but it may be that the helicopter pilot did not see the object, or that if anything was seen, it was identified by the pilot as something quite ordinary. However, if you track down any further details, I will see what $I$ can do.

One final thought on this point; I do not know if you are in touch with any of the civilian UFO research groups in this country, but if not, you might be interested in writing to them. They are always keen to hear from people, especially - I should imagine - those who are conducting their own research. May I suggest the following organisations:

Since 1979 we have sent every year a message whose regular points are (1) an appeal for total extinction of nuclear weapon and atomic power plants and (2) a warning about the big crustal disturbance in the earth coming near. The message of this leaflet is on this line.

Thank you for telephoning your report of an Unidentified Flying object to this office yesterday; I understand that you requested some further advice.

I should begin by explaining that although the Ministry of Defence does receive and co-ordinate some reports of UFO sightings, our sole concern is to establish whether or not they pose a threat to the security of the United Kingdom. Unless we judge that they do, and this has not been the case so far, we do not attempt to investigate further, or to identify whatever might have been seen.

It is clear from the reports that we see that there are many strange things to be seen in the sky, although we believe that rational explanations could be found for most of them. The possibilities that spring to mind include aircraft lights seen from unusual angles, lasers or searchlights reflecting off low clouds, ball lightning or fireballs. I accept, however, that there will always be some sightings that defy explanation, and we have an open mind on these.

You might like to write to some of the many civilian UFO organisations, who might be able to offer some advice, or tie in your sighting with others that they may have received. If you wish to do this, then may $I$ suggest the following societies:

## Dear Section 40

As I promised in my last letter, I have now shown your video to a number of my colleagues here, and discussed what it shows.

The consensus of opinion is that the bright light seen is the sun reflecting off an aircraft. Clearly the aircraft itself was too high to have been seen or heard, but the reflection off a shiny metallic surface of an aircraft can be very bright on a clear day. The fact that the light appears and then disappears would be due to the aircraft changing its position relative to you.

I would stress, however, that whilst this is our assessment, we cannot be one hundred percent sure. Other explanations, such as my original idea of an anti collision light, remain a possibility.

I should like to thank you very much for getting in touch, and $I$ am returning the video.

Thank you for your letter dated 13 June, concerning your documentary on the subject of UFOs.

I was interested to hear your views on the subject, and your account of your own experiences. I can only reiterate that we do not possess any evidence supporting the existence of alien life; also, we do not attempt in any way to silence people who have seen or are researching UFOs. Indeed, in many ways we provide a degree of assistance to such people, by referring them to UFO organisations such as BUFORA, and by writing letters such as this. I accept, however, that we may have to agree to disagree on a number of points!

There are a couple of other points that you may find useful; firstly, as I think I mentioned when you telephoned, nearly all of the reports on our files relate to sightings which might be classified as either lights or shapes in the sky, as opposed to the more "exotic" reports of close encounters/abductions. I cannot say why this should be the case, except to speculate that people might feel embarrassed about making these latter reports to anyone other than a UFO organisation. Secondly, I think it is worth pointing out that there has been a lot of recent speculation about some of the "evidence" that has been quoted to support theories of "saucer retrievals" etc. For example, there are many who now believe that documents such as the so-called Majestic 12 papers - which seem to support some of the New Mexico "saucer retrieval" stories - are fakes.

Turning to your specific questions, I hope that you will understand that for obvious reasons, we do not discuss matters relating to the Security Services. However, I have attached some general information about recruitment and careers in the Ministry of Defence, and the role of the Department, which you may find useful.

I am glad you found my previous letter useful, and I hope this is also of some help. Once again, good luck with the documentary.

Usualy a large white light ringed with red strobes cond be seen at night moving slowty ard errathonity across the clifetops. Ghis woule then appear to tand on the ground then reduce in size to a small point of red light. It would then take on the charactertstice of something running across the ground with a large torch or flaghlight Once this reached the dege of the difts it would change back in to its orighnel form and accelerete out to sea then wp tn to the shy at inerwable bpeeds. sometimes these jights would enter the sed and then remapear some time later.

Howover, near by is a masile tracking statiom and vorgan Poth, an Amexican aly Force base ot courge it couk be mitutery venioles or training cxercises but acting in anch unusual and advaroed ways?

In my late teens $I$ joined a civinian 0. . O. reseach group to purbue my interest mome $T$ was tramed as en investigator and worked whth them on many cases.

As any investigator wil tell you once you devote your time and interest in to the subject it doesn't become Lights in the sky any wore. There is so much more underneath the flimsy Government explanations and patronising articles we some times see on the T.V.

I have seen families and people seriously disrupted and aisturbed becase of a close encounters they have experienced through no wish of their own Not looneys, or rellgious fanatics, but a whole range of people, police personel, whitary men, house wives, in fact this subject can involve any one.

I have spoke and sympathised with peole who have been harassed and threatened by supposed employees of the air ministry anc $W^{T} 5$. This being because they have reaearched or spoke too openly about 0. . O.experisences.

I, and and many other kno full well that Governants of the world take this subject very seriousiy indeed. Most powers inciuding our own have known of these visitation's since the nineteen fourties. contact has been made. billions in spent in U.F.O. research development, and sone distuxbing knowledge has been discoverd.

