Dear Sir

While visiting the air port here in Marshall, Texas I heard the sound of a jet plane over head and looked up to see if I could see it. Instead I saw a white object which appeared to be very high traveling in a Northwesterly direction. This object moved very fast and it seemed to me that it maneuvered in an irregular and circular flight path, although it would keep a straight course for a period of time. To the best of my knowledge it disappeared within one or one and a half minutes. It appeared to be flashing and zig zagging as it faded out of sight.

I do not know just what this object could be and this is the first time I have ever seen anything like it.

1. Date object was observed Letter to you (29 Apr 52)
  2. Time object was first seen About 3:30 P.M. or 1530 hrs.
  3. Place from which you observed the object Marshall Airport
  4. How was object observed (naked eye, binoculars, etc.) naked eye
  5. What were you doing when the object was first observed? Standing on ramp
  6. What attracted your attention to the object? Heard jet plane overhead and looked up + saw white object instead of jet
  7. Path of object.
    - a. Direction from which object appeared (degrees or direction) First noticed directly overhead.
    - b. Direction in which object disappeared (degrees or direction) approximately 330 or 340 degrees.
    - c. Elevation object appeared (degrees above horizon) approx - 85 degrees when first sighted.
    - d. Elevation object disappeared (degrees above horizon) approx - 30 or 35 degrees
    - e. Shape of flight path of object (straight and level, arched, etc.) straight and level + seemed to oscillate to one side.
    - f. How did object disappear (grow dimmer, go out suddenly, etc.) Became smaller + smaller.
  8. Length of time the object was observed Approx - one to one and a half minutes
  9. Description of object.
    - a. How many objects were seen: one
    - b. Apparent size of object? A guess - about 20 ft. diameter

- c. Apparent speed of object? Don't know but it appeared to be fast.
- d. Apparent altitude of object? Guess - 10,000 ft. or lower.
- e. Shape of object? appeared to be round
- f. Color of object? White

g. Did object perform any maneuvers, if so describe It seemed to oscillate or move sideways from flight path and then straight.

- h. Did object make any sound, if so describe do not think so.

- i. Were any tails or trails seen? no.

- j. Draw sketch.