I personaly don't know if you are aware of the inside aspects of this subject, if you dont then some one within your department cextainy does. Unfortunately you are in a job where it is not wise to ask too many guestions or relay the truth to the public. Fowever $x$ found you vary helpful ana whling to talk and I canot thank you enough for thet.

The structure of our society has been ghaped very cleverly and in a way cynically. We all feel so aate and superior on our planet because we are surrounded by thinga we know and things we have created. Any intrucion of what does not fit in whth our system of beliefs of science has a man made safety tag called humliation sceptichsm, and unreliable.

Thank you for your letter dated 7 June 1992 concerning your investigation of a UFO sighting that occurred on Thursday 9 April 1992, just off the A303 in Wiltshire. Section 40 is no longer with this division, and $I$ have taken over his duties.

I have checked our files and can confirm that we have received no reports that tie in with this sighting.

The description provided mentions that the object was shaped like an airship, and I would suggest that the object may indeed have been an airship. I am aware that there has been a recent spate of UFO sightings involving a brightly lit cigar shaped object, that turned out to be an airship, illuminated from the inside. Whilst this report states that the object was not illuminated, other details concerning size, shape and speed do seem to be consistent with this explanation. Most of the recent airship sightings were in and around London, but it might be worth checking out anyway. It might be worth your talking to the CAA about routes and timings of airship flights, or tracking down the commercial operators of the airships, which are, I believe, mainly used for sightseeing and/or advertising.

Of course, there is a good deal of Army activity in the Salisbury Plain area, and although it is not possible to be sure, because of the uncertainty over the precise area of the sighting, there is a chance that the object seen could have been a barrage balloon.

I hope this is helpful, and I wish you luck with your investigations.

Thank you for your letter dated 15 May to the Prime Minister on the subject of UFOs. I have been asked to reply. You will also recall that when we spoke recently on this subject, I explained that I would be unable to accept your offer to appear in your documentary. I shall attempt to set out for you our position on UFO's, together with other information that you may find useful. In this way although I am unable to appear in your film, you will be able to draw upon the material in this letter in representing the position of the Ministry of Defence.

You may find it helpful if $I$ begin by explaining that although the Ministry of Defence does receive and co-ordinate some reports of UFO sightings, our sole concern is to establish whether or not they pose a threat to the security of the United Kingdom. Unless we judge that they do, and this has not been the case so far, we do not attempt to investigate further, or to identify whatever might have been seen.

Since our interest in UFOS is limited to possible defence implications, we do not carry out studies into the UFO phenomenon, nor do we have the resources to undertake any in-depth investigations. I am sure that you will appreciate that defence funds are fully committed to maintaining the security of the UK and meeting our responsibilities to allies and dependents. This being so, we could not justify the use of defence funds on scientific investigations, unless a threat to the security of the UK had been identified.

It is clear from the reports we receive that there are many strange things to be seen in the sky. However, we believe that rational explanations could be found for most of them. Some of the possibile explanations include aircraft lights or aircraft seen from unusual angles, satellites in orbit or satellite debris re-entering the atmosphere, high altitude kites, helium balloons, weather balloons, searchlights or lasers reflecting off clouds, ball lightning, fireballs and meteorites. As you are also doubtless aware, some reports turn out to be hoaxes. Having said this, we accept that there will always be some sightings that defy explanation, and we have an open mind on these.

You mentioned official knowledge of UF0s which is being kept secret; I would like to assure you that there is no question of attempting to cover up any incidents, nor are we trying in any way to obscure the truth about UFOs from the public. The Ministry of Defence does not possess any evidence which supports

- the existance of alien life, or suggests that extraterrestrial spacecraft have ever visited the earth.

The Ministry of Defence does not release material on the subject "en bloc", because, as is the case with all government departments, all Ministry of Defence files are subject to the public records act, and generally remain closed from public viewing for 30 years after the last action has been taken. However, we are able to answer specific enquiries about particular sightings that have occurred recently, and can let you know if we have received reports on the incident, and if so, what they contain. You may be interested to know the numbers of UFO sightings reported to the Ministry of Defence in recent years; the figures are as follows:

So far this year we have received 55 sightings, although about a dozen of these were almost certainly sightings of an airship - illuminated from the inside which was flying over London a lot during February and March. I saw this myself, and can understand how, from a distance, this generated reports of a bright cigar-shaped UFO travelling slowly over London. I mention this as a useful example of how an explanation can often be found for an apparently quite exotic UFO report.

You mentioned the sighting of a UFO in Rendlesham Forest; the only information that we have on this matter is the report that was made by Lt Col Charles Halt, and I have attached a copy of this for your information. We have no further documents on this sighting, and are certainly not aware of any papers relating to a close encounter with aliens. You may be aware, however, that there has been some recent press coverage of supposedly official UFO documents turning out to have been fakes.

You also mentioned that you were in touch with a number of civilian UFO organisations. We routinely refer people to värious organisations, as we are aware that they will always be interested to hear from witnesses to sightings or members of the public who are interested in the subject. You are probably in touch with these organisations already, but in case you are not, the details are as follows:

* All these groups are currently engaged in study of the UF0 phenomenon, and will, I am sure, be keen to assist you in your project. There are, of course, many books on the subject of UFOs, and any good library or bookshop will probably have a fair selection.

1. Early in the mowing of 27 Dec 80 (approximately 0300L), two UsAF security police patrolmen sem unusual lights outside the back gate at RAF Woodbridge. Thinking an aircraft might have crashed or been fores down they called for permission to go outside the gate to investigate. The onduty flight chief responded and allowed three patrolman to froceded on foot. The individuals reported seeing a strange glowing object in the forest. The object was described as being metalic in appearance and triangular in shape, approximately two three meters across the base and approximately two meters high. It illuminated the entire forest with a wite light. The object itself had a pulsing red light on top and a bank (s) of blue lights underneath. The object was hovering or on legs. As the patrolmen approached the object, it maneuvered through the trees and disappeared. At this time the animals on a nearby farm went into a frenzy. The object was briefly sighted approximately on hour later near the back gate.
2. The next day, three depressions $1 / 1 / 2 "$ deep and 7 " in diameter were found were the object had been sighted on the ground. The following night (29 Dec 80) the area was checked for radiation. Deta/gama readings of 0.1 milliroentgens were recorded with peak readings in the three depressions and near the center of the triangle formed by the depressions A nearby tree had moderate (.05-.07) readings on the side of the tree toward the depressions.
3. Later in the night a red sun-like light was seen through the trees. It moved about and pulsed. At one point it appeared to throw off glowing particles and then broke into five separate wite objects and then disappeared. Immediately thereafter, thea star-like objects were noticed in the sky, two objects to the north and one to the south, all of which were about $10^{\circ}$ off the horizon. The objects moved rapidly in sharp angules movements and displayed red, green and blue lights. The objects to the north appeared to be elliptical through in $3-1$ ? power lens. They then turned to full circles. The objects to the north remained in the sky for an hour or more. The object to the south was visible for two or three hours and beaned down a stream of light from time to time. Numerous ind iv duals, including the undersigned, witnessed the activities in paragraphs 2 and 3.

Host people, probably yourself included know a man amount about the subject. There are however many civilian organisations competed to serous research including many in the $U . K$, who $I$ have been in contact with. In the states the "citizens against U.E.O. secrecy" have obtained several documents through the freedom of information act regarding an alien contact. Wis event took place at Rendalsham Forrest U.S. Air Force Base in surrey during the late nineteen eighties. According to several investigations and interviews with military personnel involved at the base, it appears that the General in charge and scores of other personnel encounter an alien object and its occupants in the surrounding woods.

Being a citizen of the U.K. I would like to hear your views and your intentions on the subject of U. X.O.s ard their connection with national security. The subject was raised in Parliament a number of years ago, but did not inspire a satisfactory result.

Thank you for your recent letter in which you asked for some information about the reported near miss last year between an aircraft on approach to Gatwick and an unidentified object.

I have attached a copy of the $C A A^{\prime}$ s report into this incident, prepared by the Joint Airmiss Section.

Because the matter had been reported as an airmiss as opposed to a UFO incident, no report had reached this office, and I only became aware of it as a result of the recent press coverage. I checked to see if we had received any other reports that might tie in with this incident, but we had not.

I hope this is helpful.



## PART A: SUMMARY OF INFORMATION REPORTED TO JAS

THE B737 PILOT reports that he was inbound to Gatwick and in communication with London control on 128.4 while squawking with Mode C. He was heading $308^{\circ}$ and descending through FL 140 at 355 kt with visibility in the region of 40 km . His FO saw a small black lozenge shaped object about 500 m ahead of the ac and at the same level. Within the space of about 1.5 sec it passed very close, less than 100 yd away, down the port side of the ac and, at the most, 30 ft above the level of the wing. He informed London Control, via the RT, who reported seeing a small primary radar contact astern of the ac. No impact or disturbance was felt on the ac and no damage was observed during a post flight inspection. He assessed the risk of collision as high.


#### Abstract

ATC AT LATCC reports that during a moderate traffic loading on the BIG/EAS CCF sector the B737 pilot reported an object passing his ac in the opposite direction at a high closing speed. The B737 was inbound to Gatwick via the Eastwood stack and passing the BEXIL way point. He was descending through $15,000 \mathrm{ft}$ and thought the object may have been a balloon, or part of, describing it as black and about 18 inches wide. The SC reports that a primary return was seen about 10 NM behind the B737 heading SE at about 100 kt . A following ac was given traffic information and avoiding turns to the left to avoid the primary return, which had appeared to change heading towards it, but its pilot reported seeing nothing. The DVR CSC was also advised of the facts in order that inbound traffic could be given vectors to avoid the area.


JAS Notes:


1 A Meteorological balloon was released from Crawley at 1719 on this particular day, it was light brown in colour and was trailing a silvery mesh triangle. Twenty six minutes after release (1745) it was at $27,000 \mathrm{ft}$ bearing $085.76^{\circ}$ and at a range of 30 km from Crawley. It ascended through $15,000 \mathrm{ft} 13 \mathrm{~min}$ after release (1732) when it was bearing $097.6^{\circ}$ and at a range of 17 km . There was a sharp inversion between $4000-5000 \mathrm{ft}$ where the temperature rose from $+8^{\circ}$ to $+12^{\circ}$. The top of convection was at 4500 ft , above this was a very dry area up to about $15,000 \mathrm{ft}$. Wind velocity at $14,000 \mathrm{ft}-305 / 25,10,000 \mathrm{ft}-295 / 25$.

2 AIS(Mil) undertook very thorough tracing action but could reach no positive conclusion. Their radar replay did show a primary return in the general area but it was seen to move about like a light ac or helicopter at low level. No Met or other balloons could be traced which having been released could have reached this area/time nor which could have appeared black. The only possible exception to this was that some hot-air balloon pilots launch small balloons which can be followed with a device called a 'Wind Tracker'. One balloon pilot contacted had released
balloons on the 6 th/7th July but then not again until the 19 th. On the 21 st he tracked one of his black balloons to 7200 ft before he lost sight of it and he assumed they could go much higher than this. The CAA SRG is well aware of this use of balloons; they and others of similar size (less than 2 m ) are exempted from most restrictions of the ANO by Article 109(a). The object seen by the B737 pilot must be considered as untraced.

## PART B: SUMMARY OF THE WORKING GROUP'S DISCUSSIONS

The only information available to the Working Group was the report from the pilot of the B737, photographs from the radar recordings, and reports from the appropriate ATC and operating authorities.

A member commented that the number of sightings of balloons and other unidentified objects seem to have become more prevalent in the $S$ and SE of the country. Members took note of the AIS(M) comment on the primary return seen in the general area of the airmiss as being more akin to the movement of a light ac or helicopter at low level. They were at a loss to identify the reported object since its shape and behaviour did not seem to fit any recognisable piece of aviation equipment, while the temperature inversion made it unlikely that something like a piece of black polythene could have been carried to that level. It was agreed that this airmiss was best described as a confliction between the B737 and the unidentified object. Whilst members were unsure what damage could have occurred had the object struck the $B 737$ the general opinion was that there had been a possible risk of collision.

I should begin by explaining that although the Ministry of Defence does receive and co-ordinate some reports of UFO sightings, our sole concern is to establish whether or not they pose a threat to the security of the United Kingdom. Unless we judge that they do, and this has not been the case so far, we do not attempt to investigate further, or to identify whatever might have been seen.

It is clear from the reports that we see that there are many strange things to be seen in the sky, although we believe that rational explanations could be found for most of them. The possibilities that spring to mind include aircraft lights seen from unusual angles, lasers or searchlights reflecting off low clouds, ball lightning or fireballs. Having said this, I do think, from what you say, that the object was probably an aircraft, possibly with some of its lights obscured.

You may find it helpful if I begin by explaining that although the Ministry of Defence does receive and co-ordinate some reports of UF0 sightings, our sole concern is to establish whether or not they pose a threat to the security of the United Kingdom. Unless we judge that they do, and this has not been the case so far, we do not attempt to investigate further, or to identify whatever might have been seen.

Since our interest in UFOs is limited to possible defence implications, we do not carry out studies into the UFO phenomenon, nor do we have the resources to undertake any in-depth investigations. I am sure that you will appreciate that defence funds are fully committed to maintaining the security of the UK and meeting our responsibilities to allies and dependents. This being so, we could not justify the use of defence funds on scientific investigations, unless a threat to the security of the UK had been identified.

It is clear from the reports we receive that there are many strange things to be seen in the sky. However, we believe that rational explanations could be found for most of them. Some of the possibile explanations include aircraft lights or aircraft seen from unusual angles, satellites in orbit or satellite debris re-entering the atmosphere, high altitude kites, helium balloons, weather balloons, searchlights or lasers reflecting off clouds, ball lightning, fireballs and meteorites. As you are also doubtless aware, some reports turn out to be hoaxes. Having said this, we accept that there will always be some sightings that defy explanation, and we have an open mind on these.

You mentioned official knowledge of UFOs which is being kept secret; I would like to assure you that there is no question of attempting to cover up any incidents, nor are we trying in any way to obscure the truth about UFOs from the public. The Ministry of Defence does not possess any evidence which supports the existance of alien life, or suggests that extraterrestrial spacecraft have ever visited the earth.

I am not able to send you material on the subject "en bloc", because, as is the case with all government departments, all Ministry of Defence files are subject to the public records act, and generally remain closed from public viewing for

On Sunday April 5th 1992, we received a call from a Section 40 informing us about several UFO flights in one night, over the Stapleford in Nottingham.

## REDACTED ON ORIGINAL

The first sighting was of a single orange object at 20.30 hrs , on March 29th. The second sighting was at 21.15 and consisted of six orange objects, two of these dived towards the ground and vanished behind houses. At 22.00 hours she, and at least four work colleagues witnessed another single one fly by. Sometimes the UFOs appeared stationary and also gave a whirring sound. They appeared to be orange spheres and flickered.
We received another call from a Section 40
Section 40 , stapleford, who claimed to have seen
something exactly the same, on the previous night ( $28 t h$
March and the times differed slightly. This time they
passed over at 19.30 hours, 21.30 and 22.00 hours.

The flights were steady on both nights. On the Saturday night, the six objects/spheres disappeared into low cloud.

On Friday, April 3rd, I wrote to the M.O.D. ( see letter ) On Saturday April 4th, I wrote to the Nottingham constabulary ( see letter). On Monday April 6th, Section 40 made some checks about light shows ( see statement ). On Friday April 10th, I contacted the Nottingham Recorder to appeal for information, a reporter will be phoning me on Monday 13 th April.
On Saturday April 11th, Section 40 and I went to check out the farms around Stapleford Hill. First we went to Section 40 Section 40 Stapleford, we spoke to a farm worker, who was ploughing a field. He told us that Section 40 is the farm owner, but does not live in the farmhouse. The occupants living in the farmhouse didn't see or hear anything unusual.

We then went to Section 40, on Section 40 , and this only consists of a farmhouse and outbuildings.The retired farmer, saw and heard nothing unusual.

We went to the farm shop on Section 40
Ilkeston, to find out who owns the livestock in the area. We spoke to the owner of the livestock, and every one was accounted for. No cattle mutilations or UFO sightings.

On Monday 13 th April, I received a reply from the M.O.D. ( see letter 1.
On Tuesday April 14 th, the appeal for information appeared in the Nottingham Evening Post, and on the following evening it also appeared in the Recorder. I also received a reply from Nottingham Constabulary ( see letter ).

The appeal brought in a large response, and we received over thirty phone calls during the case, up to Monday April 20th. On Friday 17th April, certain details of these sightings were printed in the Evening post.

The following day, we received a tip off that some adults were sending upminiature hot air balloons, from a house on , Stapleford. That night, ISection 40 and Section 40 and myself, went to watch the house from Section 40 After fifty minutes, it started to rain and we decided to call it a night, we went and knocked on the door, but nobody was in, so we went to their next door neighbours. Amidst their laughter, they told us that they knew nothing about it. We assumed that they were laughing at us, as we were UFO investigators.

On Sunday April 19th, at ten am, Section 40 and myself knocked on the door of number $\quad$. face appeared at the bedroom window, and shortly afterwards the door opened. We introduced ourselves, and stated that we had reason to believe that they had been launching orange glowing objects into the night sky. His face was a picture of guilt, as a million thoughts flashed through his mind. He didn't know whether he was in trouble or how we had tracked them down. He invited us in, and told us his name was (J) and he told us the names of two other lads involved. One is and the other is $\quad$ He demonstrated how it was achieved, and constructed a contraption for us, made from a firelighter, copper wire and a clear plastic bin liner bag, basically a miniature hot air balloon. The firelighter fills the bag with hot air and then the bag rises into the air. The firelighter cannot be blown out by the wind, and the balloon can go for over a mile, at great height.

Several people saw them disappear into low cloud on one occasion. A friend of showed him how it was done. It was performed on at least three occasions to the best of knowledge, and he added that the other lads could have done it on other occasions. When asked about several at one time, going up, he stated that this was correct and that one from the bunch had fallen out of the sky. " The whole idea was just for the fun of seeing them go up ". Said .

He asked for his friends and also his own name and their location to be kept from the media. We respected his wishes, and told him that it was only so we could close the case.

We asked , if he would give us a demonstration one night, and this was fixed for Monday April 20th. The evening came around, and Section 40 phoned me to say, that he couldn't make it. He had intended on being there to capture it on video tape. The students and myself, went into fields at Stapleford, and tried to launch six balloons, the wind was too strong, and they found it very difficult to launch them, after several attempts, they got three off the ground,
two crashed into trees, but the third was successful. It went over the trees and glided away into the distance. The whole experiment was captured on my 35 mm camera. (photographic). Case Closed.

## UFO' ARE HOT ATR

Recent UFO sightings over Stapleford, were hot air, according to UFO investigators, Section 40 and Section 40 Section 40of the East Midlands UFO Research Association.

Balls of orange coloured lights, spotted over Stapleford turned out to be miniature hot aix balloons.

Following a tip-off, the information received led them to a certain address in the stapleford area, where it was discovered that several students had released these objects as a prank.

One of the students demonstrated how this was achieved. It consisted of a clear plastic bin liner, with copper wire threaded through a firelighter, attached to the bag. The firelighter was then lit and the hot air inside the bag carried it up into the air. Several of these were released on different nights.

The whirring sound reported by witnesses, was probably due to the wind on the bags. The size reported, was about the size of a car, which goes to show that distance and sizes are very difficult to judge.

The students, who wish to remain anonymous, didn't intend the air balloons to be taken as UFOs. "It was just done for the fun of seeing them go up into the air. They can travel for over a mile at great height.". Said one of the students.
" We are not disappointed with the explanation, it just goes to show that we check every possibility and that over $90 \%$ of UFOs can be identified ". Said Section 40

The first sighting was reported by telephone to Sergeant Section 40 of Flight Complaints RAF Ludloe Manor @ 18.55,who confirmed that he would send a report to MoD. The second and third sightings were not reported to any third party.

FIRST SIGHTING - 18.45
First sighting @ 18.45 took place $\psi^{15 m i n}$ after sunset.A bright light appeared in front of dark rainclouds on the west horizon 15 degrees above horizon : estimated brightness magnitude -5 .The object was coming directly towards the observers unusually slowly, almost hovering. Through binoculars one could distinguish three lights - one central bright one and two subsidiary and smaller ones. The object was at no more than 2000 feet up . NO NOISE WHATSOEVER could be heard. The evening was very calm and still and one could hear cars up to $\frac{7}{2}$ mile away. The object got to within less than 1000 yards away when it seemed to stop,as though it had noticed the observers. What happened next was seen only by as was trying to set up a telescope. The object shimmered,became nebulous and then invisible. Section 40 after less than 5 seconds tracked the object through binoculars travelling very fast (faster than a military jet) in the same easterly direction noiselessly, without vapour trails. This time the object appeared as a diffuse elliptical glow with a light flashing intermittently and regularly in the middle, but toward the rear of the craft.

SECOND SIGHTING - 20.45
Observey Section 40 went out into the back garden (which faces south), it was as if he had been "summoned". In the SSE at 45 degrees an object was travelling to the west.It had 3 lights in a triangular pattern the apex of the triangle was a brighter light than the other two and was at the rear of the motion of the craft - The shape of the craft could not be made out.The object travelled very slowly as before (no faster than a microlite) but noiselessly and in a straight line. It was tracked through binoculars until it was lost from view on the western horizon. The speed of the object was constant.At its nearest the object covered $\frac{1}{2}$ degree of sky and was 3000 feet up - A comercial aircraft that pased overhead travelling south at 20.55 at 7000 feet could clearly be heard. Could the UFO have been much higher than estimated? If so it would have been massive.

## THIRD SIGHTING - 21.00

Section 40 went into back garden. The night was moonless clear and still, as before Setion 40 mmediately noticed the same triangular light formation in the SSE at 60 degrees or more in the sky and travelling to the NNW.No sound was heard.AVYB also witnessed the object.It travelled very slowly and smoothly passing to the East of the zenith.It was much lower than before ( 1000 feet?). Both observers saw the object through binoculars (10 by 40). Both observers thought they noticed a domed/curved shape on the upper side of the object.There were two side lights of a brilliant white and a central diffuse emerald green glow behind which there was a red flashing light,flashing in a regular intermittent manner but as though it was turningetion 40 says she also saw a blue light. The red light and green glow became visible only after the object had passed overhead.The object was observed until it disappeared from sight over the NNW horizon.

In all sightings the observers believe they saw the same object.It did not rise and fall, save as mentioned in the first sighting it travelled slowly,almost hovering but
making purposeful progress toward a given point.UnfortunateIy no photographs were taken - the observers were to interested to make out the nature of the object.Handwritten notes were made @ $22.003 / 3 / 92$ upon which this report is based.

Thinking an aircraft might have crashed or hen forced down, they called for permission $, 0,90$ outside the gate to investigate. The onfoty flight chief responded and allowed three potrolnon to froged on foot. The individuals reported seeing a strange glowing object in the forest. The object was described as being metelic in appearance and triangular in shape, approximately two to three meters across the base and approximately two meters high. It illuminated the entire forest with a wite light. The object itself had a pulsing red light on top and a bank (s) of blue lights undemedth. The object was hovering or on legs. As the patrolmen approached the object, it maneuvered throwh the trees and disappeared. At this time the animals on a nearby fam mont into a frenzy. The object was briefly sighted approximately an hour later near the back gate.
2. The next day. three depressions $1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ deep and $7^{\prime \prime}$ in diameter were found where the object had been sighted on the ground. The following night (29 Dec 30 ) the area was checked for radiation. Beta/gama readings of 0.1 milliroentgens were recorded with peak readings in the three depressions and near the center of the triangle formed by the depressions. A nearby tree had moderate (.05-.07) readings on the side of the tree toward the depressions.
3. Later in the night a red sun-like light bes seen through the trees. It moved about and pulsed. At one point it appeared to throw off glowing particles and then broke into five separate mite objects and then disappeared. mediately thereafter, three starlike objects mere noticed in the sky, two objects to the north and one to the south, all of winch were about $10^{\circ}$ off the horizon. The objects moved rapidly in sharp anguic: movements and displayed red, green and blue lights. The objects to the north appeared to be elliptical through an 8-12 power lens. They then turned to full circles. The objects to the north remained in the sky for an hour or more. The object to the south was visible for two or three hours and beamed down a stream of light from the to time. Unless we judge that they do, and this has not been the case so far, we do not attempt to investigate further, or to identify whatever might have been seen. Given this limited involvement, our files consist of little more than a collection of UFO sighting reports, and not the sort of documents which have been mentioned in many of the recent books to have been published on this subject.

I believe that most of the documents that have been referred to in UFO books recently are American, and that they have been released under the Freedom of Information Act. Given this, you might try contacting the United States Embassy to see if they can help. The address is 24 Grosvenor Square, London, W1A 1 AE .

I am particularly interested in the RaF Ofiticer's plans and charts etc because one of my calleague UFO investigators, retired Aeronautical EngineerSection 40 has for the last twenty five years been researching and developing an Astronautical theory concerning UFO sightings to the point where is satisiled that he can detect specific flight paths of JFOs both nationally and globallysection 40flight paths fit in with all the well evidenced UFO sightings to a point well beyond which the connection could be regarded as pure coincidence - suffice to say that the event now under enquiry also fits neatly into one of the well established flight paths

I look forward to receiving your official explanation of the events described above and as to what you think the object was and as to why the Log book was doctored so that evidence of the sighting was removed also, as requested, would it be possible for an interview to be arranged with the RAF Investigator?

Given this limited involvement with the subject, the Ministry of Defence has no department which is appointed solely for the purpose of studying uFo reports, nor are there any staff employed on the subject full time. With regard to the procedure for UFO sightings, any report submitted to the Ministry of Defence is automatically passed to this office. The reports we receive, which are usually limited to very brief details of what was witnessed, are passed to staff in departments concerned with air defence of the United Kingdom, who examine them as part of their normal duties. The Ministry of Defence does not carry out studies, investigations or surveys into the UFO phenomenon.

It is clear from the reports we receive that there are many strange things to be seen in the sky. However, we believe that rational explanations could be found for most of them. The possibilities that spring to mind include aircraft lights, aircraft seen from unusual angles, kites, helium balloons, weather balloons, unusual cloud formations, satellites in orbit or satellite debris re-entering the earth's atmosphere, ball lightning, fireballs and meteorites. As you may be aware from your reading, there is also a suspicion that some reports are hoaxes.

At 10.00 p.m. this evening $I$ telephoned the main exchange number for the Royal Air Force based at Coltishall, Norfolk, to report a strange object in the sky and to seek reassurance from someone in authority.

After explaining to the telephonist why $I$ had called and asking to speak to some member of the base staff who could help, I was "cut-off'. I immediately called again only to have the same telephonist, a rude, off-handed, arrogant young man tell me 'stop wasting my time' and then disconnect me once again. At no time was $I$ given the opportunity of explaining, in full, why I was telephoning. I am shocked at the way members of the public, the very people our armed forces serve, are treated and $I$ would ask you for an explanation of this man's behaviour.

Further to our telephone conversation of today Friday 22nd November 1991. I enclose details of the observations made by a number of Civil Servants in an Edinburgh Office block on the late afternoon of Wednesday 20th November 1991.

The witnesses have described the following incident:
During the period 15.50 hours until 16.15 on 20.11.91. Several objects were observed making erratic movements to the East of Edinburgh. From the vantage point in an upper floor of an office Block on the West of Edinburgh, the objects were seen above the local Edinburgh landmark of "Arthurs Seat" which is a large volcanic hill two miles to the East of the City Centre and an estimated 6 miles line of sight from the point of observation.

It is fair to add that several witnesses thought that the objects may have indeed been a greater distance to the East but in the same general direction.

The objects were not identified as conventional aircraft due to the very erratic movement patterns they made.

At around 16.15 a Civil aircraft thought to have been an Edinburgh bound Shuttle made its appearance in the same general area of airspace. As the Aircraft approached the objects they were seen to scatter upwards at phenomenal speed until they disappeared.


I find it hard to beleive that military aircraft would be operating in this area so close to traditional Civil air routes and I would be grateful if you would assist us by confirming whether or not there may have been Military manouvers at the above location and time.

I would also be most grateful for any other non confidential information that may assist us in our investigation into this incident.

1. We have received information about a UFO sighting which occurred yesterday over South Wales/Hereford and Worcester.
2. The sighting occurred at approximately 1650 Z yesterday, and reports were made to a number of different locations, including the police at Worcester and Dyfed, local fire brigade stations, the CRO at RAF Hereford (where there were a number of military witnesses), and Duty officers at RAF Shawbury, RAF Brampton and in Main Building. The Distress and Diversion Cell at West Drayton also fielded a number of calls. I understand that the sighting was reported on local radio and television, and reports appeared in the Shawbury Star and the Manchester Evening News.

I write further to my telephone call on the 8 th November 1991. The purpose of that call was to enquire about some strange bluewhite lights which my family had seen in the sky between about 7 and 10 pm on the day before. I was advized that if $I$ wrote to you I could be told whether or not there was some simple technical explanation for the appearance of these strange lights. I might add, that the colleague who originally telephoned your office, on my behalf, subsequently rang the Met office and although the person there was not able to offer any meteorological explanation for the lights, he or she, did comment, that other phone calls had been received from this district.

As I explained on the telephone, the lights appeared to come from betweeen 3 to 5 seperate scources. They followed a path which appeared sometimes circular, sometimes elliptical, but always in a clockwise direction. We assumed the scource was above cloud level because at certain places on their path, the lights appeared to disappear behind the clouds. # Space invader shocks UFO talks

KATHRYN HOWARD, an American siuger with shimmering bond hair and tress, was just aboui to tell of her abduction experience (Sweden, April 1969, went to the moon in spaceship as tall as Sheffeld Central Library, listened to rhythm of universe) whea something happened.

A cigar-shaped object, no more than 6 in long and with a bulbous tip, shof across the stage in front of her at a speed of at least 10 mph . It crashed to the floor, skidding, shattering and making a startling noise.
"Oooh?" went the audience. "Whow" Were aliens imervening to stop MIs Howard revealing all? When it energed that The Independent on Sunday's photographer had merely tripped over a lead, wrenching a microphone from its stand, the whispers of explanation were laden with disappointment.
Tew people at the Sixth International Congress on UFOs might have been expected to show relief that Ms Howard was not going to be re-abducted before our eyes, but a lot fell cheated. And that explains some of the current problems of "Ufology".
"If I resolve a case, Tive succeeded,', says the British UFO Research Association's invesigathons director, Jenny Randles. "Dut too many Ufologisis don't wamt to explain things. That's not what they're here for." Talking, teeth clewched, of New Agers and assorted hippie types, she says that tampering with evidence

that might provide a rational explanation is not unkoowa. "There are people within the Uhology commanity who hold very firmly to beliefs about extra-terrestrial intelligence. And there are no lengths they won't go to to stop those who challenge them."

The central question - can Ufology become a serious sciantifie discipline when there are so many nutters around? - is well illustrated at Mike Alexander's stall outside the conerence. There, dense, desktop-pablished casebooks and statistical investigations struggle for your castom with Ainix llying-saucer kits, dolls of Steven Spielberg's star $E T$, and a display from the comedy movie Spaced Invaders: "Now
there's living proot there is no intelligent hife in space."

Mr Alexander ("sceptical with an open mind") isn't worried about mixing science with Hollywood. "A lot of people take all this too seriousiy," he says - of fering a sticker, "UFOs are real - ask the Goverament", for $£ 3$.

Just as sanguine is his fellow Independent UFO Network member Terry Jones, who sports a Gary Numan tattoo and a flying suit with "US Colonial Marines" badges attached - "Like in the move Alters," he says with pride. Is he, perhaps, an abductee? Mr Jones considers. "I don't think I am. I don't believe I am - not as far as I know. But Ive got an intense interest in the subject."

Ms Randles relies on the respect of the Ministry of Defence and Jodrell Bank to help her investigate dozens of reports of "anomalous phenomena" (90) per cent are guicky exphained every year.
"It's a waste of time to be seen as a bunch of amateurs wandering around looking for aliens on hilltops," she complains. "But in the end it always comes down to money: to fund serious research you've got to pander to an extent to the communits."

She went of to test her sensibie explanations of com circles on an audience still reeling from Ms Howard's stories of Mot aliens and a universe that goes "Vroom, vroom".

## Dear Section 40

Thank you for your letter dated 14 August concerning the handling of unknown light phenomena.

The procedure with regard to sightings of any unusual lights or objects in the UK is that reports made by or received by military personnel in the UK (American or British) should be forwarded to this department, as the central point for all such business. However, our only role is to ensure that there is no threat to the security and defence of the UK. There is no policy document setting out any criteria for this.

I am not able to comment on the procedures that apply under the Freedom of Information Act, and the release of American documents is a matter for the appropriate American authorities. The position of the Ministry of Defence is that we, are bound by the provisions of the Public Records Act, and official files generally remain closed from public viewing for 30 years after the last action has been taken. With regard to our files on UFOs, therefore, we are not able to release material en bloc, although we are able to answer any specific queries you may have about particular incidents that have occurred recently and can let you know whether we have a report on the incident and if so, what it contains.

You mentioned other departments, but as I explained, all reports should be forwarded to us, and therefore any queries on any UFO incidents that have occurred in the UK should be addressed to us.

I have a few questions which require the professional decision of your experienced staff people at MOD D/Sec(AS 2a).

Here, I am asking for the address of RAF Rudloe Manor or the other referenced names of the other departments are as follows HQ RAF Support Command, RAF Brampton, HQ Provost and Security Service. I would like to correspond with their department through a correct address on some trivial matters of interest to my self.

Here, I wish to know about your established protocol interest in these sightings of unknown light phenomena. On the subject of our US military people who are assigned to particular British base's, are there any clearly defined need for the US Military people to expedite as soon as possible through the ... British military Liais on Commander.

I would like to obtain the official understanding through communication of this and the MOD interest's in such phenomena that has been seen by US military personnal, are there rules and regulations that must be followed to the letter, when the British liaison Officer recieves the sighting report and are there restriction which allow our US military people to ask your department for a copy of the US military originated memo on the sighting events. There is a need to understand what your regulations cover and in regard to a request by a US military dept, would they have to ask for the copy of the memo at the command level at a particular section such as the Base US military CO.

There seems to be a conflicting situation involving this American Freedome of Information Act and the American UFO enthusiast who are able to obtain such memo's by describing the document with sufficient details, so that the US Military Public Affairs section CO on base can determin if any such described documents exist and then respond accordingly. You are no doubt aware of the interesting problem here, It circumvents your Official Secrets Act in the fact that if a memo or report does exist within the US milittary, then there is a possibliity of the report being on file at their Document Managment Services section.

With this knowledge, I need to know if there are any special established protocol agreements which advise the various US military departments to the effect that all documentation that is forwarded to your department that pertains to Unknown Light phenomena sightings by our US military people who are assigned to these base's in your country, are not to be acknowledged that such a memo has been forwarded to your department and no US military section Co may request a copy of the memo in order to answere a American UFO enthusiast FOIA request.

From your dept staff, a question, can the $C O$ of Document Management services at the 513 th Combat Support Group acknowledge and ask for a copy of a memo through gracious consent of Her Majesty's government, the British Minestry of Defence and the Royal Air Force. It is very important that I clearly understand your established protocol procedures exactly, so that there is no missinterpetation due to lack of communication on my part.

I have a 14 -June-1983 letter from the USAF which explains their policy of that time frame. It does indicate that the USAF did as indicated ask somewheone within the MOD for a copy of the letter. It would be inappropriate to inquire about this 14-June-1983 letter nor it's author or the individual that the letter was addressed to. However conciderable change in protocol must have occured since then.

Here, I am asking about yout established protocol instruttions to the British liaison officer's and what instructions esist that pertain to any US military personnal who wish to file a sighting report. Is there a information document on what your department people are looking for in these reports to determin if they are of a Defence Implecation.
